SUBJECT: Tennessee Code Annotated § 54-1-126

As a condition precedent to constructing pedestrian-bicycle underpasses under US Highway 321 in the Townsend area of the county, the Tennessee Department of Transportation ("DOT") will require that a local agency enter into a contract to maintain the greenway underpasses, including the walkways for safe passage of pedestrians. This obligation will also include responsibility for the maintenance of and to provide electrical current to all electrical equipment installed to serve the underpasses. Inquiry has been made as to whether the Maryville-Alcoa-Blount County Recreation and Parks Commissions ("Parks & Rec") may legally enter into this contract with DOT rather than the county.

Tennessee Code Annotated § 54-1-126 requires that DOT enter into a written contract with each city, county or metropolitan government before undertaking any work or providing any funds for work with respect to public roads, streets, highways or bridges and similar structures, within their boundaries which are not on the state system. The statute requires that the contract include a provision that such city, county or metropolitan government is solely responsible for all maintenance of the completed work. No such contract shall be valid in the absence of such maintenance provision.

Parks and Rec is not a city, county or metropolitan government. Consequently, the requirements of Tennessee Code Annotated § 54-1-126 would not be met by DOT contracting with Parks and Rec.

If the county contracts with DOT for the construction of pedestrian-bicycle underpasses under US 321, the county will be responsible for the maintenance of the underpasses and walkways, but the county can delegate the actual maintenance work to Parks and Rec.

Inquiry has been made as to the county's exposure to liability by agreeing to maintain greenway underpasses and walkways under US Highway 321 in the Townsend area of the county.

The county's exposure for liability is governed by the Tennessee Governmental Tort Liability Act, Tennessee Code Annotated §§ 28-20-101, *et seq.* (the "Act"). In general, the Act immunizes the county from suit for any injury which may result from the county's activities when the county is engaged in the exercise and discharge of any of its functions. However, the county's general immunity is removed under four circumstances, one of which is for any injury caused by a defective, unsafe or dangerous condition of any street, alley, sidewalk or highway owned or controlled by the county. See T.C.A. § 29-20-203.

With regard to the pedestrian-bicycle underpasses, the county could be liable under T.C.A. § 29-20-203 if the county does something or fails to do something in maintaining the underpasses and walkways that results in a defective, unsafe or dangerous condition thereof, and someone is injured as a consequence of such defective, unsafe or dangerous condition. The county's limits of liability under the Act for personal injury are \$130,000.00 per person and \$350,000.00 per accident. The county's Self-Insured Liability Trust Fund provides coverage for the first \$50,000.00 of any claim or judgment with commercial liability insurance being responsible for any amounts over \$50,000.00 up to the statutory limits of liability.

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into by and between THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, acting by and through its DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, hereinafter referred to as the Department, and the BLOUNT COUNTY, hereinafter referred to as the Local Agency.

W I T N E S S E I H:

WHEREAS, the Local Agency desires to modify the design of a project, more fully described in Section I below and

WHEREAS, the Department is agreeable to cooperation with the Local Agency in this matter.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises, the Department and the Local Agency hereby enter into agreement to provide for funding and performance of the project.

SECTION I: The Project to be performed is described as follows:

"The construction of pedestrian-bicycle underpasses under US-321."

SECTION II: The parties agree to fulfill their respective obligations with regard to maintenance of this facility that are imposed by the applicable Federal and State laws and regulations. Specifically, in accordance with T.C.A. Section 54-1-126, the Department will be responsible for the maintenance of the concrete box culvert only, and the Local Agency shall be solely responsible for all other maintenance of the greenway underpass. The Local Agency's responsibility for maintenance of the greenway underpass shall include, but not be limited to, maintaining the walkway for safe passage of pedestrians.

The Local Agency agrees to be solely responsible for the maintenance of and to provide electrical current to all electrical equipment of any kind whatsoever installed hereunder to serve the underpasses described herein.

STANDARD TERMS

SECTION I: The Department is not bound by this Contract until it is approved by the appropriate Department officials as indicated on the signature page of this Contract.

SECTION II: This Contract may be modified only by a written amendment which has been executed and approved by the appropriate parties as indicated on the signature page of this Contract.

SECTION III: The Department may terminate the Contract by giving the Local Agency at least ninety (90) days notice before the effective termination date.

SECTION IV: If the Local Agency fails to properly perform its obligations under this Contract or violates any terms of this Contract, the Department shall have the right to immediately terminate the Contract. The

Local Government shall not be relieved of liability to the Department for damages sustained by virtue of any breach of this Contract by the Local Agency.

SECTION V: The Local Government understands that if there is a determination by the Federal Highway Administration that any cost of the project is ineligible for federal funds because of any failure to the Local Agency, the Local Agency will be obligated to pay the Department the sum of money declared ineligible by the Federal Highway Administration.

SECTION VI: The Local Agency agrees to comply with all applicable federal and state laws and regulations in the performance of its duties under this agreement. The parties hereby agree that failure of the Local Agency to comply with this provision shall constitute a material breach of this agreement and subject the Local Agency to the repayment of all damages suffered by the State and or the Tennessee Department of Transportation as a result of said breach.

SECTION VII: Records of costs shall be kept by the Department and shall be available for inspection and copying by the Department during normal business hours for a period of not less than three years following the completion or termination of the Project.



SUBJECT: Procedure for closing county public roads

Per your request, the following is furnished with regard to the procedure for closing county public roads.

There are two methods which may be utilized. One method is found under section 14 of Chapter 265 of the 1959 Private Acts, which established the Blount County Highway Department and the office of County Road Superintendent. In my experience, this procedure has not been utilized.

There is an alternative method found under the general law at T.C.A. § 54-10-216, which is less complex than the method found in the private act. As a condition precedent to utilizing this alternative method, the county legislative body must have adopted T.C.A. § 54-10-216 as an alternative procedure by resolution approved by two-thirds (2/3) majority vote. The procedure for closing a county public road under T.C.A § 54-10-216 is as follows:

1. An application to close a designated public road must first be made in writing to the Road Superintendent.
2. The Road Superintendent must then give at least five (5) days notice to all interested parties of the time the road is to be closed. Landowners and those controlling land touched by the road are deemed interested parties.
3. The Road Superintendent then makes a recommendation to the Blount County Regional Planning Commission regarding whether or not the road should be closed.
4. Before making any recommendation with respect to closing the road, the planning commission must provide notice of such action either by written notice mailed to affected property owners or by notice advertised in a newspaper of general circulation in the county not less than fourteen (14) days before such recommendation is made.
5. After receiving the Road Superintendent's recommendation, the planning commission then makes its recommendation to the Blount County legislative body and attaches thereto the Road

Superintendent's recommendation.

6. After receiving the recommendations of the Road Superintendent and the planning commission, the county legislative body may, by resolution adopted by a majority of its members, order the closure of the public road.

A copy of T.C.A. § 54-10-216 is attached hereto for your information.

54-10-216. Closure of public roads by application to county highway department. — Notwithstanding the provisions of this part to the contrary, a county legislative body, by resolution adopted by a two-thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) majority vote, may adopt the provisions of this section as an alternative procedure for the closing of public roads in the county which are not maintained by any other governmental entity. After adopting the provisions of this section, each application to close a designated public road in the county shall be made in writing to the chief administrative officer. Upon receiving an application to close a public road, the chief administrative officer shall give notice to interested parties as provided in this part. The chief administrative officer shall make a recommendation to the regional planning commission regarding whether or not the public road should be closed. Before making any recommendation with respect to closing a road pursuant to this section, the regional planning commission shall provide notice of such action either by written notice mailed to affected property owners or by notice advertised in a newspaper of general circulation in the county not less than fourteen (14) days before such recommendation is made. After receiving the recommendation of the chief administrative officer, the regional planning commission shall make its recommendation to the county legislative body, and shall attach the recommendation of the chief administrative officer. After receiving the recommendations as provided herein, the county legislative body may, by resolution adopted by a majority of its members, order the closure of the public road. 

Jerry Hall and other residents living near the bridge over C.S.X. Railroad on Binfield Road presented a petition in opposition to the State of Tennessee's proposal to move the bridge to a new site. Steve Samples made a motion to request the Highway Department to provide definitive options for the project by the October 19 County Commission meeting. John Keeble seconded the motion. A voice vote was taken with Vice Chairman Hill declaring the motion to have passed.

Steve Samples made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 12, 2000 meeting. Steve Hargis seconded the motion. A voice vote was taken with Vice Chairman Hill declaring the motion to have passed.

The Beer Board was convened. The Board approved the minutes of the September 12, 2000 meeting.

The Public Services Committee was reconvened.

The committee received a report from County Attorney Norman Newton regarding the contract for the Townsend Bike Trail. Mr. Newton stated that the Recreation and Parks Commission may not enter into an agreement with the State for the maintenance of the trail. The State is required by statute to have a contract with either a city or county for the maintenance when it does work that is not in its system. The contract from T.D.O.T. requires the county to maintain the greenway underpasses, including walkways. Recreation and Parks Director Joe Huff will discuss the agreement at the October County Commission meeting.

Bob Evans discussed traffic problems in the Bungalow area. After a public meeting on the problem, the Highway Department is in the process of getting cost estimates for option 7. Mr. Evans and the Highway Superintendent will report back to the committee next month.

It was suggested to the Highway Department that when a proposal is made to replace a bridge that the department hold a public hearing to inform the public.

Mr. Newton discussed an offer from the State of Tennessee to acquire property owned by Blount County for a project to improve the Washington Avenue Viaduct. The state has offered \$18,175.00. The county owns the former C.S.X. Railroad right-of-way under the present bridge. Mr. Newton said that he would recommend the agreement with the stipulation that the county be given the right to continue to operate its trail across the property the state intends to acquire and that the state actually commit to construct the improvements proposed. He also recommended that approval be subject to reviewing of the final documents by the County Attorney. Bob Kidd made a motion to recommend the offer to the County Commission with the County Attorney's recommendations. Steve Hargis seconded the motion. A voice vote was taken with Vice Chairman Hill declaring the motion to have passed.

Tony Abbott reported that the extension of Charles Young Road accepted by the County Commission in September has been graded and rocked. A surface of cold-mix asphalt will be applied in October. A petition to add Lail Lane to the roads list was expected this month. A request has been made to widen Gillenwater Road. The Historical Office of TVA has made an inquiry regarding not demolishing the Melrose Station Bridge, currently being replaced.

Steve Hargis reported that he has polled school bus drivers regarding identification of needed repairs to roads along their route. He will take the report to the Budget Committee.

Bob Evans reported that the Public Services Committee deferred a requested closure of Callahan Road between Airbase Road and Wrights Ferry Road. He said that the road has since been double-gated on the Airbase Road side and "No Thru Traffic" signs installed on the other end. He speculated that the Airport is going to make this a private access to Continental Express. He said that the Airport has taken it upon themselves to pave and fence it. The County Attorney was requested to provide the County Commission with the procedure that must be followed for a road to be abandoned.

Bob Kidd made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Steve Hargis seconded the motion. Vice Chairman Hill declared the meeting to be adjourned.

Mr. Herron called the meeting to order.

1. Mr. Crawford motioned the minutes be approved and to dispense with the reading. Mr. Evans seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.
2. Mr. Herron presented the memo concerning the “Computer Room Environmental Integrity” to the committee. All the equipment in the computer room has been infiltrated with dust due to the demolition of the ceiling in the vault room and the lack of sealing off a hole (eight feet wide x one foot tall) between the computer room and the vault. Mr. Evans asked what needed to be done and Mr. Herron suggested getting the rooms cleaned. The floors are covered with concrete chips, grit, and dust. Walking through the area stirs up all the dust and the dust is tracked throughout the area. Mr. Evans asked if some type of “negative” ventilation system could be installed to get the dust out of the room. The committee unanimously approved that Mr. Herron draft a letter from the committee to Ms. Greer of the Public Building Authority requesting she install a negative ventilation system and have the area cleaned. A copy of the letter and the memo is to be included in the commissioners’ packets.
3. Mr. Herron introduced a memo concerning the lack of a raceway with power and data outlets on the commissioners’ tables in the new county commission room. Power and data outlets are under the table, which will not only be inconvenient to plug in the commissioners’ laptops but will also make accidental unplugging of the laptops more likely to occur. The committee unanimously approved that Mr. Herron draft a letter from the committee to Ms. Greer of the Public Building Authority stating the concerns arising from putting the power and data outlets under the tables. A copy of the letter and the memo is to be included in the commissioners’ packets.
4. Items approved for purchase by Data Processing was presented to the committee. The Sheriff Department’s request for an Encase V.2 Professional Forensic Software package was over Data Processing’s authorized approval limit, but the Sheriff Department needed it without delay for a criminal case so the approval was granted.
5. Mr. Herron next opened for discussion the occurrences of department heads asking to

keep the old computers that are being replaced with new computers. This defeats the purpose of getting rid of the old computers (along with their problems) and also means the old computers will again be the first to be replaced next year. Mr. Crawford made the motion that a department head needs to submit a written request to the committee, or personally come to the meeting, to explain why they should be allowed to keep the old computer. The committee would then decide whether to grant the request. Mr. Evans seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

6. Mr. Herron asked for committee direction on three instances of department heads wanting to keep old computers:
 - a.. Trustees - let D. Hitch have the old computer. The committee decided the Trustee Department should buy a new one with their funds or justify the request to the committee.
 - b. Human Resource - use the old computer for “testing” applicants. The committee decided to have the Department Head either come before the committee or send a letter explaining why the department should have the old computer.
 - c. Juvenile - keep the old computer so state reports can be brought up to date. The committee decided to let the department keep the old computer for three months.

Stock Creek Development Centre

- Additional TIIPS funding for the second power source at Stock Creek was approved. Total project cost stands at \$434,524. Total grant funding approved is \$272,005. KUB has agreed to pay \$45,000. The Industrial Board will pay \$59,173. The Maryville Electric Department and Blount County will pay \$29,173 each.

PARTNERSHIP PARK SOUTH

- Final draft of design guidelines for the park is ready for approval by the Joint Operating Committee. The Industrial Development Board will begin designing a 100,000 sq. ft. speculative building, with construction scheduled to begin Spring 2001.

BIG SPRINGS INDUSTRIAL PARK

- Standard Aero Alliance has purchased additional acreage for a major expansion of its facility. The company plans to build a 71,000 sq. ft. building, which represents a capital investment of \$16.2 million and 300 additional jobs. Standard Aero Alliance also has selected McGhee Tyson Airport as a possible site for a new maintenance facility, representing a potential \$12 million capital investment.
- Fawn Industries closed its Maryville facility the end of September. The Industrial Board held an on-site job fair for the company's employees.

BLOUNT COUNTY INDUSTRIAL PARK

- United Cities Gas is exercising its option to purchase the 4.391-acre site located at 1639 Robert C. Jackson Street.
- The Industrial Board met with BTR representatives to discuss the plant's pending closure. The Career Center at the Chamber of Commerce will help displaced workers identify employment options.

ADMINISTRATIVE

- The newly created program manager's position for the Industrial Board has been filled by Linda Cabage, who assumed her duties August 7. Linda will focus primarily on existing industry services.

MARKETING ACTIVITIES

- Prospect activity was slow during the summer months, but several existing companies are planning expansion projects. Prospects showed interest in sites at Partnership Park South, Big Springs Industrial Park, Stock Creek Development Centre and other potential sites.
- Gary Farlow participated in a trade mission to Detroit with representatives of Tennessee's Resource Valley. They targeted site consultants in the area.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

- Marriott Corporation's 50,000 sq. ft. Shared Service Center is open. The center currently houses minimum staff but will start hiring more employees at the beginning of 2001 for a total of roughly 250 personnel.

REPORT TO BLOUNT COUNTY COMMISSION – OCTOBER 2000

I. Introduction:

This report to the Blount County Commission is the report for October 2000. I will continue to provide you this report on a quarterly basis so that you may be informed of hospital activities, services and progress. This report addresses many items which I hope are of interest to you regarding hospital operations and activities including a Statistical Report, Financial Reports, and a report on other hospital projects and services.

II. Statistical Reports:

Again, the hospital continues to be very busy and continues to grow. Included in this report please find the statistical report for August 2000. This report presents the utilization of all hospital services for the first two months of our fiscal year, which began July 1, 2000. Overall, the statistical performance of our hospital, medical and health related services has significantly exceeded both budget projections and last year's actual volume of business.

For example, for the first two months of this fiscal year, inpatient admissions have been 8% above budget at 1,506, versus a budget of 1,394. Also, our total patient days have been 11.9% above budget at 6,889, versus a budget of 6,154. This continued growth in inpatient business, which the hospital has experienced since mid-1999 reflects our growing community; the recruitment of additional physicians to Blount County; the addition and expansion of hospital services; and the provision of care through the Highlands Health Partnership, as well as our improving community image. In addition, we have experienced a 3% growth in market share in the last 12 months. This is the first market share growth we have experienced since 1985.

Specifically, other inpatient and outpatient services that are growing and exceeding last year's budget projections, as well as last year's actual volume, include the following: births, total nursery days, laboratory tests, blood bank procedures, inpatient radiology exams, outpatient radiology exams, radiation oncology treatments, G lab procedures, MRI examinations, mammograms, pharmacy supply items, medical supply items, respiratory therapy treatments, EKG tests, vascular lab procedures, cardiopulmonary rehabilitation visits, inpatient rehabilitation services, outpatient rehabilitation services, outpatient surgical procedures, emotional health and recovery visits and occupational health visits at our Springbrook Clinic.

III. Financial Report:

The hospital also continues to perform well financially. Our financial performance is in dramatic contrast to most all hospitals in our state who are experiencing difficulty performing well financially due to lower reimbursement by Medicare and TennCare.

Included in this report please find the hospital's financial reports including the Statement of Revenue and Expenses, followed by the Balance Sheet. For the first two months of this fiscal year our gross patient revenue has been 11.2% above budget at \$36,779,000, versus a budget of \$33,088,000.

Unfortunately our allowances, or deductions from revenue including contractual discounts and charity care, also continue to grow and are 10.7% above budget at \$21,656,000, versus a budget of \$19,563,000.

Fortunately, however, our total operating revenues for the first two months have been 11.2% above budget at \$16,229,000, versus a budget of \$14,594,000.

Our expenses have grown at 9%, reflecting our increased volume over budget projections, where we are 9% above budget at \$15,640,000, versus a budget of \$14,347,000.

Our income from operations and patient care for the first two months of this fiscal year has been \$589,000, versus a budget of \$247,000, and our total net revenue over expenses including investments and other contributions, as well as net income has been \$1,198,000, versus a budget of \$701,000.

Therefore, as you can see, the hospital continues to perform well financially and meet both our long term and short term financial obligations. In addition, we are able to generate sufficient net income to continue to improve and grow the quality of our patient care and the growth of services to our community.

IV. Other Hospital Projects and Services:

- A. Ten Year Facility Master Plan: We continue to work on our Ten Year Facility Master Plan to address the growth we are experiencing along with our community. Final recommendations from this plan, which will guide our decision making for growth over the next five to ten years will be completed by December, 2000. I will share these findings with you as soon as they are complete.
- B. Maryville Ambulatory Surgery Center: The Maryville Ambulatory Surgery Center, which is a joint venture partnership with certain members of our medical staff, continues to perform well. This relatively new service, which is approximately 15 months old now, is generating sufficient income to meet all expenses and it has been well received by our patients and the community.
- C. Assisted Living Facility: MorningView Village, our assisted living facility now under construction is progressing well. Our scheduled opening date is April 2, 2001. Beginning this month we have begun receiving reservations and deposits on the 92 units, which will provide sheltered and supported living for the elderly in a medical and health environment. We will have three levels of care including independent care, assisted living care, and Alzheimer's and dementia care. We will invite you to tour the facility when construction is more complete.

- D. **Volume of Service:** With the continued growth in our volume of service, we are making preparations to open 20 additional inpatient beds by next month. Last winter we experienced dramatic growth and had experienced certain days where it was difficult to admit patients for needed hospital care. We will be opening 20 additional beds for use and are near completion of certain internal renovations and nursing staff recruitment to be prepared for an even greater volume of business this winter.
- E. **Home Equipment:** As you may be aware, the hospital has opened a Home Equipment business. This will add another service component to our Home Health Services, which already provide skilled nursing, infusion therapy, home life assistance and hospice care. The reason we are adding this service is to have a full range and complement of home health services for our patients and their families and to generate additional income for that service. In addition, Medicare is beginning to bundle and to pay hospitals one fee for all home health services. Therefore, it will be more efficient and effective for us to own and manage our own full complement of services rather than have to contract for certain components. We are opening this new service with the assistance of Mr. Joe Fox, who has previously operated a very successful home health business in this community. There have been some difficulties in finalizing the start-up of this service due to the fact that the company that currently owns Fox Home Medical is in bankruptcy.
- F. **Highlands Health Partnership:** We are very pleased with the success of our health plan network, which is called "Highlands Health Partnership". This health plan network, which is owned by the hospital and its medical staff, is providing health care to self-insured companies in Blount County including: City of Maryville, City of Maryville Schools, City of Alcoa, Blount County, and employees of Blount Memorial Hospital. This coming year we anticipate adding at least two more large employers to this plan. The Highlands Health Partnership has helped us grow business and has provided access to quality health care to its members. Also, the plan has saved a significant amount of money for all of these organizations. The Highlands Health Partnership is one of the few examples of a successful managed care effort.
- V. **Conclusion:** Thank you very much for receiving this report and for your support of Blount Memorial Hospital.
