

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF INTEREST BEARING GENERAL OBLIGATION CAPITAL OUTLAY NOTES, SERIES 2001 OF BLOUNT COUNTY, TENNESSEE, IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000); MAKING PROVISION FOR THE ISSUANCE, SALE AND PAYMENT OF SAID NOTES, ESTABLISHING THE TERMS THEREOF AND THE DISPOSITION OF PROCEEDS THEREFROM; AND PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY OF TAX FOR THE PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL THEREOF AND INTEREST THEREON.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Sections 9-21-101 et seq., Tennessee Code Annotated, subject to the approval of the State Director of Local Finance, counties in Tennessee are authorized to issue interest bearing capital outlay notes for a period of not to exceed twelve (12) years from date of issue for all county purposes for which general obligation bonds can be legally authorized and issued; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of Blount County, Tennessee, the (“Local Government”) has determined that it is necessary and desirable to issue not to exceed \$600,000 in capital outlay notes to improve the County’s ability to serve the public with modern equipment, specifically the purchase and equipping of county vehicles, (the “Project”) for the benefit of the citizens of the Local Government; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has determined that the Project will promote or provide a traditional governmental activity or otherwise fulfill a public purpose; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Parts I, IV, and VI of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated (the “Act”), local governments in Tennessee are authorized to finance the cost of this Project through the issuance and sale of interest bearing capital outlay notes upon the approval of the State Director of Local Finance; and

WHEREAS; the Governing Body finds that it is advantageous to the Local Government to authorize the issuance of capital outlay notes to finance the cost of the Project;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of Blount County, Tennessee, as follows:

Section 1. That, for the purpose of providing funds to finance the cost of the Project in and for the Local Government, the County Executive of the Local Government is hereby authorized in accordance with the terms of this resolution to issue and sell interest-bearing capital outlay notes in a principal amount not to exceed Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) (the "Notes") at either a competitive public sale or at a private negotiated sale upon approval of the State Director of Local Finance pursuant to the terms, provisions, and conditions permitted by law. The Notes shall be designated "General Capital Outlay Notes, Series 2001"; shall be numbered serially from 1 upwards; shall be dated as of the date of issuance; shall be in denomination(s) as agreed upon with the purchaser; shall be sold at not less than 99% of par value and accrued interest; and shall bear interest at a rate or rates not to exceed six percent (6%) per annum, and in no event shall the rate exceed the legal limit provided by law.

Section 2. That, the Notes shall mature not later than three (3) years after the date of issuance and that the Notes and any extension or renewal notes shall not exceed the reasonably expected economic life of the Project, which is hereby certified by the Governing Body to be at least 3 years. Provided, however, that each year the Notes are outstanding, one-sixth (1/6), but in no event not less than one-twelfth (1/12), of the original principal amount of the Notes shall mature without renewal but subject to prior redemption.

Section 3. That, the Notes shall be subject to redemption at the option of the Local Government, in whole or in part, at any time, at the principal amount and accrued interest to the date of redemption, without a premium, or, if sold at par, with or without a premium of not exceeding one percent (1%) of the principal amount.

Section 4. That, the Notes shall be direct general obligations of the Local Government and the Local Government hereby pledges its taxing power as to all taxable property in the Local Government for the purpose of providing funds for the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes. The Governing Body of the Local Government hereby authorizes the levy and collection of a special tax on all taxable property of the Local Government over and above all other taxes authorized by the Local Government to create

a sinking fund to retire the Notes with interest as they mature in an amount necessary for that purpose.

Section 5. That, the Notes shall be executed in the name of the Local Government and bear the manual or facsimile signature of the County Executive and the County Clerk with the Local Government seal affixed thereon; and shall be payable as to principal and interest to the office of the County Trustee of the Local Government and shall be paid out for the purpose of financing the Project pursuant to this Resolution and as required by law.

Section 6. That, the Notes will be issued in fully registered form and that at all times during which any Note remains outstanding and unpaid, the Local Government or its agent shall keep or cause to be kept at its office a note register for the registration, exchange or transfer of the Notes. The note register, if held by an agent of the Local Government or any duly authorized officer of the Local Government. Each Note shall have the qualities and incidents of a negotiable instrument and shall be transferable only upon the note register kept by the Local Government or its agent, by the registered owner of the Note in person or by the registered owner's attorney duly authorized in writing, upon presentation and surrender to the Local Government or its agent together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Local Government duly executed by the registered owner or the registered owner's duly authorized attorney. Upon the transfer of any such Note, the Local Government shall issue in the name of the transferee a new registered note or notes of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity as the surrendered Note. The Local Government shall not be obligated to make any such Note transfer during the fifteen (15) days next preceding an interest payment date on the Notes or, in the case of any redemption of the Notes, during the forty-five (45) days next preceding the date of redemption.

Section 7. That, the Notes shall be in substantially the form attached hereto and shall recite that the Notes are issued pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated.

Section 8. That, the Notes shall be sold only after the receipt of the written approval of the State Director of Local Finance for the sale of the Notes.

Section 9. That, after the issuance and sale of the Notes, and for each year that any of the Notes are outstanding, the Local Government shall submit its annual budget to the State Director of Local Finance for approval immediately upon the Local Government's adoption of the budget.

Section 10. That, if any of the Notes shall remain unpaid at the end of three (3) years from the issue date, then the unpaid Notes shall be renewed or extended as permitted by law, or retired from the funds of the Local Government or be converted into bonds pursuant to Chapter 11 of Title 9 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, or any other law, or be otherwise liquidated as approved by the State Director of Local Finance.

Section 11. That, all orders or resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed insofar as such conflict exists and this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

Section 12. Blount County shall repay the Notes from the General Fund budget.

Section 13. That the Notes are hereby designated "qualified tax-exempt obligations" within the meaning of Section 265 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

This note is subject to redemption prior to its stated maturity in whole or in part at any time at the option of the Local Government upon payment of the principal amount of the note together with the interest accrued thereon to the date of the redemption with a premium of 0% of par value.

This note is issued under the authority of Parts I, IV, and VI of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated, and a Resolution duly adopted by the Governing Body of the Local Government meeting in regular session on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of September, 2000, (the "Resolution") to finance some or all of the cost of county vehicles.

This note shall have the qualities and incidents of a negotiable instrument and shall be transferable only upon the note register kept by the Local Government or its agent, by the Registered Owner of the note in person or by the Registered Owner's attorney duly authorized in writing, upon presentation and surrender to the Local Government or its agent of the note together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Local Government duly executed by the Registered Owner or the Registered Owner's duly authorized attorney but only in the manner as provided in the Resolution of the Local Government authorizing the issuance of this note and upon surrender hereof for cancellation. Upon the transfer of any such note, the Local Government or its agent shall issue in the name of the transferee a new registered note or notes of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity as the surrendered note. The Local Government shall not be obligated to make any such Note transfer during the fifteen (15) days next preceding an interest payment date on the Notes or, in the case of any redemption of the Notes, during the forty-five (45) days next preceding the date of redemption.

Title 9, Chapter 21, Section 117, Tennessee Code Annotated provides that this note and interest thereon are exempt from taxation by the State of Tennessee or by any county, municipality or taxing district of the State, except for inheritance, transfer and estate taxes and except as otherwise provided under the laws of the State of Tennessee.

**IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED, RECITED AND DECLARED** that all acts, condition and things required to exist, happen and be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this note exist, have happened and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by the Constitution and

**WHEREAS, the Local Agency desires to modify the design of a project, more fully described in Section I below and**

**WHEREAS, the Department is agreeable to cooperation with the Local Agency in this matter.**

**NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises, the Department and the Local Agency hereby enter into agreement to provide for funding and performance of the project.**

**SECTION I: The Project to be performed is described as follows:**

**"The construction of pedestrian-bicycle underpasses under US-321."**

**SECTION II: The parties agree to fulfill their respective obligations with regard to maintenance of this facility that are imposed by the applicable Federal and State laws and regulations. Specifically, in accordance with T.C.A. Section 54-1-126, the Department will be responsible for the maintenance of the concrete box culvert only, and the Local Agency shall be solely responsible for all other maintenance of the greenway underpass. The Local Agency's responsibility for maintenance of the greenway underpass shall include, but not be limited to, maintaining the walkway for safe passage of pedestrians.**

**The Local Agency agrees to be solely responsible for the maintenance of and to provide electrical current to all electrical equipment of any kind whatsoever installed hereunder to serve the underpasses described herein.**

#### **STANDARD TERMS**

**SECTION I: The Department is not bound by this Contract until it is approved by the appropriate Department officials as indicated on the signature page of this Contract.**

**SECTION II: This Contract may be modified only by a written amendment which has been executed and approved by the appropriate parties as indicated on the signature page of this Contract.**

**SECTION III: The Department may terminate the Contract by giving the Local Agency at least ninety (90) days notice before the effective termination date.**

**SECTION IV: If the Local Agency fails to properly perform its obligations under this Contract or violates any terms of this Contract, the Department shall have the right to immediately terminate the Contract. The**

**Local Government shall not be relieved of liability to the Department for damages sustained by virtue of any breach of this Contract by the Local Agency.**

**SECTION V: The Local Government understands that if there is a determination by the Federal Highway Administration that any cost of the project is ineligible for federal funds because of any failure to the Local Agency, the Local Agency will be obligated to pay the Department the sum of money declared ineligible by the Federal Highway Administration.**

**Set a public hearing on amendment of the Zoning Map for October 19,  
2000 for the following:**

1. That the Zoning Map of Blount County, Tennessee be amended from S-Suburbanizing to C-Commercial for Parcel 90.00 of Blount County Tax Map 8, described as follows: starting at the southernmost corner of Parcel 90.00 of Blount County Tax Map 8, being also on the right-of-way line of Singleton Station Road and also the city limits of the City of Alcoa; thence northwest following the right-of-way line of Singleton Station Road to the eastern most corner of said parcel, also along a railroad right-of-way; thence northeast following the railroad right-of-way, also the northwestern property line of said parcel, to a corner intersection with the right-of-way line of Topside Road, also the city limit line of the City of Alcoa; thence eastward following the right-of-way line of Topside Road to another corner of said parcel; thence southeast following the property line of said parcel to the eastern most corner of said parcel; thence southwest following the property line of said parcel to the point of beginning; containing approximately 14 acres or the total land area of said Parcel 90.00 of Blount County Tax Map 8 and as shown on attached map.
2. That the Zoning Map of Blount County, Tennessee be amended from R-2 Rural District 2 to R-1 Rural District 1 for part of parcel 10 of Tax Map 95, being an area bounded approximately by the 1200 foot contour shown on the United States Department of the Interior Geological Survey, Kinzel Springs Quadrangle, Tennessee-Blount Co. 7.5 minute series (topographic) map and as shown on attached map.

**Set a public hearing on amendment of the Zoning Resolution for October 19, 2000 for the following:**

1. That the Zoning Resolution of Blount County, Tennessee be amended by addition of a new section under Article 4 as follows:

**Section 4.4. For Residential Structures in progress.** Any single family residential structure, being one unit or two units per lot or parcel, or accessory structure to a single family residential structure, started prior to the effective date of this Resolution shall be allowed to proceed to completion, notwithstanding non-conformity of structure, provided that progress on physical construction toward completion is continuous.

(NOTE: This is not the wording as amended in the Committee. The tape recorder did not pick up the discussion. The full Commission may wish to amend the wording at the regular meeting.)

2. That the Zoning Resolution of Blount County, Tennessee be amended by addition of the words "bed and breakfast accommodations" to Section 9.1B Uses Permitted as Special Exceptions (in S-Suburbanizing District), and to Section 9.2B Uses Permitted as Special Exceptions (in R-1 – Rural District 1).

3. That the Zoning Resolution of Blount County, Tennessee be amended by addition of a new section 2.5 under Article 2 as follows:

**Section 2.5. Decks, patios, pools and other structures of limited height.** Accessory structures such as decks, patios, pools and other unenclosed structures less than thirty (30) inches in height shall be exempt from setback requirements and exempt from building permit, provided that all requirements of Section 7.9 for vision clearance for traffic are met.

4. That the Zoning Resolution of Blount County, Tennessee be amended by addition of a new section 2.6 under Article 2 as follows:

**Section 2.6. Fences.** Fences less than ten (10) feet in height and which are not a part of a site plan required by other sections in this Resolution shall be exempt from setback requirements and exempt


from building permit, provided that all requirements of Section 7.9 for vision clearance for traffic are met.

5. That the Zoning Resolution of Blount County, Tennessee be amended by deletion of Section 7.4.B.2. in its entirety and the substitution of the following in its stead:

2. Amateur Radio Station Operator/Receive Only Antennas. This Section shall not apply to any tower, or the installation of any antenna on such tower, that is seventy (70) feet in height or less, and is owned and operated by an amateur radio station operator or is used exclusively for receive only antennas. All other applicable regulations to towers greater than 70 feet in height and found within this Section shall continue to apply.

**Items referred to the Planning Commission for further consideration**

1. An amendment previously proposed by the Planning Commission concerning parking and accessory structures in the required 40 foot setback for manufactured home parks and multifamily developments.
2. Density of multifamily use on sewer.
3. Density of commercial cabins in the R-2 zone.
4. Setback of structures along arterial roads – now set at 60 feet – especially along Hwy 321 in the Townsend area.



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




EXHIBIT "A"

## Blount County Public Library Offers Services for All Ages

At present, the library's collection contains nearly 115,000 books, 4500 books-on-tape, 9600 videos, 16,000 microforms, and over 1000 periodical titles (both print and electronic). During 1999-00 more than 230,000 persons visited the library even though more of the library's resources can be accessed through the Internet.

Although dwindling space presents a real challenge to programming in the library, three storytimes per week continue to draw children and parents to the library. 538 children participated in the 1999 summer reading club; 572 participated in the 2000 reading club, an increase of 6.32%. During 1999-2000, the Library sponsored 79 programs (on-site and off) which were attended by 2643 persons.

Use of library resource within the facility increases annually as well. Nearly 28,000 reference questions were fielded by the library staff and nearly 244 persons per week used public access computers to word process, write resumes and access the internet.

Adults are heavy consumers of the public computers which they use to access the Internet and a variety of other online resources. ## Mission Statement

The mission of the Blount County Public Library is to provide library materials in all formats for the citizens of Blount County in order that the quality of their lives might be enhanced by 1) recreational and cultural opportunities, 2) the information needed to be successful participants in the community and make informed decisions affecting their lives, and 3) opportunities for young children to develop an interest in reading and learning.

## Vision Statement

We believe libraries exist to serve *people* by helping them acquire *knowledge* regardless of the means or format by which that knowledge is communicated. We recognize that technology is a tool used solely to enhance our primary purpose - *service*. We are determined to protect our citizens' free access to *knowledge* and recognize our obligation to honor the past while helping to create the future through the storage and retrieval of our world community's collective *wisdom*.



## Annual Report 1999-2000



## Mid-2002 is projected opening of new Blount County Public Library at Sky City site

1999-2000 saw significant accomplishments toward funding the construction of a new library facility at the Sky City site near the greenway in Maryville and Alcoa. Alcoa and Maryville followed Blount County in committing tax revenues to the project.

The Foundation for the Blount County Public Library began its public campaign in May with the mailing of solicitations to households in the county. Efforts continue to secure donations from the business community. The projected total cost of the project is \$14 million, of which \$12.7 million has been secured. The Foundation's efforts raise the remaining \$1.3 million are ongoing.

Truly a cooperative project among several entities, the project will be overseen by a building committee of library staff, library board members and members of the Public Building Authority. The library is expected to be completed in mid-2002.

CIRCULATION OF LIBRARY MATERIALS AT THE BLOUNT COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY CONTINUED TO INCREASE DURING 1999-2000 IN SPITE OF OVERCROWDING - IN THE PARKING LOT, ON THE SHELVES, AND IN THE STUDY AND READING SPACE OF THE PRESENT FACILITY. CIRCULATION THIS YEAR WAS RECORDED AT 537,904 ITEMS, AN INCREASE OF 4% OVER 1998-99. NON-PRINT MATERIALS (BOOKS ON TAPE AND VIDEOS) SAW AN INCREASE OF 14% AND INHOUSE USE OF PUBLIC ACCESS COMPUTERS INCREASED NEARLY 20%.

REGISTRATION FOR THE SUMMER READING PROGRAM INCREASED BY 6% THIS YEAR AND ENROLLEES READ 9% MORE BOOKS.

A NEW INTEGRATED COMPUTER SYSTEM AT THE LIBRARY SAW CHANGES IN THE ONLINE CATALOG AND AT THE CIRCULATION DESK. A COOPERATIVE EFFORT OF LIBRARIES IN THE FORT LOUDOUN REGIONAL LIBRARY SYSTEM, THIS NEW SYSTEM ALLOWS ACCESS TO THE LIBRARY'S CATALOG THROUGH THE INTERNET AND WILL EVENTUALLY ALLOW PATRONS TO CHECK THE STATUS OF THEIR OWN ACCOUNTS, AS WELL AS PLACE HOLDS AND MAKE INQUIRIES OF THE STAFF THROUGH THE AUTOMATED SYSTEM.

LIBRARY USE CONTINUES TO GROW IN 1999-2000 DESPITE CHALLENGES OF AN OVERCROWDED FACILITY.

## Library Expenditures Average nearly \$8.78 per person during 1998-99

In 1999-2000, the three funding bodies appropriated \$779,572 for the provision of library services in Blount County (Blount County - \$379,072; Maryville - \$324,400; Alcoa - \$76,100). Other revenues (memorials, fines, fees, interest earned, and fund balances) provided an additional \$175,000. The total approved budget for 1999-00 was \$997,684. Actual expenditures totalled \$895,355 and can be summarized as:
