




ATTACH COUNTY WIDE INDEX MAP SHOWING INSPECTION CYCLE AREAS BY YEAR

A. Personnel Needs: Field appraisers are assigned to areas for visual inspection and new construction measuring and listing. Each field person will inspect parcels of his assigned area per plan for visual inspection. The county will be divided into six areas for visual review. Data entry of visual inspection changes and new construction will be completed by one office clerk.

B. Office and Equipment Needs: Adequate office space and equipment are provided in the Assessor's office.

C. Training Planned and Needed for Staff: Assessor and appraisers will attend formal IAAO courses in addition to DPA workshops and other training sessions provided by the University of Tennessee, TIAAO, and the Tennessee Assessor's Association. Clerical personnel will attend courses as available and on a need basis.

D. Geographic Areas of Responsibility Assigned to Inspection Personnel: Inspection personnel will be assigned to areas and they will be responsible for the review of their area per plan. In addition, they will be responsible for all new construction and the pricing of land splits for their area.

E. Production Rates: Production rates will be the same as listed on page 4 for each area.

F. Map Maintenance Schedule and Explanations: Maps and mylars are maintained in the assessor's office in addition to computer mapping. Mapping is maintained on a daily basis. Field appraisers will correlate maps with appraisal cards to make appropriate corrections.

G. Quality Assurance Efforts Planned: Assessor and assigned staff will inspect field work on a regular basis. A minimum of 5% of the work will be reviewed.

A. Personnel Needs: Six field persons that are assigned to visual inspection, one commercial appraiser, and one reappraisal manager. Two additional clerical persons for data entry and correlation.

B. Office Space and Equipment Needs (Space for State Personnel Providing Assistance) Adequate office space will be provided for all assessor and DPA reappraisal staff. Equipment Provided: phones, desks, tables, file cabinets, computers and computer lines, and office supplies.

C. Use of Aerial Photographs: Latest photography available will be used.

D. Assistance Request of Division of Property Assessments: DPA assistance will be requested for complex properties, appraisal analysis, statistical analysis, and program management.

A. ADMINISTRATION

1. Planning/Organizing - The time an administrator spends in establishing goals, policies and procedures and organizing the work activities for a timely completion of each reappraisal phase.
2. Directing/Controlling - The time an administrator spends in guiding a supervising personnel responsible for the accomplishment of the clerical and appraisal activities necessary to complete each phase.

B. CLERICAL

1. File Cleanup - Time required in the correction of file reports such as incorrect land codes, improvement types, property types, etc.

4. Small Tracts - Time required to review the current small tract listings for accuracy and consistency, and to review the methods used to establish values and to determine any needed changes or corrections.
5. Rural Land - Time required to review the current rural land listings for accuracy and consistency, and to review the methods used to establish values and to determine any needed changes or corrections.
6. Income and Expense - Time required to review the commercial properties and to determine the methods and forms to be used in the collection of income and expense information.
7. Sales File Cleanup - Time required to review the status of the sales file using sales reports and deed inventories. The sales file should be up-to-date and listed correctly.
8. Override Properties - Time required to review the listing of properties that have an override code. Delete all override codes making any needed changes or corrections.

D. LAND VALUATION

1. Urban - Time required to analyze vacant and improved sales to determine appropriate units of comparison, to establish base lot values, front foot and square foot values as well as units buildable. Urban parcels are located on 1" - 100' or larger scaled maps.
2. Commercial/Industrial - Time required to analyze vacant and improved sales and to determine appropriate units of comparison as well as establish base front foot, square foot and acreage values.
3. Rural - Time required to analyze vacant and improved sales of 15 acres or greater and to determine a preliminary rural land schedule. Rural land listings should be changed or corrected as needed.





WHEREAS, in order for reasonable cost associated with disasters to be reimbursed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), a written, approved, and adopted Mutual Aid agreement entered into prior to disaster assistance being rendered must be in place between both the party receiving the aid and the party providing the aid; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of all parties concerned to participate in as few but as widely encompassing Mutual Aid agreements as possible, rather than dozens of single agreements; and

WHEREAS, sections 58-2-101 through 58-2-518, Civil Defense Act of 1951 and sections 52-2-601 through 58-2-609, Local Government Emergency Assistance Act of 1987, Tennessee Code Annotated, authorize public agencies in this state to enter into mutual aid agreements for services; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee law and state policy also provide for certain reimbursements or financial aid to local government for certain natural disasters or emergency conditions declared by Governor; and

WHEREAS, each of the undersigned parties finds it to be in its best interest to have such aid agreements with other local governmental bodies in the state and region.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above recitals and the covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. The undersigned parties hereby agree to provide through its Mayor, City Manager, County Executive or Designated Senior Officer such mutual aid as may be requested by a governmental unit, which has emergency conditions of a natural or other disaster as defined by Tennessee law. The aid rendered shall be to the extent of available personnel and equipment not required for minimum needs of the party providing the aid. The judgement of the Mayor, City Manager, County Executive, or Designated Senior Officer or his designee of the party providing the aid shall be final as to the personnel and equipment so available.

2. Personnel dispatched to aid another jurisdiction shall remain employees of the party providing the aid but shall work under supervision of the Mayor, City Manager, County Executive, or Designated Senior Officer of the requesting jurisdiction. The undersigned parties retain the right to withdraw any and all aid rendered upon direction of the Mayor, City Manager, County Executive, or Designated Senior Officer of the party providing aid.
3. The Mayor, City Manager, County Executive, or Designated Senior Officer of the party providing the aid will provide a list of hourly rates and equipment costs, hours worked for all such aid rendered to the requesting jurisdiction for all actual costs, and the requesting jurisdiction agrees to compensate such claim for costs incurred as expeditiously as possible.
4. The undersigned parties will maintain workers compensation coverage for its employees and liability coverage for its vehicles and equipment. Any uninsured or extraordinary expenses may be a part of claimed costs for reimbursement. The requesting jurisdiction agrees to maintain adequate liability insurance ¹, under state law and to hold harmless and indemnify the responding party ², for any and all claims occurring while its personnel and equipment are working under the direction of the requesting jurisdiction. These indemnities shall include attorney's fees and costs that may arise from providing aid pursuant to this agreement.
5. The purpose of these recitals is to insure that the responding undersigned party is reimbursed all costs and assumes no additional liabilities as a result of this agreement. No party to this agreement shall be liable for failure or refusal to render aid pursuant to this agreement. The Mayor, City Manager, County Executive, or Designated Senior Officer shall in his or her sole discretion determine the manner which such emergency aid may be used.
6. This mutual aid agreement may be terminated by any party upon thirty (30) days written notice to the East Tennessee Development District, as the keeper of the master file, specifying the date of termination.

SUBJECT: Mutual Aid Agreement Regarding Disaster Assistance

Per your request, I have reviewed the form of the general mutual aid agreement prepared by the East Tennessee Development District Board of Directors for use by local governments and other agencies when receiving and providing disaster assistance and offer the following comments thereon.

1. Paragraph 4 of the agreement requires the requesting jurisdiction to maintain adequate liability insurance under state law. Blount County has a program of self-insurance and excess public liability insurance, which is in accordance with state law. Accordingly, I recommend that a footnote ("1") be placed after the wording "liability insurance," and corresponding footnote 1 be added at the bottom of the page as follows:

¹ and/or self insurance

2 Paragraph 4 requires the requesting jurisdiction to hold harmless and indemnify the responding party. The Tennessee Attorney General has issued a formal opinion (No. 93-01, dated January 4, 1993) that a contract provision which requires a local governmental entity to indemnify or hold harmless another governmental entity or private party beyond the liability imposed upon the governmental entity by law is void and unenforceable. Accordingly, I recommend that a footnote ("2") be added after the wording "responding party," and corresponding footnote 2 be added at the bottom of the page as follows:

A RESOLUTION TO URGE THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO PRESERVE THE PRACTICE OF SHARING CERTAIN STATE REVENUES WITH LOCAL GOVERNMENTS.

WHEREAS, county governments in Tennessee are fundamental political subdivisions of our state and are the primary providers of numerous essential government services including, but not limited to, public K-12 education, jails and law enforcement, road building and maintenance, election administration and voter registration, property assessment, solid waste disposal, record keeping and administration for the various state courts, and the many services provided by the offices of County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register of Deeds, Property Assessor, Elections Administrator, Trustee, Sheriff, and Highway Superintendent; and

WHEREAS, county governments are limited by state law regarding the forms of taxation and revenue generation which they are authorized to use and have been unable to convince the General Assembly to expand this legislative authorization, leaving many counties overly dependant on the property tax as a primary source of revenue; and

WHEREAS, counties are also suffering, together with the state, from decreased growth in sales tax revenue or even diminishing revenue collections from this revenue source; and

WHEREAS, many counties in the State of Tennessee have been struggling to find sufficient revenue sources in order to meet the growing demands of their citizens for services which are vital to the health, welfare, and safety of the people of this state, to provide improvements to infrastructure required by population and economic growth, and to meet constitutional responsibilities and state legislative mandates such as those required by the Basic Education Program; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Constitution, in Article II, Section 24, provides that "no law of general application shall impose increased expenditure requirements on cities or counties unless the General Assembly shall provide that the state share in the cost;" and

WHEREAS, although significant State funds have been provided for local roads and streets and for public education, the percentage of funding provided by the State to local governments to fund essential services has continued to diminish even as new legislative mandates for spending have been imposed on cities and counties without a corresponding increase in state-shared funding; and

WHEREAS, any reduction in state-shared revenues to local governments will likely result in either a reduction of services to citizens, an increase in property tax rates in order to maintain current levels of services, or both.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee, meeting in regular session on this 15th day of November, 2001, that the Tennessee General Assembly is strongly urged to preserve the existing system of sharing certain portions of state tax revenues with county and municipal governments in order to fulfill the State's constitutional and moral responsibility to share in funding the essential services provided by city and county governments of Tennessee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk shall mail certified copies of this resolution to the members of the Tennessee General Assembly representing the people of Blount County.



It is hereby AGREED between the Parties as follows:


1. Henry E. Beal and wife, Delphine, shall convey the above described property to Blount County, Tennessee for use in perpetuity as a park.

A) BOUNDARY ALONG MIDWAY S/D
According to recorded plat in map file 324B the fence was held as the boundary with a 20' foot strip between the boundary of BEAL and the platted lots of subdivision. The fence on the north side of TOPSIDE road (part of original 1930 deed of BEAL) does not line up with the fence on the south side of TOPSIDE road. (deed calls for a straight line). The 20' strip may have been placed to avoid any problems with the deeds.

B) BOUNDARY OF THOR
The Thor deed calls for and iron pin in the ditch. this was not found. It also calls for and iron pin at or near the center of the powerline easement. this was not found.

C) BEND IN BOUNDARY
There is a bend in the boundary at this area. The 1930 deed of BEAL calls for a black oak tree. A survey in 1941 for "LAND ACQUISITION FOR FORT LOUDOUN RESERVOIR" shows a black oak stump. We found two stump holes one 10' north of the fence bend and the other 13' south of the fence bend. Based on the deed distance we were not able to determine which one if either was the original black oak. The evidence seem to point to the one on the south. Thor deed calls for a iron pin at this corner none was found.

D) THE SOUTH WEST CORNER
The 1930 deed calls for a stone at this point. The 1941 did not show a stone as being found. We did not find a stone. There is a fence intersection with old fence running east and west and north. The deed of Thor called for and iron pin which was not found.

E) BOUNDARY WITH LOT 22R
The north east corner of lot 22R is in the fence and the north east corner is about 2 feet south of the fence.

F) BOUNDARY OF HOUSER
The deed for Houser calls for the fence of Beal as the boundary line.

G) SOUTH EAST CORNER
The 1930 deed calls for a stone at this corner and the 1941 survey also calls for a stone being found. A survey in 1989 by Blount Surveys shows on their plat that they found a stone and placed a iron pin next to it. Using data from Blount Surveys we were not able to recover this stone and set a pin in the position that was called for by Blount Survey.

H) BOUNDARY OF GEORGE
The fence was held as the boundary and iron pins were set within the fence by Blount Surveys in their survey of the George property.

I) BOUNDARY OF MATTERN
The south line of Mattern calls for the 820 contour and corners were set at this line.

SUMMARY
Because of destroyed or missing original corners the fence was used to compute area. This fence shows long term possession. A agreement may be needed along these lines.



SUBJECT: Planning matters.

***At the October 11 special called meeting, the Planning Commission took the following two actions in recommendation to the County Commission:*

1. Avenues for conditional zoning in the county.

Norman Newton wrote the following, as excerpted from a September 18 memo to staff:

In the 2000 General Assembly, Senate Bill 3336, which would have allowed conditional zoning by Blount County and the municipalities in Blount County exercising zoning authority, was introduced. However, this bill was never voted out of committee and did not become law.

The 2001 General Assembly passed Public Chapter No. 409, which was signed by the governor on June 19, 2001; copy attached (see below). This legislation authorizes conditional zoning by the municipalities in Blount County exercising zoning authority. It does not apply to county zoning.

The following is the text of Public Chapter 409:

CHAPTER NO. 409
HOUSE BILL NO. 1987
By Representatives Overbey, McCord
Substituted for: Senate Bill No. 1978
By Senator Clabough

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 13-7-201, relative to municipal zoning in any county having a population of not less than eighty-five thousand eight hundred (85,800) nor greater than eighty-six thousand one hundred (86,100) according to the 1990 federal census or any subsequent federal census.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 13-7-201, is amended by adding the following language as a new, appropriately designated subsection:

(c) In any county having a population of not less than eighty-five thousand eight hundred (85,800) nor greater than eighty-six thousand one hundred (86,100) according to the 1990 federal census or any subsequent federal census, any municipality may, by ordinance or amendment adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of its legislative body, rezone properties conditionally or based upon contract, where the agreed conditions are designed to ameliorate injuries created by the rezoning to surrounding property interests or to municipal interests.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.

With unanimous vote, the Planning Commission recommended that the County petition the State Legislators to introduce a bill to allow the County to approve conditional zonings in similar fashion to the cities, and that the County Commission be asked to request the same.

2. Participation in the regulation review process under NEMO.

This item was discussed at the last Intergovernmental Committee meeting in October. The Planning Commission also discussed this item. The consensus of the Planning Commission was to avail ourselves of the regulation review process along with the two cities. The Commission voted unanimously to recommend that the county participate in the regulation review process under the NEMO project.


***At the October 25 regular meeting, the Planning Commission took the following action in recommendation to the County Commission:*

3. Rezoning request of Pete Dolan at 3201 E. Lamar Alexander Parkway, being Tax Map 59 Parcel 87, from S-Suburbanizing to C-Commercial.

Background: Mr. Dolan has a contract to purchase the property at 3201 E. Lamar Alexander Parkway. He intends to place a cabinet making shop on the property. To facilitate the conversion of the property to commercial use, He is requesting change from S-Suburbanizing to C-Commercial zoning.

Analysis: See map of property location below. The property has direct access onto Lamar Alexander Parkway, a major arterial road. Access is clear from both directions, with a fifth turn lane in the middle of four travel lanes.

The lot has approximate dimensions of 130 feet width, and 350 feet depth, with irregular shape at a slight angle to the road. The area of the parcel is around one acre. There is an existing house on the lot, on septic field. The septic capability of the land was not evaluated for commercial use for this analysis.



Map. Location of Dolan Rezoning Request.

The surrounding uses are a mix of commercial and residential along Lamar Alexander Parkway. To the rear of the lot is residential use accessed off of Gateway Road. To the immediate west is a barn as part of a larger residential use parcel. To the immediate east is a residential use lot. One lot over to the east is a commercial use (Mountain View Mini Storage) zoned commercial along with two

other parcels zoned commercial. There are two commercial zoned areas to the west and east along the opposite side of Lamar Alexander Parkway and within sight of the lot.

The land use plan shows Lamar Alexander Parkway as a commercial corridor. The lot is within the Urban Growth Boundary of the City of Maryville, with designation for high density or intensity of use.

The factors of orientation to a major arterial road, surrounding mixed use, nearby commercial zoning, commercial designation in the land use plan, and designation in the 1101 Growth Plan for high density or intensity of use would be consistent with rezoning the property to C-Commercial.

Since the lot is within the Maryville Planning Region, this request will need to be forwarded at a later date to the Maryville Regional Planning Commission for their review and recommendation prior to final action by the County Commission.

Recommendation: Staff recommended for approval of the request to rezone to C-Commercial. The Planning Commission recommended unanimously for approval of the request to rezone from Suburbanizing to C-Commercial.

***Planning staff requests further consideration of the following:*

4. Sites and venues for citizen input in the Water Quality Planning Process.

This item was discussed in the last Intergovernmental Committee meeting in October. If any Commissioner wishes to add sites, they can inform staff at the meeting or call 273-5750. Twenty-one sites have been identified so far. The Commission may also want to discuss possibilities for including targeted interest groups such as the Home Builders Association, the Association of Realtors, and environmental groups such as the Foothills Land Conservancy and the Little River Watershed Association.

5. Forming of a Citizen Advisory Committee for Water Quality Planning and Phase II Storm Water Program.

This item was discussed at the last Intergovernmental Committee meeting. The following has been discussed by staff and Bill Dunlap, and is presented to the Commission for further consideration.

ALTERNATIVES for forming a Citizen Advisory Committee to assist in Water Quality Planning and Phase II Storm Water Program.

Alternative 1 - formation of a citizen committee of 10 to 15 persons by means of application and selection. Application would be printed in the newspaper, and selection would be from a list of applicants. Applications would also be available in the Courthouse.

Alternative 2 - formation of a committee of 10 to 15 persons by means of targeted application and selection. The committee membership would be divided between general citizenry for general application and selection process (as with alternative 1 above), with addition of an application and selection process targeted to professionals with expertise in design for water quality (such as engineers, architects, and surveyors).

Alternative 3 - formation of a citizen committee as under alternative 1 above, and formation of a separate technical advisory committee (no more than 10 members) to be composed mainly of county representatives (e.g., Highway, Planning, Environmental) and professional members (e.g., surveyors, engineers, architects, homebuilders).

Selection of the citizen members could be from a county-wide pool of applicants, or applicants could be divided to the Commission District level. With district level orientation, for example, a 10 member committee could be selected with one citizen from each district under alternative 1, similar to the committee formed in 1998 for the policies planning process. Under alternative 2, a district level orientation could select 10 members by district, and up to 5 members by targeted selection. Under alternative 3, the membership of the technical committee could be accomplished with or without applications.

Selection of a committee should be accomplished no later than mid-January 2002.

The charge of the committee(s) would be the following:

1. Advise on delineation of Urbanized area for application under the Phase II Storm Water Program.
2. Advise on selection of best management practices to be included in the county permit application under the Phase II Storm Water Program.

3. Attend some of the citizen input workshops (say a minimum of five) to gain first hand knowledge of general citizen input.
4. Advise on policies and implementation strategies to be included in the Water Quality Plan of the county.

It would be expected that the committee as a whole would meet once or twice a month for a period of nine months to one year. The Water Quality Plan should be targeted for completion by the end of 2002. The Phase II Storm Water permit application will be due to the state in early 2003.

***The following is for the information of the County Commission.*

6. Status of the IPSI project.

The group of experts in TVA working on photo interpretation for the Integrated Pollutant Source Identification (IPSI) project was temporarily pulled off of the project to apply their skills to a priority Department of Defense activity. Consequently, the delivery date for the final IPSI product has been delayed by about one month - to approximately the end of January 2002.

7. Nickle Point community trail - status of planning process.

Several months back, the Commission gave a go-ahead to pursue a planning process in the Nickle Point Community for a community trail. That process has come to a close with the community indicating that they do not support a community trail at this time. The following is the body of a letter from Susan Kerr, the leader of a design meeting in the community, concerning this matter.

A citizen planning meeting was held Tuesday night, September 18, 2001 at the Chilhowee View Community Club to assess community interest in pedestrian and bike trails. After nearly 2 hours of discussion, the consensus of the approximately 12 citizens who attended was as follows:

- The Chilhowee View Community would very much like to be connected via **off-road greenway trail** to the Maryville/Alcoa greenway system. They would support the County's efforts to produce a plan of the most likely route for that greenway, and for other trails that would link Blount County communities to that system. This greenway connection that they desire is envisioned as more of a true greenway, unconnected from the roads, that might take advantage of flood plain areas and utility right of ways.
- The Chilhowee View community as represented by the individuals at the meeting are not interested at this time in a local community sidewalk/trail system that would take any property in front of homes along road right-of-way. Some consideration was given to the idea of a slight road widening (2'-4') that would provide a striped lane for cyclists, but it was felt that a sidewalk would take too much of people's front yards.
