**IN RE: RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE BLOUNT COUNTY SENATOR AND REPRESENTATIVES TO SPONSOR LEGISLATION IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY WHICH WOULD AMEND THE PUBLIC LAW OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE TO ALLOW COUNTIES TO IMPOSE A USER'S FEE ON PERMANENT DOCUMENTS TO BE COLLECTED WHEN DOCUMENTS ARE FILED AND TO SPONSOR A PUBLIC ACT WHICH WOULD AUTHORIZE BLOUNT COUNTY TO LEVY AND COLLECT A FEE NOT TO EXCEED \$2.00 ON PERMANENT DOCUMENTS FILED. THIS FEE WOULD BE USED EXCLUSIVELY FOR THE RECORDS MANAGEMENT OFFICE.**

A. section 10-7-408 to change the wording of section 2 (b) (2) to the County Legislative Body of any county which creates a County Records Commission has the power to establish and collect through all county offices referred to in section 10-7-403 an archives and records management fee not to exceed \$2.00 per permanent document filed, such fee to be used exclusively for the operation of the Records Management Department for maintaining any records requiring by law to be permanently kept to include any county with a population of 105,800 to 105,900 according to the 2000 Census. Any elected official may opt out of this charge. Commissioner Dowdy seconded the motion.

First and foremost, we have an excellent education system comprised of dedicated teachers, administrators, parents and students. We have an equally generous Blount County Commission that has funded the construction of several new schools and related projects. We also have a Blount County Board of Education that puts kids first.

I am leaving this committee knowing we are headed in the right direction. Some important objectives I hope continue are as follows:

- 1) Build schools to demographic trends and not political whims.
- 2) Build smaller community oriented schools especially at the elementary school level.
- 3) Build smart by having core capacity built now for future expansion later.

My Great-Great Grandfather, Dr. John Jones of Campbell County, knew why education is important. He has always favored a liberal tax for the support of the cause of education, believing that money expended in building school-houses and maintaining good schools is money well expended, and is in the end more economical than supporting an ignorant and vicious population in the jail and the poor house." Over a hundred years later I echo my Great-Great Grandfather's views.

**RESOLUTION TO LEVY A COUNTY-WIDE MOTOR VEHICLE TAX**

**WHEREAS**, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 5-8-102, authorizes counties to levy a motor vehicle privilege tax as a condition precedent to the operation of a motor vehicle within a county; and,

**WHEREAS**, the need for new revenue sources to fund road improvements is great in Blount County;

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blount County legislative body that;

**SECTION 1.** For the privilege of using the public roads and highways, in Blount County, Tennessee, there is levied upon motor-driven vehicles, and upon the privilege of the operation thereof, except motorcycles, motor-driven bicycles and scooters, farm tractors, self-propelled farm machines not usually used for operation upon public highways or roads, and motor-driven vehicles owned by any governmental agency or governmental instrumentality and except for other exemptions provided by general law, a special privilege tax for the benefit of such county, which tax shall be in the amount of ten dollars (\$10.00) for each such motor-driven vehicle, the owner of which resides within said county.

This tax applies to, is a levy upon, and shall be paid on each motor-driven vehicle, the owner of which resides within said county.

**SECTION 2.** The tax herein levied shall be paid to and collected by the County Clerk of Blount County, who is authorized by Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-4-103, to collect such privilege taxes. The County Clerk shall collect this tax at the same time he or she collects the state privilege tax levied upon the operation of a motor-driven vehicle over the public highways of this state. The County Clerk shall deduct a fee of five percent (5%) as authorized in Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-21-701(55), from the amount of taxes collected and paid over to the County Trustee.

**SECTION 3.** The tax herein levied shall be deposited entirely into the Highway Capital Projects Fund minus the County Clerk fee.

**SECTION 4.** Payment of the privilege tax imposed hereunder shall be evidenced by the State of Tennessee form and receipt used to account for decals and by a decal issued by the County Clerk, which shall be displayed by affixing the decal on and to the lower right corner of the license plate in the space provided for such decal. The design of the decal shall be determined by the County Clerk and shall be the same size as the state renewal decal. The expense incident to the purchase of such decals herein required, as well as the expense of obtaining proper receipts and other records necessary for the performance of the duties herein incumbent upon the County Clerk, shall be paid from the general fund of the county.

**SECTION 5.** The privilege tax or wheel tax herein levied, when paid together with full, complete, and explicit performance of and compliance with all provisions of this Resolution, by the owner, shall entitle the owner of the motor-driven vehicle for which said tax was paid and on which the decal or emblem has been affixed as herein provided, to operate or allow to be operated such vehicle over the streets, roads, and highways of the county for a period of one year which will run concurrently with the period established for the state registration fees by Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-4-104.

In the event the wheel tax decal is sold by the Clerk for a period of more or less than a calendar year, the tax imposed shall be proportionate to the annual tax fixed for the vehicle and modified in no other manner, except that the proportional tax shall be rounded off to the nearest quarter of a dollar.

**SECTION 6.** In the event any motor-driven vehicle, for which the wheel tax has been paid and the emblem or decal issued and placed thereon, becomes unusable or is destroyed or damaged to the extent that it can no longer be operated over the public roads, streets or highways of said county; or in the event that the owner transfers the title to such vehicle, or completely removes therefrom and destroys the decal or emblem issued for and placed thereon, and the owner makes proper application to the Clerk for the issuance of a duplicate decal or emblem to be used by such owner on another vehicle for the unexpired term for which the original decal or emblem was issued, and the Clerk is satisfied that the applicant is entitled to the issuance of such a duplicate decal or emblem and the owner pays into the hands of the Clerk the sum of five dollars (\$5.00), the Clerk will then issue to such owner a duplicate receipt, canceling the original receipt delivered to the Clerk by the owner, and will deliver to the owner a duplicate decal or emblem, which shall be affixed to the motor-driven vehicle for which it is issued, as herein provided, and such duplicate decal or emblem shall entitle the owner to operate or allow to be operated the vehicle upon the streets , roads, and highways of said county for the remainder of the period for which the original decal or emblem was issued. Likewise, in the event a decal or emblem becomes obliterated, erased, or defaced, or is destroyed under the provisions of this resolution, and is therefore illegible and unusable by the owner, upon proper application made by the owner and filed with the Clerk, showing such circumstances and facts to be true, then the Clerk, upon receipt from the owner of five dollars (\$5.00) may issue and deliver to the owner, a duplicate decal or emblem.

**SECTION 7.** Any future increases to the tax must be approved by referendum.

**SECTION 8.** The effective date of collection for the aforementioned privilege tax or wheel tax will be \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_ as determined by the Board of Commissioners of Blount County this 20<sup>th</sup> day of January 2005.

WHEREAS, the Public Services Committee of the Blount County Legislative Body has received a petition from the residents along a private road lying off Morganton Road and in the Nineteenth Civil District of Blount County, Tennessee, said road being adjacent to various properties shown on Tax Map 67 of record in the Office of the Assessor of Property for Blount County, Tennessee, and being presently known as "**LUTHER MAC LANE**," said petition requesting that the Blount County Highway Department maintain said "**LUTHER MAC LANE**", said road providing sole access to the several properties along the road, and being in need of maintenance; and,

WHEREAS, the Blount County Quarterly Court in regular session on October 20, 1975, did classify the public roads in Blount County and adopt a "List of Official Roads of Blount County", sometimes referred to as the "List"; that said "List" has been amended on occasion to include new roads approved by the various Planning Agencies having jurisdiction within the boundaries of Blount County; that said "List" is of record in the Office of the County Clerk of Blount County; that such roads included on the "List" are declared to be the public roads and subject to proper maintenance according to their classification; and that the said "**LUTHER MAC LANE**" is not on the List; and

WHEREAS, it is unlawful for the Blount County Highway Department to maintain any road not on the List; and

WHEREAS, it has been enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee and confirmed by a two-thirds majority of the members of the Blount County Legislative Body in regular session, that Blount County may add such roads meeting the conditions set forth in the said Act hereinafter referred to in this Resolution as the "Act", whereby it may be lawful then for the Blount County Highway Department to maintain roads accepted for addition to the

List under the terms of the Act; and, Blount County has accepted roads by the exercise of a Policy pursuant to some terms of the Act and to other General Highway Laws of the State of Tennessee; and,

WHEREAS, "**LUTHER MAC LANE**" meets the conditions for consideration under the terms of the Policy;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Blount County Legislative Body in regular session assembled on this 17th day of February, 2005, that "**LUTHER MAC LANE**" shall be added to the "List of Official Roads of Blount County."

SECTION 1.) It is intended that this Resolution embrace the terms and conditions of the Policy herein referred to above in the adding of "**LUTHER MAC LANE**" to the "List of Official Roads of Blount County."

SECTION 2.) That the improvements contemplated are those which have been reviewed and approved by the Highway Committee of the Blount County Legislative Body; the estimate of costs for which is determined to be \$ 6,494.00 for the "cold mixed asphalt" surface treatment; and that approximately 1160 feet of "**LUTHER MAC LANE**" from its intersection with Morganton Road to a dead end shall be added to the "List of Official roads of Blount County."

SECTION 3.) That appropriate budgetary consideration be given to the Blount County Highway Department for the expenditure of Blount County's share of the costs to upgrade the condition of "**LUTHER MAC LANE**", said county share is estimated to be approximately \$ 2,165.00.

SECTION 4.) That the appropriate administrative procedures to accomplish the collection of funds representing the participation of the various property owners in the expenses of upgrading "**LUTHER MAC LANE**" be implemented in cooperation with such other Blount County Government Departments as might be necessary.

SECTION 5.) That this Resolution shall become effective upon completion of all the terms of the Act and of this resolution.



**STAFF ANALYSIS. Rezoning request from R-2-Rural District 2 to R-1-Rural District 1 for land described as Blount County Tax Map 83 parcel 67 at 461 Lovers Lane – public hearing and action to recommend.**


**Background:** John Wheeler owns a tract of land of approximately 16 acres at 461 Lovers Lane (see map on next page for location of property hatched). The portion of the lot immediately fronting on Lovers Lane is zoned R-1, allowing 23,000 square foot lots to a depth of about 100 to 150 feet (variable). The remainder of the land is in R-2 zone with minimum 5 acre lots size. Mr. Wheeler wishes to develop the remainder of his property at a higher density, and thus requests rezoning from R-2 to R-1.

**Analysis:** The part of the parcel outside the present R-1 zone covers approximately 14.5 of the 16 acres and is presently zoned R-2. The land has relatively gentler slopes nearer the road, progressing to steep slopes near the rear of the parcel. Several potential homesites exist on gently rolling to moderately steep land, with fair to good access up to about midway on the parcel. The rear of the parcel up to the ridgeline is of such slope that it would not be appropriate for R-1 zoning.

The immediately adjacent parcel 68.01 was recently rezoned from R-2 to R-1 and is of similar character to the front half of the subject parcel. The land is presently in residential use, as is all the land adjacent. The proposed rezoning will not have any use implications, but would have implications for density of development. The proposed rezoning would be an adjustment of the zone boundary and would not change the overall tenor of the use in the area for the front half of the property. The proposed rezoning would be generally consistent with the 1101 growth plan for rural areas and with the land use plan.

Staff notes that the rear half of the property is not appropriate for the R-1 zone due to slope. The approximate division between acceptable and unacceptable areas runs from the intersection of rear lot line of adjacent parcel 68.01 approximately 650 feet from center line of Lovers Lane, then about 250 feet southwest to a point about 575 feet from road center line, then about 250 feet southwest to a point about 405 feet from road center line, then about 200 feet to a point on the southwestern parcel line approximately 365 feet from center line of Lovers Lane. The division is shown on the *(following)* map as dark dotted line.

# R-2



Lovers Lane is shown on the new roads list as 16 feet of paved width. The list was not updated to reflect repavement of the road after utility construction. Field measurements show that Lovers Lane (two lane section) is 18 feet of paved width, except for one small area of slightly less than 18 feet going toward Old Walland Highway. The first section of Lovers Lane

proceeding from Old Walland Highway is divided into separate lanes of approximately 10 to 12 feet of width. There are no signs indicating that the divided lanes are one-way. The present situation and any new substantial development beyond the divided lanes would indicate the need for one-way signage.

Staff observes that much of the distance of Lovers Lane from subject property to Old Walland Hwy does not have 2 foot shoulders. The status of shoulders has not been an issue in the past for rezonings. However, there is a potential for shoulders to be a limiting factor in relation to the intended subdivision of the land.

**Recommendation:** Staff recommends for approval of the rezoning request for approximately the first half of the subject property, to dotted line indicated on the above map. The appropriate action by the Planning Commission is recommendation to the County Commission.

A PROCLAMATION REGARDING THE DESIGNATION OF THE NATIONAL INCIDENT  
MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS) AS THE BASIS FOR ALL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT IN BLOUNT  
COUNTY

**WHEREAS:** In Homeland Security Directive (HSPD)-5, the President directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State, Local and Tribal Governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to, and recover from domestic incidents. regardless of cause, size, or complexity, and

**WHEREAS:** The collective input and guidance from all Federal, State, Local and Tribal Homeland Security Partners has been, and will continue to be, vital to the development, effective implementation and utilization of a comprehensive NIMS, and

**WHEREAS:** It is necessary and desirable that all Federal, State, Local and Tribal emergency agencies and personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management, and

**WHEREAS:** To facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management, it is critical that Federal, State, Local and Tribal organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structure, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified command structure, uniform personnel qualification standards, and uniform standards for training and exercising, emergencies or disasters, and

**WHEREAS:** The NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities, and resources will improve the State's ability to utilize federal funding to enhance local and state agency readiness, maintain first responders safety, and streamline incident management processes, and

**WHEREAS:** The Incident Command System components of NIMS are already an integral part of various incident management training programs, and

**WHEREAS:** The National Commission of Terrorist Attacks (9-11 Commission) recommended adoption of a standardized Incident Command System.

**NOW THEREFORE I, BEVERLEY D. WOODRUFF**, Mayor of Blount County, Tennessee, by virtue of authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby establish the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the County Standard of incident management.



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Homeland Security Presidential Directive/HSPD-5



Subject: Management of Domestic Incidents

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Purpose

(1) To enhance the ability of the United States to manage domestic incidents by establishing comprehensive national incident management system.

Definitions

(2) In this directive:

(a) the term "Secretary" means the Secretary of Homeland Security.

(b) the term "Federal departments and agencies" means those executive departments enumerated in 5 U.S.C. 101, together with the Department of Homeland Security; independent establishments enumerated in 5 U.S.C. 104(1); government corporations as defined by 5 U.S.C. 103(1); and the United States Postal Service.

(c) the terms "State," "local," and the "United States" when it is used in a geographical sense shall have the same meanings as used in the Homeland Security Act of 2002, Public Law 107-296.

Policy

(3) To prevent, prepare for, respond to, and recover from terrorist attacks, major disasters, and other emergencies, the United States Government shall establish a single, comprehensive approach to domestic incident management. The objective of the United States Government is to ensure that all Federal departments and agencies have the capability to work efficiently and effectively together in a national approach to domestic incident management. In these efforts, with regard to domestic incident management, the United States Government treats crisis management and consequence management as an integrated function, rather than as two separate functions.

(4) The Secretary of Homeland Security is the principal Federal official for domestic incident management. Pursuant to the Homeland Security Act of 2002, the Secretary is responsible for coordinating Federal operations within the United States to prepare for, respond to, and recover from terrorist attacks, major disasters, and other emergencies. The Secretary shall coordinate the Government's resources utilized in response to or recovery from terrorist attacks, major disasters, and other emergencies if and when any one of the following four conditions applies: (1) a Federal department or agency acting under its own authority has requested the assistance of the Secretary; (2) the resources of State and local authorities are overwhelmed and Federal assistance has been requested by the appropriate State and local authorities; (3) more than one Federal department or agency

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become substantially involved in responding to the incident; or (4) the Secretary has been directed to assume responsibility for managing the domestic incident by the President.

(5) Nothing in this directive alters, or impedes the ability to carry out, the authorities of Federal departments and agencies to perform their responsibilities under law. All Federal departments and agencies shall cooperate with the Secretary in the Secretary's domestic incident management.

(6) The Federal Government recognizes the roles and responsibilities of State and local authorities in domestic incident management. Initial responsibility for managing domestic incidents generally rests with State and local authorities. The Federal Government will assist State and local authorities when their resources are overwhelmed, or when Federal interests are involved. The Secretary will coordinate with State and local governments to ensure adequate planning, equipment, training, and exercise. The Secretary will also provide assistance to State and local governments to develop all-hazard plans and capabilities, including those of greatest importance to the security of the United States, and to ensure that State, local, and Federal plans are compatible.

(7) The Federal Government recognizes the role that the private and nongovernmental sectors play in preventing, preparing for, responding to, and recovering from terrorist attacks, major disaster emergencies. The Secretary will coordinate with the private and nongovernmental sectors to develop adequate planning, equipment, training, and exercise activities and to promote partnerships in incident management capabilities.

(8) The Attorney General has lead responsibility for criminal investigations of terrorist acts or threats by individuals or groups inside the United States, or directed at United States citizens or institutions abroad, where such acts are within the Federal criminal jurisdiction of the United States, as well as for related intelligence collection activities within the United States, subject to the National Security Act of 1947 and other applicable law, Executive Order 12333, and Attorney General procedures pursuant to that Executive Order. Generally acting through the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Attorney General, in cooperation with other Federal departments and agencies engaged in activities to protect our national security, shall also coordinate the activities of the members of the law enforcement community to detect, prevent, preempt, and disrupt terrorism against the United States. Following a terrorist threat or an actual incident that falls within the jurisdiction of the United States, the full capabilities of the United States shall be dedicated, consistent with United States law and with activities of other Federal departments and agencies to protect national security, to assisting the Attorney General to identify the perpetrators and bring them to justice. The Attorney General and the Secretary shall establish appropriate relationships and mechanisms for cooperation and coordination between their two departments.

(9) Nothing in this directive impairs or otherwise affects the authority of the Secretary of Defense, Department of Defense, including the chain of command for military forces from the President to the Commander in Chief, to the Secretary of Defense, to the commander of military forces, or military command and control procedures. The Secretary of Defense shall provide military support to the authorities for domestic incidents as directed by the President or when consistent with military command and appropriate under the circumstances and the law. The Secretary of Defense shall retain authority over military forces providing civil support. The Secretary of Defense and the Secretary shall establish appropriate relationships and mechanisms for cooperation and coordination between their two departments.

(10) The Secretary of State has the responsibility, consistent with other United States Government activities to protect our national security, to coordinate international activities related to the preparation, response, and recovery from a domestic incident, and for the protection of United States citizens and United States interests overseas. The Secretary of State and the Secretary shall establish appropriate relationships and mechanisms for cooperation and coordination between their two departments.

(11) The Assistant to the President for Homeland Security and the Assistant to the President for Security Affairs shall be responsible for interagency policy coordination on domestic and international incident management, respectively, as directed by the President. The Assistant to the President

Homeland Security and the Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs shall work ensure that the United States domestic and international incident management efforts are united.

(12) The Secretary shall ensure that, as appropriate, information related to domestic incident and provided to the public, the private sector, State and local authorities, Federal department agencies, and, generally through the Assistant to the President for Homeland Security, to the The Secretary shall provide standardized, quantitative reports to the Assistant to the Preside Homeland Security on the readiness and preparedness of the Nation – at all levels of govern prevent, prepare for, respond to, and recover from domestic incidents.

(13) Nothing in this directive shall be construed to grant to any Assistant to the President any issue orders to Federal departments and agencies, their officers, or their employees.

#### Tasking

(14) The heads of all Federal departments and agencies are directed to provide their full and cooperation, resources, and support, as appropriate and consistent with their own responsibi protecting our national security, to the Secretary, the Attorney General, the Secretary of Defe Secretary of State in the exercise of the individual leadership responsibilities and missions: paragraphs (4), (8), (9), and (10), respectively, above.

(15) The Secretary shall develop, submit for review to the Homeland Security Council, and a National Incident Management System (NIMS). This system will provide a consistent nationw approach for Federal, State, and local governments to work effectively and efficiently togethe for, respond to, and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size, or complexi for interoperability and compatibility among Federal, State, and local capabilities, the NIMS v core set of concepts, principles, terminology, and technologies covering the incident commar multi-agency coordination systems; unified command; training; identification and managemer resources (including systems for classifying types of resources); qualifications and certificatic collection, tracking, and reporting of incident information and incident resources.

(16) The Secretary shall develop, submit for review to the Homeland Security Council, and a National Response Plan (NRP). The Secretary shall consult with appropriate Assistants to th (including the Assistant to the President for Economic Policy) and the Director of the Office o and Technology Policy, and other such Federal officials as may be appropriate, in developin implementing the NRP. This plan shall integrate Federal Government domestic prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery plans into one all-discipline, all-hazards plan. The NR unclassified. If certain operational aspects require classification, they shall be included in cla annexes to the NRP.

(a) The NRP, using the NIMS, shall, with regard to response to domestic incidents, provide tl and mechanisms for national level policy and operational direction for Federal support to Sta incident managers and for exercising direct Federal authorities and responsibilities, as appro

(b) The NRP will include protocols for operating under different threats or threat levels; incor existing Federal emergency and incident management plans (with appropriate modifications revisions) as either integrated components of the NRP or as supporting operational plans; ar opera-tional plans or annexes, as appropriate, including public affairs and intergovernmental communications.

(c) The NRP will include a consistent approach to reporting incidents, providing assessments making recommendations to the President, the Secretary, and the Homeland Security Coun

(d) The NRP will include rigorous requirements for continuous improvements from testing, ex experience with incidents, and new information and technologies.

(17) The Secretary shall:

(a) By April 1, 2003, (1) develop and publish an initial version of the NRP, in consultation with Federal departments and agencies; and (2) provide the Assistant to the President for Homeland Security with a plan for full development and implementation of the NRP.

(b) By June 1, 2003, (1) in consultation with Federal departments and agencies and with State governments, develop a national system of standards, guidelines, and protocols to implement the NRP and (2) establish a mechanism for ensuring ongoing management and maintenance of the NRP including regular consultation with other Federal departments and agencies and with State governments.

(c) By September 1, 2003, in consultation with Federal departments and agencies and the Assistant to the President for Homeland Security, review existing authorities and regulations and prepare recommendations for the President on revisions necessary to implement fully the NRP.

(18) The heads of Federal departments and agencies shall adopt the NIMS within their departments and agencies and shall provide support and assistance to the Secretary in the development and implementation of the NIMS. All Federal departments and agencies will use the NIMS in their domestic incident management and emergency prevention, preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation as well as those actions taken in support of State or local entities. The heads of Federal departments and agencies shall participate in the NRP, shall assist and support the Secretary in the development and maintenance of the NRP, and shall participate in and use domestic incident reporting system protocols established by the Secretary.

(19) The head of each Federal department and agency shall:

(a) By June 1, 2003, make initial revisions to existing plans in accordance with the initial version of the NRP.

(b) By August 1, 2003, submit a plan to adopt and implement the NIMS to the Secretary and the Assistant to the President for Homeland Security. The Assistant to the President for Homeland Security shall advise the President on whether such plans effectively implement the NIMS.

(20) Beginning in Fiscal Year 2005, Federal departments and agencies shall make adoption of the NIMS a requirement, to the extent permitted by law, for providing Federal preparedness assistance grants, contracts, or other activities. The Secretary shall develop standards and guidelines for determining whether a State or local entity has adopted the NIMS.

As outlined in letters dated January 7, 2005 and mailed to the Mayors of Alcoa, Maryville, and Blount County, we have received notice from the Tennessee Department of Environment & Conservation of the annual adjustments to the Financial Assurance required for the Alcoa / Maryville / Blount County Sanitary Landfill. Recall that, starting in 2002, TDEC annually calculates the financial assurance required for closure and post closure monitoring of the various permit areas of the Landfill. While the calculated amounts shown in our financial agreements change, our responsibility and liability for closure and post-closure monitoring do not. In that regard, the funds being set aside for this work will remain the same and are included in the tipping fee charged each Landfill customer.

Enclosed for your review and for forwarding to your respective council / commission are copies of correspondence from TDEC. As noted, these letters were also mailed to each of the Mayors. I've also enclosed a summary table and the amendments that will require the signatures of all three Mayors. Please place on the next council / commission agenda authorization for approval of this amendment. These are the same - with updated amounts provided by TDEC - as were approved annually by each elected body in since 2002. Let me know when these are approved so originals of the amendments may be distributed for execution. (Note: The contract amount for SNL 05-103-0105 has decreased. This is the closed Class I / Household Waste cell and should continue to decrease annually as our post-closure monitoring period continues to diminish.)

Commissioner Keith Brock made a motion to approve all nine(9) changes, with \$25.00 per employee payroll deduction. Motion failed for a lack of a second. Commissioner David Graham made a motion to re-visit this issue during next months meeting to allow teachers and employees to discuss possible changes, second by Commissioner Donna Dowdy. Roll call vote as follows: Brock-yes, Dowdy-yes, Graham-yes, McCall-absent, and Walker-yes. Motion passed. General discussion followed.

The Blount County Planning Commission met in regular session on Tuesday December 21, 2004, at the Courthouse. Staff was represented by: John Lamb, Director of Planning; Douglas Hancock, Planner; Roger Fields, Building Commissioner; and Gaye Hasty, administrative assistant.

Commissioners Present: Chairman, Ed Stucky, Rick Brownlie, Joe Everett, Gary Farmer, Steve Gray, Tom Hodge, Bob Kidd, Bruce McClellan, Carl McDonald, Kenneth Melton, Bill Proffitt, and Jim Scully. Commissioners Absent: None.

The minutes of the November 23, 2004 regular monthly meeting were approved. Prior to the meeting, these were mailed to members for review.

**Long Range Planning & Zoning:**

**Rezoning request from R-2 rural District 2 to R-1 rural District 1 for land described as Blount County Tax Map 83 parcel 67 at 461 Lovers Lane – Public Hearing and action to recommend:**

The property is owned by John Wheeler and is a total of 16 acres located at 461 Lovers Lane. The portion of the lot immediately fronting on Lovers Lane is zoned R-1. The part of the parcel outside the present R-1 zone covers approximately 14.5 of the 16 acres and is presently zoned R-2. There are several potential home sites located outside the R-1 zone. The steep land begins midway through the tract of land. The higher sloped area on the back side of the property would not be appropriate for the R-1 zone. The adjacent parcel 68.01 was recently rezoned from R-2 to R-1 and is of similar character to the front half of the subject parcel. The proposed rezoning would be generally consistent with the 1101 growth plan for rural areas and with the land use plan.

The new roads list shows Lovers Lane as having 16 feet of paved width. The road has been resurfaced recently and field measurements now show a paved road width of 18 feet with the exception of one small area that is slightly less than 18 feet. The road does split into two, one-way sections at the first section of Lovers Lane at the Old Walland Highway. There are no signs indicating that the divided lanes are one-way. Mr. Lamb recommended that signage be placed in the area where the road is divided to accommodate the higher density. Mr. Lamb also noted that much of the distance of Lovers Lane from subject property to Old Walland Highway does not have 2 foot shoulders.

Based on the analysis of the land and the consistency of the past rezoning in the area, Planning Department staff recommended for approval of the rezoning request for approximately the first half of the subject property, to the dotted line

indicated on the map furnished in the staff memo. The appropriate action by the Planning Commission is recommendation to the County Commission. The item was then opened up for public comment.

Mr. Don Tipton a resident of Lovers Lane Road across from the subject property stated that he had a right of way to a spring located on the subject property. Mr. Lamb replied that staff and the surveyors were aware of the right of way to the spring and that notations would be made on the plat when the land is developed.

Commissioner McDonald asked Mr. Tipton if the area on Lovers Lane had become more heavily developed or if it were still as it were a few years ago with larger acreage tracts with single family dwellings. Mr. Tipton replied that much of the land had been divided into tracts for family members in which homes or mobile homes had been placed.

Commissioner McDonald expressed concern over taking large acreage tracts and allowing them to be rezoned to make 23,000 square foot lots.

Commissioner McClellan made the motion to accept the rezoning request and recommend to the County Commission. Commissioner Kidd seconded the motion. A roll call was taken:

The rezoning request was approved with 9 yes votes and 3 no votes. The request will now be recommended to the County Commission.

**Public Hearing and action to recommend; Request to close Barkshed Road at the intersection with McGhee Road.**

The Highway Department forwarded a request by property owners along Barkshed Road to close the road at the interchange with McGhee Road making Barkshed Road a dead end. There will be improvements to McGhee Road to bring it to a level of adequate infrastructure due to a preliminary plat approval. The adequate access will then allow people to access through McGhee Road to Mint Road. However, there are potential problems of pass through traffic from the new subdivision and existing development onto Barkshed Road and then onto Carpenter Campground Road. The issues of inadequate road width and geometrics of Barkshed Road are well taken in the petition.

The Highway Department does not support the closing of Barkshed Road. Staff defers to the Highway Department regarding this matter. Required procedure and action for such requests is review and recommendation by the Planning Commission to the County Commission.

This was not presented as a public hearing, but people were in attendance to speak on the request.

Mr. Dennis Johnson a resident of Barkshed Road for 13 years stated that he would like to see Barkshed Road left open. He stated that improvements to McGhee Road would most likely divert traffic to Mint Road.

Mrs. Kathleen Coning Butler stated that she was a lifelong resident of this road. Mrs. Butler stated that when she was a young child Barkshed Road was closed at this interchange and was opened up at the interchange with McGhee Road in 1953. She stated the farmers in the area would have problems getting to areas where they have crops and livestock if this road were closed.

Commissioner Proffitt made the motion to accept the recommendation of the County Highway Superintendent and leave Barkshed Road open at the interchange with McGhee Road. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Melton. The motion received unanimous approval.

**Clarification of minimum standard for road shoulder as condition precedent to platting.**

Mr. Lamb pointed out one addition that was made at the last meeting and not explicit to the November memo. The addition was included on page 9 of the December memo to Planning Commissioners. The purpose of the addition was for the purpose of determining paved width of roads. The roads list maintained by the Blount County Highway Department showing road pavement width shall be the basis for determination, provided that direct measurement showing roads of greater width than listed may be considered. The clarification of road shoulders was also included in the memo. Mr. Dunlap stated that he was in agreement with the addition.

Commissioner McDonald stated that a part of the deliberation at the November meeting included the Highway Superintendent having the final decision on whether or not the road would be sufficient for purposes of a major subdivision. He expressed concern that this was not included in the changes in the December memo.

Mr. Lamb stated that this matter was addressed in part (b) of the amendment stating "Minimum off-site Road Standards as Criteria Precedent to Platting. Except upon recommendation of the County Road Superintendent..." Mr. Lamb explained that the minimum would be eighteen (18) feet except upon his

recommendation. The only way he would get the recommendation would be if a study were done along with his recommendation for consideration by the Planning Commission.

Clarification was given regarding the last paragraph of the amendment regarding squeeze points. Mr. Lamb explained that this would set a base that the Planning Commission could not go below.

Commissioner Kidd stated that he felt it was very important for Mr. Dunlap to have discretionary power to make recommendations in certain situations and by having this in the amendment allows him to do so.

Commissioner Melton made the motion to approve the amendment as presented for the public hearing. Commissioner Brownlie seconded the motion. The motion received unanimous approval.

### **Policy on centralized on-site wastewater sewer as public sewer.**

This item was presented for clarification purposes. The plat for Kinzel Springs was approved during the November meeting that had a public sewer indication for the development. There was a lack of communication regarding the approval. The past approval of "public sewer" regarding the sand filtration system required that the system be owned and operated by a public utility. The proponents of the Kinzel Springs plat were going under what the State allows. The State does allow several alternatives; one of those being private ownership of the physical plant and public utility operation.

Mr. Norman Newton gives his opinion that ownership is not a necessary issue under present wording of regulations. He further recommended that if the Planning Commission wishes to require both ownership and operation by a public utility that more specificity given to the subdivision regulations. Based on opinion of Mr. Newton, the Kinzel Springs plat should be accepted with provision of a privately owned system as designed, but with condition that it be operated by a public utility. Mr. Lamb provided this information to the proponents of the subdivision.

Mr. Lamb offered suggestions of what is to be required at final plat stage: 1) documentation of approval of the sewer system by the state; 2) review by Norman Newton of supporting documents concerning agreements between the private entity (property owner's association) and the public utility; and 3) certification on the final plat by the public utility that the alternate wastewater system has been installed and will be operated by the public utility. This is consistent with past requirements on plats and also past requirements for any common elements to be maintained by a property owner's association.

Mr. Lamb also noted that there would be some lots off of the main Kinzel Springs plat that will not be served by the system. Mr. Lamb suggested that the developers confer with the Highway Department to find out if there are constraints with installing private elements in a public right-of-way. This could be solved by taking them out of the private right-of-way.

Commissioner Scully asked who would be responsible for the cost of maintaining the system.

Mr. Lamb replied that the developer would install the system and then it will be turned over to the property owner's association in three to five years.

Commissioner McClellan asked who would maintain it when the property owner's association takes it over.

Mr. Lamb answered that it would be hired out to the public utility district for that area which is East Sevier. The public utility will run and have the maintenance responsibility for that system.

Commissioner McDonald wanted to know who would insure proper maintenance of the system once the developer sells all the lots and it is turned over to the property owner's association.

Mr. Rick Erving with Jordan, Jones, and Goulding Engineering stated that the developers had negotiated a contract with East Sevier Utility District to maintain the operation of the system. These systems are regulated by the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation. There is a NDPS permit that has to be obtained from the State of Tennessee. There are tests that have to be performed on a monthly basis. Those results are submitted to TDEC. If there is a violation, the State comes back to East Sevier Utility District and they will make them repair the system or fix it. It is totally regulated by TDEC. The property owner's association will hold ownership or deed of trust to this site. There is a thirty year lease with East Sevier Utility District for maintenance of the system.

Mr. Lamb stated that the Hunter Interest Group would be specifically addressing this issue and will have some recommendations regarding these on-site systems. He stated that he just wanted to bring the Commission up to speed on what had been approved and make sure that everyone understood what was involved in the approval.

**Request to reconsider proposed amendment on adequate school infrastructure in light of past Commission action.**

This item came before the Commission at the request of Commissioner Scully to reconsider the proposed amendment on adequate school infrastructure. This request was prompted by the denial of a preliminary plat at the November

meeting. Mr. Lamb stated that if subdivision plats are going to be turned down using this criteria it is best to have something in the regulations.

Commissioner Scully made the motion to approve the proposed amendment to the Subdivision Regulations as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner McDonald.

Mr. Lamb reminded the Commission that this motion would be to set the public hearing to amend the subdivision regulations.

Commissioner Everett stated that he felt this matter should be looked at further before the regulations are amended. He also expressed concern over lawsuits being filed over plat denials when there are possible opportunities to do something to relieve the over crowding in specific areas. He stated that just because there were not enough seats in one particular school did not mean that there were not enough seats in the entire county.

Commissioner Farmer stated that he was concerned with the term "any school" being classified as intolerable would be cause to turn down a subdivision. He cited the report of the school board indicating that Heritage Middle School is now classified as intolerable but would be changing the next school year due to rezoning. He stated that if the Commission justifies its actions, two or three schools being classified as intolerable would be reason for denial but not using one school being classified as intolerable.

Commissioner Hodge stated that he was not sure whose responsibility that it was to make sure the schools are not over crowded. He stated that he felt the Planning Commission had a responsibility to not make the problem worse, but also voiced concern that they were not the only government body that should dictate and have control of the issue. He stated that he was not sure that the Planning Commission should be making those decisions. He further stated that he felt it was the responsibility of the elected officials (County Commission) to address the issues of how to resolve the over crowding of the schools. Commissioner Hodge stated that he did not want to make the situation worse, but wanted to see the problem solved. The problem is still going to exist even if the regulations are put into place. The Planning Commission cannot solve the problem it has to be taken to a higher level.

Commissioner McDonald reminded the Commission that the existing regulations state that the Commission shall not approve any subdivision of land if the infrastructure is not in place. He stated that schools are defined as infrastructure. He stated that it is the responsibility of the Planning Commission as they are the body that decides on the subdivision of land. He stated that the County Commission funds whatever they fund including schools. The Board of Education is obligated to take care of every student that walks into a school. The Planning Commission is the only one that directly affects the growth by enlarging

the number of available lots for home construction. Commissioner McDonald stated that the Planning Commission is the only place that the issue is dealt with until the infrastructure is changed. When the infrastructure is changed, then the Planning Commission can relax the rule or abolish the rule. When the infrastructure is not in place and there is a rule that says we shall not approve a subdivision without the proper infrastructure in place, then the Planning Commission is violating its own rule.

Commissioner Gray stated that if the Planning Commission is going to engage in turning down subdivision plats based on the schools, then the wording should be in the regulations. This is based on the advice of Attorney Stephen Wise.

Commissioner Stucky stated that he had a concern regarding the way the amendment is written. As the paragraph is written, it is an absolute and already within the regulations the Planning Commission has the obligation to turn down a subdivision if the infrastructure is not in place. He stated that as the paragraph is written now it leaves no leeway. If a subdivision comes before the Commission that will generate no students, the way the paragraph is written the subdivision must be turned down. He stated that this was his major concern with the proposed amendment.

Commissioner McDonald stated that he had empathy to the point Commissioner Stucky made. He stated that he is not sure how the language should be structured in the regulations to help deal with developments which would not involve school age children.

Mr. Lamb addressed the Commission at this time and suggested that the Commission set the standard as it had been done with the roads and have a provision for a developer impact study. This report would detail what the subdivision would be and would commit that development to a certain market that would or would not generate a certain number of students. The School Department would then review the study and report back to the Planning Commission before action. That would leave the decision to the discretion of the Planning Commission based on findings of the School Board and the developer. The Planning Commission would be the final judge.

Commissioner McDonald made the request to withdraw the second he had made to the motion to allow Mr. Lamb to make the discussed revisions to the proposed amendment. Commissioner Scully withdrew his motion.

Commissioner Everett pointed out that the revisions should include lifting criteria of denial once money is approved for the new schools.

**Policy on notification to developers of plats denied based on inadequate infrastructure.**

Mr. Lamb stated that this had been discussed with the situation of lifting criteria and will be deferred to the January meeting.

**Request to reopen discussion on possible amendment to the Rural Arterial Commercial Zone regulations.**

This will be deferred to the January meeting.

**Discussion of sign regulations.**

This will be deferred to the January meeting.

**HEARINGS**

**Concept Plans: None.**

**Preliminary Plats – Major Subdivisions:**

**Lili Marlene off Lee Shirley Road:**

The Lili Marlene Subdivision off Lee Shirley Road is a proposed 13 lot subdivision along a proposed private road.

The proposed subdivision is located within the Lanier Elementary School, Carpenters Middle School, and William Blount High School zones. The School Department lists Lanier Elementary as “Intolerable”, Carpenters Middle as “High” (meeting two of the three criteria for overcrowding), and William Blount High as “Intolerable”.

Lee Shirley Road has an average 16 to 18 feet paved surface. From the location of the proposed subdivision the road is 18 feet or wider to Russell Hollow Road and to the Loudon County line. The Highway Department has indicated that Lee Shirley Road is satisfactory for this plat.

Noting the issue of schools to be resolved, and based on internal design, Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for preliminary plat approval subject to the following:

- A high intensity soil map must be supplied to the Environmental Health Department staff prior to final plat submittal as some lots may require restrictions, lot line modifications or combination.

- All erosion control must be in place prior to any on-site construction. Any and all road and drainage changes must be submitted in writing and prior to modifications in the field. Any construction or road activity prior to a pre-construction conference on-site with the developer and all contractors is at the risk of the developer. Supply copy of SWPPP to staff prior to pre-construction meeting with staff.
- Property Owner's Association documentation for all common elements including the private road and drainage facilities to be supplied prior to final plat. Review of this document by the Attorney for the County Mayor may be required.
- Payment of \$40.00 per lot platting fee prior to final plat.

Commissioner Hodge stated that he would like to see some way of keeping record in the order in which they are presented so that in the case that one of the schools is taken off the intolerable classification that the developer may resubmit the plat.

Mr. Lamb stated that staff would keep a record of the plats denied and will notify the individuals when the school situation changes.

Mr. Ken Mack the developer of this subdivision addressed the Commission and asked about the plat being a "phased development". Mr. Mack asked if he could get a preliminary approval and then come back in a year for final plat approval. Mr. Mack stated that he would agree to a condition of plat approval that only three or four lots could be sold until further approval is gained from the Planning Commission.

Mr. Lamb explained that Mr. Mack is willing to have a four lot, year- by- year type of development on this subdivision. He stated that this was within the spirit of the discussions being held regarding 4 lots being considered minor impact year- by- year.

Commissioner Brownlie stated that he understood the concept of approving the lots in a matter of increments like year-to-year. Commissioner Brownlie asked if the regulations would allow him to come back month-by-month for the approvals.

Mr. Lamb stated that the specific wording applied only to one lot subdivisions. The regulations state that you cannot bring a succession of one lot subdivisions in for approval in one month. It has to be month-by-month. He is not aware of anything phased like this. Mr. Lamb stated that Mr. Mack wanted approval so that he could put the entire road in as a unit and then bring back a phased lot-by-lot situation.

Commissioner Melton clarified that it would be appropriate to put in four lots a year and the Commission could make a motion to allow him to do this on an annual basis.

Mr. Lamb stated that it would be appropriate until the school situation was resolved in that district. He would get final plat approval on four lots only. The condition on that would be that he would have to wait 12 months before he came back with another four lots.

Mr. Mack stated for the record that he was in agreement with the approval of the preliminary plat so that the infrastructure for the entire subdivision can be put into place and then getting four lot final plat approvals per year for the subdivision.

Commissioner Melton made the motion to approve the preliminary plat as recommended by staff, with provision of four lot maximum final plat per year as agreed to by Mr. Mack. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Brownlie.

Commissioner Scully pointed out that the neighbor across the street is getting flooded out now and the road has not even been put in.

Mr. Mack stated that he has spoken with the Highway Department regarding this problem and it will be addressed.

Mr. Hancock stated that staff had gone back to the engineer regarding this problem. When the original plat was designed there was not a drainage plan or detention basin. Sterling Engineering re-evaluated the property and designed a large detention basin that will be located on lot 1. Mr. Hancock stated that he had an alternate recommendation for Mr. Mack. He stated that if Mr. Mack builds the entire road then he also has to build all of the drainage and detention facilities with no guarantee that the school situation will never change. The alternate recommendation stated that if Mr. Mack decided to do four lots off of a common driveway with a remainder greater than five acres he would not be responsible for putting in a paved road. He would be allowed to use a gravel road and would only have to put in four, one-inch water lines. This would be consistent with the temporary nature of that road. If the situation changed he would not have a lot of development money up front. That would be a total of four lots and a remainder greater than five acres giving him a minor plat which would not be a problem for the schools. Lot 1 could be reserved for the future detention facility.

Mr. Mack has indicated that he does not desire to have a common driveway but would rather install the road now.

Commissioner Hodge asked if it would be possible for a developer to take the risk of putting in a road and the utilities and then gaining approval for four lots on a month-to-month basis. In three months he could gain approval for a total of twelve lots. He asked if this was a possible loop hole in the regulations. Commissioner Hodge stated that he felt this could be used to get by the intolerable classification for more than four lots.

Commissioner Stucky stated that this was a valid point and felt that it should be addressed later in the agenda.

Commissioner McDonald asked if there was a legal issue involved with this regarding preliminary plat approval and the final plat approval not being given within the one year time frame.

Mr. Hancock replied that the preliminary plat would have to be extended for a period of one year. There is a 24 month window on preliminary plats. The preliminary plat would have to be re-submitted.

Commissioner Stucky re-stated the motion to be approved. The motion which was seconded was to approve the preliminary plat as recommended by staff with a phased implementation with a maximum of four lots to be approved at final plat stage. The preliminary plat would be approved for a total of 13 lots with the subsequent build out relying upon infrastructure being in place and a maximum of four lots per year at final plat approval.

Commissioner Melton called for the question which gained unanimous approval from the Commission.

The motion to approve the preliminary plat as re-stated by Commissioner Stucky then received unanimous approval.

Commissioner Stucky stated that Commissioner McDonald had brought up a good point earlier in the meeting that needed to be addressed. Commissioner McDonald asked that the loop hole that some one could come in month after month with a minimum subdivision or something less than a major subdivision be addressed.

Commissioner McDonald explained that the City of Maryville has within its regulations that you cannot come back month to month because it changes the configuration to a major subdivision and all the lots are then considered to be major. At that point all the lots have to meet the regulations for a major subdivision rather than the rules for a minor subdivision.

Mr. Lamb stated that he would get with the City of Maryville and find out how the situation is addressed.

#### **Re-plat of Tract 4 of Chilhowee Hills Baby Farms:**

The re-plat of Tract 4 of Chilhowee Hills Baby Farms off Norcross Road is a proposed 4 lot subdivision with 2 lots being served exclusively by a 25' common driveway easement.

The School Department did express concern regarding the schools being over capacity located within the district of this subdivision. The schools affected are Montvale Elementary, Heritage Middle School and Heritage High School. The proposal regarding the school infrastructure does not affect minor plats.

Planning staff finds that the preliminary plat for the re-subdivision of Tract 4 of Chilhowee Hills Mini Farms meets the design standards of the subdivision regulations with respect to lot design. Planning, Engineering and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for preliminary plat approval subject to:

- A high intensity soil map must be supplied to the Environmental Health Department staff prior to final plat submittal as some lots may require restrictions, lot line modifications or combination.
- All erosion control must be in place prior to any on-site construction. A pre-construction conference by the developer, all contractors and county staff is required prior to any construction. Any construction or road activity prior to a pre-construction conference on-site with the developer and all contractors is at the risk of the developer. Any applicable Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) permit shall be supplied to staff.
- Water is to be metered at Norcross Road and individual lines installed to each lot prior to final plat.
- A Maintenance Agreement to be supplied prior to final plat for the maintenance of the common driveway.
- Payment of \$20.00 per lot platting fee.

Commissioner Melton pointed out that this had originally been platted as a mini-farm.

Mr. Lamb explained that mini-farm was a loop hole for five acre tracts years ago that did not forestall them from subdividing at a future date unless that is a restriction on the lot itself.

Commissioner Scully made the motion to disapprove the plat.

Commissioner Stucky stated that there had to be a basis for denial.

Commissioner Scully stated that he just didn't agree with it.

Commissioner Stucky explained to Commissioner Scully that there had to be a reason for denial.

Commissioner Scully stated that he did not like the lay out of the subdivision and the fact that there were farms all around.

Commissioner Hodge asked for clarification of the regulations which would allow a subdivision of land regardless of the environment which is around it.

Mr. Hancock replied that the Planning Commission is still compelled even if the private restrictions stated that the property could not be re-divided, to approve or recommend for approval because that is a private covenant.

The motion died for lack of a second.

Commissioner Farmer made the motion to approve the preliminary plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Everett. The preliminary plat was approved with Commissioner Scully voting no.

**Final Plats: Major Subdivisions:**

**Rosewood Subdivision, Phase 1 (previously Rosebrook Subdivision):**

The Rosewood Subdivision, Phase 1 off Lee Lambert Road is a proposed 35 lot subdivision with new county roads. The preliminary plat was approved as the Rosebrook Subdivision in August of 2004. The new property owner is Jeff Hodge.

Commissioner Hodge mentioned for clarification purposes that he is no relation to the property owner.

Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for Phase 1 final plat approval subject to:

- Name change to Rosewood Subdivision to apply to the previously approved preliminary plat for Rosebrooke Subdivision as approved in August of 2004.
- Letter from the Highway Department for the status of the Bridge improvements.
- Property Owner's Association documentation should be supplied for review and consultation with Attorney for the County Mayor, as necessary.
- Payment of \$40.00 per lot platting fee prior to final plat.

Commissioner Hodge made the motion to approve the plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Everett. The plat was approved with Commissioner Kidd abstaining from the vote. Commissioner McDonald was absent during this part of the meeting.

**Preliminary and Final Plats – Major Subdivisions: None.**

**Preliminary and Final Plats – Minor Subdivisions:**

### **Bible Property:**

The Bible Property off West Miller's Cover Road is a proposed 3 lot subdivision with 2 lots served along the county road and 1 served by a 25' easement.

The School Department did express concern regarding the schools being over capacity located within the district of this subdivision. The schools affected are Walland Elementary, Heritage Middle School and Heritage High School. The proposal regarding the school infrastructure does not affect minor plats.

Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for preliminary and final plat approval subject to:

- Common Driveway note to be added to the final plat for any potential future re-subdivision.
- Payment of the \$60.00 platting fee.

Commissioner Everett made the motion to approve the plat as recommended by staff. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Brownlie.

Commissioner McClellan stated that a note should be added to the plat regarding the spring located on lot 3 and any rights adjoining property owners may have to that spring or spring house.

Staff added this as part of the recommendation for approval.

The motion to approve the preliminary and final plat was approved unanimously.

Commissioner Farmer had questioned earlier why the School Department was sending evaluations on minor subdivisions with 4 lots or less.

Mr. Lamb replied that the earlier request was made by the Planning Commission to send all plats for review by the School Department. He stated that they could change it and send only major plats.

Commissioner Stucky clarified with the Planning Commission that their wish was to only send major plats to the School Department for comment.

### **Douglas Cox Property:**

The Douglas Cox Property off Flats Road is a proposed 3 lot subdivision served off the existing county road.

Planning, Engineering and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for preliminary and final plat approval subject to:

- Marking of lot corners by the project surveyor; final staff evaluation for driveway locations, and any driveway restrictions to be noted on the final plats.

- Signature plats.
- Payment of the \$60.00 platting fee.

Commissioner Melton made the motion to approve the preliminary and final plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Brownlie. The plat received unanimous approval.

**Re-subdivision of the Kenneth Cottrell Property:**

The re-subdivision of the Kenneth Cottrell Property off Lanier Road is a proposed 4 lot subdivision with 3 lots served off the existing county road and 1 lot to be served by a 25' easement.

Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for preliminary and final plat approval subject to:

- Common Driveway note to be added to final plats for any potential future re-subdivision.
- Signature plats including utilities.
- Payment of the \$80.00 platting fee.
- Improvements to be made at tile as recommended by subdivision inspector and remove brush piles.

Commissioner Brownlie made the motion to approve the plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Melton. The preliminary and final plat received unanimous approval.

**Re-plat of Lot 4 Brewers Ridge:**

The preliminary and final plat for the re-plat of Brewers Ridge is a proposed 4 lot subdivision with 3 lots having county road frontage and 1 lot to be served by a 25' easement.

The previous plat for Brewers Ridge, including lot 4 was approved as a four lot subdivision off of Brewer Road at the November 2004 regular meeting. The present plat is for the re-plat of one of the lots of the same overall property from last month, bringing the total lot count to seven lots.

The proposed subdivision is located within the Lanier Elementary School, Carpenters Middle School, and William Blount High School zones. The School Department lists Lanier Elementary as "Intolerable", Carpenters Middle as "High", and William Blount High as "Intolerable".

Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for preliminary and final plat approval subject to:

- Final lot line delineation by the Environmental Health Department and any necessary lot restrictions noted on the final plat.

- Common Driveway note to be added to final plats for any potential future re-subdivision.
- Completion of all ditch improvements and certification from the project engineer.
- Signature plats including all utilities.
- Payment of the \$80.00 platting fee.

Commissioner Hodge asked if this was an example of what he had indicated earlier about prior month approvals.

Commissioner Gray questioned staff as to what requirements would have been different if this had been presented as a 7 lot subdivision.

Mr. Hancock answered that Brewer Road is 18 feet wide. The road is a non-issue. The School Department has given a negative report on both plats. The only major difference would have been with the engineering. They did look at engineering on these four lots because they passed the five lot threshold. The previous four lots were not considered but it is possible that they would have had to put in some kind of a detention facility for seven small lots. In this case, their engineer said that they do not need the detention facility for the four lots. So there is a minor loop hole that has been used.

Mr. Greg Stroud, surveyor addressed the Commission at this time regarding this plat. He explained that the plat was going to originally be submitted as a seven lot subdivision but he was scheduled to be out of town for over a week on personal matters. The information was already in place for a seven lot subdivision. The developer decided to present the plat as a four lot subdivision with three, one acre tracts and one, 4.5 acre tract. Mr. Stroud stated that if he had been in town, the plat would have been submitted as one plat.

Commissioner Hodge stated that by presenting the plats as he had done actually worked to the advantage of the developer because they were considered as minor plats.

Mr. Lamb explained that both plats were presented as Brewer's Ridge Subdivision. This is one unit of development. It is not two units separately and apart. This is one contiguous development.

Commissioner Hodge stated that if this is the way the regulations are laid out and whether they agree with it or not, the regulations allow this.

Commissioner Brownlie asked if going from 4 lots to 7 lots would automatically change it to a major subdivision.

Mr. Lamb explained that he had brought in two successive minor plats and they have to be reviewed as such.

Commissioner Proffitt made the motion to approve the preliminary and final plat as recommended by staff. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hodge. A roll call vote was taken:

The preliminary and final plat was approved with 7 yes votes and 4 no votes.

**Zurma Caldwell and Bruce Henry Property:**

The Zurma Caldwell and Bruce Henry Property is a proposed 3 lot subdivision off the existing county road and a remainder greater than 5 acres.

Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for preliminary and final plat approval subject to:

- Final lot line delineation by the Environmental Health Department and any necessary lot restrictions noted on the final plat.
- Signature plats including utilities.
- Payment of the \$60.00 platting fee.
- Driveway restrictions for all driveways.
- Clear the fence rows.

Commissioner Proffitt made the motion to approve the plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Brownlie. The motion received unanimous approval.

**Miscellaneous Items:**

**Site Plans:**

**Addition to the Agenda:**

Mr. Fields requested that a site plan revision be added to the agenda. Commissioner Everett made the motion to add the item to the agenda, seconded by Commissioner Melton. The motion received unanimous approval.

**Site Plan revision for Aquajet Auto Wash:**

The site plan for Aquajet Auto Wash was approved at the June 2004 meeting of the Blount County Planning Commission. The revised site plan being presented is to change the direction of the footprint of the building. All setbacks will be met by this new site plan and buffering will still be required. Mr. Fields recommended for approval of the revised site plan.

Commissioner Hodge made the motion to approve the revised site plan as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Melton. The site plan revision was approved unanimously.

**Seymour Air Park, Inc. at 1010 Boling Road:**

The site plan is for an additional airplane hanger to be located at 1010 Boling Road in the Seymour Air Park. The site plan indicates a 100' x 200' structure and all building setback requirements will be met. This is considered to be an expansion of an existing non-conforming use. The Air Park pre-dates our zoning regulations. Mr. Fields recommended for approval of the site plan.

Commissioner Scully made the motion to approve the site plan as recommended by staff. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Brownlie and received unanimous approval.

**Mitchell Myers at 3832 Morganton Road:**

This site plan is for a storage building to be located at 3832 Morganton Road at the present site of MDI Self Storage. The proposed building measures 55' x 40' and will be used as storage space. This is considered to be an expansion of an existing non-conforming use. All building setbacks will be met. All parking must be located off of the public road right of way and could be a gravel lot. Mr. Fields recommended for approval of the site plan.

Commissioner Melton made the motion to approve the site plan as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Everett. The site plan received unanimous approval.

**Harrison, Inc. off of Court Street:**

The site plan for Harrison, Inc. is for the relocation of the Harrison Concrete and Asphalt plant. The site plan that has been submitted is incomplete at this time. Mr. Fields asked that this item be postponed.

Commissioner Brownlie made the motion to postpone this item, seconded by Commissioner Melton. The motion received unanimous approval.

**Continuation of Long Range Planning.**

**Scheduling consideration of Hunter Interests Growth Study recommendations.**

Mr. Lamb suggested that extra meetings be held to go over the Hunter Interests Growth Study. After discussion, it was decided to hear subdivision plats first in the meeting and then do long range planning for approximately two hours. This will begin in January.

**Scheduling consideration of revisions to Subdivision Regulations.**

This will be worked in with long range planning time.

**Staff reports.**

**Adjournment.**

HOUSE BILL 1397  
By McCord

AN ACT to authorize the "Blount County Adequate Facilities Tax."

WHEREAS, Blount County, Tennessee, has been growing at an accelerated rate over the past several years, having been impacted by the location of new industry in the county and by rapid growth in the standard metropolitan area of Knoxville, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, projected nonresidential development, the availability of jobs and residential expansion are anticipated to stimulate a significant demand for new dwelling units in the county; and

WHEREAS, projected growth and land use development will cause an increased demand for county-provided public facilities and services; and

WHEREAS, Blount County is committed, for the benefit of both present and future residents, to maintaining a level of public facilities and services commensurate with those presently provided; and

WHEREAS, the Blount County's present population, employment base, tax base, and budget cannot alone support the additional revenues needed to supply facilities and services to serve new growth without a substantial increase in the property tax rate on existing development; and

WHEREAS, due to these circumstances, it is necessary and appropriate that Blount County be given authorization to extend its taxing power to enable the county to impose a fair and reasonable share of the cost of public facilities necessitated by new development on that development so as not to create an unfair and inequitable burden on existing county residents and taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the most logical and effective mechanism to accomplish the intended result would be to authorize Blount County to levy a privilege tax on new residential and non-residential development in the county outside of the incorporated areas of the cities of Maryville and Alcoa; now, therefore

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Blount County Adequate Facilities Tax."

SECTION 2. As used in this act, unless a different meaning appears from the context:

(1) "Blount County adequate facilities tax board of appeals" means the board established in Blount County to hear appeals regarding the taxes assessed under this act.

(2) "Building" means any structure, including any addition to an existing structure, constructed for residential or nonresidential support, shelter, or enclosure of persons, chattels, or movable property of any kind; the term includes a mobile home but excludes those building's specified in section 6.

(3) "Capital projects" means new and expanded county public facilities and services; any public facility or service requiring the expenditure of public funds, over and above annual local operating expense, for the purchase, construction, or replacement of the physical assets of the county are included.

(4) "Capital improvements program" means a proposed schedule of future capital projects, listed in order of construction priority, together with cost estimates and the anticipated means of financing each project.

(5) "Certificate of occupancy" means a license for occupancy of a building or structure issued in Blount County outside the incorporated areas of the cities of Maryville and Alcoa.

(6) "Development" means the construction, building, reconstruction, erection, extension, betterment, or improvement of land providing a building or structure or the addition to an existing building or structure, or any part thereof, which provides, adds to, or increases the floor area of a residential or nonresidential use.

(7) "Dwelling unit" means a room, or rooms connected together, constituting a separate, independent housekeeping establishment for owner occupancy, rental or lease on a daily, weekly, monthly, or longer basis; physically separated from any other rooms or dwelling units which may be in the same structure; and containing independent cooking and sleeping facilities.

(8)

(A) "Floor area" for residential development means the total of the gross horizontal area of all floors, including basements, cellars, or attics, which is heated or air conditioned living space, or designed to be finished into heated or air conditioned living space at a future date.

(B) "Floor area" for nonresidential development means the total of the gross horizontal area of all floors, including usable basements and cellars, below the roof and within the outer surface of the main walls of principal or accessory buildings or portions thereof, or within lines drawn parallel to and two feet (2') within the roof line of any building or portions thereof without walls, but excluding arcades, porticoes, and similar open areas which are accessible to the general public, and which are not designed or used as sales, display, storage, service, or production areas.

(9) "New" means new to Blount County.

(10) "Nonresidential" means the development of any property for any use other than residential use, except as may be exempted by this act.

(11) "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, joint venture, association, corporation, estate, trust, business trust, receiver, syndicate, or other group or combination acting as a unit, and includes the plural as well as the singular number.

(12) "Place of worship" means that portion of a building, owned by a religious institution which has tax-exempt status, which is used for worship services and related functions; provided, however, a place of worship does not include buildings or portions of buildings which are used for purposes other than for worship and related functions or

which are or are intended to be leased, rented, or used by persons who do not have tax-exempt status or which are intended or used as a dwelling unit for any person.

(13) "Public building" means a building owned by the state or any agency thereof; a political subdivision of the state, including but not necessarily limited to counties, cities, school districts, utility districts, and special districts; or the federal government or any agency thereof.

(14) "Residential" means the development of any property for a dwelling unit.

SECTION 3. It is the intent and purpose of this act to authorize Blount County to levy and collect a privilege tax on new development in the county outside the incorporated areas of the cities of Maryville and Alcoa so as to ensure and require that the persons responsible for new development share in the burden of growth by paying their fair share of the cost of new expanded public facilities and services ("capital projects") made necessary by such development.

SECTION 4. Engaging in the act of development within Blount County outside of the incorporated areas of Maryville and Alcoa is a privilege upon which Blount County may, by resolution of its legislative body, levy a tax in an amount not to exceed the rates set forth in Section 7.

SECTION 5. The county's legislative body shall levy the tax by resolution after adopting a capital improvements program indicating the need for capital projects anticipated to be funded, in part, by the tax and after finding that the need for such capital projects is reasonably related to development in the county outside of the incorporated areas of the cities of Maryville and Alcoa. The resolution of the county legislative body levying this tax shall state the rates of the tax on new residential and nonresidential development. The county's legislative body shall, by resolution, adopt administrative guidelines, procedures, regulations and forms necessary to properly implement, administer, and enforce the provisions of this act.

SECTION 6. This act shall not apply to the development of:

- (1) Public buildings;
- (2) Places of worship;
- (3) Barns or outbuildings used for agricultural purposes;

(4) Replacement of buildings or structures for previously existing buildings or structures destroyed by fire, or other disaster; or

(5) A building or structure owned by a non-profit corporation which is a qualified 501(c)(3) corporation under the Internal Revenue Code.

SECTION 7. For the exercise of the privilege described in Section 4, the legislative body of Blount County may levy a tax on new development in the county outside the incorporated areas of the cities of Maryville and Alcoa not to exceed:

(1) One dollar (\$1.00) per gross square foot on new residential development; and

(2) Fifty cents (\$0.50) per gross square foot on new nonresidential development.

The county may develop a tax rate schedule by which residential and nonresidential uses are classified by type for the purpose of imposition of the tax authorized by this act.

SECTION 8. The tax established by this act shall be due and collected at the time of application for a certificate of occupancy to the official duly authorized to issue a certificate of occupancy for a building or structure located in the county outside of the incorporated areas of the cities of Maryville and Alcoa.

The tax herein authorized is declared to be a lien against the real property upon which the development has occurred until paid and shall be superior to all other liens on such property except for property tax liens. Interest of one percent (1%) per month, and a penalty of one half percent (1/2%) per month shall be added to the tax due if not paid when first due, unless the taxpayer successfully contests the applicability of such tax by appeal as provided in this act. Notice of such lien may be, but is not required to be, recorded in the office of the register of deeds for Blount County, Tennessee. Such lien may be enforced by action instituted in any court of competent jurisdiction in Blount County for sale of the real property to enforce the lien.

SECTION 9. All tax funds collected shall be used to provide capital projects and to reduce debt incurred therefor and shall be deposited into the county's general and debt service funds for such purposes.

SECTION 10. The authority to levy this privilege tax on new development in Blount County outside the incorporated areas of the cities of Maryville and Alcoa is in addition to all other authority to impose taxes, fees, assessments, or other revenue raising or land

development regulatory measures granted either by the public or private acts of the state, and the levy of such tax, in addition to any other authorized tax, fee, assessment, or charge, shall not be deemed to constitute double taxation.

#### SECTION 11.

(a) Any person aggrieved by the decision of a official duly authorized to issue a certificate of occupancy for a building or structure located in the county outside the incorporated areas of the cities of Maryville and Alcoa or of any other responsible official concerning any aspect of this act may obtain review of the such decision in the following manner:

(1) By payment of the disputed amount of the tax to Blount County and by notifying the official that the payment is made under protest; and

(2) By requesting an appeal of the decision of the official in written form within ten (10) days of the protest and payment.

(b) Appeals shall be heard by the Blount County adequate facilities tax board of appeals (the "board"). A hearing shall be scheduled within forty-five (45) days of the written request for appeal. The board shall rule on all appeals within thirty (30) days of the hearing date, unless the hearing is continued from time to time by a majority vote of the board for further information.

(c) The board shall act as an administrative or quasi-judicial body that determines the intent of this act and its applicability to the appellant taxpayer and rules upon the decision of the official. The board shall not be bound by formal rules of evidence applicable to the various state courts.

(d) Hearings before the board shall proceed as follows:

(1) The official duly authorized to issue the certificate of occupancy or other responsible official shall explain the ruling and the reasons for the ruling.

(2) The appellant taxpayer shall explain such taxpayer's reasons for protesting the official's decision.

(3) The board may request further information from any county or city official, employee, or attorney. The board shall not have the power to subpoena.

(4) The board shall deliberate and render its ruling by a majority vote.

The board's ruling shall be reduced to writing and shall become a part of the board's minutes. Copies of the rulings shall be sent to the respective parties.

Rulings of the board shall be final, except that either the official duly authorized to issue the certificate of occupancy or other responsible official or the appellant taxpayer may seek review of the board's actions by common law writ of certiorari proceeding in any court of competent jurisdiction in Blount County.

SECTION 12. If any provisions of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to that end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 13. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the county legislative body of Blount County. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the county legislative body and certified by him to the Secretary of State.

SECTION 14. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes it shall become effective upon being approved as provided in Section 13.






