

Action Plan for Security and Life Safety Enhancement of Courthouse

I. Goal

To provide a safe and secure work environment for the employees of Blount County Government elected officials, and citizens, while recognizing that the Blount County Courthouse is a public building that needs to be reasonably accessible to the general public.

II. Approach

In order to remain sensitive to the needs and perceptions of the citizens, the enhancement project shall be completed in phases and the access control system shall be flexible. A proximity card reader based access control system is the best type of system for this application. When used in conjunction with proper signage a card access system will protect the employees of Blount County and the Elected Officials while providing easier access to the Courthouse.



Before I begin I'd like to thank Joe Everett for all of his hard work, compassion and help. I hope your fellow commissioners possess your ethics and heart.

My name is Lisa Brosenne. I have with me a petition signed by others sharing my concerns and feelings on the following issues. I also have a plat map showing how our lands connect.

Let me emphasize, this is not an attack on the responsible and respectful hunter. But not all hunters fall in that category, thus the plight of my neighborhood. But this problem stretches statewide.

Each year dangerous and disrespectful hunters and trappers terrorize our neighborhood and others. People who are aware they are trespassing but blatantly and abusively continue to do so.

I grew up in a very rural area I know this behavior is not acceptable. The law-abiding citizens of Blount Co. have the right to live peacefully and safely in the rural environment we call home, along with our children, pets, livestock and the wildlife we so cherish.

I personally have had my life threatened and have been vulgarly cursed. Families are forced to whisk children indoors as bullets crack into our yards, fields and woods. Sleep is interrupted by baying hunting dogs, all hours of the night, only to look out to see flashlights so close to our homes, you can hear the holders of them talking. Pets have been shot or scatter in fear, property vandalized, litter is strewn about. And the wildlife we cherish and are happy to have live on our properties is killed or maimed.

I watched in horror, helpless, as 4 hunters allowed 4 dogs to maul and tear at a raccoon. As if this weren't horrific enough the raccoon was then used as target practice before the life of the animal was taken. Then, in the hunters' repulsive way, the mutilated animal was held up and I was asked, "Here lady do you want some of this." All this occurred as I was standing in the creek 10 to 15 feet away yelling to these so-called sportsmen that they were trespassing and to leave and leave the raccoon alone.

My neighborhood is outraged that with the purchase of a permit that this behavior is allowed to continue. We have had enough; we want the terrorism stopped, NOW!

Posting of signs is futile. Besides, hunters like these know how to get around them. Signs are shot up, torn down or disappear altogether. This of course gives the hunter his alibi, that the land was not properly posted, an excuse as old as these mountains.

My neighbors and I agree, the following resolutions will both help and protect the landowners, hunters and the state and local law enforcement.

1. Mandatory written permission to hunt.

Hunters must obtain and carry written permission from a landowner to hunt. Easily verified by officials this will help put an end to the excuse of not seeing signs. Trapping is mandatory written permission, why not hunting?

2. Landowner responsibility.

A landowner who gives written permission to a hunter has a responsibility to make sure the hunter knows land boundaries and observes them. There is no excuse for trespassing onto neighboring land. If a hunter trespasses or violates other landowners in any way the landowner granting hunting permission to the hunter should be held just as responsible as the hunter.

3. Owner-control of hunting dogs

The excuse that a hunter is retrieving his dog is also as old as these mountains. Everyone else is responsible for keeping control of their pets or they pay the consequences.

4. State and local law enforcement Right to Prosecute

This would allow law enforcement officials to prosecute without the landowner having to be present. There are 3 main reasons this is wanted.

A) Some people are physically not up to court (i.e. age, health)

B) Financial burden. Neither missing work nor finding funds to prosecute violators is an option for most people, especially in these hard economic times.


C) The top reason is Fear of Retaliation. There are many stories to back this fear. People know all too well what can happen to themselves, livestock and properties, if an angry illegal hunter wants revenge.

5. Blount Co. Sheriff's department needs to have a unit that is specifically prepared to go out in the woods, fields, etc, especially for the evening shift.

Above all things I know this county loves revenue. Just think of the monies brought in when violators are more quickly and easily prosecuted and fined.


Commissioners, human and animal lives are at stake. Please act swiftly to resolve this ongoing problem.

Tennessee Code/TITLE 70 WILDLIFE RESOURCES/CHAPTER 4 MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS/PART 1 HUNTING AND FISHING/70-4-106. Permission of owner of land to take wildlife or big game required - Penalty for violations.

70-4-106. Permission of owner of land to take wildlife or big game required - Penalty for violations.

(a) (1) It is unlawful for any person to hunt, take, chase, trap or kill any wild animal, wild bird, wild fowl or fish, upon the land of another without having first obtained the permission or approval of the owners of the land, or of the person or persons in charge of the land and having authority from the owner to give such permission.

(2) A violation of this subsection is a Class C misdemeanor. Upon conviction for any violation of this subsection, the court may revoke the license of the person so convicted. Any license so revoked shall be surrendered to the court and transmitted to the arresting officer, to be made a part of the prosecution record.

(b) (1) (A) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a), it is unlawful for any person to hunt, take, chase, trap or kill any game as defined in § 70-1-101 upon lands posted with signs approved by the wildlife resources agency bearing the language "Hunting By Written Permission Only" and bearing the name of the landowner or the person in possession or control of such lands, without having first obtained the written permission of or being accompanied by the landowner or the person in possession or control of such lands and having authority from the owner to give such permission. Every person who hunts, takes, chases, traps or kills any game on such lands shall have such written permission in immediate possession at all times and shall display the same upon demand of an officer of the wildlife resources agency, sheriff or other peace officer charged with the enforcement of the laws of this state. Written permission shall not be required of the landowner, the landowner's dependents, the person in possession or control of such lands, or the dependents of the person in possession or control of such lands.

(B) The signs posted pursuant to this subsection must be posted by either of the following methods:

(i) The signs must be visible at all major points of ingress and at one hundred yard (100 yd.) intervals on the perimeter of the lands being posted; or

(ii) The signs must be visible at all major points of ingress and at two hundred fifty yard (250 yd.) intervals on the perimeter of the lands being posted accompanied by fluorescent visual markings. Such fluorescent visual markings must be at least one inch (1") wide and four (4") inches long and shall be at fifty-yard (50 yd.) intervals including the two hundred fifty yard (250 yd.) interval where signs are placed. The division of forestry, in cooperation with the department of agriculture and the wildlife resources agency, shall determine a unique universal paint color or colors to be used for these property boundary markings.

(C) Any person who posts signs pursuant to this subsection without authorization from the landowner is subject to the penalties imposed by subdivision (b)(2).

(2) (A) A violation of this subsection is a Class C misdemeanor. Upon conviction for any violation of this subsection, the court may revoke the license of the person convicted. Any license so revoked shall be surrendered to the court.

(B) The provisions of this subsection are enforceable and may be prosecuted by all officers of the wildlife resources agency, sheriffs and other peace officers charged with the enforcement of the laws of this state.

(C) An affidavit from the landowner or the person in possession or control of such lands stating that the property on which the violation occurred was properly posted in accordance with the provisions of this section shall create an inference that such lands were properly posted.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CONTINUOUS FIVE (5) YEAR REAPPRAISAL CYCLE.

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated Section 67-5-1601 establishes a general six (6) year reappraisal for updating and equalizing property values for every county in Tennessee for property tax purposes; and

WHEREAS, a six (6) year reappraisal program consists of an on-site review of each parcel of real property over a five-year period followed by revaluation of all such property in the year following completion of the review period and includes a current value updating during the third year of the review cycle and sales ratio studies during the second and fifth years of the review cycle; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 318 of the 1997 Public Acts provides upon the approval of the assessor and upon the adoption by majority approval vote of the county legislative body, the reappraisal program may be completed by a continuous five (5) year cycle comprised of an onsite review of each real property over a four (4) year period followed by revaluation of all such property in the year following completion of the review period; and

WHEREAS, the county legislative body of Blount County understands that by approving such a five (5) year reappraisal cycle a sales ratio study will be conducted during the second and fourth years of the review cycle and the centrally assessed properties and commercial/industrial tangible personal property will be equalized by the sales ratio adopted by the State Board of Equalization.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE OF BLOUNT COUNTY, TENNESSEE, meeting in regular session on this the 18th day of December, 2003, that:

PURSUANT to Tennessee Code Annotated Section 67-5-1601, as amended by Chapter 318 of the 1997 Public Acts, reappraisal shall be accomplished in Blount County by a continuous five (5) year cycle beginning July 2001, comprised of an on-site review of each parcel of real property over a four (4) year period followed by revaluation of all such property for tax year 2006.

Enclosed please find a summary, which provides a portion of the requested Blount County Five-Year Reappraisal Plan *and* outlines sections of the current Six-Year Reappraisal Plan. This requested modification will enable Blount County to facilitate the transition to a Four-Year Reappraisal Cycle beginning in 2006 and is based upon the following rationale and contingencies:

1. Funding is lacking at the local assessor's office to add the personnel required in the areas of field operations and data processing support.
2. The Division of Property Assessments is limited in regard to their ability to provide essential personnel in the areas of field operations and technical assistance to complete reappraisal before the 2006 year.
3. It was agreed upon in discussions at earlier Budget Committee and Full Commission meetings that the local assessor's office will be augmented with the supplementary personnel required (1 field appraiser and 1 data processing clerk) over the next two budget years to implement such a plan.

Thank you for your time and attention in this matter of vital importance to Blount County. I look forward to addressing any questions you may have in regard to this request.

Reappraisal
Five and Six Year Cycles
Information Summary and Comparison

1. The goal of the property assessor is to reflect fairness and equalization.
(TCA 67-1-502; TCA 67-1-506)
2. Equitable assessments assure property owners that they are paying *only* their fair share of the costs required to operate schools and libraries, to provide police and fire protection, to construct and maintain roads, and to provide basic public services such as water and sanitation.
3. A high-growth county requires a shorter reappraisal cycle in order to distribute the burden of tax responsibility more equitably.
4. The property assessor does not set the tax rate or collect taxes. Rather, the role of property assessor is to establish market value for taxable properties and to adjust these values per the reappraisal cycle designated by the County Commission.
(TCA 67-5-1601)
5. The law requires a certified rate to be established whenever market values are adjusted. The certified rate protects the property assessor from being held responsible for increasing taxes and it balances the amount of funds received by the county and municipality from the previous year. (TCA 67-5-1701)
6. Only the governing body in the county or municipality can establish a levy in excess of the certified rate. (TCA 67-5-1702)
7. **Definition of Reappraisal:** Each property and area of the county is appraised individually and the values that are established must reflect an appraisal as close to 100% of market value as possible. A high-growth county will reflect values below market values each year thereafter until the next scheduled reappraisal.
8. **Definition of Current Value Update (CVU):** A six-year reappraisal cycle requires a statistical analysis review in the third year to compare sales prices to appraisals. If the overall value of appraisals has fallen to less than 90% of fair market value, all real property values will be up-dated. All property owners receive the same percentage of increase regardless of their individual growth.
(TCA 67-5-1601)
9. During a six-year reappraisal cycle the share of the tax burden is greater for properties with smaller valuations versus those properties with larger values and appraisal adjustment on an individual basis takes longer to obtain equalization. Further, although a six-year reappraisal cycle in tandem with a required current value up-date fulfills the requirements for the county's overall level of increase, it does not necessarily achieve fairness and equalization.

10. Traditionally, the cumulative growth in Blount County over six years has been **32-35%**. However, the rate of growth varies among the different areas in the county.
11. **Definition of Sales Ratio**: State law mandates that the personal property and public utility assessments be equalized by the appraisal ratio adopted by the state board in relationship to the real property sales analyzed.

Historically, a sales ratio year for Blount County is a loss of property tax revenue of \$400-\$500K for that tax year.



Any increase in funding over Blount County's initial appropriation for any fiscal year that is required as a result of this Agreement shall be shared by the parties as follows:

9. **AMENDMENTS.** This Agreement may be altered or amended at any time by the unanimous agreement of all parties hereto, which amendment will not become effective until reduced to writing and executed by all of the parties hereto.

RESOLUTION FOR FUNDING TO REDUCE THE FATALITIES ON SECONDARY ROUTES, TO REMOVE SCHOOL BUS HAZARDS, AND TO RELIEVE OVERCROWDED TRAFFIC ARTERIES IN BLOUNT COUNTY

WHEREAS, the national Highway Safety Administration reports that 84% of the traffic fatalities in Tennessee have occurred on secondary (undivided) highways; and,

WHEREAS, the Blount County Commission and the Blount county Highway department have learned from a study performed by Wilbur Smith & Associates of traffic needs in Blount County and summarized in their "Road Needs Study of 2000" that the study's PRIORITY ONE improvements would cost \$23.8 million to correct the deficiencies on 16 Blount County primary and secondary roads and including state routes Old Glory Road (SR) and Montvale Road (SR) and Federal route Sevierville Road (US 411) which need to be widened and otherwise improved for passing vehicles' safety; and,

WHEREAS, the Blount county Commission directed the Blount county Highway Department to survey local school bus drivers for their route safety concerns and identified 56 hazardous conditions which were estimated to cost \$47 million to correct; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee used \$63 million of TDOT revenue for county and state roads to balance its Tenn Care budget deficiencies and projects an additional 5% reduction in the TDOT budget for the 2004-2005 budget year; and,

WHEREAS, Blount Countians paid approximately \$19 million in state and federal motor fuel taxes in FY 2002/03; and,

WHEREAS, Blount County Highway Department revenue from all sources budgeted for FY 2002/03 is \$300,000 less than the actual revenue for FY 2002/03 and has never exceeded \$5.8 million; and,

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Department of Transportation has been successful in securing increased shared revenue from the Federal Highway Administration from 70% to 92% of the fuel tax paid by Tennessee fuel buyers; and,

WHEREAS, the public health, safety, and welfare requires the Blount County Commission to request the Tennessee State Legislature to

refund to Blount County 75% of the fuel taxes paid by Blount County fuel buyers for the next 6 years in order that the deficiencies identified in the "Needs Study" may be addressed with adequate funding; and,

WHEREAS, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration may continue to monitor traffic accidents and fatalities and the progress of this lifesaving strategy to determine the adequacy and effectiveness of the increased funding and if additional tax sharing changes should be made;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Blount County Legislative Body in regular session on this the 18th day of December, 2003, that the Legislature of the State of Tennessee be requested to approve legislation the result of which is to increase the funding for roads and the improvements to roads in Blount County exclusive of projects already planned or in progress to not less than 75% of motor fuel taxes paid by Blount Countians over the next six years beginning with the 2004/05 budget year.

The Blount County Planning Commission met in regular session on Thursday, October 23, 2003, at the Courthouse. Staff was represented by: John Lamb, Director of Planning, Douglas Hancock, Planner; Roger Fields, Building Commissioner; and Gaye Hasty, administrative assistant.

Commissioners Present: Chairman, Gene Brown, Bob Arwood, Steve Gray, Gail Harris, Bob Kidd, Kenneth Melton, Carl McDonald, Bill Proffitt, Rick Rigsby, Ed Stucky and Darrell Tipton. Commissioners Absent: Dan Neubert.

The minutes of the September 25, 2003 regular monthly meeting and the September 30, 2003 special called meeting were approved. Prior to the meeting, these were mailed to members for review.

Long Range Planning & Zoning:

Commissioner McDonald requested that items 2 and 3 on the agenda be reversed in order to discuss considerations on the RAC zoning before the public hearings were held on the re-zoning requests.

Public Hearings and consideration of action to recommend on road closures: proposal to close Williamson Chapel Loop Road; proposal to close dead end portion of Old Melrose Station Road:

Call was made for public comment regarding the proposal to close Williamson Chapel Road. There was none. Call was made for public comment regarding the proposal to close the dead end portion of Old Melrose Station Road. Mr. Don Wilson asked the commission what does the road closure mean, and how is access retained along the closed portion. Mr. Tony Abbott with the Blount County Highway Department explained that by closing the road the county is no longer responsible for the maintenance of that road. The road will remain available for access by the residents. The property owners along the road would then be responsible for the maintenance. Mr. Wilson explained that there was currently damage to the road from recent flooding and wanted to know if the county would repair the damages before the road closure. Mr. Abbott stated that the county would make minor repairs to the road. Mr. Wilson said that he had no problem with the road closure as long as the repairs were made before the property owners took over the maintenance. Mr. Terry Bason and Mr. Ron Millsaps spoke on behalf of the road closure with no objections as long as the county continued to help with the litter pick-up and the road repairs being made.

Both road closures were recommended by the Blount County Highway Department and upon recommendation by the Planning Department would be sent to the County Commission for approval. Commissioner Harris made the motion to approve both road closures, seconded by Commissioner Melton. The motion was approved unanimously.

Consideration of proposals to amend the RAC –Rural Arterial Commercial District text:

Mr. Lamb pointed out that there were now four proposals on the table for amending the RAC zone. Two of the proposals were addressed by staff in the memo but two of the proposals were turned in too late for staff to review and put into the memo. These proposals were turned in by Carl McDonald and John King. Commissioner Harris made the motion to drop the proposal turned in by the Raven Society in favor of consideration for the proposal turned in by Carl McDonald. Commissioner Melton seconded the motion. The motion passed with Commissioner McDonald “passing”. At this time, Mr. Lamb clarified the origin of the proposal from the County Mayor’s office. The proposal was written by Mr. Lamb under the direction of the County Mayor. Mr. Lamb stated that he had independent input in the content along with other people. He further stated that he was comfortable with the proposal from the County Mayor’s office and that the proposal does address the major issues of the RAC zone, within the confines of the intent and the purpose of the zone. Mr. Lamb stated that he also understands that the proposal is subject to deliberation and possible modification by the Planning Commission and that it is the statutory responsibility of the Planning Commission to make a recommendation to the County Commission. At the same time, it is not inappropriate for staff, either as independent professional advice, as directed by the County Mayor, or submitted independently by others, to make proposals to the Planning Commission for their consideration. Mr. Lamb stated that the proposal that came from the County Mayor’s office was a valid proposal and that it was appropriately submitted to the Planning Commission. Mr. Lamb at this time presented four over-riding issues that were addressed in each of the proposals.

- The re-zoning of land. The re-zoning of land is covered both in state statutes and in Blount County’s zoning regulations. None of the proposals advocate or advise for automatic re-zoning of land.
- The depth of re-zoning. It is not entirely necessary to set a limit on depth of re-zoning for all cases. If a limit is set, it should be maintained as an upper limit and not as a norm for every re-zoning request that comes through.
- Review for change of use. This is the process for special exception already in the R-1 zone. The proposals for either automatic review for every change of use, or automatic re-zoning process on every change of use are not appropriate in the context of the general commercial zone. There should be uses that do not need this type of review. Such uses being listed as permitted uses in that category and in that zone. This

would allow the commercial land market to function with some flexibility. This was the main intent of the RAC zone in the first place.

- The proposal from the County Mayor's Office is in conformity with the 1101 Growth Plan statutes and the plan for the County.

The floor was opened for discussion at this time. Particular points discussed were: depth of re-zoning requests; is the area rural or not since it is on a five lane highway; what types of manufacturing should be excluded; etc.

Long range planning was concluded at this point to begin hearings.

HEARINGS

Concept Plans: None

Preliminary Plats – Major Subdivisions:

James Sloan Property:

The James Sloan Subdivision off Williamson Chapel Road is a proposed 9 small lot subdivision, 4 lots served exclusively along a 25' common driveway easement and 5 lots with county road frontage. Planning, Engineering and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for preliminary plat approval subject to the following notes:

- Developer to schedule a pre-development meeting with Planning Department staff prior to any on-site construction.
- Supply Property Owner's Association documentation for the maintenance of the drainage basins and common driveway. Supply copies of any necessary permits for grading from the State of Tennessee to staff.

Commissioner Kidd made the motion to approve the plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Rigsby. The motion received unanimous approval with Commissioner Brown abstaining from the vote.

Laurel Mountain Estates:

Laurel Mountain Estates off Laurel Road in Laurel Valley is a proposed 10 lot subdivision along proposed paved private roads with common area and remainder for future development. This preliminary plat was renewed at the September 2003 regular meeting. This is for a re-design of the private road section. The developer has eliminated a section of the private road and the new design indicates a common driveway to be located on a 50' common driveway easement. Staff supports the design change since they will not be serving any more lots. Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for the preliminary plat changes to be approved subject to the following notes:

- As per the deed of record, all lots created in this subdivision must be part of the Laurel Valley Home Owner's Association. The Association will

determine, prior to final plat approval, whether or not the new paved sections will be accepted for maintenance responsibility by the Association. If not, these lots will additionally be responsible for maintenance of the new road sections independent of the Laurel Valley Home Owner's Association.

- The detention area will require a Property Owners Association to be established. The Property Owners Association must also allow for the maintenance of the new roads, as well as the existing Laurel Valley Roads. Additional maintenance responsibility must be established for a section of the road onto the Heinsohn Property as well. A corrective plat must be submitted for the 2.4 acre tract, or another remedy must be explored prior to a final plat being considered.
- All erosion control measures must be in place prior to any on-site construction. A pre-construction conference with engineering and planning staff on-site with the developer and all contractors is required prior to commencing any construction, and any previous work is at the risk of the developer.
- All drainage and detention facilities must be certified as being built in accordance with the project engineering plans and specifications prior to final plat submittal and any applicable permits for clearing activities to be supplied.

Commissioner Kidd made the motion to approve the revisions to the approved preliminary plat as recommended by staff. The motion, which was approved unanimously, was seconded by Commissioner Stucky.

Final Plats – Major Subdivisions:

Cobblestone Subdivision Phase 2:

Cobblestone Subdivision Phase 2 is a proposed 33 small lot subdivision located off Sam James Road and Blockhouse Road. Twenty-five lots will have access along a proposed new paved county road and 8 lots will have driveway access along Blockhouse Road. Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for Phase 2 final plat approval subject to all signatures on the final plat, final POA documentation to be recorded with the final plat including maintenance responsibility for the drainage facilities, and the updated certification letter from the project engineer, and driveway restriction for lot 14 to be noted on the final plat. Commissioner Kidd made the motion to approve the final plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Rigsby. The motion was approved with Commissioner Tipton abstaining from the vote.

Lisa McCarter Property:

The Lisa McCarter Property off Doc Norton Road is a proposed 17 lot subdivision. Six of the proposed lots (1,2,3,5,15, & 16) will have access off of the

proposed new paved county road section, 5 lots (4,6,7,8,& owner's tract) will be served by a common driveway easement, and 6 lots (9,10,11,12,13, & 14) will be served by the 50' private road easement. None of the lots will have driveway access served off of Doc Norton Road. Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for final plat approval subject to POA documentation being submitted and signatures on plat. Commissioner Rigsby made the motion to approve the final plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Proffitt. The motion received unanimous approval.

Hunter's Ridge Subdivision Phase 1:

Hunter's Ridge Subdivision Phase 1 off Old Niles Ferry Road. Phase 1 has 8 lots along the county road, with 2 restricted driveway locations. The entire subdivision indicates 29 proposed lots. Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for final plat approval for Phase 1 subject to undated POA documentation to be recorded along with the final plat and final inspection of the gravel common driveway entrances. Commissioner Rigsby made the motion to grant final plat approval for Phase 1 as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Melton. The motion was approved unanimously.

Kinzel Springs Subdivision Phase 2:

Kinzel Springs Subdivision Phase 2 off Long Branch is a proposed 11 lots along a 50' paved private road easement. Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for final plat approval subject to staff holding the plat until the road is finished and final POA documentation being completed. Commissioner Rigsby made the motion to approve the plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Tipton. The motion was approved with Commissioner Harris voting "no".

Randall Davis Estate Subdivision:

The Randall Davis Estate Subdivision off Clover Hill Ridge Road is a proposed 7 lot subdivision, 4 lots will be served exclusively off a 25' common driveway easement. Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for final plat approval subject to:

- Recording of maintenance agreement with final plat.
- All signatures on the final plat to be recorded, including notes from the Environmental Health Department.
- Final inspection that the tile has been re-installed.

Commissioner Rigsby made the motion to approve the final plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Proffitt. The motion passed unanimously.

Preliminary and Final Plats – Major Subdivisions: None

Preliminary and Final Plats – Minor Subdivisions: None

Miscellaneous Items:

Roger Fields to address the Planning Commission regarding Big Valley Campground:

The Board of Zoning Appeals requested that Mr. Fields approach the Planning Commission about changing the building setbacks in Big Valley Resort. The BZA is hearing a large number of requests for variances on the building setbacks. The current building setbacks are 5' from the side and rear property lines, 5' feet from the front property line or 20' from the edge of the paved road, whichever is greater. After discussion, Commissioner Melton made the motion to leave the setbacks as they are at the present time. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Harris and received unanimous approval.

Gary Ferguson – Discussion on Duplication Areas and Accessory Structures:

Mr. Ferguson stated that there had been recent question regarding duplication areas and what can and cannot be built on a duplication area. Mr. Ferguson explained that the primary area is what is actually required in linear footage to go into the ground to approve waste water discharge from the structure. It is also required that 100% reserve area is retained to repair that system if and when the need arises. The problem most recently has been with citizens complaining about amenities such as swimming pools, garages, structures, circular driveways, etc. being built on the reserve area. Before the Environmental Health Departments signs off on a new home inspection, they verify that the duplication area is there. Many lending institutions are requiring an inspection letter saying that duplication area is available before they lend money on a home. If a structure has been built in this area, they will not proceed with the closing. The suggestion was made that a procedure be put into place that would require an inspection with the owner after the building permit is issued and before a structure is built. This process would help eliminate future problems for property owners. This would not help situations that may have already occurred. Staff will present the Commission with possible solutions at a future meeting.

Site Plans:

Davis Variance Request off North Union Grove Road:

The Davis Tract is an 8 acre tract with a 25' flag-stem to North Union Grove Road. A portion of the flag-stem actually narrows down to 19'. The property owners would like to subdivide a one acre lot off this tract. The lot would utilize

an easement across their flag-stem and existing driveway. A variance is required for the section of the easement that goes down to 19'. Staff is not opposed to the request provided that the future plat indicates the common driveway restrictions and that a variance was granted on the plat. Commissioner Stucky made the motion to grant the variance, seconded by Commissioner Rigsby. The variance was approved with Commissioner McDonald voting "no".

Columbus Teaster Property off Lover's Lane:

The Columbus Teaster Property off Lover's Lane is a situation where several lots were not created by plat and they come off of the easement that is being presented on the new plat. Since those lots are a part of the plat being presented, staff requires that the deeded lots be brought in on any plat that has a common design element to correct the past violation. Staff recommended that the plat be denied and that a new plat incorporating all previously deeded lots along the common driveway easement be submitted to correct past violations. The new plat and evaluation of the easement will be subject to all present standards for such developments. The owner of the property, Mr. Columbus Teaster and his surveyor, Glenn Harrelson were present to answer questions regarding the request. Mr. Harrelson stated that he did understand that four lots were created illegally. Mr. Harrelson explained that the two lots now being platted would meet the planning requirements. One lot will front on Lover's Lane and the other lot would be the fourth lot along a 25' common driveway. The driveway is paved and is 10' wide. Mr. Harrelson stated that the people who were deeded the property several years ago do not want to have it surveyed, and the people who are buying the newly platted lots do not want to have the entire area surveyed. There was some confusion as to dates of when the property was divided. Commissioner Rigsby made the motion to defer the plat until next month so that more research could be done regarding these divisions. Commissioner Kidd seconded the motion. The motion to defer was approved with Commissioner McDonald "passing".

Discussion of disposition of escrow account for Indian Grove Subdivision:

Blount County has been holding in an escrow account \$10,000.00 for a surety bond for Indian Grove Subdivision. Mr. Lamb recommended extending the agreement for three months. Commissioner Kidd made the motion to extend the agreement as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Arwood. The vote received unanimous approval.

Setting of meeting dates for November and December:

Due to regular meeting dates falling on holidays, the meeting for November was set for Tuesday, November 25 and the meeting for December was set for Monday, December 22.

Conclusion of Long Range Planning:

After discussion, Commissioner Harris made the motion to use the proposal submitted by Commissioner McDonald as the basis and the structure of the consideration of the RAC and RAND zone. Commissioner Tipton made the motion to table Commissioner Harris's motion. The motion to table was seconded by Commissioner Kidd. Upon a voice vote, the chairman declared the motion tabled.

Public Hearings and consideration of action to recommend on proposals to re-zone property from R-1 to RAC for: 4618 East Lamar Alexander Pkwy; 5141 Hwy 411 South; 5205 Hwy 411 South; 5127 Hwy 411 South; 5223 Hwy 411 South; 5003 Hwy 411 South.

4618 East Lamar Alexander Parkway:

The owner has withdrawn the re-zoning request.

5141 Highway 411 South:

Public hearing and consideration of action to recommend on proposal to re-zone property from R-1 to RAC Rural Arterial Commercial for property located at Tax Map 100, Parcel 012.01 and part of Parcel 012.04. No one in the audience spoke to this item. Staff recommended for approval of this re-zoning request. Commissioner Rigsby made the motion to approve this re-zoning request. The motion died for lack of a second.

5205 Highway 411 South:

Public hearing and consideration of action to recommend on proposal to re-zone part of the property located at Tax Map 100, Parcel 012.06 to a depth of 750'. The frontage of parcel 012.06 to a depth of 250' already has RAC zoning from a previous re-zoning approval. Mr. Chris Ralls, attorney representing Ms. Penny French asked the Planning Commission to defer action until a decision is made regarding the RAC zoning. Mr. Steve Edwards, owner of the property explained that he would like an additional 500' added to his property which is already zoned RAC. The total depth of this tract is 2,150' and does abut the French property. Mr. Edwards stated that the remaining property should supply an adequate buffer zone. Mr. Edwards stated that he has no definite plans for the property at this time. Staff recommended for approval of the re-zoning request.

5127 Highway 411 South:

Public hearing and consideration of action to recommend on proposal to re-zone property located at Tax Map 100, Parcel 012.03 from R-1 to RAC Rural Arterial Commercial. The total depth of this re-zoning request is 210'. Mr. Steve Edwards, owner of this tract stated that this parcel contains a house and a shed at the present time. Staff recommended for approval. No one in the audience spoke to this item.

5223 Highway 411 South:

The owner of the property and applicant requested that this item be deferred to the next regular meeting. Notice and posting for public hearing will be done again for the next regular meeting.

5003 Highway 411 South:

Public hearing and consideration of action to recommend on proposal to re-zone property located at Tax Map 100, Parcel 022.01 from R-1 to RAC Rural Arterial Commercial. The issue of use compatibility with adjacent properties does not allow firm technical recommendation given that potential uses may be buffered. The Planning Commission voted to recommend denial of the re-zoning request at a previous meeting based mainly on incompatibility with surrounding uses. This is again a valid basis for denial of the re-zoning, and would still allow expansion of the existing uses to the full extent of the property under present zoning provisions. Staff recommended that any re-zoning considered be conditioned on no further access points onto Ramsey Road. No one in the audience spoke to this item.

No action was taken on the re-zoning requests therefore the requests will be rolled over to the next meeting of the Planning Commission.

Commissioner Kidd at this time recognized and thanked Commissioner Harris for her time spent serving on the Planning Commission.

H) Discussion regarding Mr. Jeff McCall's feedback on part-time employees with benefits.


