LAW ENFORCEMENT
CIVIL SERVICE MERIT SYSTEM

PRIVATE ACTS OF 1972

CHAPTER 332

SECTION 1. All counties having a population of not less than sixty-three thousand and seven hundred (63,700) nor more than sixty-three thousand eight hundred (63,800) inhabitants according to U. S. Census of population of 1970 or any subsequent U. S. Census of population may establish merit system for employees of the office of sheriff of such counties.

SECTION 2. The merit system to which this Act shall apply shall be the classified service which includes all positions and salaried employees in the office of sheriff except the sheriff, his chief deputy, jail cook, bookkeeper and his personal secretary, unless such secretary is deputized as a deputy sheriff.

SECTION 3. There is hereby created a merit service board composed of five (5) members selected by the Quarterly County Court to administer the provisions of this Act.

SECTION 4. The terms of the members shall be three (3) years; provided, however, that the initial appointment shall be as follows:

- (a) Two (2) members for one (1) year.
- (b) Two (2) members for two (2) years.
- (c) One (1) member for three (3) years.

All appointments thereafter shall be for three-year terms. A member shall be eligible to reappointment.

SECTION 5. All members of the board must be over twenty-one (21) years of age; of good moral character; a citizen of the United States and the State of Tennessee and must reside in the county.

SECTION 6. The members of the board shall receive such compensation as may be determined by the Quarterly County Court.

SECTION 7. The board shall designate one of its members to serve as chairman of the board. The sheriff shall appoint one of his employees to be personnel officer. The personnel officer shall be the keeper of the personnel records of employees under the provisions of this Act and shall serve as secretary of the merit service board.

SECTION 8. The merit service board as a body shall have the power:

- (a) To adopt and amend rules and regulations for the administration of this Act.
- (b) To make investigations concerning the enforcement and effect of this Act and to require observance of the rules and regulations.
- (c) To hear and determine appeals and complaints respecting the administration of this Act.
- (d) To establish and maintain a roster of all employees of the classified service in the office of the sheriff showing their positions, rank, compensation and places of residence.
- (e) To ascertain and record the duties and responsibilities pertaining to all positions in the classified service and to classify such positions in the manner hereinafter provided.
- (f) Except as otherwise provided in this Act to formulate and hold competitive tests to determine the qualifications of persons who seek employment in any position, and as a result of such tests, establish employment lists of eligibles for the various positions.
- (g) To establish records of the performance and a system of service ratings to be used to determine promotions, the order of lay-offs or reduction of force and the order or re-employment to assist in the determination of dismissal for cause and for other purposes.
- (h) To provide for part-time and temporary positions and appointments and to establish rules defining and governing such positions; provided, however, that no temporary position shall be more than three (3) months.
- (i) To keep any other records as may be necessary for the administration of this Act.

SECTION 9. The board shall, as soon as practical after this Act becomes operative, adopt a classification plan and make rules and regulations for its administration. The classification plan shall state for each class of positions, a class title, and the duties, authorities, responsibilities and character of work required for each position. Each class of positions may be subdivided, and classes may be grouped and ranked in such manner as is deemed appropriate. The board shall determine the requirements of each position and class thereof as to education, experience, capabilities, knowledge and skill. As far as practical, the probable lines of promotion to and from the classes of position shall be indicated.

SECTION 10. The board may, upon request and advice of the sheriff, create new positions or combine, alter or abolish existing positions in such manner as the board, acting with the advice of the sheriff, deems necessary for the effective operation of the office of sheriff; provided, however, that no position in the classified service shall be abolished except upon approval of the board acting in good faith upon the advice of the sheriff.

SECTION 11. The board shall formulate reasonable rules governing the granting of leaves of absence to members of the classified service in good standing. The board shall request the recommendation of the sheriff upon any request of leave of absence before acting thereon and shall be guided by the requirements of the adequate law enforcement and operational efficiency of the office of sheriff when considering any such request for a leave.

Any person coming under the classified service who shall hereafter be inducted into the armed forces of the United States of America, or who shall hereafter enter said service voluntarily, by enlistment or otherwise in a time of war or other national emergency shall, upon application to the sheriff, receive a military leave of absence for the duration of the period of service required. Such employee shall retain all rights for seniority and shall be entitled to re-employment in the same capacity and position which he held at the time of entering said military service. The application for such rein-statement in position shall be made by or on behalf of such employee within three (3) months after termination of active service in the armed forces.

SECTION 12. The sheriff shall inform the board by periodic reports of the employment needs of the office of sheriff and the board shall, as often as required by the needs of the office of sheriff, hold tests for the purpose of establishing lists of eligibles for the various positions in the classified service. Such tests shall be public, competitive and open to all persons who may be lawfully appointed under the rules promulgated by the board and existing prior to the announcement of the examination. Such rules shall set limitations as to residence, age, health, habits, moral character and other necessary pre-requisites for the performance of the duties of the position for which examination is designated and such rules shall not be less than those provided in Section 38-1104 of the Tennessee Code Annotated.

Promotion tests shall be public, competitive and free to all persons examined and appointed under the provisions of this Act and who have held a classified position with the office of sheriff for at least one (1) year period of time. All tests shall be practical and shall consist only of subjects which will fairly determine the capacity of the person examined to perform the duties of the position in which the appointment is to be made. Tests may include examination for physical fitness and manual skill. No questions in any test shall relate to religious or political opinions or affiliations. The eligibles shall take rank upon a list which shall be compiled for each position, in the order of their relative excellence as determined by the tests without reference to the priority of the time from when the tests are given. No lists of eligible persons shall be valid after one (1) year except, however, the merit service board may extend an eligible period for not more than one (1) year. Notice of the time, place and general scope of each test and the duties, pay and experience required for all positions for which the test is to be held, shall be given by; the board to each applicant at least one (1) week preceding the test. The notice must be in writing and addressed to the last known address supplied by the applicant. Notice of promotional tests shall be given as the board may prescribe.

SECTION 13. Whenever a vacancy occurs in any position in the classified section of the office of sheriff, the sheriff shall make requisition to the board for the names and addresses of all persons eligible for appointment thereto. The board shall certify the names of all persons on the eligible list for position wherein the vacancy exists within thirty (30) days of the requisition to the board. The sheriff thereupon shall investigate each of the five (5) highest on the list of eligibles. In

the event the investigations result in none of the five (5) eligible persons being acceptable to the sheriff, he shall investigate the next five (5) eligibles on the list, one after another until one of the eligibles investigated is acceptable to the sheriff. The sheriff shall appoint such person to the position wherein the vacancy exists and shall notify the board of his action. If the merit service board fails to provide a list, then the sheriff may make appointments to vacancies after having notified the board of his action or his intentions so to do.

No appointment or promotion for any position in the classified service, shall be deemed complete until after the expiration of six (6) months probationary service during which time the sheriff may determine the effectiveness of the employee. If in his judgment the employee does not meet the standards, he may terminate the employment of any person certified and appointed when he deems it to be in the best interest of the service. Whenever a position of the classified service is filled by promotion and the services of the person promoted are terminated by the sheriff during the probationary period, such person shall forthwith be returned to duty in the previous position held by him in the classified service unless such person's conduct during the probationary period had given grounds for dismissal for cause under this Act. Any person dismissed during the probationary period shall not be eligible to a hearing before the board.

A person who is certified to the sheriff and does not report for duty at the time so designated and who does not explain such failure to report in writing within five (5) days, may be rejected by the sheriff who shall forthwith notify the board of the action taken and the reason therefor, and the person's name will then be removed from the eligible list.

SECTION 14. All employees in the classified service may be transferred from one position to another in the same class, and not otherwise. Transfers may be instituted only by the sheriff and shall be permitted only with the consent of the sheriff.

SECTION 15. The practice and procedure of the board with respect to any investigation by the board as authorized by this Act, shall be in accordance with the rules and regulations to be established by the board. Such rules and regulations shall provide for a reasonable notice to all persons affected by any order which the board may issue upon completion of such investigation. Such persons shall have the opportunity to be heard either in person or by counsel, and to introduce testimony in his behalf at a public hearing which shall be held for that purpose.

The board, when conducting any investigations or hearings authorized by this Act, shall have the power to administer oaths, take depositions, issue subpoenas, compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of books, accounts, papers, records, documents and testimony. In case of the obedience of any person to comply with the orders of the board or of a subpoena issued by the board or any of its members, or on the refusal of a witness to testify on any matter on which he may be lawfully interrogated, the judge in any court of record within the county on application of any member of the board, shall compel obedience by proceedings as for contempt. The sheriff or his legal deputy shall serve such subpoenas as issued by the board.

SECTION 16. The sheriff shall give an immediate report in writing of all appointments, reinstatements, vacancies, absences or other matter effecting the status of any member of the

classified service or the performance of the duties of such members. The report shall be in the manner and form prescribed by the board.

The sheriff may suspend any employee for not more than ten (10) days for cause and there shall be no right of appeal for any suspension thereof. Provided, however, the sheriff shall not have the authority to suspend any employee for more than one suspension of ten (10) days within any given six (6) month period of time without a right of appeal. If the sheriff shall suspend any employee for a period longer than ten (10) days, the suspended employee shall be notified in writing of the charges which caused his suspension. He shall thereafter have ten (10) days to request a hearing before the merit service board, and upon his request the board shall set a hearing not more than thirty (30) days from the date of the receipt of his request for a hearing.

SECTION 17. The sheriff shall have the authority to dismiss any employee for ordinary cause with a right of appeal to the board assured the employee. The dismissed employee shall be notified in writing of the causes for dismissal. He shall have ten (10) days to request a hearing before the board and upon his request the council shall set a hearing not more than thirty (30) days from the date of the receipt of his request. The rules of procedure for the conduct of any investigation by the merit service board shall apply to this hearing. Upon a finding by the board that the sheriff has not complied with the procedures of board, the board may order the employee to be reinstated.

SECTION 18. No. employee holding a position in the classified service shall take an active part in any political campaign while on duty nor under any circumstance shall any employee of the office of sheriff solicit money for political campaigns or in any way use his position as a deputy sheriff so as to reflect his personal political feelings as those of the office of sheriff or to use his position as deputy sheriff to exert any pressure on any one person or group of people to sway that person's or persons' political views. Neither an employee while on duty nor any officer while in uniform shall display any political advertising or paraphernalia on his person or on his automobile. No employee of the office of sheriff shall make any public endorsement of any candidate in any campaign for elected office. However, nothing in this Act shall be construed to prohibit or prevent any such employee from becoming or continuing to be a member of a political club or organization and enjoying all the rights and privileges of such membership or from attending any political meetings, while not on duty, or in the course of his official business, nor shall he be denied from enjoying any freedom from interference in the casting of his vote. Any person violating the provisions of this Section shall be dismissed from the service of the office of the sheriff.

SECTION 19. The sheriff shall not require any employee in the classified service to participate in any political activity as a condition of employment, continuation of employment, or promotion. If, upon an investigation by the board and its determination that such actions have taken place, the board shall issue an order to the sheriff to cease and desist such activity. If the sheriff fails to comply or persists in the activity, the council may apply to any court of record in the county for a citation of contempt.

SECTION 20. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not effect other provisions or applications of the

Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to that end the provision of this Act are declared to [sic] severable.

SECTION 21. All laws or parts of laws in conflict with the provisions or [sic] this Act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 22. This Act shall become effective as to any county to which it may apply when the same shall have been approved by the Quarterly County Court of such county by vote of not less than two-thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) of the members thereof, such approval to be made by said Quarterly County Court within ninety (90) days after the sine die adjournment of the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee for the year 1972, the public welfare requiring it becoming effective at the time. Its approval or non-approval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the Quarterly County Court and certified by him to the Secretary of State.

SECTION 23. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this Act, as provided in Section 22, it shall be effective on becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes it shall become effective September 1, 1972 upon being approved as provided in Section 22.

RESOLUTION NO. 14-04-003

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING AND INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE PROVISIONS OF THE 2012 EDITION OF THE COMPREHENSIVE INTERNATIONAL BUILDING AND FIRE CODES AND THE 2010 ADA STANDARDS FOR ACCESSIBLE DESIGN FOR THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF BLOUNT COUNTY AND THOSE INCORPORATED CITIES WITHIN BLOUNT COUNTY WHICH HAVE NOT ADOPTED THEIR OWN CODES REGULATING BUILDING SAFETY AND CONSTRUCTION.

WHEREAS, pursuant to TENN. CODE ANN. § 5-20-101, *et seq.*, Blount County may adopt a resolution which incorporates by reference the provisions of any published code containing a compilation of rules and regulations for building construction, plumbing and gas installation that has been prepared by a technical trade association or model code organization without setting forth the provisions of such code in full:

WHEREAS, Blount County has previously adopted the 2006 editions of the comprehensive International Building and Fire codes, 2005 National Electric Code and the 1999 North Carolina Accessibility Code for the regulation of construction within Blount County; and

WHEREAS, the codes previously adopted by Blount County are obsolete, and it is the sense of the Blount County Commission that the newest editions of the code be adopted to stay in compliance with state regulations; and

WHEREAS, one (1) copy of the 2012 edition International Building Code (IBC), International Residential Code (IRC), International Mechanical Code (IMC), International Plumbing Code (IPC), International Fuel Gas Code (IFGC), International Fire Code (IFC), International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) and the 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design have been on file in the office of the Blount County Clerk for more than ninety (90) days; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to TENN. CODE ANN. § 5-20-106, the IBC, IRC, IMC, IPC, IFGC, IFC, IECC and ADASAD shall apply only to the unincorporated area of Blount County and those incorporated cities within Blount County which have not adopted their own codes regulating general building safety and construction; and

WHEREAS, no resolution adopting and incorporating the IBC, IRC, IMC, IPC, IFGC, IFC, IECC and ADASAD may be effective until published in a newspaper having general circulation in Blount County.

WHEREAS, the Blount County Department of Building Safety has reviewed the most current editions of the codes to be adopted herein, has suggested amendments to these codes, which amendments are attached to this Resolution as Exhibits I-VIII.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee, meeting in regular session assembled this 17th day of April, 2014 as follows:

Section 1. The provisions of the following subsections (A-H) are hereby adopted and incorporated by reference for the unincorporated area of Blount County, Tennessee and those incorporated cities within Blount County which have not adopted their own codes regulating building safety and construction.

- A. The 2012 International Building Code (IBC), with amendments detailed in Exhibit I of this resolution;
- B. The 2012 International Residential Code (IRC), with amendments detailed in Exhibit II of this resolution;
- C. The 2012 International Mechanical Code (IMC), with amendments detailed in Exhibit III of this resolution;
- D. The 2012 International Plumbing Code (IPC), with amendments detailed in Exhibit IV of this resolution;
- E. The 2012 International Fuel Gas Code (IFGC), with amendments detailed in Exhibit V of this resolution;
- F. The 2012 International Fire Code (IFC), with amendments detailed in Exhibit VI of this resolution;
- G. The 2012 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC), with amendments detailed in Exhibit VII of this resolution;
- H. The 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design (ADASAD), with amendments detailed in Exhibit VIII of the resolution;

Section 2. In the event that the provisions of any of these codes conflict, the building official for Blount County shall enforce the more stringent of the conflicting provisions.

Section 3. Enforcement and violations of the adopted codes shall be governed by TENN CODE ANN. § 5-20-104 and § 5-20-105.

Section 4. The Blount County Clerk is directed to cause this resolution to be published in *The Daily Times*, a newspaper having a general circulation in Blount County.

Section 5. This Resolution shall take effect upon its adoption and publication in *The Daily Times*, the public welfare requiring it.

Subject: Changes Transitioning from the 2006 to the 2012 International Codes

Blount County Commissioners:

Attached you will find a copy of an overview containing changes that will take place if the county transitions from the 2006 International Codes to the 2012 International Codes. This overview was compiled after a page by page comparison of the two codes. To the best of my ability, it contains those items that will create the biggest change for contractors or homeowners.

Our department worked with the City of Maryville and City of Alcoa over a period of a year to reflect the changes that would keep the code as uniform as possible from jurisdiction to jurisdiction. The consensus was to try and keep the code consistent for those individuals building in all jurisdictions.

The overview contains an explanation of what each amendment in the resolution represents under each separate code and then tries to present the changes based on those amendments. If there are any questions that I can clear up, please feel free to call me at your convenience.

Overview of Changes Transitioning from the 2006 to the 2012 International Codes

Under T.C.A. Section 68-120-1019(b)(4), local government's building construction safety code publications must be current within seven(7) years of the date of the latest editions in publication. Surrounding jurisdictions, (i.e. City of Maryville, City of Alcoa, City of Knoxville and Knox County) have already updated to the 2012 codes. It would be important to stay on the same code cycle as these surrounding jurisdictions so that building codes stay as close to uniform as possible from county to county.

To begin, the county presently has adopted for the regulation of **commercial construction** the International Building Code (IBC), International Fuel Gas Code (IFGC), International Plumbing Code (IPC), International Mechanical Code (IMC), International Energy Conservation Code (IECC), the International Fire Code (IFC) and the 1999 North Carolina Accessibility Code (NCAC). These will be taken individually to attempt to provide information on any significant changes. Most of any changes will be addressed by the architect or engineer of record during the planning process and should not cause a significant issue.

2012 International Building Code:

Amendments of the resolution reflected in Sections 101.1-110.5, 1612.3, 1704.2, 2901.1, 3401.3, 3412.2, 3412.3.2 are housekeeping type changes that are required to properly name sections specific to Blount County. Also, these sections remove items that conflict with the duties of the building codes department. For instance, transferring septic responsibility to Environmental Health, deleting reference to the enforcement of the Property Maintenance Code and transferring all flood hazard area responsibility to the Floodplain Zoning Resolution enforced by the Building Commissioner.

Amendments in Sections 1013.2-1013.8 change the code back to read what is presently enforced in the 2006 version.

Chapter 11 on Accessibility is being deleted in order to conform to what the state has adopted for commercial construction. That is the 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design.

The Amendment in Section 1203.1 gives flexibility in blower door testing by allowing it to be optional and not a requirement. The 2012 IBC requires that dwelling units be tested for air leakage.

Chapter 27 on Electrical is being deleted based on a recommendation of the County Attorney. Due to the state having jurisdiction, the county is not responsible for enforcement of the electrical code.

Amendments in Sections B101.2 and B101.2.7 reflect changes that are needed to continue the Board of Construction Appeals as established.

The most significant change in the IBC is located in Section 310.5.1 and deals with individuals wanting to put an adult or child day care in their home. Presently, the code allows up to sixteen (16) people in a single family dwelling without having to provide a sprinkler system. The 2012 code drops this number to five (5). So anyone wishing to care for more than five (5) persons in a residential home would be required to sprinkle it.

2012 International Fuel Gas Code:

All amendments of the resolution reflect housekeeping measures as stated above. After comparing the 2006 and 2012 code, there appears to be no changes that will create a significant increase in construction cost from a commercial standpoint. As stated above, the architect or engineer will address any requirements in the building plans.

2012 International Plumbing Code:

Amendments of the resolution in Sections 101.6-109 reflect housekeeping measures as stated above.

Chapter 12 and Chapter 13 are being removed to better reflect what is presently adopted. These sections are not contained in the 2006 codes.

The most significant change in the IPC is located in Section 312 and no longer allows air testing on plastic drain lines. This is due in part to the danger involved with airing the system up over the required test pressure. However, this also could possibly create another problem during winter months with freezing temperatures. Therefore, the enforcement of this requirement will be weather specific so as not to create a bigger problem with frozen pipes.

2012 International Mechanical Code:

Amendments of the resolution in Sections 101.1-109 reflect housekeeping measures as stated above.

Section 312 is being amended to put the responsibility of calculating heating and air loads on the mechanical contractor or engineer of record.

Section 401.2 again addresses the requirement for blower door testing and amends the code to make the requirement optional as amended in the IBC.

There appears to be no more significant differences between the 2006 and 2012 code.

2012 International Energy Conservation Code:

The resolution contains amendments relating to both commercial and residential construction. This is because the 2012 IECC contains sections for both. The changes discussed here will only relate to commercial construction. Residential changes will be discussed later in the residential code section.

Amendments of the resolution in Sections C101.1-C109 reflect housekeeping measures as stated above.

Section C402.2.6 is amended to allow perimeter concrete slab insulation to be optional. The 2012 code requires concrete slabs to be insulated around the perimeter for energy conservation. In our area, termite infestation is moderate to high. Termites are attracted to the insulation used in these applications. Therefore, the code is amended to make this requirement optional.

Section 402.4.1.2.3 again addresses the requirement for air leakage testing and amends the code to make the requirement optional.

The largest and most significant changes between the 2006 and 2012 codes occur in the IECC, both commercial and residential. With respect to commercial, insulation values increase significantly. For instance, exterior wall insulation for wood framed commercial buildings increases from R-13 to R-20. Attic insulation increases from R-30 to R-38. Again, these changes will be reflected in the drawings submitted by the architect or engineer related to the project.

Another significant change is reflected in the requirement for more efficient light bulbs used in electrical fixtures. The code requires at least 75% of the bulbs used be high efficacy. This requirement will be difficult to enforce.

2012 International Fire Code:

Amendments of the resolution in Sections [A]101.1-103.2 reflect housekeeping measures as stated above.

Sections [A]105.1.2 and [A]105.6 delete required permits for operations such as, welding, crop ripening, fumigation, open flames in churches, etc. This is due in part to the manpower needed to police such operations.

The remaining sections in the resolution address further housekeeping type measures.

After comparing the 2006 and 2012 code, it appears there are no significant changes that will be different than what is being enforced at the present time. Again, any small differences will be addressed by the architect or engineer on the specific project.

2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design:

These standards are replacing the present code the county has adopted, which is obsolete. The standards are what the state has adopted for accessibility and would be the minimum requirements that would have to be enforced on commercial construction in the county. There are no specific changes between these standards and what is presently adopted that would cause significant issues during construction. The standards still give general requirements for designing a building to allow someone who is disabled the ability to access all necessary areas.

The county has adopted for the regulation of **residential construction** the 2006 International Residential Code. Residential construction makes up the largest amount of inspections that are completed on a yearly basis. It stands to reason that any significant changes in the requirements would create a huge impact on contractors, as well as, homeowners. Therefore, the following is an attempt to provide information on those changes.

2012 International Residential Code:

Amendments of the resolution in Sections R101.1-Table R301.2(1) contain housekeeping measures as stated above.

Section R301.2.2 is amended so that townhouses built in our seismic zone are not required to meet the seismic provisions of the code. This keeps the requirements as they are presently adopted.

Section R302.2 amends the code back to what is presently adopted. Townhouses with sprinklers would be exempt from this section and those without sprinklers would have to have a 2 hour separation wall.

Section R302.5.1 deletes the requirement that doors from the garage into the house have self closing devices.

Section R303.4 makes the requirement for whole house ventilation optional when the blower door test does not meet specific requirements.

Section R309.5 deletes the requirement for residential sprinkler systems in private garages based on separation distance of exterior walls.

Section R312.1.1 amends the code back to read as it is adopted now with respect to guards around walking surfaces thirty (30) inches above grade.

Section R312.2 deletes a section that requires opening limiters on windows within sleeping areas. It is the opinion of the surrounding jurisdictions that it creates a safety hazard during an emergency.

Sections R313.1 and R313.2 are amended to make the requirement for sprinkler systems in townhouses and residential homes optional based on T.C.A. § 68-120-101 (a)(8).

Sections R314.2 and R322.1.7 contain housekeeping measures.

Section R401.4.1 is amended to include the requirement for two (2) runs of number 4 rebar throughout all concrete footings within Blount County. This is based on the soil types located within the county.

Section R501.3 amends the requirement that floor systems in crawlspaces and basements used for storage be protected underneath with sheetrock to be optional.

Amendments of the resolution in Sections R502.11.4 and R802.10.1 contain housekeeping measures as stated above.

Table N1102.1.1, N1102.1.3 and Section N1102.2.6 amends the code back to what is presently adopted with respect to insulation values.

Sections N1102.4.1.2, N1103.1.1 and N1103.2.2 are amended to make optional the requirements for blower door testing, programmable thermostat and duct leakage testing.

Sections G2413 and G2428 delete the requirement for sizing of fuel gas pipe and vent pipe for gas appliances. This is typically regulated by the service provider.

Chapters 34-40 address electrical enforcement and have been deleted. The state has responsibility for the enforcement of electrical codes.

Remaining amendments to the resolution, again, reflect housekeeping measures.

The first significant change that is reflected in the 2012 IRC is the requirement for carbon monoxide detectors located outside sleeping areas in dwellings that contain fuel-fired appliances and dwellings that have an attached garage.

The next change requires that all shingle roofs now contain drip edge at the gables and eaves.

The next change requires that all concrete footings contain a minimum of two (2) runs of number 4 rebar throughout, as mentioned above in the resolution.

The next change requires that foundation drain tiles and foundation waterproofing/damp proofing will now be enforced on any concrete or masonry foundation that retains earth and encloses interior spaces and floors below grade.

As mentioned above in the IPC, plastic drain lines can no longer be tested with air. Again, this will be enforced based on weather conditions at the time of the test.

Headers and corners are now required to be insulated. Additional sealing to prevent air infiltration is also required.

Clothes dryer exhaust lengths have changed from a maximum of 25 feet to 35 feet.

Egress windows are now required in bonus rooms above garages.

Finally, decks will be attached to a structure based on Section R507. This section gives specific direction on the attachment of the ledger board that is not contained in the 2006 codes.



Significant changes transitioning to the 2012 International Residential Code

1. **Handrails** are required on at least one side of steps with four risers or more (Section R311.7.8).
2. **Carbon monoxide detectors** are now required outside each separate sleeping area in the immediate vicinity of the bedrooms in dwelling units within which fuel-fired appliances are installed and in dwelling units that have attached garages (Section R315).
3. **Foundation drain tiles and foundation waterproofing/damp proofing** will now be enforced on any concrete or masonry foundation that retains earth and encloses interior spaces and floors below grade (Section R405 and Section R406).
4. **Deck attachment** to the structure will be based on the new section in the code book (Section R507, see attached handout).
5. **Drip edge** is now required at the eaves and gables of shingle roofs (Section R905.2.8.5).
6. **Protection from impact** is required for all appliances located in an area where they are subject to impact from a vehicle (Section M1307.3.1, see attached handout).
7. **Clothes dryer exhaust duct** specified length has increased to 35 feet (Section M1502.4.4.1).
When fittings are used, the maximum length shall be reduced according to the table attached (Table M1502.4.4.1).

R506.2.4 Reinforcement support. Where provided in slabs on ground, reinforcement shall be supported to remain in place from the center to upper one third of the slab for the duration of the concrete placement.

❖ The code does not require reinforcement for the concrete slab-on-ground floors. When reinforcement is provided, common practice is to use welded wire fabric. The welded wire fabric frequently is left on the ground during the pour and not picked up. When lifted up by construction personnel, it is often not in a proper or consistent location, with some on the ground and some near the top of the slab. This section does not require installation of reinforcement; however, if it is installed, it must be properly located in the slab, or its benefit is lost.

**SECTION R507
DECKS**

R507.1 Decks. Where supported by attachment to an exterior wall, decks shall be positively anchored to the primary structure and designed for both vertical and lateral loads. Such attachment shall not be accomplished by the use of toenails or nails subject to withdrawal. Where positive connection to the primary building structure cannot be verified during inspection, decks shall be self-supporting. For decks with cantilevered framing members, connections to exterior walls or other framing members, shall be designed and constructed to resist uplift resulting from the full live load specified in Table R301.5 acting on the cantilevered portion of the deck.

❖ If an exterior wall is used to support a deck, the deck framing must be positively attached to the building structure. This connection design must include a con-


sideration of both vertical and lateral loads, and the connection must be available for inspection. If it is not, this method of support is not permitted and the deck must be self-supporting.

If a deck has cantilevered framing, the framing must have a connection to its support that is designed to resist any uplift resulting from the full live load acting on the cantilevered span only. This load condition will produce maximum uplift at the support opposite the cantilevered end.

R507.2 Deck ledger connection to band joist. For decks supporting a total design load of 50 pounds per square foot (2394 Pa) [40 pounds per square foot (1915 Pa) live load plus 10 pounds per square foot (479 Pa) dead load], the connection between a deck ledger of pressure-preservative-treated Southern Pine, incised pressure-preservative-treated Hem-Fir or approved decay-resistant species, and a 2-inch (51 mm) nominal lumber band joist bearing on a sill plate or wall plate shall be constructed with 1/2-inch (12.7 mm) lag screws or bolts with washers in accordance with Table R507.2. Lag screws, bolts and washers shall be hot-dipped galvanized or stainless steel.

❖ This section contains the prescriptive design for positive anchorage of a deck attached to the primary structure. The design is for vertical loads only [50 psf (2394 Pa) maximum] on the deck.

Researchers at Virginia Tech University and Washington State University have tested simulated deck-ledge to house-band-joist connections in their respective laboratories. A practical range of pressure-preservative-treated (PPT) deck ledger lumber (incised Hem-Fir and Southern Pine) was attached to a simulated Spruce-Pine-Fir band joist by 1/2-inch (12.7 mm) lag screws or bolts with washers. The ledger connec-


e. Deck ledger shall be minimum 2 x 8 pressure-preservative-treated No. 2 grade lumber, or other approved materials as established by standard engineering practice.

f. When solid-sawn pressure-preservative-treated deck ledgers are attached to a minimum 1-inch-thick engineered wood product (structural composite lumber, laminated veneer lumber or wood structural panel band joist), the ledger attachment shall be designed in accordance with accepted engineering practice.

g. A minimum 1 x 9 1/2 Douglas Fir laminated veneer lumber rimboard shall be permitted in lieu of the 2-inch nominal band joist.

h. Wood structural panel sheathing, gypsum board sheathing or foam sheathing not exceeding 1 inch in thickness shall be permitted. The maximum distance between the face of the ledger board and the face of the band joist shall be 1 inch.

❖ See the commentary to Sections R507.2 and R507.2.1.

rows in the table cover newer, high-performance elbows that have longer turning radii and smoother walls (i.e., no mitered joints); thus, the equivalent length is substantially reduced. When an installer discovers that the length of an exhaust duct will exceed the limits of the code, he or she may find that using higher performance elbows will keep the length within the allowable limits.

M1502.4.4.2 Manufacturer's instructions. The size and maximum length of the exhaust duct shall be determined by the dryer manufacturer's installation instructions. The code official shall be provided with a copy of the installation instructions for the make and model of the dryer at the concealment inspection. In the absence of fitting equivalent length calculations from the clothes dryer manufacturer, Table M1502.4.4.1 shall be used.

❖ This section allows the 35-foot (7620 mm) limit of the previous section to be exceeded where longer exhaust duct lengths are allowed by the appliance manufacturer's instructions. Today's appliances often, but not always, permit longer distances, therefore this section allows the installer to take advantage of those longer distances where specified by the manufacturer. The make and model of the dryer must be provided to the code official, along with the respective installation instructions, to permit the code official to inspect the duct installation based on the manufacturer's instructions. Because the installation is specific to and dependent upon a certain appliance make and model, the code official must follow through to make sure that the appliance did get installed. Remember that the prime objective is to prevent a dangerous mismatch between a dryer and its exhaust system.

Where not otherwise specified by the dryer manufacturer, the flow resistance contributed by fittings installed in the duct system must be in accordance with Table M1502.4.4.1. Each type of fitting and its angle is equated to a certain length of straight duct and this "equivalent length" is added to the actual straight duct length in the system to obtain the total length. The table recognizes newer fitting designs that have smooth bore interiors and much larger turning radii than traditionally used fittings. Such designs

greatly reduce friction loss as can be seen by their much smaller equivalent lengths. If an installer is unable to stay within the allowable length on a particular job, he or she may find that substituting better fittings will correct the problem (see Section M1502.4.5).

M1502.4.5 Length identification. Where the exhaust duct is concealed within the building construction, the equivalent length of the exhaust duct shall be identified on a permanent label or tag. The label or tag shall be located within 6 feet (1829 mm) of the exhaust duct connection.

❖ A point to consider is the situation that will exist when the original dryer is replaced or the original occupant moves out and the new occupant installs a different dryer. In either case, the replacement dryer might not be compatible with the existing duct length. If the duct system equivalent length is not identified in a conspicuous manner, the new resident will be unaware of the potentially hazardous situation that has been created by the dryer and exhaust duct mismatch. It is assumed that the installer will be aware of the equivalent length of exhaust ducts that are entirely exposed and observable (see Commentary Figure M1502.4.5).

M1502.4.6 Exhaust duct required. Where space for a clothes dryer is provided, an exhaust duct system shall be installed. Where the clothes dryer is not installed at the time of occupancy the exhaust duct shall be capped or plugged in the space in which it originates and identified and marked "future use."

Exception: Where a *listed* condensing clothes dryer is installed prior to occupancy of the structure.

❖ Where a space is provided for the future installation of a clothes dryer, an exhaust duct system must be installed so that such system can be inspected and approved (see Figure M1502.4.6). Otherwise, it is likely that the dryer and exhaust duct system will be installed later without the code official's knowledge and it will not be inspected for proper installation. Note that Section M1502.4.4.2 does not appear to be an option when an exhaust duct system is "roughed-in" for future use because the make, model and exhaust capability of the dryer will be unknown. The

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 4, Chapter 3, and 22; Title 12, Chapter 3; Title 67, Chapter 6; Title 68, Chapter 120 and Title 71, Chapter 5, relative to energy efficiency and conservation.

WHEREAS, ensuring clean, safe, reliable and affordable energy is critical to the prosperity of Tennessee's economy, the sustainability of Tennessee's environment and the general welfare of Tennessee's citizens; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee's citizens, businesses, and governments face escalating energy costs and varying environmental effects of energy production and consumption; and

WHEREAS, state government, as one of the largest consumers of energy within Tennessee, has the capacity and responsibility to lead by example in improving energy efficiency and conservation; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee sees especially unique opportunities in promoting residential energy efficiency in the wake of findings that show the Volunteer State has the highest per capita residential electricity consumption in the nation; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee is home to a wealth of public and private resources that can drive the development of clean energy technology and increase economic development potential in the energy sector; and

WHEREAS, the governor's task force on energy policy, comprised of representatives of state agencies and the General Assembly and individuals representing business, environmental and other interests, worked throughout 2008 to develop recommendations that could serve as the basis for a sound, comprehensive energy policy for Tennessee; now, therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Tennessee Clean Energy Future Act of 2009".

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1012, is amended by deleting the words "office of energy management" in subsection (a) and substituting instead the words "state building energy management program".

SECTION 3. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1012, is amended by adding the following language as a new subsection (c):

(c) The energy management program described in subsection (b) may include, but is not limited to, implementing energy cost saving measures in buildings under the jurisdiction of the State Building Commission. The measures may include, but shall not be limited to, maintenance, repair or replacement of lighting and mechanical equipment and related controls. Energy cost saving measures may be implemented through contracts with energy professionals including, but not limited to, energy service companies, commissioning and retro commissioning firms and agencies and energy auditing consultants. Such contracts are subject to approval by the State Building Commission. All departments, institutions and agencies having control of, or responsibility for, the management or operation of buildings under the jurisdiction of the State Building Commission shall cooperate with state building energy management in implementing energy cost saving measures.

SECTION 4. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1017, is amended by deleting the words "office of energy management" in subsection (a) and substituting instead the words "state building energy management program".

SECTION 5. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1017, is amended by deleting the words "Encouragement of the use of" in subdivision (a)(2) and substituting instead the words "Development and implementation of projects using".

SECTION 6. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1018, is amended by deleting subsection (b) in its entirety and substituting instead the following:

(b) Each person designated as a liaison with the department shall cooperate with and assist the department in conducting energy audits of the building or group of buildings for which such person is the designated liaison, as well as any other studies or plans carried out by the department under the provisions of this chapter or energy efficiency codes. Duties of such person shall include, but not be limited to, collecting energy use and other data requested by the department, assisting the department in identifying energy use reduction opportunities, implementing energy use reduction efforts and monitoring and reporting results following such efforts.

SECTION 7. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1109, is amended by deleting the second sentence of subsection (a) and substituting instead, "Each year, every effort should be made to achieve a target goal that one hundred percent (100%) of newly purchased passenger motor vehicles be energy-efficient motor vehicles."

SECTION 8. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1109, is further amended by adding the following language after the second sentence in subsection (a):

The department shall ensure that at least twenty-five percent (25%) of newly purchased passenger motor vehicles procured for use in areas designated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as ozone nonattainment areas shall be hybrid-electric vehicles, provided that such vehicles are available at the time of procurement. In the event that such vehicles are not available at the time of procurement, the department may instead meet this mandate by procuring compact fuel-efficient vehicles. In areas not designated by the EPA as ozone nonattainment areas, the department shall ensure that at least twenty-five percent (25%) of newly purchased passenger motor vehicles are hybrid-electric vehicles or compact fuel-efficient vehicles.

SECTION 9. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1109(b)(2), is amended by adding the following language as a new subdivision:

(C) Plans for integrating energy-efficient motor vehicles identified in Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1109(c)(1)(E) and (G), into the state passenger motor vehicle fleet.

SECTION 10. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1109(c)(1)(C), is amended by deleting the word "or".

SECTION 11. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1109(c)(1)(D), is amended by inserting after the word "A" and before the word, "vehicle" the words, "compact fuel-efficient vehicle, defined as a".

SECTION 12. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1109(c)(1)(D), is further amended by deleting the word "and" following the semicolon and substituting instead the word "or".

SECTION 13. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-3-1109(c)(1), is further amended by adding the following language as new subdivisions:

(E) An electric vehicle (EV);

(F) A vehicle powered by natural gas; or

(G) A vehicle powered by ultra low sulfur diesel fuel that meets Bin 5, Tier II emission standards mandated by the EPA and that has an EPA-estimated highway mileage rating of at least thirty (30) miles per gallon or greater for the model year purchased.

SECTION 14. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 12-3-605, is amended by adding the following language as new, appropriately designated subsections:

() All future office equipment, appliances, lighting, and heating and cooling products and systems purchased by and for state agencies shall be Energy Star qualified, provided that such Energy Star qualified products and systems are commercially available.

() Existing purchasing contracts for all state agencies that do not provide as options Energy Star qualified office equipment, appliances, lighting and heating and cooling products and systems shall not be renewed upon expiration. All future contracts for state agencies shall provide as options Energy Star qualified office equipment, appliances, lighting and heating and cooling products and systems.

() The Department of General Services, in consultation with the Department of Finance and Administration, shall establish and publish guidelines providing direction to all state agencies regarding implementation of this section.

SECTION 15. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-6-232(b)(1), is amended by deleting the language "or emerging occupations," and by substituting instead the language "emerging occupations, or clean energy technology, including, but not limited to, clean energy technology research and development and installation,".

SECTION 16. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-6-232(b)(1), is further amended by deleting the period (".") after the words "trade show facilities" and substituting instead the following:

; provided, however, that emerging industry can include those primarily engaged in manufacturing clean energy technology. For the purposes of this section, clean energy technology means technology resulting in energy efficiency, technology used to generate energy from biomass, geothermal, hydrogen, hydropower, landfill gas, nuclear, solar, and wind sources, and technology that is designed to result in the development of advanced coal through carbon capture and sequestration or otherwise any other manner that significantly reduces CO2 emissions per unit of energy generated. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, businesses engaged in the development and construction of coal fired power plants shall not be eligible for the emerging industry tax credit. The credit provided under this section shall apply only if the Commissioner of Revenue and the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development have determined that allowance of the credit is in the best interests of the state. For purposes of this section, "best interests of the state" includes, but is not limited to, a determination that the taxpayer made the minimum investment as a result of the credit.

SECTION 17. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-6-232(c), is amended by deleting the period (".") after the language "67-4-2109(a)-(c)" and by substituting instead the language "and the exemption provided under § 67-6-206(a).".

SECTION 18. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-120-101(a), is amended in subdivision (1) by inserting the language "energy efficiency;" between the language "structural strength and stability;" and "means of egress;".

SECTION 19. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-120-101(a), is amended by adding the following as a new subdivision (8):

(8) Shall not include mandatory sprinkler requirements for one-family and two-family dwellings; however, notwithstanding the foregoing, local governments may adopt more stringent requirements for one-family and two-family dwellings;

(9) The department shall analyze the cost and effectiveness of sprinkler equipment in one-family and two-family dwellings in areas where residential sprinklers are in use, including Tennessee and other states deemed appropriate by the department, and report the results of such analysis to the general assembly on or before May 1, 2010. In conducting such analysis, the department shall seek input from nonprofit and business groups or organizations including, but not limited to, the Tennessee Fire Chiefs Association and the Home Builders Association of Tennessee.

SECTION 20. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-120-101(b), is amended by deleting subdivision (1) in its entirety and by substituting instead the following language:

(1)(A) The standards established pursuant to subsection (a) apply to municipal, county, state and private buildings, including one-family and two-family dwellings, unless otherwise provided by statute.

(B)(i) Notwithstanding subdivision (b)(1)(A), the standards established pursuant to subsection (a) relative to one-family and two-family dwellings do not apply in any county or municipality in which the legislative body of the county or municipality, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote, adopts a resolution to exempt the county or municipality, as appropriate, from the application of statewide standards for one-family and two-family dwellings within the jurisdictional boundaries of the county or municipality, as appropriate; provided, however, any action by the county legislative body concerning the implementation of this subdivision (b)(1)(B)(i) shall be limited to the jurisdictional boundaries outside any municipality located within such county. Upon approving the resolution, the presiding officer of the legislative body shall notify the state fire marshal of the actions taken hereunder.

(ii)(a) An initial resolution following July 1, 2009, may be adopted by a county or municipal legislative body to take effect on July 1, 2010, or at a later date stated in the resolution.

(b) A resolution adopted pursuant to subdivision (b)(1)(B)(ii)(a) or the adoption of any other resolution, shall expire one hundred eighty (180) days following the date of the election for the local legislative body next occurring following the adoption of the resolution, but an earlier expiration date may be stated in the resolution.

(C) The governing body of any such county or of a municipality located in any such county which has taken the action pursuant to subdivision (b)(1)(B) is authorized to reverse such action by adopting a resolution to apply the provisions of subsection (a) with respect to one-family and two-family dwellings within the jurisdictional boundaries of the municipality or county, as appropriate; provided, that, any action by the county legislative body concerning its actions shall be limited to the

jurisdictional boundaries outside any municipality located within such county. The presiding officer of the governing body shall notify the state fire marshal of the approval of the resolution.

SECTION 21. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-120-101(b)(2), is amended by deleting subdivision (A) in its entirety and substituting instead the following language:

(A) The local jurisdiction has chosen to adopt and enforce building construction and fire safety codes for construction of all buildings; for construction of all buildings other than one-family and two-family dwellings; or for construction of one-family and two-family dwellings only; and

(i) For one-family and two-family construction, it has adopted the International Residential Code, published by the International Code Council, Inc.,

(ii) For construction other than one-family and two-family dwellings, it has adopted a building construction safety code consisting of the International Building Code, published by the International Code Council, Inc., and either:

(a) The International Fire Code, published by the International Code Council, Inc.; or

(b) The Uniform Fire Code, published by the National Fire Protection Association, Inc., if adopted on or after July 1, 2006; and

SECTION 22. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-120-101(b)(2), is amended by deleting subdivision (B) in its entirety and substituting instead the following language:

(B) It is adequately enforcing its code and performing any reviews of construction plans and specifications and inspections required by the state fire marshal under this section.

SECTION 23. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-120-101(b)(4), is amended by deleting subdivision (A) in its entirety and substituting instead the following language:

(A) The local government's building construction safety code publications are not current within seven (7) years of the date of the latest editions thereof, unless otherwise approved by the state fire marshal in writing, provided, however, that nothing herein shall require a local government to adopt a standard more stringent than the standards enforced by the state fire marshal, pursuant to this section, or to adopt a mandatory sprinkler requirement for one-family and two-family dwellings; or

SECTION 24. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-120-101(c)(1), is amended by inserting the words "Renovations of existing" before the words "one-family and two-family dwellings;"

SECTION 25. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-120-101, is amended by adding the following as a new subsection (f):

(f)(1)(A) The state fire marshal may, in addition to the other provisions of this part, authorize and appoint any person, employed by any municipality or county or acting through a professional corporation pursuant to § 48-101-601, who meets the qualifications enumerated in subdivision (f)(2) as a commissioned deputy building inspector in this division, who shall have all the power of other deputies and assistants to enter any one-family and two-family dwellings to make inspections of the buildings and their contents, and to report the inspections in writing to the commissioner. The commissioner is directed to contract with each deputy building inspector through the municipality or county employing the inspector or the inspector's professional corporation to provide one-family and two-family building inspection services. The contracts shall be entered into between the commissioner, with the approval of the Commissioner of Finance and Administration, and the professional corporation employing the building inspector and the building inspectors shall not be deemed employees of the state for payroll purposes or otherwise.

(B) A deputy building inspector shall be certified by the State of Tennessee as:

(i) a building inspector pursuant to § 68-120-113; or

(ii) a plumbing inspector pursuant to § 68-120-118;

or

(iii) a mechanical inspector pursuant to § 68-120-118.

A deputy building inspector shall be limited in performing inspections to the discipline in which they are certified.

(C) The commissioner shall provide a program to ensure that one-family and two-family building construction inspection services are available throughout the state on a timely basis. An inspection shall be considered timely if it is performed within three (3) working days of when the request is made to the inspector, except that an inspection of a footer shall be considered timely if it is performed within one (1) working day of when the request is made to the inspector.

(2)(A) Deputy building inspectors appointed by the commissioner are authorized to inspect one-family and two-family building construction upon receipt of a request from the owner of the property, a licensed contractor, or from municipal governing bodies, or from the county legislative body of the county in which

the buildings are located. Each inspector, either through their municipality, county or professional corporation, shall be authorized to charge for and receive a fee for each inspection.

(B) The state fire marshal shall establish a schedule of fees to pay the cost incurred by the department for the administration and enforcement of this part.

(C) The state fire marshal may require the inspection of one-family and two-family dwellings with or without a request, in the same manner that inspections are made in accordance with § 68-102-116, and the remedies for dangerous conditions shall be the same as provided in § 68-102-117; provided, that no fees shall be charged for making inspections directed by the state fire marshal as authorized by those sections.

(D) No inspection fees may be charged except where an actual inspection is made.

(3) The state fire marshal may promulgate such rules and regulations as necessary to carry out the provisions of this part, in accordance with the Uniform Administrative Procedures Act, compiled in Title 4, Chapter 5.

SECTION 26. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 71-5-401, is amended by deleting the section in its entirety and substituting instead the following:

71-5-401.

(a)(1) The Department of Human Services shall administer any funding received under the federal low-income energy assistance and weatherization programs, any other federal funds for energy assistance or energy conservation for residential units and any state funds appropriated to the department for purposes of providing to eligible persons energy assistance and residential weatherization as defined by federal law or regulation. To meet the goal of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the department shall ensure that there are qualified contractors and contracting firms, energy auditors and auditing firms, and energy inspectors and inspection firms qualified to provide weatherization services and products.

(2) Administration in accordance with state plan approved by federal government or state law.

(i) The department shall administer the low-income energy assistance and weatherization programs in accordance with the state plan for each program as approved by the federal government for any federal funding, and in accordance with any provisions of state law for any state funding provided for such assistance.

(ii) The provisions of the state plan approved by the federal government governing the expenditure of federal funds for such programs shall supersede any state law or regulations that are inconsistent with the approved state plan.

(3) Rulemaking authority.

(i) The department shall have the power to promulgate any necessary regulations to administer the low-income energy assistance and weatherization programs pursuant to the provisions of the Uniform Administrative Procedures Act, compiled in Title 4, Chapter 5.

(ii) If necessary to provide for the immediate expenditure of any emergency low-income energy assistance or weatherization funds in the event of any severe energy crisis or disaster as declared by the governor, or to provide timely assistance under any funding criteria that require the expenditure of such funds under any short-term funding program, the department shall have authority to promulgate any necessary regulations to implement the provision of such assistance by public necessity rule; provided, that any permanent rules shall be promulgated pursuant to the Uniform Administrative Procedures Act, compiled in Title 4, Chapter 5.

(b)(1) The department may allocate to the residential weatherization program any funds received for energy assistance under the federal low-income energy assistance program or from any other federal energy assistance fund up to the maximum amount permitted by federal law.

(2) Any separate state funding for energy assistance shall be allocated as authorized in the annual appropriations act.

(c) Notwithstanding any state law or regulation to the contrary, the department may provide residential weatherization assistance at any percentage of the federal income poverty level that is permitted by federal law.

(d) Benefit levels shall be determined based upon those prescribed by federal law.

SECTION 27. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 71-5-402, is amended by deleting the section in its entirety.

SECTION 28. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-120-101(b), is amended by adding the following language as subdivision (3) and renumbering the subsequent subdivisions appropriately:

(3) If a local jurisdiction chooses to adopt and enforce codes for only one-family and two-family dwellings or for all buildings other than one-family and two-family dwellings that would be subject to the codes adopted by the state fire marshal pursuant to subdivision (a)(1), the state fire marshal shall enforce the statewide codes with regard to those buildings for which the local jurisdiction has not adopted and is not enforcing codes.


SECTION 29. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to that end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 30. The provisions of this act shall be subject to sunset review pursuant to Title 4, Chapter 5, in 2014.

SECTION 31. For purposes of rulemaking this act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. Sections 18 through 25 and Section 28 shall take effect July 1, 2010, the public welfare requiring it. Sections 26 and 27 of this act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. All remaining sections of this act shall take effect July 1, 2009, the public welfare requiring it.






The County's debt management policy is attached.

All of the proceeds of the 2013B Bonds were used to currently refund existing debt of the County. As required by the debt policy, the decision to refund was explicitly approved by the Board of County Commissioners at a public meeting on September 19, 2013. The refunding complies with the debt management policy as it is expected to generate positive savings by lowering the administrative carrying cost of the County's variable rate debt. Additionally, the direct bank placement structure of the 2013B Bonds, eliminates the need for credit and liquidity support for the bonds, thereby lowering the risk profile associated with the debt. The term of the 2013B Bonds is within the term of the refunded bonds. The refunding transaction and the costs associated therewith were presented to the Board of County Commissioners at the above-referenced public meeting.

18. (If any) Description of Derivative and Compliance with Written Derivative Management Policy:

As described in the County's refunding plan submitted to the State on August 30, 2013, the Refunded Bonds had five outstanding swaps between The Public Building Authority of Blount County, Tennessee and Deutsche Bank and one outstanding swap between The Public Building Authority of Sevier County and Deutsche Bank. As part of the refunding, the respective swaps were novated from the Public Building Authorities to the County, and the interest and obligations under the swap agreements were moved from the Public Building Authorities to the County. No material changes or amendments were made to the swaps. As provided in the State's Refunding Report dated September 17, 2013, the swaps are deemed to remain under the 2002 State Refunding Board Guidelines.

Part 1 Substantive Provisions

Tenn. Code Ann. § 5-6-106 (2013)

5-6-106. Powers and duties -- Generally -- Ex officio memberships -- Appointments.

(a) The county mayor shall be the chief executive officer of the county and shall have all the powers and duties formerly exercised by the county judge, county chair, or elected official exercising general supervision of the county government as provided by this chapter, other general law, special, local or private acts.

(b) (1) The county mayor shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio member of the county legislative body. The county mayor or the county mayor's designated representative shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio member of each committee of the county legislative body and of each board, commission or authority of the county government, except as provided by law or by action of the county legislative body.

(2) In those circumstances not addressed by the provisions of subdivision (b)(1), the county mayor may designate, from time to time, a professional staff member with appropriate training or a member of the county legislative body to sit in the county mayor's place on any board, authority or commission that the county mayor serves upon by virtue of holding the office of county mayor. Any such designee shall have the powers, including the power to vote, as are otherwise conferred upon the county mayor when serving upon such board, authority or commission. At any such meeting attended by the county mayor, only the county mayor shall exercise voting power.

(c) Except as otherwise provided by general law, or special or private act, the county mayor shall appoint members of county boards and commissions and county department heads. Such appointees shall be subject to confirmation by the county legislative body, and in so doing, the legislative body may express its views fully and freely and shall vote for or against confirmation. The legislative body shall not seek or interview such prospective employees prior to their appointment by the county mayor. Such appointment and confirmation are not applicable to employees appointed by other elected county officials.

Tenn. Code Ann. § 5-1-104 (2013)

5-1-104. County officers -- Filling vacancies.

(a) Each organized county shall have, in addition to the judicial officers elected by the qualified voters or by the county legislative body, such other officers as are authorized by law to manage county business.

(b) (1) Vacancies in county offices required by the Constitution of Tennessee or by any statutory provision to be filled by the people shall be filled by the county legislative body, and any person so appointed shall serve until a successor is elected at the next general election, as defined in § 2-1-104, in the county and is qualified. The county legislative body shall be required to make an appointment to fill a vacancy within one hundred twenty (120) days of receiving notice of the vacancy unless during that time period there is a general election scheduled in the county and there is sufficient time for the vacancy to be placed on the ballot in accordance with this section. Any appointment to fill a vacancy by the county legislative body shall be made in accordance with chapter 5, part 1 of this title. This subdivision (b)(1) shall not apply to any county that has a metropolitan form of government and a population in excess of five hundred thousand (500,000), according to the 2000 federal census or any subsequent federal census. This subdivision (b)(1) shall not apply in any county having a population of not less than eight hundred ninety-seven thousand four hundred (897,400) nor more than eight hundred ninety-seven thousand five hundred (897,500), according to the 2000 federal census or any subsequent federal census.

(2) If the vacancy occurs after the time for filing nominating petitions for the party primary election and more than sixty (60) days before the party primary election, then nominees of political parties shall be selected in such primary election and a successor elected in the August general election. If the vacancy occurs less than sixty (60) days before the party primary election but sixty (60) days or more before the August election, then nominees of political parties shall be selected by party convention and a successor elected in the August election. If the vacancy occurs less than sixty (60) days before the August election but sixty (60) days or more before the November election, then nominees of political parties shall be selected by party convention and a successor elected in the November election.

(3) If a vacancy occurs more than ten (10) days prior to the regular qualifying deadline, then the regular qualifying deadline shall apply. If the vacancy occurs after the tenth day prior to the regular qualifying deadline, independent candidates and candidates nominated by any political party for the vacancies shall qualify by filing all nominating petitions no later than twelve o'clock (12:00) noon, prevailing time, on the fifty-fifth day before the election. If the qualifying deadline is the fifty-fifth day before the election, candidates must withdraw

no later than twelve o'clock (12:00) noon, prevailing time, on the fifty-second day before the election.

(c) Notwithstanding any provision of law or any provision of any charter of a metropolitan government to the contrary, whenever an election is held to fill a vacancy in a county office that is elected from districts, including, but not limited to, county school board members, county legislative body members, county highway commissions, and constables, the county legislative body may provide by resolution duly certified to the county election commission that persons qualifying as candidates shall be elected from the most recently adopted reapportionment plan in the county. If the county legislative body requires the election to be held using districts as adopted in the most recently adopted reapportionment plan in the county, the county legislative body shall specify to the county election commission which district shall be used to fill the vacancy by election. In the absence of a resolution requiring the latest reapportionment plan be used and specifying which district shall be used for the election, the election shall be held using the district as constituted for the election of the vacated incumbent.

5-5-111. Filling vacancies -- Notice to legislative body -- Notice to public -- Nominations -- Appointment by vote of legislative body -- Challenge of appointment -- Deadline -- Applicability of provisions.

(a) (1) Whenever an office is required to be filled, or a vacancy occurs in any office required to be filled, by the county legislative body, the county clerk shall provide notice to every member of the county legislative body of the need to fill the office or vacancy. If the office of county clerk is vacant, the notice shall be provided by the county clerk's deputy. If, in addition, there is no deputy county clerk, notice shall be provided by the acting chair of the county legislative body. In accordance with § 8-48-108, the formal notice to members required by this subdivision (a)(1) is directory and may be waived by the members of the county legislative body if all members have constructive notice of the vacancy or opening through other sources of information.

(2) In addition to the notice provided for in subdivision (a)(1), the presiding officer of the county legislative body shall cause public notice to be given in a newspaper of general circulation in the county at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting of the body at which the office is to be filled, notifying the public of the vacancy or opening and specifying the office or offices to be filled at the meeting.

(b) Before the county legislative body votes or considers any motion or resolution regarding the office to be filled, the chair shall allow registered voters of the county an opportunity to submit names to the county legislative body for consideration. The names may be submitted in writing to the chair prior to the meeting or may be submitted in person at the meeting. In order for a name to be considered, a member of the county legislative body must subsequently nominate the person. Members of the county legislative body may also nominate a candidate or candidates to fill the office or vacancy without the name being submitted by a voter. Nominations do not require a second. If the person nominated is not present at the meeting, the person making the nomination shall submit a signed statement from the nominee that the nominee is willing to serve in the office if appointed.

(c) Should a member of the county legislative body accept a nomination for an office or vacancy that is required by the Tennessee constitution to be filled by the county legislative body, the member shall be prohibited from voting on the appointment or any motions or resolutions relative to making the appointment until the office or vacancy is filled. For the purposes of determining a majority, the membership of the county legislative body shall be reduced to reflect any member or members prohibited from voting on the appointment. If a member of the county legislative body is subsequently appointed to fill the office or vacancy, the member shall immediately resign from the county legislative body upon accepting

the appointment. If the member does not receive the appointment, the member shall not be required to resign and may continue the member's duties on the county legislative body upon the conclusion of the vote on the appointment.

(d) After nominations cease, the county legislative body may discuss the nominations and may, at the discretion of the chair, interview nominees or allow nominees the opportunity to address the county legislative body. Upon motion passed by the majority of the members, the vote to make the appointment may be postponed to a subsequent meeting, provided that adequate public notice of the meeting is given in accordance with title 8, chapter 44.

(e) To receive an appointment, a nominee must receive the votes of a majority of the members of the county legislative body eligible to vote on the appointment. The county legislative body shall adopt rules of procedure for eliminating nominees in cases where there are multiple nominees for an appointment and no nominee receives a majority of the votes after the initial vote. No secret balloting shall be permitted. Each member's vote regarding the appointment process shall be recorded by the clerk and entered on the minutes of the county legislative body. A tie vote of the county legislative body regarding an appointment may be broken in the same manner that other tie votes of the body may be broken.

(f) Any complaint challenging the legality of an appointment made by the county legislative body shall be filed with the chancery court of the county within ten (10) days of the date of the appointment.

(g) When filling a vacancy in offices required to be filled by the county legislative body, the county legislative body shall fill the vacancy in accordance with the deadline provided in § 5-1-104.

(h) (1) This section shall not apply to any county that has a metropolitan form of government and a population in excess of five hundred thousand (500,000), according to the 2000 federal census or any subsequent federal census.

(2) This section shall not apply to any county having a population of not less than eight hundred ninety-seven thousand four hundred (897,400) nor more than eight hundred ninety-seven thousand five hundred (897,500), according to the 2000 federal census or any subsequent federal census.
