




A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE BLOUNT COUNTY SENATOR AND REPRESENTATIVES TO SPONSOR THE ENACTMENT OF A PRIVATE ACT BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE AUTHORIZING BLOUNT COUNTY TO LEVY AND COLLECT A PRIVILEGE TAX ON NEW RESIDENTIAL AND NONRESIDENTIAL LAND DEVELOPMENT IN THE COUNTY.

WHEREAS, Blount County, Tennessee, has been growing at an accelerated rate over the past several years, having been impacted by the location of new industry in the county and by rapid growth in the standard metropolitan area of Knoxville; and

WHEREAS, projected nonresidential development and the availability of jobs in the county is anticipated to stimulate a significant demand for new dwelling units; and

WHEREAS, projected growth and land use development will cause an increased demand for county-provided public services and facilities; and

WHEREAS, Blount County is committed, for the benefit of both present and future county residents, to maintaining a level of public services and facilities commensurate with those presently provided; and

WHEREAS, Blount County is prepared to impose a fair, equitable and reasonable share of the cost of providing necessary public services and facilities on existing county residents and taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, Blount County's present population, employment base, tax base and budget cannot alone support the additional revenues needed to provide public services and facilities to serve new growth without a substantial increase in the property tax rate on existing development; and

WHEREAS, due to these circumstances, it is necessary and appropriate that Blount County be given authorization to extend its taxing power to enable the county to impose a fair and reasonable share of the cost of public services and facilities necessitated by new development on that development so as not to create an unfair and inequitable burden on existing county residents and taxpayers; and

DRAFT

WHEREAS, the most logical and effective mechanism to accomplish the intended result would be to authorize Blount County to levy a privilege tax on new residential and nonresidential land development in Blount County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee, that the Blount County Senator and Representatives are hereby requested to sponsor the enactment of a private act in the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee authorizing Blount County to levy and collect a privilege tax on new residential and nonresidential land development in the county and that such private act include the following provisions, to wit:

SECTION 1. The tax authorized by the private act shall be known as the "Blount County Adequate Facilities Tax."

SECTION 2. The intent and purpose of the private act is to authorize Blount County to levy and collect a privilege tax (the "tax") on new land development in the county payable at the time of issuance of a building permit or certificate of occupancy so as to ensure and require that the persons responsible for new development share in the burden of growth by paying their fair share for the costs of new and expanded public services and facilities made necessary by such development.

SECTION 3. The private act shall declare that the act of land development within Blount County is a privilege upon which Blount County may, by resolution of its legislative body, levy a tax in an amount not to exceed the rates set forth herein.

SECTION 4. The private act shall authorize the county's legislative body to levy the tax by resolution after adopting a capital improvements program indicating the need for new and expanded public services and facilities anticipated to be funded, in part, by the tax and after finding that the need for such public services and facilities is reasonably related to new land development in the county. The resolution of the county's legislative body levying this tax shall state the rate (s) of the tax on new residential and nonresidential land development. The county's legislative body shall, by resolution, adopt administrative guidelines, procedures, regulations and forms necessary to properly implement, administer and enforce the provisions of the private act.

SECTION 5. For the exercise of the privilege described in section 3 above, the private act shall authorize Blount County to levy a tax on new land development not to exceed

(a) _____ per gross square foot of new residential development, and

(b) _____ per gross square foot of new non-residential development.

The county may develop a tax rate schedule by which residential and nonresidential uses are classified by type for the purpose of imposition of the tax authorized by the private act.

SECTION 6. The tax established by the private act shall be due and collected at the time of application for a building permit for new development as defined in the act or, if a building permit is not required, at the time of application for a certificate of occupancy to the county or city official duly authorized to issue building permits or certificates of occupancy. If the building permit is issued by the county, then the county building commissioner or other responsible official shall receive payment in full in cash or negotiable instrument as specified by resolution of the county's legislative body and as approved by the county attorney. If the building permit is issued by one of the incorporated cities of Blount County, the city shall, before issuance of the building permit, require evidence by a valid certificate executed by the county building commissioner or other responsibility official that the full amount of tax due the county has been paid or a negotiable instrument has been received and accepted. No building permit for residential or nonresidential land development as defined in the private act shall be issued in any incorporated or unincorporated area of Blount County unless the tax has been paid in full to the county or a negotiable instrument as specified by the county's legislative body and as approved by the county attorney has been received and accepted. The issuance of a building permit by any city official without a certificate from the county that the tax has been paid or a negotiable instrument has been received and accepted shall render the city liable to the county for the sum or sums that would have been collected by the county had such certificate been required by the city.

The private act shall declare that the tax is a lien against the real property upon which the new development has occurred until paid and shall be superior to all other liens on such property except for property tax liens. Interest of _____ percent per month and a penalty of _____ percent per month shall be added to the tax due if not paid when first due, unless the taxpayer successfully contests the applicability of such tax by appeal as provided in the private act. Notice of such lien may be, but is not required to be, recorded in the office of the register of deeds. Such lien may be enforced by civil action instituted in the chancery court of Blount County or any other court of appropriate equitable jurisdiction in the county for sale of the real property to enforce this lien.

SECTION 7. The private act shall provide that proceeds from the tax shall be used to provide new and expanded county public services and facilities and to reduce debt incurred therefor and shall be deposited into the county's general and debt service funds for such purposes.

SECTION 8. The private act shall provide that the authority to levy the tax on new development in Blount County is in addition to all other authority to levy or impose taxes, fees, assessments or other revenue raising or land development regulatory measures granted either by public or private acts of the State of Tennessee and that the levy of such tax, in addition to any other authorized tax, fee, assessment or charge, shall not be deemed to constitute double taxation.

SECTION 9. The provisions of the private act shall in no manner repeal, modify or interfere with the authority granted by any other public or private law applicable to Blount County. The private act shall be deemed to create an additional or alternative method for Blount County to levy and collect taxes for the purpose of the county providing public services and facilities made necessary by new development in the county.

SECTION 10. The private act shall have no effect unless it is approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the county's legislative body. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the county's legislative body and certified by the presiding officer to the Tennessee Secretary of State.

RESOLUTION TO LEVY A COUNTY-WIDE MOTOR VEHICLE TAX

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 5-8-102, authorizes counties to levy a motor vehicle privilege tax as a condition precedent to the operation of a motor vehicle within a county; and,

WHEREAS, the need for new revenue sources to fund road improvements is great in Blount County;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blount County legislative body that;

SECTION 1. For the privilege of using the public roads and highways, in Blount County, Tennessee, there is levied upon motor-driven vehicles, and upon the privilege of the operation thereof, except motorcycles, motor-driven bicycles and scooters, farm tractors, self-propelled farm machines not usually used for operation upon public highways or roads, and motor-driven vehicles owned by any governmental agency or governmental instrumentality and except for other exemptions provided by general law, a special privilege tax for the benefit of such county, which tax shall be in the amount of ten dollars (\$10.00) for each such motor-driven vehicle, the owner of which resides within said county.

This tax applies to, is a levy upon, and shall be paid on each motor-driven vehicle, the owner of which resides within said county.

SECTION 2. The tax herein levied shall be paid to and collected by the County Clerk of Blount County, who is authorized by Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-4-103, to collect such privilege taxes. The County Clerk shall collect this tax at the same time he or she collects the state privilege tax levied upon the operation of a motor-driven vehicle over the public highways of this state. The County Clerk shall deduct a fee of five percent (5%) as authorized in Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-21-701(55), from the amount of taxes collected and paid over to the County Trustee.

SECTION 3. The tax herein levied shall be deposited entirely into the Highway Public Works Fund minus the County Clerk fee.

SECTION 4. Payment of the privilege tax imposed hereunder shall be evidenced by the State of Tennessee form and receipt used to account for decals and by a decal issued by the County Clerk, which shall be displayed by affixing the decal on and to the lower right corner of the license plate in the space provided for such decal. The design of the decal shall be determined by the County Clerk and shall be the same size as the state renewal decal. The expense incident to the purchase of such decals herein required, as well as the expense of obtaining proper receipts and other records necessary for the performance of the duties herein incumbent upon the County Clerk, shall be paid from the general fund of the county.

SECTION 5. The privilege tax or wheel tax herein levied, when paid together with full, complete, and explicit performance of and compliance with all provisions of this Resolution, by the owner, shall entitle the owner of the motor-driven vehicle for which said tax was paid and on which the decal or emblem has been affixed as herein provided, to operate or allow to be operated such vehicle over the streets, roads, and highways of the county for a period of one year which will run concurrently with the period established for the state registration fees by Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-4-104.

In the event the wheel tax decal is sold by the Clerk for a period of more or less than a calendar year, the tax imposed shall be proportionate to the annual tax fixed for the vehicle and modified in no other manner, except that the proportional tax shall be rounded off to the nearest quarter of a dollar.

SECTION 6. In the event any motor-driven vehicle, for which the wheel tax has been paid and the emblem or decal issued and placed thereon, becomes unusable or is destroyed or damaged to the extent that it can no longer be operated over the public roads, streets or highways of said county; or in the event that the owner transfers the title to such vehicle, or completely removes therefrom and destroys the decal or emblem issued for and placed thereon, and the owner makes proper application to the Clerk for the issuance of a duplicate decal or emblem to be used by such owner on another vehicle for the unexpired term for which the original decal or emblem was issued, and the Clerk is satisfied that the applicant is entitled to the issuance of such a duplicate decal or emblem and the owner pays into the hands of the Clerk the sum of five dollars (\$5.00), the Clerk will then issue to such owner a duplicate receipt, canceling the original receipt delivered to the Clerk by the owner, and will deliver to the owner a duplicate decal or emblem, which shall be affixed to the motor-driven vehicle for which it is issued, as herein provided, and such duplicate decal or emblem shall entitle the owner to operate or allow to be operated the vehicle upon the streets , roads, and highways of said county for the remainder of the period for which the original decal or emblem was issued. Likewise, in the event a decal or emblem becomes obliterated, erased, or defaced, or is destroyed under the provisions of this resolution, and is therefore illegible and unusable by the owner, upon proper application made by the owner and filed with the Clerk, showing such circumstances and facts to be true, then the Clerk, upon receipt from the owner of five dollars (\$5.00) may issue and deliver to the owner, a duplicate decal or emblem.

SECTION 7. The effective date of collection for the aforementioned privilege tax or wheel tax will be _____, _____ as determined by the Board of Commissioners of Blount County this 21st day of October 2004.



SUBJECT: Referral of items from the Planning Commission.

1. Request of the Public Services Committee for consideration of measures to delete the 60 day time limit for BZA decisions on special exceptions, and either (1) place a moratorium on commercial special exceptions along Hwy 411 and Hwy 321 in the county until the Hunter Interests growth strategy plan is done, or (2) delete commercial special exception provisions from the zoning regulations for Hwy 411 and Hwy 321 until the Hunter Interests growth strategy plan is done.

This item was referred to the Planning Commission for consideration and recommendation. The Planning Commission declined to take action or make recommendation on this item. The following is excerpt of staff report on the item for reference.

The issue of the 60 day limit on decisions of the Board of Zoning Appeals for special exceptions was considered in the past by the Planning Commission. The following is the subject zoning regulation text Section 11.5 E:

E. The Board shall act on the application within 60 days of the hearing, unless the applicant requests an extension of time. Upon hearing, any party or parties in interest may appear in person or by agent or attorney.

The purpose of the 60 day limit is to prevent undue delay or dilatory inaction in decisions. The information needed on a matter should be complete by the time of hearing, and 60 days after hearing was considered a reasonable time to gather any new information or allow consideration needed for a decision. If the BZA feels that information is not complete or is not accurate, or does not support the special exception, they have the discretion and authority to deny the application. This is appropriate planning and regulatory administration practice. Staff does not support deleting the requirement for 60 day decision limit. This matter has been referred also to Norman Newton for review and opinion.

The issue of moratorium on commercial special exceptions along Hwy 411 and 321 is a policy consideration in relation to the on-going Hunter Interests growth plan. This matter has also been referred to Norman Newton for review and opinion. Staff cautions that commercial special exceptions apply to not only Hwy 411 and 321, but also to other arterial and collector status roads in the County. There may then be another issue of equal application in placing a moratorium.

The issue of deleting provisions for commercial special exceptions along Hwy 411 and 321 is a policy consideration in relation to the on-going Hunter Interests growth plan. This would have the same effect as a moratorium. This matter has also been referred to Norman Newton for review and opinion. Staff cautions that commercial special exceptions apply to not only Hwy 411 and 321, but also to other arterial and collector status roads in the County. There may then be another issue of equal application in deleting provisions only for Hwy 411 and 321.

Staff also handed out a supplemental analysis at the August regular meeting (of the Planning Commission). The supplemental analysis was in response to comments sent to several Planning Commission members. The following is the body of supplemental staff analysis edited for reference.

1. Justin Evans, Planner with the Local Planning Assistance Office, notes that the status of other county and city regulations does not preclude setting time limits on decisions. Staff notes that the only default in favor of the applicant would be allowing the applicant to demand that a decision be made. This could be pursued through the courts if all else fails. The time limit on decision does not automatically default to approval of the application after 60 days.
2. Bart Hose, Regional Director of the Local Planning Assistance Office, notes that state statutes do not preclude setting time limits on decisions, and that such time limits are at the discretion of the local government.

3. Maryville does not have the same provisions for time limits, but it is a matter of discretion, and staff would advocate that Maryville consider our 60 day time limit as reflecting a more appropriate standard for administering regulations.

4. Much has been made of the assertion that no other county or city in the region or the state has such provisions. You do not have to look far to find an exception to that assertion. Loudon County has a 60 day time limit, and Lenoir City has a 45 day time limit.

If you pursue the logic of the argument that we should fall in line with the majority of other counties in the state, it would follow that we should not have zoning at all since the majority of counties in the state do not have zoning (55.8%), and such an argument could be extended to other regulations such as building codes (71.6% of counties do not have building codes). The argument for an action based on number and percentages of counties having or not having a regulation is spurious. What we need to do is ask: Is an action consistent with good planning and regulatory administration, and is it good for Blount County?

Staff contends that placing time limits on decisions is good planning and regulatory administration. This is supported in the Growing Smart Legislative Guidebook published by the American Planning Association.

Such limits will forestall any attempts at delays intended to frustrate the proper administration of regulations. If an applicant meets requirements of the regulations, the application should be approved expeditiously. If not, the application should be denied expeditiously. Determination of requirements should be a straightforward process of evidence and interpretation of regulations, and the Board of Zoning Appeals should be able to accomplish such in a specified period of time. Keep in mind that the BZA has wide discretionary authority to deny an application if it determines that the application is deficient in content, does not meet standards of the regulations, or would have an adverse impact.

2. Recommendation regarding legality of zoning regulations Section 6.2 that allows expansion of non-conforming uses onto new property.

The Planning Commission recommends that Section 6.2 of the zoning regulations be deleted in its entirety. The vote was unanimous. This item will require setting of public hearing with at least 15 days notice in the newspaper prior to action. The following is excerpted and edited staff report for reference.

SUBJECT: Section 6.2, as amended, of the Zoning Resolution

The planning commission has requested my opinion on the appropriateness of section 6.2, as amended, of the county's Zoning Resolution. Section 6.2 currently provides:

Section 6.2. Expansion of an existing non-conforming industry or business onto newly acquired adjacent land. A non-conforming industry or business in existence and in operation at the effective date of this Resolution, which subsequently acquires adjacent land for the purpose of expansion of the non-conforming use, may be allowed to expand onto the newly acquired land if approved as a special exception by the Board of Zoning Appeals under provisions of Section 11.5 of this Resolution.

Reference is made to my December 19, 2000, memorandum to John Lamb. In that memorandum, I reviewed certain principles which are set forth in the *421 Corp.* case referred to in the July 2004 staff memorandum and in the case of *Dickson County v. Jennette*, 2000 W. L. 1121550 (Tenn. Ct. App.). After reviewing these principles, I concluded that the pre-existing non-conforming use provisions of Tenn. Code Ann. § 13-7-208(b)-(d) constitute vested rights which must be followed and which cannot be altered, expanded or restricted by local governments.

Section 6.1 of the Zoning Resolution is consistent with Tenn. Code Ann. § 13-7-208(b)-(d) and sets forth vested rights which the county must recognize. However, these vested rights apply only to land owned and in use by the affected industrial, commercial or business establishment and do not operate to permit expansion of an existing industry or business through the acquisition of additional land. See Tenn. Code Ann. § 13-7-208(e). Accordingly, under the state statute, the vested rights set forth in section 6.1 cannot be extended to adjacent land.

Section 6.2 purports to recognize that the Board of Zoning Appeals has the discretion to allow a non-conforming industry or business to expand onto newly acquired land if approved as a special exception. This is the result that is expressly prohibited by Tenn. Code Ann. § 13-7-208(e). The real question is whether a local government can allow by special exception a result that is expressly prohibited by state law. Based on legislative history discussed in the *421 Corp.* case, I do not believe that it can. *421 Corp.*, p. 477. However, I acknowledge that this question has not been directly addressed by any Tennessee appellate court decision that I can find in my research. Accordingly, my analysis may be incorrect.

I recommend that Article 6 address only the vested rights provided Tenn. Code Ann. § 13-7-208(b)-(d), and that section 6.2 be deleted therefrom. I note that section 6.2 is surplusage to section 11.5, which provides for and governs the granting of special exceptions. If I am wrong in my analysis, section 11.5 is still available if a landowner wants to try to obtain a special exception to expand onto newly acquired land.

Staff notes that in the next to last paragraph of Mr. Newton's memo, his assumption that special exception provisions in Section 11.5 are available to expand a non-conforming use onto newly acquired land is not correct. Section 11.5 is general provision for special exceptions. Specifics of special exceptions are contained in separate sections relating to particular uses. Given the analysis of Mr. Newton, staff recommends amending the zoning regulations to delete Section 6.2 in its entirety. If the Planning Commission so decides, appropriate action would be recommendation to the County Commission to delete Section 6.2. Amendment of the regulations would then go through a process of public notice, public hearing and consideration for action by the County Commission.

3. Recommendation to amend the zoning regulations concerning length of cessation of operation of commercial and industrial businesses.

The Planning Commission recommends amending the zoning regulations to reflect newly enacted state statutes regarding length of cessation of operation of commercial and industrial businesses as non-conforming uses under zoning. The vote was unanimous. This item will require setting of public hearing with at least 15 days notice in the newspaper prior to action. The subject state legislation is attached to this memo for reference. The appropriate wording of amendment is as follows:

That Section 5.3 be amended by deletion of the wording "two (2) years" and placing therein "thirty (30) months".

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 13-7-208, relative to the continuation of uses and structures not in conformance with local government zoning.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 13-7-208, is amended by adding the following language as new subsections:

(g) The provisions of subsections (b)-(d) shall not apply if an industrial, commercial, or other business establishment ceases to operate for a period of thirty (30) continuous months and the industrial, commercial, or other business use of the property did not conform with the land use classification as denoted in the existing zoning regulations for the zoning district in which it is located. Anytime after the thirty (30) month cessation, any use proposed to be established on the site, including any existing or proposed on-site sign, must conform to the provisions of the existing zoning regulations. For the purposes of this subsection, the thirty (30) month period of continuous ceased operation shall be tolled by:

(1) The period in which an industrial, commercial, or other business establishment is party to any action in a court of competent jurisdiction regarding the use of the property until such time that a final settlement, order, decree, or judgment has been rendered;

(2) Any period in which a facility is being constructed, reconstructed, renovated, or refurbished, provided that all necessary building permits were obtained within thirty (30) months of cessation of continuous use;

(3) The filing of an application for a building permit for the alteration, renovation or reconstruction of a structure which is non-conforming or of a structure in which or out of which a non-conforming industrial, commercial or other business use operates or is located; or

(4) The reactivation of the non-conforming use any time prior to the end of the thirty (30) month period.

Provided, however, the restrictions of subsections (g) and (i) shall only apply if the property owner intentionally and voluntarily abandons the nonconforming use of the property. In any contested matter on the use of such property, the government has the burden of proving an overt act of abandonment in such matter.

(h) The provisions of subsections (b)-(d) shall apply to an off-site sign, which, for the purposes of this section means any sign that advertises or gives direction to any business, product, service, attraction, or any other purpose or interest, other than the industrial, commercial or other business establishment located on the site where the sign is located; provided, however, that any expansion shall be limited as follows:

(1) Any off-site sign smaller than a standard 8-sheet poster, which, for the purposes of this subsection means an off-site sign with overall dimensions of at least five feet four inches (5' 4") to six feet two inches (6' 2") in height and eleven feet four inches (11' 4") to twelve feet two inches (12' 2") in width shall not be expanded to a size greater than a standard 8-sheet poster;

(2) Any standard 8-sheet poster shall not be expanded to a size greater than a 30-sheet poster, which, for the purposes of this subsection means an off-site sign with overall dimensions of twelve feet three inches (12' 3") in height and twenty-four feet six inches (24' 6") in width;

(3) Any standard 30-sheet poster shall not be expanded to a size greater than any standard bulletin, which, for the purposes of this subsection means any off-site sign with overall dimensions of ten feet (10') to fourteen feet (14') in height and thirty-six feet (36') to forty-eight feet (48') in width;

(4) Any standard bulletin shall not be expanded to a size greater than any super bulletin, which, for the purposes of this subsection means any off-site sign with overall dimensions of sixteen feet (16') to twenty feet (20') in height and sixty feet (60') in width;

(5) Any super bulletin shall not be expanded; or

(6) Any off-site sign with height larger than standard 8-sheet poster height or width larger than standard 8-sheet poster width but not meeting the definition of a standard 8-sheet poster, a standard 30-sheet poster, a standard bulletin, or a standard super bulletin shall not be expanded by more than one hundred percent (100%) of its surface area.

(i) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (d), any structure rebuilt on the site must conform to the provisions of the existing zoning regulations as to setbacks, height, bulk, or requirements as to the physical location of a structure upon the site, provided that this subsection shall not apply to off-site signs.

(j) The provisions of subsections (g), (h) and (i) do not apply to any home rule municipality, however, subject to the approval of the local legislative body, a home rule municipality may opt into the provisions of these subsections.

(k) Notwithstanding the foregoing, subsection (g) shall not apply to any industrial establishment location where twenty-five percent (25%) or more of the gross annual sales from such location are derived from sales to or contracts with local, state or federal governments or as a subcontractor to contracts with the same, or to any industrial establishment location where seventy-five percent (75%) or more of the gross annual sales from the location are made to agriculture or construction businesses.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.

At its August 10, 2004, meeting, the Public Services Committee passed a motion to refer the following proposals to the Planning Commission for consideration and requested guidance from me with regard thereto.

Proposals

Delete the 60-day time limit for BZA decisions on special exceptions, and either (1) place a moratorium on commercial special exemptions [exceptions] to zoning along Highway 321 and 411 South until the Hunter Interests growth strategy is complete, or (2) delete commercial special exception provisions from the zoning regulations for Highway 411 South and Highway 321 until the Hunter Interests growth strategy plan is completed.

Opinions

Tenn. Ann. § 13-7-107(a) provides in pertinent part that "[t]he county legislative body may provide and specify, in its zoning or other ordinance, general rules to govern the organization, procedure and jurisdiction of the board of appeals. . . ." Tenn. Ann. 13-7-109 provides that "[t]he board of appeals has the power to: . . . (2) Hear and decide, in accordance with the provisions of any such ordinance requests for special exceptions"

Based on the foregoing enabling legislation, I am of the opinion that the county's zoning resolution may be amended to delete the procedural 60-day time limit for BZA decisions; provided that, the statutory procedures for amending zoning ordinance [resolution] provisions are followed. See Tenn. Code Ann. § 13-7-105. Likewise, I am of the opinion that the county's zoning resolution may be

amended to remove jurisdiction from the BZA to grant commercial special exceptions for properties along Highway 411 South and Highway 321.

I do not believe that the county's zoning resolution can properly be amended to place a moratorium on commercial special exceptions for properties along Highway 321 and Highway 411 South because a moratorium would not be considered jurisdictional in nature and would not be consistent with section 11.5 of the zoning resolution.

A RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A POLICY FOR EXCEPTION TO THE AMOUNT OF PAY RECEIVED BY A BLOUNT COUNTY COMMISSIONER

WHEREAS, the Blount County Commission appreciates, encourages, and desires persons to serve as county leaders in the capacity of county commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Blount County Commission recognizes that certain county citizens chose not to seek public office due to the potential of losing benefits from the Federal, State, and/or private employers or retirement benefits of those previous employers; and

WHEREAS, the Blount County Commission desires to remove any obstacle(s) which could reduce a potential county citizen's ability to serve.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Blount County Commission does hereby establish the following policy of pay for the Blount County Commission:

1. Blount County Commissioners shall all receive compensation as adopted by the County Commission with the following exception:
If it has been determined that a commissioner is placing in jeopardy his/her retirement benefits from Medicaid, Medicare, Social Security, or like benefits of prior employers due to the amount of compensation paid by Blount County, then said commissioner shall be paid an amount less than the annual eligible compensation amount due the commissioner. The amount of adjusted compensation shall be the total compensation eligible less than the amount, which could cause the commissioner to lose benefits, less an additional \$100. The amount of the adjusted compensation shall be determined annually and adjusted as needed anytime throughout the fiscal or calendar year once it has been determined that a benefit is in jeopardy.
2. It is the intent of this policy that no commissioner shall agree or be compensated an amount less than the amount approved by the commission except in cases of where other benefits are put in jeopardy.
3. In no event shall a commissioner be compensated less than that required by statutes. TCA 5-5-107.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect from and after passage, the Public Welfare requiring it.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be made a part of the official records of the Board of County Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee.

SUBJECT: Proposed resolution

The Public Services Committee has referred a resolution entitled "A Resolution to Establish a Policy for Exception to the Amount of Pay Received by a Blount County Commissioner" to the county commission for consideration at its November 18, 2004, regular meeting, and has requested my opinion thereon. A copy of the proposed resolution is transmitted herewith.

The Tennessee Attorney General has opined that the waiver of a statutory salary by a county public official is void as against public policy; that the statute authorizing payment of salaries to members of the county legislative body is mandatory; and that a county commissioner may not accept a salary less than that set by the county legislative body. *See Op. Tenn. Atty. Gen. No. 04-015.* I cannot reconcile the proposed resolution with this Attorney General opinion.

The proposed amendment would allow a commissioner, upon his or her individual determination, to accept and be paid a salary lower than the salary established by the county commission for its members. Accordingly, the resolution, if adopted, would appear to allow indirectly what the Attorney General has said cannot be done directly. Moreover, the enabling legislation which authorizes the county commission to establish a stated salary per month for its members, Tenn. Code Ann. § 5-5-107 (c), provides "... or a greater amount provided by resolution duly adopted by the county legislative body as a stated salary per month." (emphasis added.) This statute does not contemplate or authorize the county commission to provide for alternate salaries for its members.

In an article appearing in the October 28, 2004, edition of *The Daily Times*, it was reported that Ron Woody, a county government consultant with University of Tennessee County Technical Services Association ("CTAS"), assisted in crafting the proposed resolution. Mr. Woody's questionable involvement in the preparation of the resolution gave me concern that CTAS was impliedly representing that the resolution would be upheld if challenged in court. Accordingly, I contacted

Ronald E. Fults, Chief Legal Consultant for CTAS, and asked him. Mr. Fults said that there may be an arguable basis for the resolution, but it is questionable, and that his office would not issue an opinion that the resolution would be upheld upon court challenge.

Conclusion

It is my opinion that the proposed resolution violates the principles discussed in the Attorney General opinion referred to above, is not authorized by Tenn. Code Ann. § 5-5-107 (c) and would not be upheld upon court challenge.

Dear Public Services Committee Members:

At the September 16, 2004, Commission Meeting you received my letter of resignation due to a problem with my Social Security Benefits. In tonight's (November 9) Public Services Committee packet you will find "A Resolution to Establish a Policy for Exception to the Amount of Pay Received By a Blount County Commissioner." Ron Woody, CTAS consultant, gave his assistance in construction of this resolution and stated this would be a reasonable approach, but if it were tested by a court - who would know the positions in which the court would take; and it would appear that the only claimant would be a commissioner who is affected by the reduced pay and that same commissioner is the one benefitting from the policy.

The Tennessee Attorney General's Opinion will not allow an individual commissioner to reduce his/her salary but it does allow the legislative body to reduce its salary.

The right to vote, and have one's vote accurately and fairly counted, is as fundamental a right as we have in this country. In 1965, Congress passed the Voting Rights Act. There are a block of voters in our County between the ages of 62-65 who could not serve as a County Commissioner under the present conditions if they chose to do so. In your packet you will find a copy of a letter from Congressman Duncan that addresses this problem.

In summary, I would ask you to please recommend this resolution to the full Commission for approval.

Thank you for your recent contact with my office regarding the matter involving your Social Security disability benefits and your salary as a Blount County Commissioner.



Please consider the following request:

Introduction: I am the newly elected senator from District 8 (Blount and Sevier Counties).

Background: One of my constituents is a Blount County commissioner. A recent pay raise for commissioners places his Commission salary income above the permissible limit for him to continue receiving Social Security disability benefits. He must either resign his elected office or forfeit his benefits.

I believe he should not be placed in this dilemma. He needs to continue drawing benefits and he should be allowed to serve the term to which he was elected.

There may be other elected officials in Tennessee faced with this same problem. There may also be wealthy Tennesseans who wish to serve in an elected office, but who do not need or want a salary from the State.

I believe no one who is elected to an office should be compelled to receive a salary from a local or state government, if he or she wishes to refuse compensation.

Such a decision does not harm the taxpayer. Rather, the cost of government is reduced by such a decision (even though slightly), and the citizens of Tennessee benefit.

Request: I request that your staff prepare a bill for me to introduce in the One Hundred Fourth General Assembly, or explain to me why the bill is either redundant or violates existing law.

Please include the following features in this bill :

- **Applicability:** The enacted law would apply to any person elected to any office in any state or local government in Tennessee.
- **Salary:** The elected office holder may choose to receive all of his/her salary, any percentage of the salary, or none of the salary. The official must designate his/her intentions before the fifteenth day of January, and he/she may alter his/her intentions only during the first fifteen days of January in succeeding years.

- **Benefits:** The elected office holder may choose to receive or decline any benefit of the office (insurance, retirement, etc.), except that the government will not supply funds in excess of matching funds required to be paid by the office holder.
- **Disposition of unpaid funds:** When an office holder elects to receive less than the customary salary or benefits, he/she cannot later ask to be reimbursed for unpaid funds that could have been paid during that year. All monies which could have been paid in salary and benefits to the office holder will be returned to (retained in) the general fund of the government which would have paid the full salary or benefits. (That is, the office holder cannot designate that the unused salary/benefits be paid to another entity, e.g., a church or non-profit organization.)

SUBJECT: Relocation of McGhee Tyson ANG Main Gate

1. Due to the devastating events of 9/11, the military has had a drastic increase in the security requirements needed to protect both our military assets and our most valuable resource-our people. A recent 134th Air Refueling Wing security assessment conducted by the Air Force reinforced this need for increased security. The assessment reviewed our current situation and made recommendations to comply with these new mandatory requirements. The military has allocated 1.2 million dollars in equipment to help mitigate the shortfalls in our security; however an increase in manning was not authorized.
2. After doing a great deal of research, we have found that our current main gate entrance will not meet the requirements for the installation of new equipment. It is for this reason that we have concluded the best solution would be to construct a new main gate on Air Base Road just west of Callahan Road. A new gate at this location will encompass the 134 Air Refueling Wing, the Army National Guard and the 119th Command and Control Center. This new gate enables us to create a National Guard complex alleviating the need for three gates and greatly reducing the need for increased manpower. This solution not only meets our needs by fulfilling our security requirements, it is also the best solution for the taxpayer due to the fact that there will be no additional cost to Blount County and the additional benefit of improvements to Callahan Road.



You have requested my opinion as to the actual ownership of two tracts of real property located on the southwest side of William Blount Drive at the intersection of County Farm Road and the imposition of restrictions on the use of this property should it be declared surplus and sold by the county. Minutes, September 9, 2004, Public Services Committee meeting.

Ownership:

This property is part of the old "county farm" property. It was separated from the main tract by the construction of William Blount Drive.

Prior research with regard to the county farm property failed to locate a deed. However, there are county court minutes during the Civil War era which authorize the issuance of notes to finance the purchase of this property.

The county has exercised adverse possession, dominion and control of this property for well over 100 years and on at least one occasion, has made a conveyance off of this property to an adjoining land owner. See W.D. Vol 515, page 877, Blount County Register's office. Accordingly, I have concluded that Blount County is the actual owner of this property.

Restrictions:

The county may lawfully impose restrictions on the two tracts should the property be declared surplus to be sold by public auction or sealed bid. The county did impose restrictions, i.e., agricultural use only, in the deed of conveyance referred to above. The enforcement of any restrictions imposed would be the responsibility of the county.



(o) (1) All sales of county-owned property, real or personal in nature, which has become surplus, obsolete or unusable shall be made by public auction as defined in §§ 47-2-328 and 62-19-101 or by sealed bid under this section, in the discretion of the purchasing agent or responsible official.

(2) The county purchasing agent shall give public notice of such auction by inserting at least once in a newspaper of county-wide circulation or by posting on a public bulletin board in the county courthouse at least five (5) days prior to the date of such auction, a notice specifying the auction date, time, place, property to be sold and terms of such auction.

47-2-328. Sale by auction.

(1) In a sale by auction if goods are put up in lots each lot is the subject of a separate sale.

(2) A sale by auction is complete when the auctioneer so announces by the fall of the hammer or in other customary manner. Where a bid is made while the hammer is falling in acceptance of a prior bid the auctioneer may in his discretion reopen the bidding or declare the goods sold under the bid on which the hammer was falling.

(3) Such a sale is with reserve unless the goods are in explicit terms put up without reserve. In an auction with reserve the auctioneer may withdraw the goods at any time until he announces completion of the sale. In an auction without reserve, after the auctioneer calls for bids on an article or lot, that article or lot cannot be withdrawn unless no bid is made within a reasonable time. In either case a bidder may retract his bid until the auctioneer's announcement of completion of the sale, but a bidder's retraction does not revive any previous bid.

(4) If the auctioneer knowingly receives a bid on the seller's behalf or the seller makes or procures such a bid, and notice has not been given that liberty for such bidding is reserved, the buyer may at his option avoid the sale or take the goods at the price of the last good faith bid prior to the completion of the sale. This subsection shall not apply to any bid at a forced sale.

62-19-101. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

(1) "Apprentice auctioneer" means any individual who, for compensation or valuable consideration, or otherwise, is employed, directly or indirectly, by an auctioneer to deal or engage in any activity defined in subdivision (3);

(2) "Auction" means a sales transaction conducted by means of oral or written exchange between an auctioneer and members of the audience, which exchange consists of a series of invitations for offers for purchase of goods or real estate made by the auctioneer and offers to purchase made by members of the audience culminating in the acceptance by the auctioneer of the highest or most favorable offer made by a member of the participating audience;

(3) "Auctioneer" means any individual who, for a fee, commission, or any other valuable consideration, or with the intention or expectation of receiving the same, by the means or process of auction or sale at auction, offers, negotiates, or attempts to negotiate a listing contract, sale, purchase, or exchange of goods;

(4) "Commission" means the Tennessee auctioneer commission;

(5) "Continuing education" means six (6) hours each renewal period;

(6) "Firm" means any person who, as part of such person's business, arranges, manages, sponsors, advertises or carries out auctions;

(7) "Goods" means any chattels, merchandise, real or personal property, or commodities of any form or type which may lawfully be kept or offered for sale; and

(8) "Person" includes an individual, association, partnership, corporation, and the officers, directors and employees of a corporation.

ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES

Accounting Procedures outline the guidelines for acquisition and disposition of the four classes of property.



Real Property

1. Real Property Acquisition/Disposition Record

- a. Upon acquisition of Real Property, the Property Coordinator will file a Real Property Acquisition/Disposition Record with the Central Accounting Property Coordinator.
- b. Major changes to real property must be reported to the Central Accounting Property Coordinator as soon as possible after the change occurs.

Major changes include sale or lease, change in insurance level, change in name, additions and renovations.

- c. Construction-in-progress at the end of each fiscal year should be evaluated and reported to the Central Accounting Property Coordinator as soon after June 30 as possible.

Personal Property

Fixed Assets Often surplus property is available which **could** be adequate for many of your needs. Therefore, we urge you to investigate the possibility of surplus property before requisitioning new purchases.

Fixed Assets Acquired by Purchase:

1. Capital Outlay Request Form

- a. This form is completed each year during the budget process and approved by the Budget Committee and the Blount County Commission.
- b. Use of the capital outlay appropriation for a purchase from a line item different from the line item which was approved at the beginning of the fiscal year would require prior approval of (1) a budget transfer to the appropriate line item and (2) a revised Capital Outlay Request Form.

Dear Alvin:

At your request, I have researched the issue as far as whether or not the School Board could transfer the above-referenced property to a church. You also asked if the property could be done so with the restriction that if the church ever ceases to use the property for church purposes, it would revert back to the schools. If the property is titled in the name of the School Board, School Department, etc., this very well could be done. However, I did check with Norm Newton, the attorney for Blount County, with regard to the title of this property.

Coincidentally, Mr. Newton had just recently completed a title search on this property, pursuant to a request from a county commissioner. It appears that the property in question was transferred to the county, probably during the Civil War era. The actual deed has not been located, but apparently, minutes were found in county court records indicating that the county purchased the property. Additionally, the county has been holding the property as its own for an extended period of time. Thus, I do not find that the property is owned by the School Board or School Department. As such, the School Board is without authority to transfer this property to anyone, as there is no evidence that it is owned by the School Department.

Based upon the foregoing, we cannot sell or give away real estate for which we do not have legal ownership. If, in fact, a church, or any other group of individuals are interested in this property, it is my opinion that they will need to go through the County Commission to accomplish this transaction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these budget adjustments are suggested, but not limited to the following areas:

- A 6% reduction in General County operating budgets to be equally distributed.
- A 2% reduction in General Purpose School operating budgets to be equally distributed.
- A reduction of 75% in all travel and entertainment budgets.
- A maximum of \$50,000.00 to be budgeted as non-profit donations.
- No merit increases for Blount County Commissioners, office holders, and department heads.
- Request that the Budget Committee require detailed project objectives and justification for all capital outlay and other charges requests before approval.
- Use of growth factor.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Budget Committee is requested to give monthly reports to the County Commission on progress in obtaining the above goal of providing debt service money for school construction.

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE ZONING RESOLUTION OF BLOUNT COUNTY, TENNESSEE CONCERNING ADULT ORIENTED ESTABLISHMENTS.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee, in session assembled this _____, 2004:

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Tennessee has enabled Blount County to adopt and amend zoning regulations in Tennessee Code Annotated Sections 13-7-101, *et seq.*, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee adopted zoning regulations in Resolution 00-06-010 **A RESOLUTION ADOPTING ZONING IN BLOUNT COUNTY PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 13-7-101, *et seq.*, OF THE TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED**, and

WHEREAS, The Board of Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee finds that adult oriented establishments are commercial uses and should be limited to high intensity commercial zones, that such businesses produce secondary negative impacts on surrounding uses, that such impacts may be mitigated by distance, and that the above findings are supported by various literature and court cases, most notably those found in the Planning Advisory Service, Report Number 495/496 entitled "Everything you always wanted to know about regulating sex businesses" by Eric Damian Kelly and Connie Cooper (December 2000), and

WHEREAS, it is desired to amend such Resolution to regulate the location of adult oriented establishments, their separation from like uses, and their separation from other uses which would be negatively impacted by closeness to adult oriented establishments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF BLOUNT COUNTY, TENNESSEE, to adopt the following:

That Sections 9.1 D, 9.2 D, 9.3 D (S-Suburbanizing, R-1 – Rural District 1, R-2 – Rural District 2 Uses Prohibited) be amended by addition of wording at the end of the respective sections as follows: "and adult oriented establishments as defined in TCA 7-51-1101 *et seq.*"

That Section 9.4 A (C-Commercial District Permitted Uses) be amended by addition of wording as follows: "adult oriented establishment as defined in TCA 7-51-1101 *et seq.*, subject to requirements in Section 7.12"

That Section 9.10 D (RAC-Rural Arterial Commercial District Uses Prohibited) be amended by deletion of the section in its entirety and the following placed therein:

D. Uses Prohibited: In the RAC –Rural Arterial Commercial District, adult oriented establishments as defined in TCA 7-51-1101 *et seq.* are prohibited, and all other uses are prohibited except those uses permitted specifically above.

That a new Section 7.12 be added under General Provisions as follows:

Section 7.12. Adult Oriented Establishments. In addition to all other requirements for commercial uses, the following shall be requirements for adult oriented establishments as defined in TCA 7-51-1101 *et seq.*:

A. any adult oriented establishment shall be located no nearer than 1000 feet measured from nearest lot line to nearest lot line in any direction to lots containing protected uses delineated in subsection B below;

B. protected uses shall be any residential use, place or house of worship including church or temple, public or licensed educational institution that serves persons younger than 18 years old, day care center, public park, public or private recreation area or playground, library, museum, or other public building that caters to or serves in whole or in part persons younger than 18 years old;

C. any adult oriented establishment shall be located no nearer than 1000 feet measured from nearest lot line to nearest lot line in any direction to a lot containing an adult oriented establishment;

D. anyone wishing to establish an adult oriented establishment under provisions of this Section shall submit to the Blount County Building Commissioner for his review and determination of requirements, a map of land uses, based on Blount County Tax Map parcels at scale of one (1) inch equals 100 feet, showing the parcel proposed for use as adult oriented establishment and uses of all parcels within or affected by distance requirements in subsections A, B and C above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE IN FORCE AND BECOME EFFECTIVE UPON ITS ADOPTION, THE PUBLIC WELFARE REQUIRING IT.

SUBJECT: Adult Oriented Business zoning regulations proposed.

See below a proposed amendment of the zoning regulations recommended by the Planning Commission, with condition of legal review by Norman Newton. See attached staff analysis considered by the Planning Commission. This comes for setting of public hearing date with requirement of 15 days notice in the newspaper. The proposed amendments will also be passed on to the Maryville and Alcoa Planning Commissions for review and recommendation as required by state law. The following is the recommendation of the Planning Commission:

That Sections 9.1 D, 9.2 D, 9.3 D (S-Suburbanizing, R-1 – Rural District 1, R-2 – Rural District 2 Uses Prohibited) be amended by addition of wording at the end of the respective sections as follows: “and adult oriented establishments as defined in TCA 7-51-1101 et seq.”

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D. anyone wishing to establish an adult oriented establishment under provisions of this Section shall submit to the Blount County Building Commissioner for his review and determination of requirements, a map of land uses, based on Blount County Tax Map parcels at scale of one (1) inch equals 100 feet, showing the parcel proposed for use as adult oriented establishment and uses of all parcels within or affected by distance requirements in subsections A, B and C above.

7. Discussion of and possible action on avenues to address issues of adult entertainment businesses in the county.

Commissioner Steve Gray requests discussion of this item. The County Commission considered and adopted provisions of TCA 7-51-1101 et seq., providing for registration and regulation of adult oriented establishments. Under provisions of the law, an Adult Oriented Establishment Board of five members is to be appointed by the County Mayor. The Board will have powers specified in the law, including powers to issue yearly licenses for adult oriented establishments.

The state law specific to adult entertainment is very strong. See copy of the statutes enclosed with this memo (also available on the internet at <http://198.187.128.12/tennessee/lpext.dll?f=templates&fn=fs-main.htm&2.0> with click through to Title 7 then Chapter 51 then Part 11). The statute provides for stand alone licensing regulations, but also recognizes additional avenues for regulation in zoning as follows in TCA 7-51-1104(f):

No license shall be issued by the board unless the applicant certifies, by proof satisfactory to the board, that the applicant has satisfied the rules, regulations and provision of the applicable zoning requirements in the county. Any zoning requirements shall be in addition to and not an alternative to any requirements of this legislation.

And in TCA 7-51-1121 as follows:

Part not exclusive or preemptory of local laws or regulations.

(a) Nothing in this part shall preempt or prevent political subdivisions in this state from enacting and enforcing other lawful and reasonable restrictions, regulations, licensing, zoning, and other criminal, civil or administrative provisions concerning the location, configuration, code compliance, or other business operations or requirements of adult-oriented establishments and sexually-oriented businesses. Except as specified in this part, such other lawful and reasonable restrictions, regulations, licensing, and other criminal, civil, or administrative

provisions shall not be a basis for the board's denying , revoking, or suspending a license or permit under this part.

(b) Notwithstanding any provisions of subsection (a) or any other law to the contrary, if a city or other political subdivision in this state chooses to enact and enforce its own regulatory scheme for adult-oriented establishments and sexually-oriented businesses, then the provisions of this part, shall not apply within the jurisdiction of such city or other political subdivision.

Norman Newton, in a memo to Commissioner Steve Gray, dated September 2, 2004, found that "...the county's zoning resolution can address the location, configuration, and site plan requirements, etc., of such premises." This is in addition to the licensing requirements of the state statutes in 7-51-1101 et seq. (see following two pages for full text of Mr. Newton's memo).

Mr. Newton also referred to provisions of TCA 7-51-1401 et seq. which regulates times of operation and internal design of adult oriented establishments. In TCA 7-51-1406 refers to zoning regulations as follows:

Nothing in this chapter shall preempt or prevent political subdivisions in this state from enacting and enforcing other lawful and reasonable restrictions, regulations, licensing, zoning and other civil or administrative provisions concerning the location, configuration, code compliance or other business operations or requirements of adult-oriented establishments and sexually-oriented businesses.

We may then consider it established by state statutes that adult oriented commercial land uses are proper subjects of zoning regulations. But such power or authority to regulate is not unbounded.

SUBJECT: Adult-Oriented Establishments.

Per your request, I have researched the following questions:

1. Are there currently any restrictions in Blount County regarding this type business (adult video stores)?
 - (a) If not, can the County Legislative Body impose restrictions?
 - (b) If yes, what is the proper procedure as far as enforcement or removal of such businesses?
2. What can the Blount County Legislative Body do to discourage these types of businesses in certain areas?
3. Whether it is legal for an individual commissioner to post a website regarding activity at such a business.

Opinions and Analysis:

1. Maybe. It appears that Blount County appointed an Adult-Oriented Establishment Board in 1988; however, the Board suspended meetings in December 1990 due to a pending lawsuit filed in Knox County challenging such a board. Blount County has never revived that Adult-Oriented Establishment Board.

(a) Yes. Rather than rely on the past adoption and apparent abandonment of the former Adult-Oriented Establishment Board under legislation that has since been amended, the Blount County legislative body can adopt the amended legislation known as the "Adult-Oriented Establishment Registration Act of 1998" (the "1998 Act"). See TENN. CODE ANN. § 7-51-1101, *et seq.* This can be accomplished by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the county legislative body adopting the 1998 Act. TENN. CODE ANN. § 7-51-1120.

(b) This question will be addressed as part of the answer to your second question.

2. After adoption of the 1998 Act by the Blount County legislative body, the county mayor shall appoint a five (5) member Adult-Oriented Establishment Board (hereinafter "Board"). TENN. CODE ANN. § 7-51-1103. The statute mandates that "no adult-oriented establishment shall be operated or maintained in any applicable county without first obtaining a license to operate issued by the county adult-oriented establishment board." TENN. CODE ANN. § 7-51-1104. All existing adult-oriented establishments must submit an application within one hundred twenty (120) days of the adoption of the 1998 Act becoming effective in the county. *Id.*

The Board shall provide the application form. A copy of the completed application form shall be provided to the county sheriff's department to facilitate a criminal investigation of the applicant, including a fingerprint identity check. TENN. CODE ANN. §§ 7-51-1105, 1122. The applicant must also certify that the rules, regulations and provisions of the applicable zoning requirements in the county have been satisfied. TENN. CODE ANN. § 7-51-1104 (f).

The license expires in one (1) year and a renewal application must be made within sixty (60) days prior to the license expiration date. TENN. CODE ANN. § 7-51-1111. Further, the adult-oriented establishments are subject to random inspections by the sheriff or the Board's designated representative. TENN. CODE ANN. § 7-51-1107.

In addition, criminal penalties are already available in regard to hours of operation and the physical design of the premises of adult-oriented establishments. See TENN. CODE ANN. § 7-51-1401, *et seq.* This part allows a local ordinance, resolution or private act to further restrict hours of operation. TENN. CODE ANN. § 7-51-1402(b). Violation for a first offense is a misdemeanor carrying a fine of five hundred (\$500) dollars. TENN. CODE ANN. § 7-51-1404.

And finally, the county's zoning resolution can address the location, configuration, site plan requirements, etc., of such premises.

3. Maybe. An individual commissioner has the same free speech guarantees under the First Amendment as any other citizen; however, that commissioner must take care not to act in his official capacity nor utilize the official county website when expressing personal convictions. Furthermore, an individual commissioner is subject to liability for defamation.

We must first consider state statutes enabling the county to adopt zoning regulations. Such statutes are contained in a separate set of laws found in TCA 13-7-101 et. seq., and provide the following as grant of power

13-7-101. Grant of zoning power.

(a)(1) The county legislative body of any county is empowered, in accordance with the conditions and the procedure specified in this part, to regulate, in the portions of such county which lie outside of municipal corporations, the location, height and size of buildings and other structures, the percentage of lot which may be occupied, the sizes of yards, courts, and other open spaces, the density and distribution of population, the uses of buildings and structures for trade, industry, residence, recreation or other purposes, and the uses of land for trade, industry, residence, recreation, agriculture, forestry, soil conservation, water supply conservation or other purposes.

As part of the execution of a zoning plan, TCA 13-7-102 provides that the County Commission

.... may divide the territory of the county which lies within the region but outside of municipal corporations into districts of such number, shape or area as it may determine and within such districts may regulate the erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration and uses of buildings and structures and the uses of land. All such regulations shall be uniform for each class or kind of buildings throughout any such district, but the regulations in one (1) district may differ from those in other districts.

In considering zoning regulations, we should also remember the purposes of zoning contained in TCA 13-7-103 as follows:

Such regulations shall be designed and enacted for the purpose of promoting the health, safety, morals, convenience, order, prosperity welfare of the present and future inhabitants of the state and of its counties, including, among other things, lessening congestion on the roads or reducing the wastes of excessive amount of roads; securing safety from fire and other dangers; promoting adequate light and air, including protecting and encouraging access to sunlight for solar energy systems; preventing, on the one hand, excessive concentrations

of population and, on the other hand, excessive and wasteful scattering of population or settlement; promoting such distribution of population and such classification of land uses and distribution of land development and utilization as will tend to facilitate and conserve adequate provisions for transportation, water flowage, water supply, drainage, sanitation, educational opportunity, recreation, soil fertility, food supply and the protection of both urban and nonurban development.

The main points to glean from state statutes are that zoning addresses defined aspects of land use, allows for control of land use and the effects of land use on surrounding uses, must be equally applied for like uses, and must be related to the purpose of the police power which is to protect the public health, safety and welfare. This will be important in discussions about adult oriented commercial land uses, since there will be important issues of scope of regulation and content neutrality to be considered for any zoning regulations.

The following several paragraphs summarize Planning Advisory Service Report Number 495/496 entitled “everything you always wanted to know about regulating sex businesses xxx”, by Eric Damian Kelly and Connie Cooper, (December 2000). Any reference below to this publication will be as Kelly and Cooper with page number if appropriate.

Adult oriented business has been around for a long time. The business ranges from the criminal, e.g. prostitution, to the legal. The legal may include production, distribution and sale of books, magazines, pictures, videos, movies, and “toys” or devices. Legal business is now often not confined to a storefront, but can be found in many hotel rooms as cable options for movies, and on the internet either through direct download or purchase through mail order. The consumption of the products of adult oriented business has also changed, particularly with the advent of video cassettes and the internet. What used to be confined to a storefront arcade or a movie theater, can now be viewed or consumed in the privacy of the home. The definition of what is legal in adult oriented business has evolved over time with changes in society, and changes in technology. Adult oriented business is so pervasive that it is impractical for local governments to expect to ban it altogether.

Kelly and Cooper distinguish several different types or categories of adult oriented businesses. They recognize three types of mainstream businesses selling some hardcore materials. Bookstores, newsstands and video stores are common mainstream businesses that may have a small portion of their stock that could be identified as adult oriented. If the proportion of the stock is less than 10 percent, then Kelly and Cooper do not consider such businesses to be adult oriented land uses.

Mixed retail outlets constitute another level of classification where the proportion of adult oriented material exceeds 10 percent of stock or floor area display. Such businesses are considered as mixed outlets since a substantial portion of the inventory and display space is used to sell non-adult oriented products. Some of the video stores falling in this category separate the adult product line from the mainstream line by segregation in a separate enclosed room (backroom adult display).

Stores oriented predominantly to adult media (books, magazines and videos) fall within the next category. Such stores often carry a wide range of products besides media, including lingerie, novelties, and "toys" or devices. Some of the stores also integrate video viewing booths.

Certain shops may be oriented more to non-media products such as lingerie, novelties, "toys" and devices. These shops have a different character than media oriented shops, and often have a different clientele.

Retail, or wholesale, selling of media is one aspect of adult oriented business. Showing the media is another. Movie theaters showing mainly pornographic movies are both a land use and a medium. This mix gives X-rated movie theaters constitutional protections different from retail business operations.

Video viewing booths are a different matter. A video viewing booth is not a theater, but is a small enclosure, usually for individual occupancy, in which a video is shown for a fee as on premises entertainment. Such booths are usually associated with a retail adult oriented store selling media such as books, magazines and videos.

Beyond media and product oriented adult businesses are human performance and human contact businesses. Human performance, or live entertainment, may be strictly segregated from the audience on a stage, or allow close

contact such as lap dancing. Other human performance or contact businesses include encounter studios, nude photography studios, and massage parlors. Sometimes, these types of businesses are fronts for criminal activities such as prostitution.

Given the wide range of adult oriented business types, a single one-size-fits-all regulation approach may not be appropriate. In addition, zoning can only address issues of land use, and not issues of criminal activities or issues of internal operation. Law enforcement authorities should address criminal activities, and licensing procedures with associated inspections should address internal operation issues.

For lawful adult oriented businesses, there are two ways of approaching regulation. For operations or internal management issues, licensing is the most appropriate avenue of regulation. Under licensing, such issues as access by minors, hours of operation, interior design, cleanliness, qualifications of management and employees, and periodic review can be addressed. Most importantly, periodic review, such as requirement for yearly license renewal, can catch violations more effectively than zoning regulations, and violations can more easily lead to suspension or revocation of license to operate.

Kelly and Cooper find that “Regulating sex businesses is complex. Zoning is an essential but inadequate tool to regulate sexually oriented businesses.” (p.85) Nonetheless, zoning can play a role in regulating adult oriented land use, and can be an effective partner in an overall scheme of regulating such businesses through licensing.

There are major legal issues in regulating adult oriented land uses through zoning, in addition to all other legal issues of zoning regulation. First is the application of First Amendment principles of freedom of expression. Second is the application of Fourteenth Amendment principles of protection of privacy. Of the two, the most contentious is the First Amendment as it applies to adult oriented land uses.

Adult oriented media, and the showing of such media, has broad constitutional protection under freedom of expression. In general, you cannot directly regulate the content of such media or expression. However, you can address by regulation the secondary effects of the land use, i.e., the adult oriented business as a land use category.

In summary, Kelly and Cooper cite several studies that support findings that adult oriented businesses have negative land use effects that may be addressed through land use regulations in zoning (Chapter 3). The negative effects can justify content neutral regulations based on separation distance from protected uses, and separation distances from like uses to control concentration. Kelly and Cooper caution that we should “Recognize that sexually oriented uses have a place in a community.” (p. 155) However, “Do not think the First Amendment gives unlimited protection to all sexually oriented activities.” (p. 155)

Kelly and Cooper continue in their advice: “Do not assume there is a relationship between criminal activity and sexually oriented businesses.” (p. 156) But at the same time:

Recognize that sexually oriented uses do have negative secondary impacts. Studies completed in Kansas City, Missouri; Rochester, New York; New York City, and other communities substantiate the fact that sexually oriented uses can create secondary impacts such as lowering of property values, and, if not appropriately regulated, provide the opportunity for minors to be exposed to adult materials and performances.” (p. 156)

Recommendations of interest to zoning include separation requirements, conditional use, and signage. Of the three, separation requirements have the most validity and least legal problems. Kelly and Cooper recommend the following:

Establish minimum separation distance between adult uses and family-oriented uses. A principal purpose of zoning is to separate incompatible uses, and there is a basic incompatibility between an entirely adult-oriented entertainment use and a use or activity that regularly includes youth. In addition, studies in Indianapolis and Rochester show that sex businesses are likely to have negative effects on the property values of residences and similar uses within 500 to 1000 feet. Based on these findings, cities should consider separation distances between adult uses and “protected uses or districts,” which include: exclusively residential uses or districts; houses of worship; public or licensed educational institutions that serve persons younger than 18; day care centers; a public park, recreation area or playground;

libraries, museums, and other public buildings; entranceways into the community; historic districts; and transit malls. (p. 160)

Kelly and Cooper recommend that separation distances be based on pedestrian or driving distance, i.e. by sidewalk or road distance, and not as the crow flies. They also recommend that adult uses be separated from each other by a distance between 500 to 1000 feet. (p. 160) However, separation requirements must be reasonable to be defensible, and “There must be actual sites available for uses protected by the First Amendment.” (p.161) In other words, the intent and effect of regulations should not be to zone adult oriented businesses out of existence.

Kelly and Cooper recommend that adult oriented land uses be restricted to commercial and industrial zones. They caution again that “Uses protected by the First Amendment must be allowed by right somewhere.”

Concerning conditional uses, termed special exceptions in relation to county regulations, Kelly and Cooper find that such special exception provision and process is probably unconstitutional as applied to most adult oriented establishments due to issues of prior restraint of protected expression. (p. 163, and pp.103-104)

Concerning signage, Kelly and Cooper caution that there is a double First Amendment issue, applying to the products associated with the use and again applying to the message on signs. To remain content neutral as much as possible, they suggests that signage issues be studied in much more depth by legal counsel before pursuing specific regulation. (p. 115, and p.140)

In view of the above information, staff reviewed the county zoning regulations, with the following findings and recommendations:

1. Operation issues are addressed by the recently adopted state statutes in TCA 7-51-1101 et seq., and 7-51-1401 et seq., for licensing adult oriented businesses, and zoning need not address such operation issues.
2. Statutory definition of “adult oriented establishment” may be incorporated by reference from TCA 7-51-1102 as a definition of land use for zoning regulation purposes and for consistency with the adopted licensing provisions..

3. The regulation of separation is allowed under state statutes on zoning, and is appropriate for application to adult oriented establishments.
4. The appropriate separation of adult oriented establishments from each other can be 1000 feet.
5. 1000 feet is also an appropriate separation of adult oriented establishments from the following land uses: any residential uses; houses of worship; public or licensed educational institutions that serve persons younger than 18 years old; day care centers; public parks, recreation areas or playgrounds; libraries, museums, and other public buildings that cater in whole or in part to persons younger than 18 years old.
6. Adult oriented establishment should be a use of right in the C-Commercial zone, with objective condition of separation from other adult oriented establishments, and from uses identified in 5 immediately above.
7. Any regulation of signage for adult oriented establishments should undergo rigorous legal review and advice before action by the county, and should be considered in the context of review of sign regulations in general.
8. There may be other avenues for regulating adult oriented establishments under county zoning, but such avenues should undergo rigorous legal review and advice before action by the county.
- (9. This item was staff recommendation for proposed amendments, and is deleted for this presentation in deference to the recommendation of the Planning Commission.)





I want to thank you and Blount County Commissioners for the ~~\$12,500.00~~ ^{\$12,250} provided to Senior Citizens Home Assistance Service of Blount County.

Our Mission is and continues to be assisting Senior Citizens and citizens with functional disabilities achieve or maintain the highest level of independence possible while living their home or apartment.

Funds that we receive from Blount County are used to provide homemaker and personal care services to individuals that are 60 years of age or older or individuals that are 18 years of age or older with functional disabilities who cannot afford to pay the full cost of our service which is \$13.00/hour. Eighty-eight of the 115 clients (77%) served in 2003 in Blount County were under the 150% poverty level. These guidelines are published by HHS in the Federal Register as of February 13, 2004. The funds are used for our clients who are on a Sliding Scale Fee. We have clients that pay from \$4.00 to \$7.00/hr. These clients have incomes that range from \$584 to \$776/month and after monthly expenses of health insurance, medicines, taxes, rent, mortgage payments, utilities, lifeline, their net income ranges from \$90 to \$366/month remaining to buy groceries, clothes or other necessities.

Funds are also used as 10% match for the National Family Caregiver support program and 25% match for the State of Tennessee Homemaker Program.

Nursing Home care continues to increase. Blount County nursing home care ranges from \$3658 to \$5100/month. These prices are for a private or semi private room. This does not include medication or other supplies used. Based on the 115 clients we cared for in 2003, their average cost if placed in a nursing home would be $4379 \times 115 = \$503,585 - \$71,415 (\$621 \text{ avg income} \times 115) = \$432,170$. This would be the monthly cost to keep these clients in the nursing home.

As all of you know, funding of the Highway Department has been an issue for several years now. It is really though, in the past two years, that this has become a cash flow issue. As of June 30, 2004, the Highway Department ended the year with a fund balance of @ \$27,000. Because of this fact, we are taking steps at this time to ensure the fund does not end in the negative for next fiscal year. These steps are as follows. Cash balances are being monitored on a daily basis. The future of all projects are being monitored and any projects other than those already started, and which will be completed in the next month, will be put on hold. No purchase orders will be issued until such time as we deem appropriate reserve levels will be maintained. With no action on revenues for the Highway Fund, expenditures will be required to be cut or at the very least limited to only essential services. These steps are necessary and required not only for cash flow but to build fund balances back to necessary levels.



During the regular scheduled meeting of the Blount County Board of Education on November 4, 2004, the Board passed the 2004-2005 School Capacity Designations.

As you are aware, the capacity designation formula is based upon three criteria: school design capacity standard, square foot per students standard, and building academic capacity standard. If a school does not exceed any of these standards, it is designated as **low**. If a school exceeds one of three standards, it is designated as **watch**. If a school exceeds two of three standards, it is designated as **high**. If a school exceeds all three standards, it is designated as **intolerable**.


The Blount County Planning Commission has requested that the Blount County Board of Education provide them with capacity designations one time per year. The optimal time of this report for the school system is the Fiscal Period Two (F2), which is the 2nd twentieth day of school, which usually occurs around the first or second week of October. The Board would like to make F2 the yearly reporting date for capacity designations to the planning committee.

As per the attached report, currently the Blount County School System has six schools with the designation of **intolerable**. Those schools are Friendsville Elementary School, Lanier Elementary School, Montvale Elementary School, Heritage Middle School, William Blount Middle School, and William Blount High School. Although this report is for a full year's time period, we believe that Heritage Middle School will open up next year with an enrollment lower than its academic capacity, thus changing its designation

from intolerable to high. To make this possible, the Board of Education may modify the attendance district for a portion of the Heritage Middle School's students, and rezone them to Eagleton Middle School's attendance district.

Under Tenn. Code Ann. § 57-4-301(b)(2), which authorizes each county or municipality within which the privilege of selling alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises is exercised to levy and collect a fixed amount tax on such privilege, either the county or the municipality may assess the tax on the privilege, but not both. See *Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County v. Motel Systems, Inc.*, 525 S.W.2d 840 (Tenn. 1975).

On November 21, 1996, the Blount County legislative body adopted a resolution levying the local annual fixed amount tax on the privilege of selling alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises in the county. On December 5, 1996, the Blount County legislative body adopted a resolution amending the November 21, 1996, resolution, to provide that the tax would be due and payable to the county clerk on January 1 of each year. See copies of resolutions transmitted herewith.

By referendum, the voters of the City of Alcoa recently approved the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises. Under the authority of Tenn. Code Ann., § 57-4-301(b)(2) and the previous action of the Blount County legislative body referred to above, Blount County has levied and is the proper political subdivision to collect the local annual fixed amount tax on the privilege of selling alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises in Alcoa.
