WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Tennessee has enabled Blount County to adopt zoning regulations in Tennessee Code Annotated Sections 13-7-101, *et seq.*, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee adopted zoning regulations in Resolution 00-06-010 and Resolution 00-06-011, including provisions for a building permit to administer the zoning regulations, and

WHEREAS, it is desired to cover the expense of administering the zoning regulations through a fee for building permits and other applications related to administering the zoning regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BLOUNT COUNTY, TENNESSEE, to adopt the following:

For residential structures, excluding multifamily structures and manufactured home parks, a permit fee of \$20.00 or 1/8 of one percent of the cost of construction, whichever is greater, up to a maximum of \$1,000.00, shall be charged per application.

For multifamily structures, a permit fee of \$125.00 per dwelling unit shall be charged, up to a maximum of \$1,000.00 per application.

For manufactured home parks, a permit fee of \$100.00 per rental space shall be charged, up to a maximum of \$1,000.00 per application.

For manufactured homes placed in manufactured home parks, including replacement of manufactured homes, a permit fee of \$50.00 per unit shall be charged per application.

For any other residential related structure, including additions and accessory structures, a permit fee of \$20.00 or 1/8 of one percent of the cost of construction, whichever is greater, up to a maximum of \$1,000.00 shall be charged per application.

For commercial and industrial structures, including signs, additions and accessory structures, but excluding telecommunication towers and antennas with supporting cabinets, a permit fee of \$50.00 or 1/2 of one percent of the cost of construction, whichever is greater, up to a maximum of \$1,000.00 per application, shall be charged.

For telecommunication towers, a permit fee of \$1,000.00 shall be charged per application.

For antennas and supporting cabinets associated with telecommunication towers, a permit fee of \$50.00 shall be charged per application.

For permits related to flood plain regulations, an additional fee of \$25.00 shall be charged.

For an application for appeal to the Board of Zoning Appeals, a fee of \$50.00 shall be charged.

For an application for variance to the Board of Zoning Appeals, a fee of \$100.00 per application shall be charged.

For an application for special exception to the Board of Zoning Appeals not elsewhere covered, a fee of \$100.00 shall be charged.

For an application for rezoning (amendment of the Zoning Map), a fee of \$250.00 shall be charged.

Building permit fees were discussed. John Lamb stated that there are problems with administering the present fee structure because it does not have a cap and it does not take into consideration all the different types of uses and different types of activities that are involved in zoning. He recommended a maximum of \$1,000 per permit on commercial. He recommended flat rates of \$125 per dwelling unit for multi-family units with a maximum of \$1,000. He also recommended a flat rate of \$100 per unit for manufactured home parks and a maximum rate of \$50 per unit for placement of manufactured homes in parks. He also recommended a maximum of \$1,000 per telecommunication tower. A minimum fee of \$20 or a fee of 1/8 of 1% whichever is greater for residential or multi-family and a minimum fee of \$50 or a fee of 1/8 of 1% whichever is greater for commercial and industrial permits is also recommended. He testified that he has the authority of Hackney Petroleum Company to testify on their behalf in this matter; that Hackney Petroleum Company is a corporation; that the business is located at the intersection of Helton Road and East Lamar Alexander Parkway; that the location is known in the community as "Lem's Corner"; that there has been a convenience store at the location for many years; that a survey has been filed with the application that shows that the location is more than 2000 feet from a school, church, or other public gathering place; that a residence is shown on the survey that is located within 300 feet of the business; that they will do everything within their power to see that no beer is sold to minors; that no person owning at least a 5% interest in the corporation nor any manager or employee has been convicted of violation of any laws regarding the sale, transportation, manufacture or distribution of alcoholic beverages.

Mr. Newton administered the oath to Linda Free, manager of Amoco Food Shop # 110. Ms. Free testified that Michael Edmondson, the owner of the residence within 300 feet of the business, is the son of the business property owner Wayne Edmondson; that Michael Edmondson is aware of the public hearing on the beer permit; that he has no objection to the issuance of the permit; that she has not managed a store that sold beer before; that she is aware of the laws regarding the sale of beer to minors; that she will make sure that there are no sales to minors; that employees know the laws regarding the sale of beer to minors.

Mr. Newton asked if there was anyone in the audience who wished to speak to the issuance of the permit. There was no response.

Bob Kidd Made a motion to approve the issuance of the permit. Kenneth Melton seconded the motion. A voice vote was taken with Chairman Williams declaring the motion to have passed.




