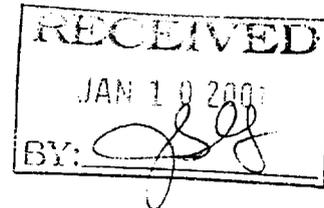

**General Building Information:** The building under investigation is a one-story educational facility that was constructed around 1976. A complete set of construction drawings was provided for our review. No specifications or soils report was available. The structural system is typically composed of concrete masonry unit (CMU) bearing walls with perimeter brick veneer cladding. The roof system typically consists of open web bar joist framing which support either a Insulrock cementitious wood fiber roof deck (at auditorium and gymnasium) or a wide ribbed metal roof deck (at all other areas).

**Initial Visit:** During our initial visit to the site, we were accompanied by Ms. Greer and Mr. French. The primary areas observed in this initial field visit were the walls around the backstage area of the auditorium and the sidewalls of the wood shop area that abut the backstage area of the auditorium. A wall of particular interest during these observations was the common wall between backstage and the adjacent wood shop. Slab on grade elevation on the backstage side of this wall is 950'-6" and drops to 949'-2" on the wood shop side. This wall supports a 10'-0" wide mezzanine (finished floor elevation of 961'-10") which runs full length along the backstage side. This wall also supports a high/low roof condition in which the wood shop roof framing bears at elevation 967'-2" and the auditorium roof bears approximately at elevation 982'-6.

The width of the auditorium is 4'-0" greater than the abutting wood shop area. Therefore the building steps in 2'-0" on each side where this transition occurs.

**Distress Observed During Initial Visit:**

1. As observed from the mezzanine above the backstage area of the auditorium, there is a horizontal crack 7'-4" above the mezzanine floor level (refer to photo 1 and photograph

location maps, crack elevation = 969'-2"). This crack extends essentially full length of the common wall before stepping down near the corners. A series of vertical cracks intersect this horizontal crack at intervals of approximately 5'-4" on center (refer to photo 2).

2. There is a large vertical crack near the east end of the common wall (refer to photo 3 & 4). This crack exhibits large (approximately 3/8") out-of-plane relative displacement.
3. The west sidewall exhibits bi-directional stair step cracking as illustrated in photo 5. The east sidewall exhibits little to no cracking.
4. There is a wall opposite the common wall that supports the other side of the 10'-0" mezzanine but does not support any roof load. Where this wall intersects the east sidewall, there is a separation of approximately 1/2" (refer to photo 6). This separation also appears to be evident where the mezzanine slab abut the east sidewall.
5. Wall tile cracking was observed in the northeast and northwest sidewall corners, in the restrooms below the mezzanine.
6. Stair step cracking was observed in the sidewalls of the wood shop area (refer to photos 7 & 8). Also cracking is occurring where interior bearing walls intersect these sidewalls (refer to photos 8, 9, & 10).
7. A vertical crack is present in the exterior brick veneer (refer to photo 11) at each corner where the auditorium wall steps in 2'-0" at the auditorium/wood shop transition. This crack stops approximately 2'-0" above the top of the low roof parapet.

Second Visit: After the initial visit, we received a full copy of the construction drawings. While reviewing the drawings, it was observed that the gymnasium was detailed and constructed in a similar manner as the auditorium. Some of the theories we had developed regarding the reasons for the occurrence of these cracks could be dispelled or possibly substantiated by what we could observe in these similar areas. We contacted Ms. Greer to schedule a second site visit in order to observe walls above the projection room at the rear the auditorium, walls in the gymnasium, and gain access to the roof. As noted below, similar cracking patterns were observed in the gymnasium north endwall and the south (rear) endwall of the auditorium (these cracks were not as large as the ones present in the north common wall between the auditorium backstage and wood shop areas). An additional objective of this second visit was to install crack monitors along the common wall between the auditorium and the wood shop area.

#### Distress Observed During Second Visit:

1. Stair step cracking was observed in the east (refer to photo 12) and west sidewalls near the rear wall of auditorium. A small horizontal crack is also present in the auditorium rear wall.
2. A horizontal crack was present essentially the full length of gymnasium north end wall (refer to photo 13, horizontal crack patched in white).
3. Stair step cracking was observed in the sidewalls of gymnasium (refer to photo 13, 14 & 15).
4. Vertical cracking was present in the endwalls at the main roof x-bracing locations (refer to photo 16).

#### Additional Observations:

1. We did not observe any building expansion joints, CMU contraction joints or brick expansion joints in any of the areas observed during our site visit.
2. Roof deck expansion joints were observed on the roof at areas where there is a change in deck direction only.

3. The roof bar joists were detailed to be placed directly adjacent to the building sidewalls, but there is no attachment between the roof deck and the sidewalls. Detail 3-S13 shown on B-1 is copied from the construction drawings and is a typical detail where the roof framing is adjacent and runs parallel to the building sidewall.

#### Conclusions:

Based on our observations, there did not appear to be any differential movement between the block walls and "floating" slab (poured against, and not tied to CMU bearing wall) at the slab-on-grade/wall interface areas. In addition there does not appear to be significant vertical differential movements between the CMU block at the crack locations. Therefore we do not feel that settlement is the cause for these cracks.

In general, the continuous horizontal cracks indicate the presence of out-of-plane (perpendicular to the face of the wall) bending stresses. The stair stepping cracks in the sidewalls indicates the presence of in-plane (parallel to the face of the wall) shear stresses. It is our opinion that horizontal movement at the high roof elevation of the auditorium, combined with horizontal restraint created by the low roof, has resulted in the horizontal cracks directly above the low roof framing elevation (this is somewhat substantiated since there is no horizontal crack in the south end wall of the gymnasium, where no low roof condition is present). Since there is no joint at the corners where the endwall meet the sidewalls (walls were constructed integrally), this horizontal movement is translated into shear stresses at the sidewalls.

The horizontal movement discussed above, could be due to several things such as thermal expansion, moisture expansion (due to changes in relative humidity) or possibly lateral loads due to wind. While it is possible that wind loading may have contributed to this building distress, it seems more likely that a static type loading is responsible. Wind loads are short and intermittently applied loads, while thermal or moisture expansion of construction materials would be gradual and apply a constant loading over a longer period of time. Based on our review of the expansion properties of the cementitious roof deck used over the gymnasium and auditorium, under a change in relative humidity from 50 to 97%, the roof deck would try to expand as much as 2" in the auditorium and 2-3/4" in the gymnasium.

Due to the lack of a continuous deck attachment along the sidewalls, there is no roof diaphragm action to resist and distribute these horizontal movements and subsequent forces. Since there is no roof diaphragm to engage and resist this horizontal movement, all the force is being concentrated at end walls. The absence of building expansion joints and wall control joints provides a condition where forces that build up during expansion cycles do not have any way to be relieved. This again results in the majority of these stresses being concentrated at the endwalls.

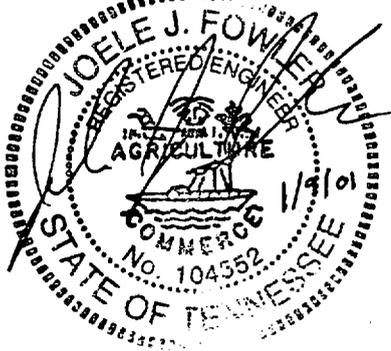
#### Preliminary Recommendations:

Under the second phase of our services, we would propose investigating a retrofit in which the roof system would engage sidewalls and stabilize the walls in the auditorium and gymnasium to prevent further crack propagation. In addition, it may be necessary to reinforce portions of the sidewalls and add expansion joints in several areas of the building to isolate and prevent movement from being transferred between different portions of the building. We recommend a meeting to discuss how our services are to proceed beyond this initial phase.

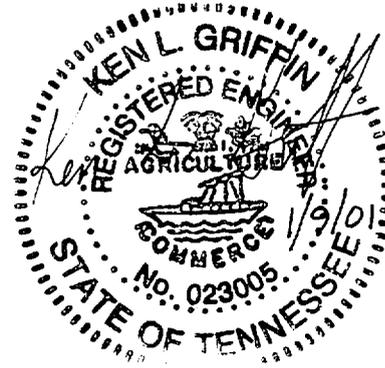
As mentioned above, we have placed several crack monitors along the common wall between the auditorium backstage and wood shop area. Due to the cyclic nature of the material expansion we would like to continue to periodically monitor the cracks until further direction is established.

**SUBJECT:** Procedure for closing county public roads

Per your request, the following is furnished with regard to the procedure for closing county public roads.

There are two methods which may be utilized. One method is found under section 14 of Chapter 265 of the 1959 Private Acts, which established the Blount County Highway Department and the office of County Road Superintendent. In my experience, this procedure has not been utilized.

There is an alternative method found under the general law at T.C.A. § 54-10-216, which is less complex than the method found in the private act. As a condition precedent to utilizing this alternative method, the county legislative body must have adopted T.C.A. § 54-10-216 as an alternative procedure by resolution approved by two-thirds (2/3) majority vote. The procedure for closing a county public road under T.C.A § 54-10-216 is as follows:

1. An application to close a designated public road must first be made in writing to the Road Superintendent.
2. The Road Superintendent must then give at least five (5) days notice to all interested parties of the time the road is to be closed. Landowners and those controlling land touched by the road are deemed interested parties.
3. The Road Superintendent then makes a recommendation to the Blount County Regional Planning Commission regarding whether or not the road should be closed.
4. Before making any recommendation with respect to closing the road, the planning commission must provide notice of such action either by written notice mailed to affected property owners or by notice advertised in a newspaper of general circulation in the county not less than fourteen (14) days before such recommendation is made.
5. After receiving the Road Superintendent's recommendation, the planning commission then makes its recommendation to the Blount County legislative body and attaches thereto the Road

Superintendent's recommendation.

6. After receiving the recommendations of the Road Superintendent and the planning commission, the county legislative body may, by resolution adopted by a majority of its members, order the closure of the public road.

**54-10-216. Closure of public roads by application to county highway department.** — Notwithstanding the provisions of this part to the contrary, a county legislative body, by resolution adopted by a two-thirds ( $\frac{2}{3}$ ) majority vote, may adopt the provisions of this section as an alternative procedure for the closing of public roads in the county which are not maintained by any other governmental entity. After adopting the provisions of this section, each application to close a designated public road in the county shall be made in writing to the chief administrative officer. Upon receiving an application to close a public road, the chief administrative officer shall give notice to interested parties as provided in this part. The chief administrative officer shall make a recommendation to the regional planning commission regarding whether or not the public road should be closed. Before making any recommendation with respect to closing a road pursuant to this section, the regional planning commission shall provide notice of such action either by written notice mailed to affected property owners or by notice advertised in a newspaper of general circulation in the county not less than fourteen (14) days before such recommendation is made. After receiving the recommendation of the chief administrative officer, the regional planning commission shall make its recommendation to the county legislative body, and shall attach the recommendation of the chief administrative officer. After receiving the recommendations as provided herein, the county legislative body may, by resolution adopted by a majority of its members, order the closure of the public road. [Acts 1995, ch. 478, § 1.]

**SUBJECT:** Procedure for closing county public roads

Reference is made to my memorandum of October 16, 2000, to Commissioner W. C. (Bob) Evans.

In the October 16, 2000, memorandum, I noted that there are two methods which may be utilized for closing county public roads. One method is found under section 14 of Chapter 265 of the 1959 Private Acts (the "private act method"). The other method is found under the general law at T.C.A. § 54-10-216 (the "alternative method") and can be used as an alternative to the private act method if the county commission has adopted T.C.A. § 54-10-216 by resolution approved by two-thirds (2/3) majority vote.

The private act method may be utilized to open, change, close or restore to the public use any and all county roads or highways, while the alternative method can only be used to close a county road.

In my October 16, 2000, memorandum, I outlined the procedure under the alternative method. I did not outline the procedure under the private act method because it does not involve action by the county commission and in my experience, has not been utilized.

Per your request, the procedure for closing a county public road under the private act method is as follows:

1. An application must be made by regular petition signed by at least one of the citizens affected thereby and filed with the Road Superintendent.
2. This petition shall:
  - (a) state the district or districts in which the road is located,
  - (b) give a complete description of the present road and the proposed changes, and
  - (c) state the names of the landowners to be affected by the proposed changes.
3. Within ten (10) days after the filing of such application or petition, the Road Superintendent

shall give notice:

- (a) in writing,
  - (b) to the person first named on the petition and the landowners affected by the proposed change,
  - (c) of the date on which the Road Superintendent will be present at the place designated as the beginning point in said petition, to act on the application, and
  - (d) which notice must be served at least five (5) days before the date for acting on the petition; however, if any landowner affected by the proposed change is a non-resident of the county, ten (10) days written notice shall be served on him, and if any land owner affected thereby is a non-resident of the state or his place of residence is unknown, publication shall be made for four (4) consecutive weeks in a newspaper published in the county of the time and place of the acting upon the petition.
4. After giving the required notice, the Road Superintendent shall:
- (a) attend at the appointed time and place, and
  - (b) act upon the application, and
  - (c) if he decides that the proposed change is for the best interest of the county, assess whatever damages there may be if any against the county, and
  - (d) report in writing his action to the County Executive, and
  - (e) file his report, the original petition and copies of all notices to land owners with the county clerk.
5. The County Executive shall:
- (a) consider the report and facts connected with the matter, and
  - (b) prepare such order or orders as he may deem for the welfare and best interest of the county.
6. Any party affected may:
- (a) within ten (10) days of the date of the entry of the decision or judgment of the County Executive, appeal such finding or judgment,
  - (b) to the circuit court,
  - (c) upon the execution of a proper appeal bond.

Upon giving the required notice as above, the said Superintendent shall attend at the appointed time and place and shall act upon the application and if he decides the proposed change is for the best interest of the County, he shall assess whatever damages there may be if any against the County and report in writing his action thereon to the Judge of the County Court and with said report shall file with the Clerk of the County Court, the original petition and copies of all notices to land owners. The Judge of the County Court shall consider the report and facts connected with the matter and prepare such order or orders as he may deem for the welfare and best interest of the County. Any party affected may within ten (10) days from the date of the entry of the decision or judgment of the Judge of the County Court, appeal such finding or judgment to the next term of the Circuit Court upon execution or proper appeal bond.

**SUBJECT:** Proposed Mutual Aid Agreement, Emergency Ambulance Service, East Tennessee Region (the "agreement")

I have reviewed the agreement with regard to form and the legal effect thereof. I do not recommend that Blount County enter into this agreement. The reasons for not entering into this agreement include the following:

1. Blount County has contracted with Rural/Metro of Tennessee, L.P., ("Rural/Metro") to (1) make emergency and non-emergency ambulance services available within the geographical boundaries of Blount County, Tennessee, (2) provide emergency and non-emergency ambulance services to indigent citizens of Blount County, Tennessee, and jail inmates and (3) provide emergency and non-emergency ambulance services to Blount County government employees and their dependants at reduced rates. This contract does not affect Rural/Metro's ability to charge all persons who have the ability to pay for ambulance services provided to them. Under this contract, Rural/Metro is an independent contractor, and the ambulance services provided are not deemed to be a function of the local government, i.e., Blount County, as contemplated by the agreement.
2. Under Blount County's contract with Rural/Metro, Blount County is not liable for claims of third parties for personal injuries, property damage and professional responsibility arising out of Rural/Metro's operation of its ambulance service. The agreement contemplates potential liability on the part of Blount County for Rural/Metro providing emergency ambulance services within other jurisdictions.
3. It is not clear why Blount County is being requested to enter into this agreement. Neither Blount County nor any governmental entity is named as a party to the agreement.
4. Blount County's contract with Rural/Metro does not prevent Rural/Metro from agreeing to provide emergency ambulance services within other jurisdictions. If Rural/Metro agrees to make emergency ambulance services available in other jurisdictions, Blount County's approval thereof is not necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in the consideration of the nonrefundable sum of \$ \_\_\_\_\_ paid by Licensee to Register for and on behalf of Blount County, Tennessee, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and other good and valuable considerations as hereinafter set forth, the parties agree as follows:

1. **License.** Register grants to Licensee the right and privilege to enter upon, use and occupy the Register's office located in the Blount County Courthouse to examine the public records located therein at times other than the normal business hours during which the office is open to the public. The license hereby granted is personal to Licensee, revocable by Register and unassignable.

2. **Key.** Upon request by Licensee and in order for Licensee to exercise the license and privileges granted hereunder, Register shall provide Licensee with a key which will unlock four (4) doors, to wit: a designated outside door to the building, a door providing access to the fourth floor of the building, the main entry door of said office and the main door to the records room of said office. While in the possession of Licensee, such key shall be personal to Licensee and shall not be shared with any other person(s) or entity(ies) or duplicated by Licensee. Licensee shall return said key to Register by 8:00 a.m. on the next business day following Licensee's use thereof.

3. **Termination.** In the event Licensee violates any of the covenants and agreements assumed hereunder by Licensee, Register, at Register's option, may terminate this agreement. Register reserves the right to terminate this agreement without cause upon ten (10) days written notice to Licensee.

4. **Indemnity.** Licensee shall exercise the license and privileges granted hereunder at Licensee's own risk. Licensee shall never claim any damages against Register and/or Blount County, Tennessee, for any injuries or damages suffered on account of Licensee's exercise of the license and privileges granted hereunder and shall at all times defend, indemnify and hold harmless Register and Blount County, Tennessee, from and against all claims, damages, obligations, actions, causes of action, costs and expenses, including attorney fees, of any nature whatsoever, whether based on tort, contract or other theory of recovery and whether for injury to person(s) and/or damage to property, which may in any manner be imposed on or incurred by Register and/or Blount County, Tennessee, on account of or in any way relating to the exercise by Licensee of the license and privileges granted hereunder.

5. **Miscellaneous.** Licensee shall record in a log book provided by Register Licensee's exercise of the license and privileges granted hereunder, duly noting the dates and times thereof.

Licensee shall record and pay for all photocopies made by Licensee utilizing Register's photocopying equipment while Licensee is exercising the license and privileges granted hereunder.

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee adopted zoning regulations in Resolution 00-06-010 **A RESOLUTION ADOPTING ZONING IN BLOUNT COUNTY PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 13-7-101, *et seq.* OF THE TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED**; and

**WHEREAS**, it is desired to amend such Resolution to recognize existing platted campground subdivisions developed into separately owned lots with lot sizes that would be adversely impacted under general setback requirements of the various zones in the Zoning Resolution, and to allow lesser setbacks where appropriate.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee, to adopt the following:

That **Article 2. EXEMPTIONS, EXCLUSIONS AND EXCEPTIONS**, BE AMENDED BY ADDITION OF A NEW section 2.7 to read as follows:

**Section 2.7. Platted Campground Lots.** Setback regulations of the various districts in this Resolution shall not apply to any campground platted into individual lots and registered with the Blount County Register of Deeds as a plat prior to the effective date of this Resolution, provided that a minimum of five (5) feet setback shall be required from side and rear lot lines, and provided that a minimum of five (5) feet setback shall be required from front property lines or twenty (20) feet from edge of paved internal street, whichever is greater.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Resolution shall be in force and become effective upon its adoption, the public welfare requiring it.

A request was made to pay an invoice from the Daily Times in the amount of \$2,650.00 for publication of early voting sample ballot. The motion was made by Bob Kidd and seconded by J.C. Franklin to approve the request. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### **Highway**

The motion was made by Steve Samples and seconded by Bob Kidd to allow a committee consisting of several representatives from the School Board and PBA to start the process of architect selection and take requests for proposals on the new Sneed High School. The School Board and PBA committee will report their findings to the Budget Committee at the February 2001 meeting. The motion was unanimously approved.

### **Eagleton Gym**

The motion was made by Steve Samples and seconded by Bob Kidd to allow the committee consisting of several representatives from the School Board and PBA to start the process of expanding the current gym or constructing a new gym at Eagleton School. The School Board and PBA committee will report their findings to the Budget Committee at the February 2001 meeting. The motion was unanimously approved.

### **Commission Room Sound System**

Steve Samples stated no report at this time.

### **FY00-01 Budget Manual**

The motion was made by J.C. Franklin and seconded by Bob Kidd to approve the FY00-01 Budget Manual as presented. The motion was unanimously approved.

### **Other Items**

A certificate of appreciation was presented to Commissioner Bob Kidd for his service on the Budget Committee.

**BLOUNT COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION  
RESCHEDULED DECEMBER MEETING  
TUESDAY, DECEMBER 19, 2000  
5:00 P.M.**

The Blount County Planning Commission met at the Courthouse on Tuesday, December 19, 2000. The meeting was rescheduled from the regular meeting date because of the holidays. Staff members present were Director John Lamb and Planner Douglas Hancock. Roger Fields, Building Commissioner, was also present.

Commissioners Present: Chairman Gene Brown, J.C. Franklin, Larry Garner, Gail Harris, Tom Hodge, Leroy Huff, Bob Kidd, Carl McDonald, Kenneth Melton, Bill Proffitt, and Darrel Tipton.

The minutes of the November 22, 2000 meeting were approved with one correction regarding a recommendation made by Commissioner Garner. The action was taken by motion from Tom Hodges and seconded by J.C. Franklin. The motion received a unanimous vote for approval.

**Long Range Planning:** Mr. Lamb opened the discussion regarding land use and zoning along Highway 411 South. He exhibited the County's proposed Growth Plan which identifies high to moderate density development. Remaining areas were designated as low to moderate density development. The Land Use Concept plan identified specific areas along highway corridors as high-density commercial. Remaining areas along the corridors were viewed as special exceptions for low to moderate commercial activities defined as a maximum of 4000 square feet under roof and a one acre site minimum.

Mr. Lamb exhibited a map showing an updated land use classification using tax map information and field inspection. He concluded that the predominance down 411 South was open land and residential uses. Commercial activity is concentrated inside the city limits. At the last meeting, staff was directed to submit two alternatives addressing amending the special exception provisions or establishing a new low to moderate density commercial zone down 411 South. The first option included an additional six thousand square feet per acre up to three acres for a special exception commercial use. This would permit residential uses to change to commercial uses as necessary. The second alternative would create a new commercial zone to encompass corridor areas that were originally zoned as Rural 1. Commissioner Garner questioned the square footage requirements which he perceived as unusually small. Mr. Lamb reiterated that these suggestions were submitted for discussion only. He noted that septic fields and parking spaces must be included in space requirements on the site.

The discussion continued with Commissioner Kidd expressing his concern that the 4000 square feet was inadequate. Commission McDonald pointed out that issues differ when sewer is not available to a site.

Commissioner Garner raised the question regarding the current designation of the US 411 South corridor as residential. He indicated that the area should have been assigned commercial status on the original zoning map. Mr. Lamb concluded that the area was suited for commercial activity and that the cap of floor area to land area might be considered inadequate. He emphasized that the R-1 Zone includes imbedded commercial activity along arterial and collector status road. Chairman Brown requested comparison figures from other counties regarding square footage for buildings and site requirements for discussion at the next meeting. Information from Gary Ferguson from the Environmental Division was mentioned as pertinent to any revisions.

**Vicinity of Singleton Station and Topside Road:** The commission requested an evaluation of the general area of Singleton Station and Topside Road. This was the result of a past request for rezoning of Ditch Witch property in the vicinity. Mr. Lamb presented a map depicting the present commercial uses that could be included in the recently rezoned area. Commissioner Garner questioned the initial zoning of the property. Mr. Lamb responded that specific areas were recognized as established uses with the understanding that expansion would be addressed as special exceptions. Commissioner Melton maintained that the zone should remain unchanged as residents are disturbed by noise and traffic from the existing commercial activity. No action was taken.

**Discussion of land use and zoning regarding Big Valley Campground:** Mr. Lamb reported on his meeting with representatives of Big Valley Campground regarding the restrictions included in the Zoning Ordinance for campground lots. The maximum square footage for a unit is 400 square feet. The group has discussed the feasibility of changing the ordinance to recognize platted campgrounds with individual ownership. Mr. Lamb will report on progress at the next meeting.

**Discussion of platting procedures and approval of electric improvements - Ft. Loudon Electric:** An invitation had been extended to representatives of Ft. Loudon Electric Cooperative to attend this meeting. As no one was present, the discussion was postponed.

**Discussion of zoning provisions for grandfathering situations - Zoning Resolution, Articles 4, 5, and 6:** Staff reported that a memo had been received from Norman Newton, attorney for the County Executive, regarding "grandfathering" criteria. Several commissioners requested adequate time to review the document. The discussion was postponed until the January meeting.

**Discussion of land use and zoning regarding commercial cabins:** A letter from Edward Stuckey was included in the mail-out regarding the rental cabin business in the Townsend area. Mr. Stuckey expressed his concerns regarding the impact of the density restrictions as outlined in the Zoning Ordinance. The discussion was postponed until the arrival of Mr. Stuckey.

**HEARINGS:**

**Request for Preliminary Plat Approval - Whitehead Estates:** This request was withdrawn by the developer.

**Request for Final Plat Approval - Chessingham Subdivision:** Chessingham Subdivision received preliminary plat approval in March of 2000. The property contains 25.9 acres off Big Springs Road. Thirty-four lots are included in the design. Utility water has been installed. A paved road has been constructed to county standards for dedication for maintenance. A letter from the project's engineer has been submitted. A letter for electric has been received. Staff recommended for approval with several stipulations. Those included a raised area in the pavement that can be corrected within the first year after approval. The Property Owners Association agreement has been reviewed and some wording will be changed. The drainage improvements must be completed including clean-up and rip-rap. A new letter from the project engineer for drainage is required. The certification process must be completed. Larry Garner moved to grant the request citing staff's recommendation. Tom Hodge seconded the motion. The motion received a unanimous vote for approval.

**Request for Final Plat Approval - Little Mountain, Phase 2:** The request for final plat approval for Phase 2 of Little Mountain Development has been withdrawn. The developers, however, submitted a variance request from the maximum allowable road grade. The request involves grades that are 15.85% for 264 linear feet of roadway and 15.87 % for 220 linear feet. Staff recommended approval of the variance request with stipulations. These included a conference with the developer and staff prior to any further construction. This would enable specific on-site road and drainage considerations to be incorporated prior to construction. Mr. Hancock also indicated the necessity of reworking all ditches and culverts before any further resurfacing, installation of underground utilities on the cut side of the mountain roadways and a requirement of six inches of pug-mix for the sections requiring a variance. He reported that the developers agreed to the conditions. Commissioner Garner questioned the status of the road surface the final stage of completion. Mr. Lamb pointed out that the requirement for developments of this type is a gravel surface. Rick Everett responded that pug-mix will be used on the areas that exceed 15% but pavement will be added in the spring. Gary Glarner who is the developer addressed the commission regarding the subsurface rock and the blasting that has been necessary for construction in Phase II. He assured the members that paving would done for the second phase but when weather conditions

allow. Larry Garner indicated the need for a definitive time should be established. He told of his visit to the property and pointed out several problems with ditching and rip rap in place. These problem areas were acknowledged in Mr. Hancock's recommendation also. Commissioner McDonald questioned bonding or acceptance of a Letter of Credit for the construction. It was noted that Letters of Credit or bonding cannot be applied for private road construction. Kenneth Melton moved to grant the variance request. Leroy Huff seconded the motion. The motion passed with the following voting "aye": (1) Brown, Franklin, Harris, Hodge, Huff, Kidd, Melton, Tipton. Those voting "no" were (1) McDonald, (2) Proffitt. Garner passed.

**Request for Preliminary and Final Plat Approval - Shor and Mour Mountain Estates:** The Shor and Mour Mountain Estates is located off Old Chilhowee Loop Road. Two lots are proposed for the 4.9 acre tract. An existing 16' feet driveway serves the property. The owners have submitted a request for a variance from the minimum 25' width requirement. A driveway exists to the property and is 16' wide. The driveway extension to Lot 1A has been platted as 25' in width. Mr. Hancock recommended for approval of the request with the condition that the use of Seymour Estate Way as access to Chilhowee Loop Road be abandoned. Commissioner McDonald questioned the necessity of establishing an easement to serve the property that requires a variance when one exists. Staff pointed out that owners use the existing driveway as access. It was pointed out that the original access is gravel surfaced and created to serve five acre tracts. The developers own a twenty-five feet strip of the fifty feet easement. With the new division, a separate easement has been proposed to serve the two tracts that are less than five acres. Derrell Tipton moved to grant preliminary and final approval to Shor and Mour Mountain Estates with access off Seymour Estates Way stipulating the abandonment as a condition for approval. Larry Garner seconded the motion. The motion passed with Huff and Melton passing upon roll call.

**Approval of Site Plan for Alcoa-Maryville Church of God:** Mr. Lamb reported that the City of Maryville has approved the extension of sewer to the site on East Lamar Alexander Parkway. He recommended for approval of the site plan. He noted that buffering was an option but not required. J.C. Franklin moved to grant approval to the site plan with a second from Tom Hodge. The motion received a unanimous vote for approval.

**Approval of Site Plan for New Hope Baptist Church:** Mr. Lamb reported on his review of the site plan for New Hope Baptist Church off Dotson Memorial Drive. Soil problems restrict the use of the property. Septic system expansion must be accommodated along with additional parking. He indicated that parking requirements could be underestimated resulting in future problems. Gary Ferguson explained that the marginal soils had to be tested by the percolation method. The conclusion was that a septic field could be installed but no duplication area was available. Upon further investigation, an error was discovered in property

lines. The percolation tests that were favorable were located on adjoining property. Mr. Ferguson explained that a septic system was in danger of failing on this site leaving the options of sewer extension or pumping. John Miller, architect, was present as representative for the project and answered parking projection questions. Leon Williams, builder, told of possibilities of acquiring adjacent property for septic field expansion. It was Mr. Lamb's opinion that parking could be addressed by postponing construction of the balcony. Because of the problems regarding the expansion of the septic system to accommodate the enlarged structure, Darrell Tipton moved to defer action on the request. Larry Garner seconded the motion which received unanimous approval.

**Discussion of Commercial Cabins in R-2 Zone:** Edward Stuckey, owner of a cabin rental business in the Townsend area, had arrived to address the commission. Mr. Stuckey addressed members regarding his concerns for the density requirements of the Zoning Ordinance. Mr. Stuckey's property is designated as R-1 with a portion in R-2. He explained that his operation could not be established with present zoning regulations. He pointed out that variances would be necessary and asked for consideration for land use density for vacation cabin rentals. It was concluded that staff will meet with Mr. Stuckey and other interested individuals for a discussion of the issue.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:45 p.m.

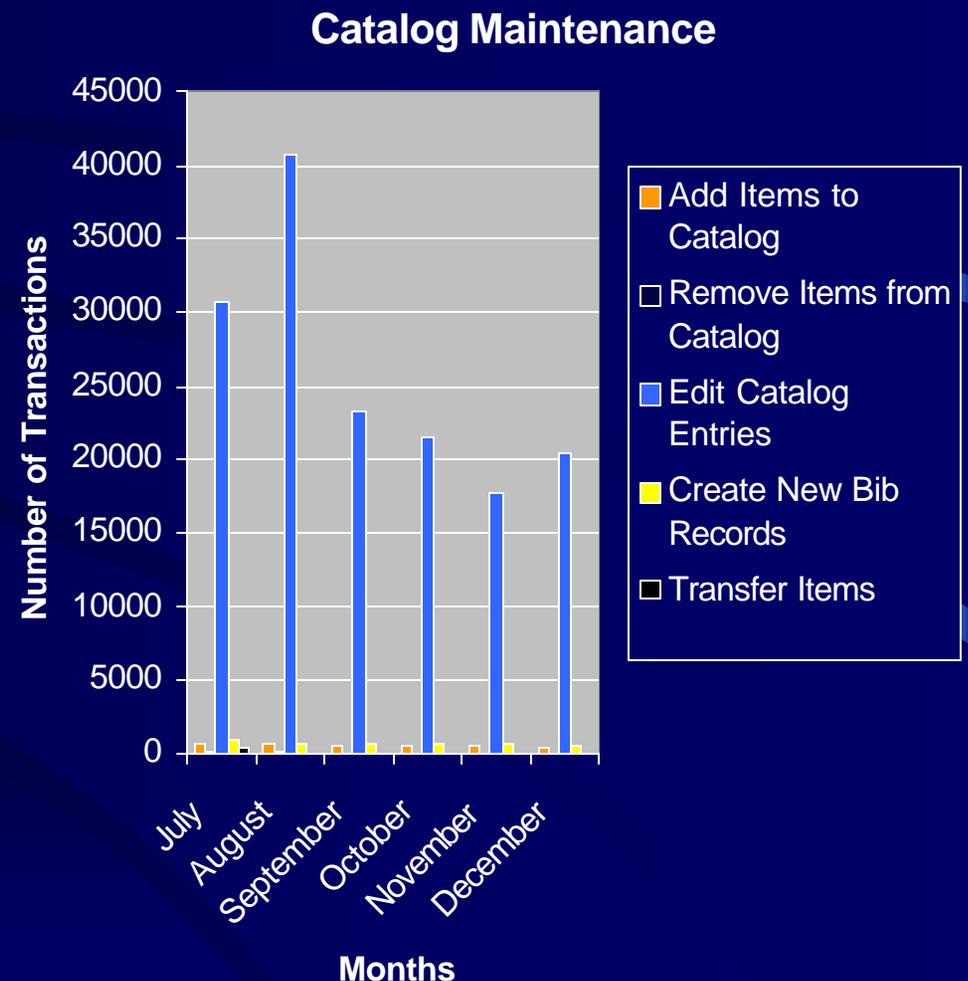


## **Blount County Public Library uses new web-based automated system to track different types of library transactions**

In March, 2000, the Blount County Public Library joined with 9 other libraries in the Fort Loudoun Region of the Tennessee State Library and Archives in establishing and using a single, central library automated system. Any transition to a new system where millions of data pieces are involved is destined for some frustrations, particularly as the new tracking system settles in. Transactions are tracked and counted differently and a shared system inherently presents new challenges. However, in this case, the libraries have increased capabilities to track and document other kinds of transactions besides those associated with checking out and checking in library materials. This report reflects those augmented capabilities.

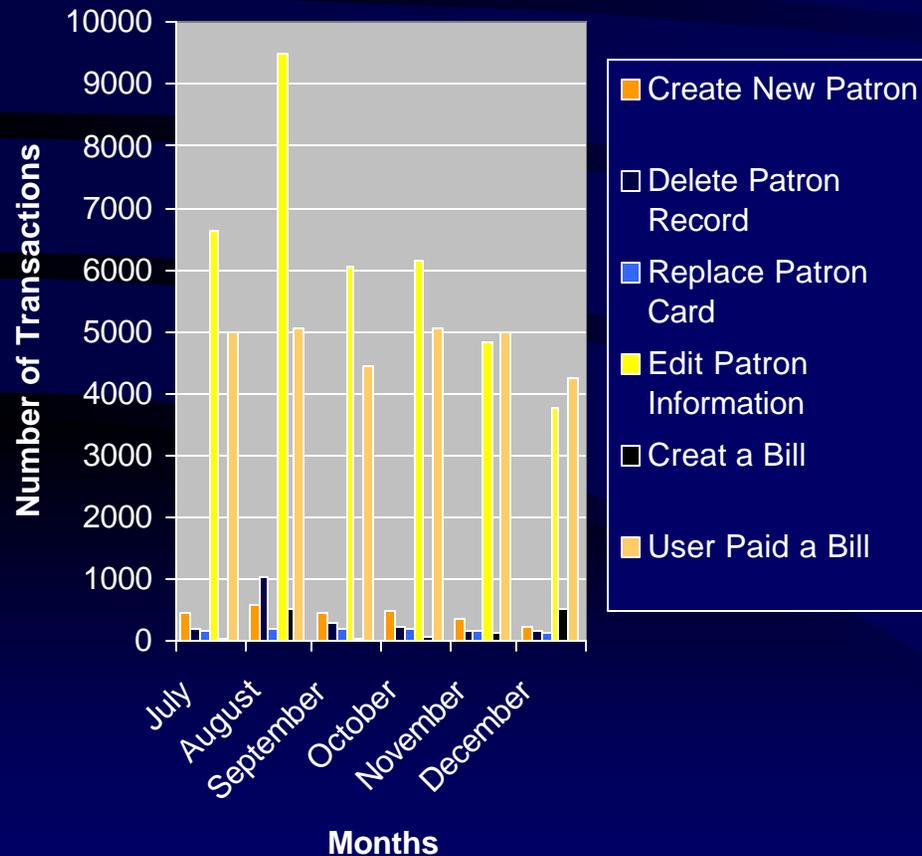
# Maintaining the Online Catalog is essential to BCPL's operation

# Up-to-date patron records protect public property

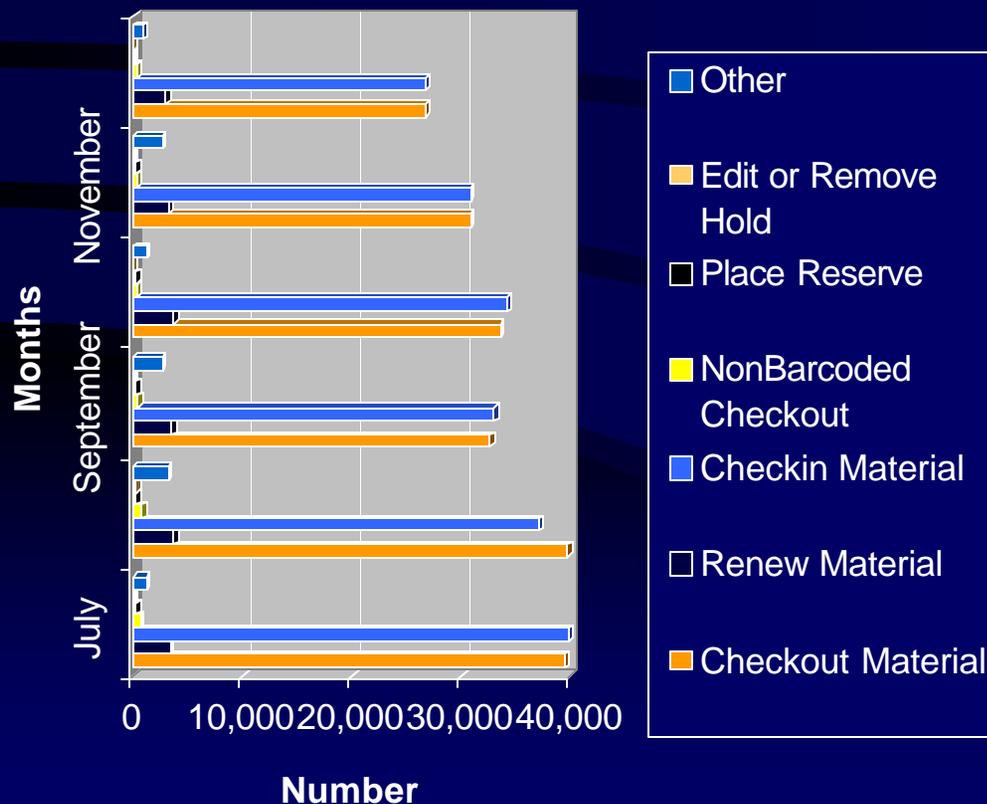
Maintenance of Patron Records



- An average of 450 new patrons are registered each month.
- Lost cards are replaced at an average rate of 175 per month.
- Nearly 225 expired cards are removed from the database each month.
- Almost 5000 fines and damage bills are paid each month.
- An average of 6000 patron records are updated each month.

# Most of the day-to-day “business” of any library relates to the circulation of materials

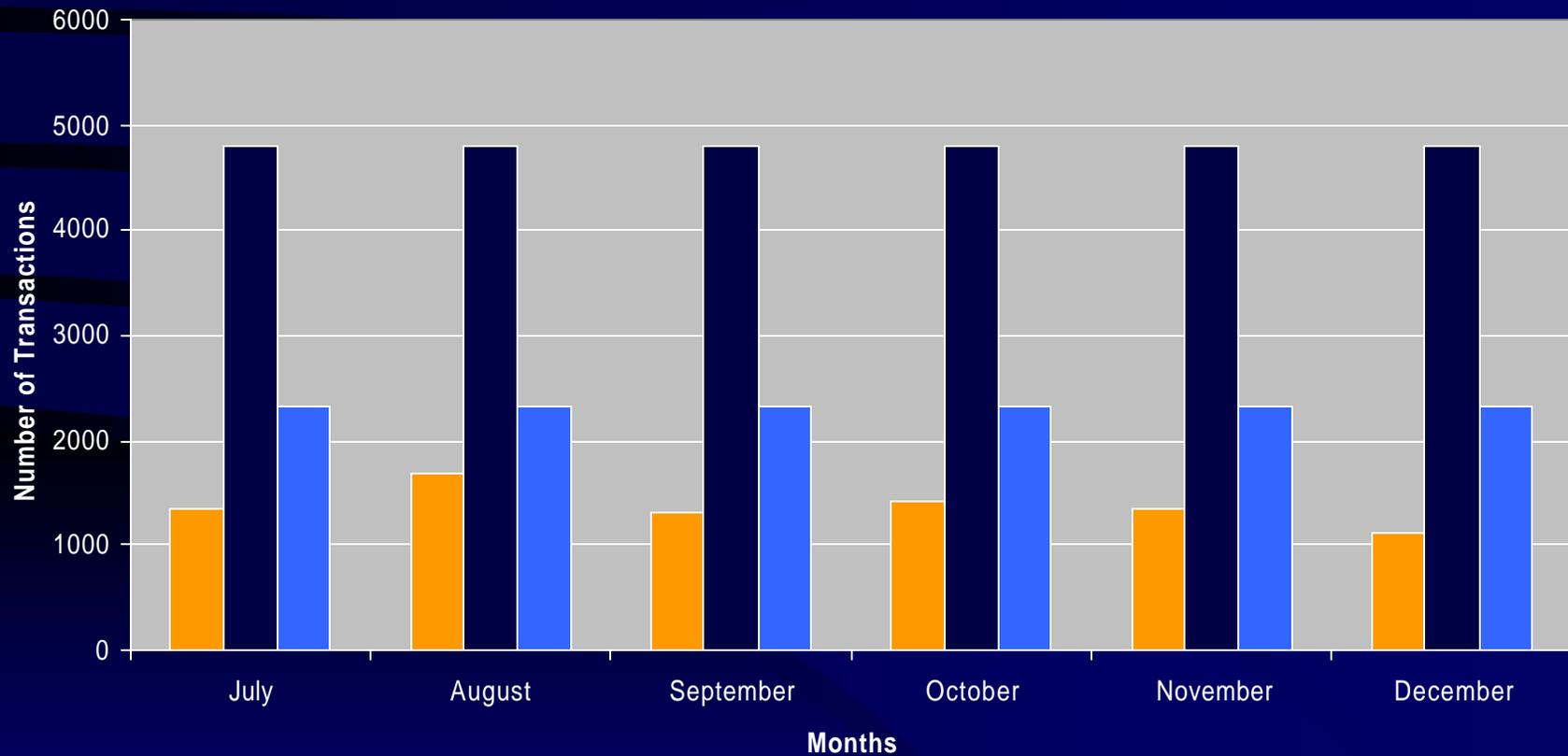
Use of Library Materials



- The checkout of library materials is the most frequently used indicator of library business; however, it is not the sole function of a library.
- Renewal of library materials can account for nearly 125 transactions per day.
- Circulation of library materials calls not only for the checking out of materials at the circ desk, but the checking in of the same materials and reshelving them, a challenge in any library.
- Reserves or holds are a favorite service used by frequent library users.

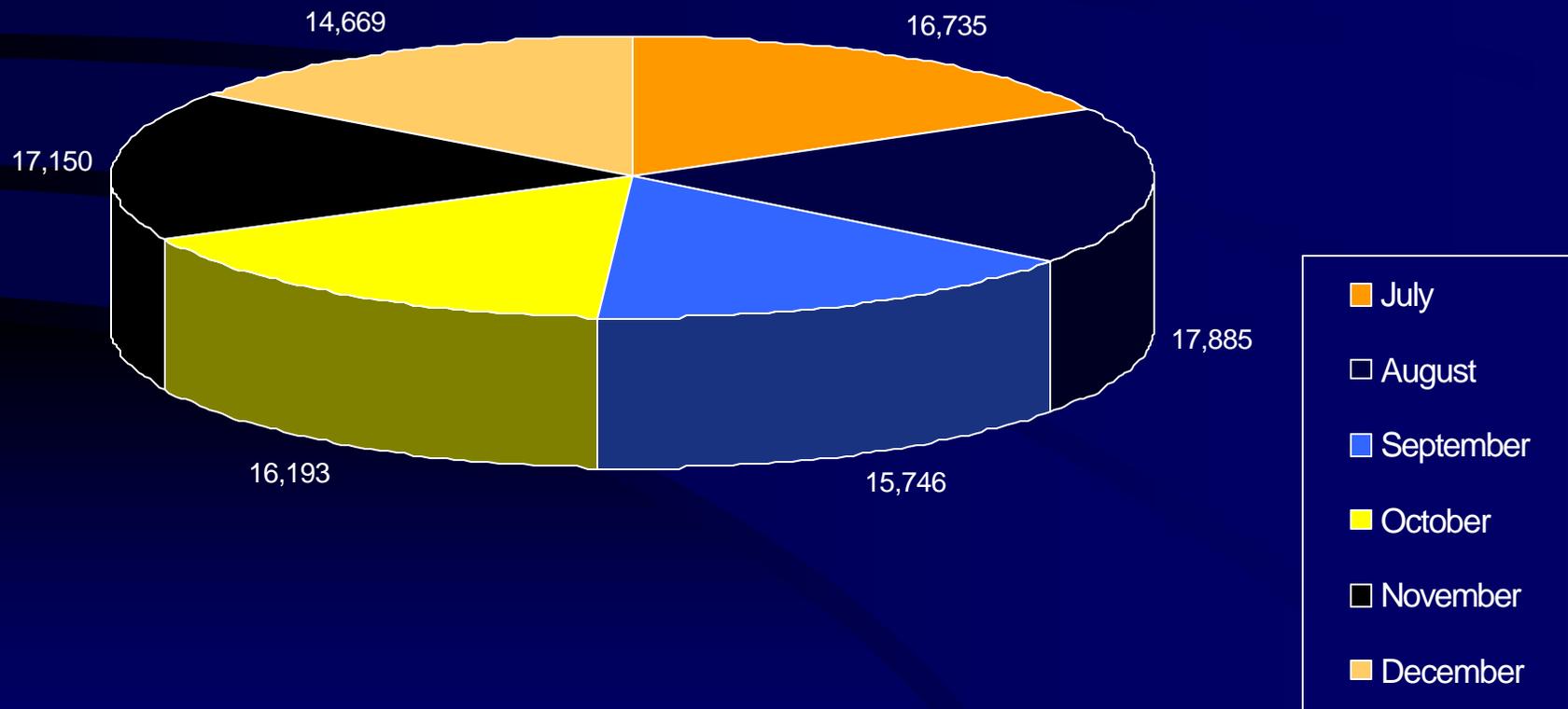
