Tennessee Code/TITLE 67 TAXES AND LICENSES /CHAPTER 1 GENERAL PROVISIONS /PART 4 COUNTY BOARDS OF EQUALIZATION /67-1-401. Composition of boards.

67-1-401. Composition of boards.

(a) The county legislative body of each county shall, at the April session of each even year, from the different sections of the county, elect, for a term of two (2) years, five (5) freeholders and taxpayers who shall constitute a county board of equalization.

(1) In any county having a population greater than eight hundred thousand (800,000) according to the 1990 federal census or any subsequent federal census, the county board of equalization shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years, consisting of nine (9) freeholders and taxpayers, of which three (3) members shall be appointed by the county commission or governing board, three (3) members shall be appointed by the city council or governing board of the largest municipality, and one (1) member each shall be appointed by the city councils or governing boards of each of the three (3) largest remaining cities having a population greater than ten thousand (10,000). The county legislative body shall administer the board of equalization, but each legislative body shall pay its appointed representatives in accordance with the resolution as adopted by the county legislative body. Each legislative body appointing members to the board shall pay its prorated share of the funding for the board. Any municipality which has an appointment to the board and which has a population of less than fifty thousand (50,000) may elect not to appoint a representative.

(2) In cities of a population of sixty thousand (60,000) or over according to the federal census of 1970 or any subsequent federal census, two (2) members of the board shall be appointed by the city council or existing governing board of such taxing district.

(3) In counties having one (1) or more cities with a population of not less than ten thousand (10,000) nor more than sixty thousand (60,000), one (1) member of the board shall be appointed by the city council or governing body of each of the two (2) largest cities with a population in excess of ten thousand (10,000), within the county.

(4) In counties which have no city having a population of ten thousand (10,000) or more, one (1) member of the board shall be appointed by the city council or governing board of the largest city or town in the counties.

(5) (A) In a county with a metropolitan form of government, the charter for the metropolitan government may provide for the creation of a metropolitan board of equalization consisting of either five (5) or seven (7) members. Appointments to such board shall include members selected from minorities, as well as members of the sex which historically have been under-represented on the board of equalization. The provisions of this subdivision (a)(5)(A) shall not apply to such counties having a population of less than ten thousand (10,000) according to the 1980 federal census or any subsequent federal census.

(B) If a county with a metropolitan form of government having a population of not less than four hundred seventy thousand (470,000) nor more than five hundred thousand (500,000) according to the 1980 federal census or any subsequent federal census creates a board of equalization consisting of seven (7) members, at least two (2) of the members of the board shall be appointed consistent with the provisions of subdivision (a)(5)(A).

(b) If the county legislative body fails to elect, the county mayor shall appoint the members of the board and shall also fill such vacancies as the vacancies occur.

(c) (1) Magistrates or state, municipal or county legislative or executive officials or employees shall all be ineligible for positions on a county board of equalization, but this prohibition does not apply to persons who receive only compensation in lieu of expenses or a per diem payment for services. No member of any county board of equalization shall represent any taxpayer in an assessment appeal. The provisions of this subsection (c) do not apply to municipal officials or employees whose city, located in a county with a population of eight hundred thousand (800,000) or more according to the 1990 federal census or any subsequent federal census, is not eligible to appoint a member to the board.

(2) (A) Notwithstanding other provisions of this subsection (c), except in counties having a population of more than eighty-five thousand (85,000) but less than eighty-six thousand (86,000) according to the 1990 federal census or any subsequent federal census, state employees may be appointed to the county board of equalization if their employment responsibilities do not include property assessments, except that in counties having a population of more than eight hundred thousand (800,000), according to the 1990 federal census or any subsequent federal census, state employees shall not be appointed to the county board of equalization.

(B) No state employee serving on the county board of equalization shall be compensated by the state for time served on the county board except that an otherwise eligible employee may use accumulated annual leave to serve on the county board with approval of the employee's supervisor.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN TASK FORCE

WHEREAS, Internet crimes against children are growing each year and law enforcement needs its own cyber units and the ability to carry out investigations that transcend traditional geographic boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Internet usage by children will involve more than 45 million children in the next four years; and

WHEREAS, the Knoxville Police Department is the recipient of a grant from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (Grant 2000 MC-CX-K004) to investigate Internet crimes against children; and

WHEREAS, the grant calls for the Knoxville Police Department to train up to ten law enforcement agencies in the investigation and prosecution of Internet crimes against children.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Knoxville Police Department and the Blount County Sheriff's Department hereby form a joint partnership through this Memorandum of Understanding to provide the following:

The Knoxville Police Department, hereby known as the grantor agency, will provide the subgrantee agency with:

1. Computer equipment including a personal computer, printer and software appropriate for the investigation of Internet crimes.

2. Training for the subgrantee agency personnel assigned to the Internet Crimes against Children Task Force ("ICAC") at its Knoxville location and at the subgrantee's

location.

3. Guidelines for the operation of the ICAC unit, in accordance with the guidelines that have been approved by the National Internet Crimes Against Children Board of Directors and the ICAC Program Operational and Investigative Standards.

4. Technical assistance in the handling of forensic evidence and court presentation when necessary.

The Blount County Sheriff's Department, hereby known as the subgrantee agency, will:

1. Designate personnel to investigate and prosecute Internet crimes against children.
2. Allow designated personnel to attend training in ICAC and will provide transportation to off-site training.
3. Provide secure space for the ICAC unit to work and ensure that the computer equipment will only be used for the investigation of ICAC cases.
4. Provide an Internet connection for the unit to investigate ICAC crimes.
5. Work with the local district attorney general to prosecute ICAC crimes when evidence warrants prosecution.
6. Maintain statistics on cases investigated, opened, prosecuted and closed and submit information to the grantor agency on a quarterly basis.
7. Ensure that investigations and prosecutions of Internet crimes against children initiated prior to this Memorandum of Understanding are kept segregated from investigations and prosecutions under ICAC
8. Ensure that, should equipment cease to be used for ICAC investigations, said


equipment will be returned to the grantor agency.

This agreement shall be effective as of the date set forth below, and shall be effective for the life of the above-mentioned grant or three years, whichever comes first. Either party may cancel the Memorandum of Understanding by providing a letter of notice to cancel the Memorandum of Understanding, noting the date of the cancellation.







Dear Mayor Myers:

One issue which arose at last week's Tube Committee meeting was whether the Little River is a "navigable waterway."

Some members of the committee performed on-line research regarding this issue and provided me with a printout from the website www.americanwhitewater.org. What these individuals failed to realize is that there is a legal definition of a navigable waterway and a practical definition of a legal waterway.

From a practical standpoint, the Little River is a navigable waterway. Individuals are able to navigate down the channel on inner tubes, and in the past, the channel was used to float logs to the mill.

The analysis regarding whether the Little River fits the legal definition of navigable waterway provides a different result. The legal definition of navigable water requires the waterway to be of sufficient depth, width, and volume to allow "useful commerce." The waterway must have sufficient volume to allow the movement of vessels which are ordinarily employed for the purpose of commerce. Tennessee courts have previously determined whether certain waterways are legally navigable, but I can find no case which establishes whether the Little River is or is not legally navigable.

Based on my reading of various cases and statutes, I reiterate my position that the Little River is not a navigable waterway. While the river is certainly used for commerce as evident by the large number of tubes, I do not believe that these tubes constitute "vessels" as discussed in various cases nor do I believe that this tubing commerce is the same type of commerce contemplated by the cases. The commerce you see referenced in case law deals primarily with the floating of barges and the transportation of goods along the waterway.

The issue of navigability is important for one reason: it helps answer the question of who owns the waterway. Streams, lakes, and rivers which are navigable in a legal sense cannot be privately owned, but streams, lakes, and rivers which are navigable only in the practical sense may be owned by the adjoining property owners. The general public does have an easement along these waterways for the purpose of transportation and commerce. Regardless, the adjoining landowners own the stream, lake and riverbeds underneath the water.

My interpretation of this issue is merely my opinion, and a court of law may very well disagree.

I enclose for your review Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency Rule 1660-1-1-.01. This provision may help you and the committee as you develop the "rules of the river" as discussed at last week's meeting.

And as always, I am glad to research any specific questions you or the committee have regarding this or any other issue. As I stated at the meeting, one of the easiest solutions for the city is to more closely monitor trespassing on the land along the river. In addition, the city may wish to implement a permit/licensing requirement for companies operating tube businesses within the corporate limits. At the end of the day, however, neither of these options addresses the core issue which is reducing a large number of tubes on the river.

CHAPTER 1660-1-1 RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR TENNESSEE WILDLIFE RESOURCES AGENCY
MANAGED ACCESS AREAS

Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. R. 1660-1-1-.01 (2005)

1660-1-1-.01 PUBLIC USAGE

(1) All access areas are open to the general public, at all times, free of charge for use subject to the following rules:

(a) Picnicking is permitted.

(b) Camping is prohibited except when authorized in writing by the Executive Director.

(c) Unattended boats and/or vehicles shall not be left in such a manner as to deprive or interfere with other persons' access to boat ramps and parking areas. No houseboats duck blinds, commercial fishing boats or structures shall be left or built within the access areas' boundaries.

(d) No person, or persons, shall deface or remove trees or other plants, dirt, gravel or sod or any structure placed on the area by the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency or with the approval of the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency.

(e) No garbage, rubbish, litter or any refuse, sewage or other material which would pollute said areas or waters, or render them unsatisfactory or unsanitary shall be left on the area.

(f) Commercial use of access areas, including cleaning of fish and mussel shell processing is prohibited, except commercial fisherman may launch or remove their boats in said areas. Agricultural use and grazing is prohibited.

(g) The use of firearms is prohibited except for hunting during the regular state-wide open season, and then is limited to shotguns only. Target shooting prohibited at all times.

(h) Disorderly conduct and/or use of intoxicants and/or other behavior modifying substances are prohibited.

(i) Swimming from or on ramps or in such a manner as to deprive or interfere with the launching or removal of boats is prohibited.

(j) Handicapped parking zones, as posted are reserved for handicapped users.

(k) Parking regulations will be enforced as posted. Officers of the Wildlife Resources Agency may, at their discretion, have offending vehicles towed or issue citations.

RESOLUTION NO. 227-06-1C

Resolution to Adopt the Recommendation from the Tubing Committee

WHEREAS, the number of individuals using the Little River for tubing during the summer of 2005 increased dramatically; and

WHEREAS, the City of Townsend Commission received numerous complaints and inquiries from residents and visitors regarding tubing operations along the Little River; and

WHEREAS, regulation of tubing operations on the Little River is necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of citizens, residents, business owners, and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the City of Townsend Tubing Committee has made recommendations to the City of Townsend Commission regarding tubing operations along the Little River;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the City of Townsend, Tennessee as follows:

Section 1. The City of Townsend adopts the Tubing Committee's recommendations in their entirety, including:

- a. All tube businesses must obtain a regular business license from the Blount County Courthouse;**
- b. Tube businesses must purchase a "Tube Business Permit" from the City of Townsend. This Tube Business Permit must be accompanied by proof of liability insurance and a reasonable fee to be determined by the City of Townsend at a later date;**
- c. Tube businesses are to instruct tube users of the guidelines regarding use of the Little River. A sign must be posted at tube businesses outlining the following guidelines:**
 - i. No alcoholic beverages are allowed on the river.**
 - ii. Littering is not permitted within the river or along the river banks.**
 - iii. Trespassing on private property is strictly prohibited.**
 - iv. Tubers must enter and exit the Little River only at designated areas.**
 - v. Tubers must only use designated restroom facilities.**
 - vi. Children 12 years old and under must be accompanied by a parent and wear a life vest at all times.**
- d. The City of Townsend, Tennessee shall purchase and install large signs indicating entrance and exit points along the river.**

- e. The City of Townsend, Tennessee shall also purchase small signs with this information. Residents and property owners along the Little River may purchase these signs from the City of Townsend.
- f. The City of Townsend, Tennessee and/or the Tube Committee shall notify property owners along the river that small signs may be purchased from the City. In addition, this correspondence shall be printed in The Daily Times and Local Yokel.

Section 2. These recommendations are necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of citizens, residents, business owners, and visitors to the City of Townsend, Tennessee.

BLOUNT COUNTY OPEN BURNING POLICY

1.1 Open Burning Prohibited

After the effective date of these regulations, no person shall cause, suffer, allow, or permit open burning of any kind except as specifically permitted in this section.

1.2 Definitions

“Air Curtain Destructor” is a portable or stationary device that directs a plane of high velocity forced draft air through a manifold head into a burn chamber with vertical walls in such a manner as to maintain a curtain of air over the surface of the burn chamber and a recirculating motion of air under the curtain. The use of an air curtain destructor is considered controlled open burning.

“Air Pollution Emergency Episode” is defined as air pollution alerts, warnings, or emergencies declared by the Blount County Environmental and Codes Office during adverse air dispersion conditions that may result in harm to public health or welfare.

“Natural Disaster” is defined as any event commonly referred to as an “Act of God” and includes, but is not limited to the following weather related or naturally occurring categories of events: tornadoes, hail and wind storms, snow or ice storms, flooding, and earthquakes.

“Open Burning” is the burning of any matter under such conditions that products of combustion are emitted directly into the open atmosphere without passing directly through a stack.

“Person” is any individual, partnership, co-partnership, firm, company, corporation, association, joint stock company, trust, estate, political subdivision, agency, authority, commission, department of the United States government, or of the State of Tennessee government; or any other legal entity, or their legal representative, agent, or assigns.

“Registered Sanitary Landfill” is defined as one approved by the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, Division of Solid Waste Management, to which a registration number has been assigned.

“Wood Waste” is defined as any product which has not lost its basic character as wood, such as bark, sawdust, chips, and chemically untreated lumber whose “disposition” by open burning is to solely get rid of or destroy.

1.3 Exceptions to Prohibition - Without Permit

Open burning, as listed below, may be conducted without permits subject to specified limitations and provided further that no detriment to public health, no land, air, or water traffic hazard is created, and no public nuisance is or will be created by such open burning. This grant of exemption shall in no way relieve the person responsible for such burning from the consequences or the damages, injuries, or claims resulting from such burning, or of the responsibility of obtaining any other permit from any other agency.

- A. Fire used for cooking food, ceremonial, or recreation purposes, including barbecues, and outdoor fireplaces. This exception does not include commercial food preparation facilities and their operation.
- B. Comfort heating on construction jobs provided the burning is in suitable metal containers and only untreated wood is burned. This is not to be construed to allow burning of painted or chemically treated wood for comfort heating. Open burning for comfort heat is not permitted when the local ambient temperature exceeds 45°F.
- C. Fires set at the direction of law enforcement agencies or courts for the purpose of destruction of controlled substances and legal drugs seized as contraband. Priming materials used to facilitate such burning shall be limited to #1 and #2 grade fuel oils.

1.4 Exceptions to Prohibition - With Permit

Open burning may be allowed in Blount County outside Alcoa and Maryville City limits when a valid permit has been obtained from the Department for the following purposes prior to the initiation of the open burning providing no detriment to public health, no public nuisance, and no land, air, or water traffic hazard is created.

- A. Open burning may be conducted to clear land of brush wood (of which no part may exceed three (3) inches in diameter) grown on that land where the land is being maintained for the following purposes:
 - 1. Established private residences, consisting of one or two dwelling units.
 - 2. Farming operations, growing crops for human or animal consumption or raising livestock for human consumption. Note: commercial nursery operations are not included in this description. Commercial nursery operations are those businesses where plants (trees, shrubs, etc.) are grown for transplanting, for use as stocks for budding and grafting, or for sale.
 - 3. Established church congregational property.

This will not be construed to allow burning of materials cleared to prepare land for any construction purposes. NOTE: The term "brush wood" excludes leaves, grass clippings, and stumps.

- B. Open fires may be set for the training and instruction of public or private fire-fighting personnel. Provided all applicable conditions are met; including, but not limited to:
 - 1. Application is made not less than 10 days prior to the proposed burn date. Failure to submit completed forms or to supply any requested supplementary information concerning a proposed open burning operation shall constitute just cause for refusing issuance of a permit.
 - 2. The following certifications must be made with the application, on the date of application:
 - a. Certification that the structure is free of asbestos;
 - b. Certification that the structure is free of asphalt shingles;
 - c. Certification that the burn is for training purposes;
 - d. Certification that a traffic hazard will not be generated.
 - 3. Routine demolition of structures via supervised burning by responsible fire control personnel will not be considered fire training or an elimination of a fire hazard. Therefore, such activity deemed not for training or fire hazard elimination purposes is prohibited.

C. (Reserved)

D. Such other open burning as may be approved by the Blount County Environmental and Codes Office where there is no other practical , safe, and/or lawful method of disposal. Documentation demonstrating why the requirements of these Regulations cannot be met must be submitted. The Director(s) will determine whether to approve or disapprove after receipt of the documentation and completion of the staff inspection.

Open burning of materials must be conducted in conformity with the following conditions:

- 1. All material to be burned must be dry and in other respects be in a state to sustain good combustion.
- 2. No fire shall be ignited while any air pollution emergency episode is in effect in the area of the burn.

3. Open burning must be conducted when ambient conditions are such that good dispersion of combustion products will result.
4. For open burning exceeding one month in duration, alternate disposal methods must be investigated and a written report of progress must be delivered to the Blount County Environmental and Codes Office.
5. All changes in the types of, or increase in quantities of materials burned must be preceded by notification to the Department for Director's review. The Director(s) will determine whether to approve or disapprove the changes. This notification must be delivered to the Blount County Environmental and Codes Office.
6. Nothing in this Section is intended to preclude, or restrict, the Blount County Environmental and Codes Office from stipulating additional requirements as a condition of permitting or denying a permit as it deems appropriate.

1.5 Open Burning Conditions - With Permit

All open burning shall be between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. or as authorized by the Department.

- A. All vestiges of open burning shall be non-existent in the air no later than 4:00 p.m.
NOTE: Materials may not be burned in piles exceeding 144 cubic feet.
- B. Under adverse meteorological or weather conditions as determined by the Director(s), and on "air pollution action days", all permits shall be invalid, and no open burning shall be allowed. "Air pollution action days" are those days on which the Department has determined that air pollution levels may potentially exceed a National Primary Ambient Air Quality Standard. These standards are identified in 40 CFR 50.
- C. Permits must be received and maintained on site prior to commencement of and during burning.
- D. All material to be burned must be dry and in other respects be in a state to sustain good combustion.
- E. The granting of an open burning permit shall in no way relieve the person responsible for such burning from the consequences or the damages, injuries, or claims resulting from such burning, or of the responsibility of obtaining any other permit from any other agency.

- 1.6 None of the exceptions listed in paragraphs 1.3 or 1.4 are to be construed to allow the open burning of leaves, tires, plastics, synthetics, grass clippings, stumps, waste fluids, garbage, treated wood, wire insulation, or construction rubbish including, but not limited to shingles, siding, insulation, asphalt, or coal tar impregnated products, etc.

- 1.7 Regardless of any other provision in these Regulations, the use of any air curtain destructor will be prohibited in Blount County after June 1, 2006. None of the exceptions listed in paragraphs 1.3 or 1.4 (including 1.4.D) are to be construed to allow the use of an air curtain destructor after this date. Exceptions may be made at the discretion of the agency until September 30, 2006.

The County Commission is requested to approve the resolution necessary for the County's compliance with the EPA Phase II Stormwater regulations:

1. Illicit Discharge Resolution

Recall that these and other regulatory requirements promulgated under the Phase II regulations were first reviewed by the County's Phase II Stormwater Citizen Advisory Committee, a seven-member board. This committee met in 2002 and 2003 to determine the various facets of the County's Phase II program. Several presentations were presented to the County Commission by John Lamb and Lamar Dunn & Associates, Inc. describing the Phase II program and its federal mandates. County staff met with representatives from Maryville and Alcoa to develop the specific requirements of the resolution. Maryville and Alcoa have already adopted this as an ordinance within their Phase II programs. In addition to review by the County Attorney, this resolution was also distributed to the Stormwater Advisory Committee for their review.

As supplement to the full-text resolution, a summary is provided below.

Illicit Discharge

- Prohibits discharge into the storm sewer system and/or a receiving stream of various specific and general wastes that may cause environmental harm.
- Such discharges may be direct (a piped connection to the County's drainage system) or indirect (across a parking lot and into curb & gutter, etc.).
- Also noted are several discharges that are not considered illegal such as runoff from lawn sprinkler systems, washing of cars from residences, and car washes (for no more than two consecutive days) by non-profit organizations. Note that there is some effort to prohibit discharges from fundraising car washes by non-profit organizations. However, staff elected not to prohibit those unless specifically directed to do so by state / federal regulators.
- Notification requirements for spills.
- Notices of violations and penalty fines for violations. As with the Soil Erosion & Sediment Control Resolution, the County is allowed to levy penalties for amounts up to \$5,000 per day per violation.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING REGULATIONS TO PROTECT WATER QUALITY IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF BLOUNT COUNTY BY PROHIBITING, SUPPRESSING, AND PREVENTING THE CONTAMINATION OF STORM WATER BY ILLICIT DISCHARGE OF POLLUTANTS.

WHEREAS, Tenn. Code Ann. § 5-1-118(c) authorizes counties, by adoption of a resolution by two-thirds (2/3) vote of their respective legislative bodies, to exercise those powers granted to all or certain municipalities by Tenn. Code Ann. § 6-2-201(22) and (23), with specified exceptions; and

WHEREAS, on September 21, 2000, the Board of County Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee, by a vote of 20 in favor, 0 opposed, and 1 absent adopted Resolution No. 00-09-01 authorizing Blount County to exercise said powers granted to all or certain municipalities; and

WHEREAS, upon the adoption of said Resolution No. 00-09-01 and pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 6-2-201(22), Blount County became authorized to define, prohibit, abate, suppress, prevent, and regulate all acts, practices, conduct, businesses, occupations, callings, trades, uses of property and all other things whatsoever detrimental, or liable to be detrimental, to unincorporated areas of the county and to exercise general police powers; and

WHEREAS, Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 68-221-1101-1106 authorizes counties to adopt regulations for storm water discharges and contaminates in order to protect water quality in their respective unincorporated areas; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority of Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 5-1-118(c), 6-2-201(22) and 68-221-1101-1106 and Resolution No. 00-09-01, Blount County desires to adopt the regulations hereinafter set forth to protect water quality in the unincorporated areas of Blount County by prohibiting, suppressing, and preventing the contamination of storm water by illicit discharge of pollutants.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of County Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee, meeting in regular session assembled this 20th day of April, 2006, that the following regulations to protect water quality in the unincorporated areas of Blount County by prohibiting, suppressing, and preventing the contamination of storm water by illicit discharge of pollutants are hereby adopted to wit:

ILLICIT DISCHARGE RESOLUTION

SECTION 1. Definitions.

Illicit discharge - Any discharge to the stormwater system that is not composed entirely of stormwater and not specifically exempted in **Section 3 b.**

Person - Any and all persons, natural or artificial, including any individual, firm, partnership or association, and any municipal or private corporation organized or existing under the laws of this or any other state.

Restaurant - An establishment or facility where food is prepared and sold.

Runoff - The water resulting from precipitation that is not absorbed by the soil.

Sanitary sewer - A system of underground conduits that collect and deliver sanitary wastewater to a wastewater treatment plant.

Sanitary wastewater - Wastewater from toilets, sinks and other plumbing fixtures.

Sewage - Human wastes carried by water from residences, buildings, industrial establishments or other places, together with such industrial wastes, stormwater or other water as may be present; or any substance discharged from a sanitary sewer collection system.

Sinkhole- (1.) A naturally occurring depression where drainage collects in the earth's surface that is a minimum of two (2) feet deep. These depressions are typically denoted as closed contours. (2.) A hole, fissure or other opening in the ground, often underlain with limestone, dolomite or other rock formation that provides for and is being designated as a natural conduit for the passage of stormwater.

Stormwater system - The system of roadside drainage including roadside curbs and gutters, curb inlets, swales, catch basins, manholes, gutters, ditches, pipes, lakes, ponds, sinkholes, channels, creeks, streams, storm drains, and similar conveyances and facilities, both natural and manmade, located within the county which are designated or used for collecting, storing, or conveying stormwater, or through which stormwater is collected, stored or conveyed, whether owned or operated by Blount County or other person.

Swale - A natural or manmade depression or wide shallow ditch used to route or filter runoff.

Vegetation - Collection of plant life, including trees, shrubs, bushes, and grass.

Wastes, industrial/commercial - Liquid or other wastes resulting from any process of industry, manufacture, trade or business, or from the development of any natural resources.

Wastes, other - Discarded brush; sawdust; shavings; leaves; lawn clippings; animal wastes; used or previously applied lime; garbage; trash; refuse, loose used paper, paper products, plastic containers, or metal containers; ashes, offal, discarded tar; discarded paint; discarded or uncontained solvents; used, discarded, or spilled petroleum products, antifreeze, motor vehicle fluids; used or discarded fires, gas tanks, or chemicals; or any other used, uncontained, or unpackaged, or disposed of materials which may discharge to or otherwise enter the stormwater system.

SECTION 2. Purpose.

The Board of County Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee finds that the uncontrolled discharge of pollutants to the stormwater system has an adverse impact upon the water quality of the receiving waters.

- (a) The 1987 amendments to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, commonly known as the Clean Water Act, established the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) program, which requires permits for discharges from stormwater systems into waters of the United States. The Environmental Protection Agency has promulgated regulations implementing the NPDES program.
- (b) The NPDES regulations for stormwater discharges require certain municipalities, including Blount County, to:
 - (1) Prohibit through ordinance, order or similar means, illicit discharges to the stormwater system;
 - (2) Develop and implement a plan to detect and address non-stormwater discharges including illegal dumping; and
 - (3) Implement appropriate enforcement procedures and actions.

SECTION 3. Prohibitions.

- (a) No person shall:
 - (1) Connect, or allow to be connected any sanitary sewer to the stormwater system, including any sanitary sewer connected to the stormwater system as of the date of adoption of this resolution; illicit discharges include, but are not limited to:
 - (A) Sewage discharges except as deemed unavoidable due to collection system operation/maintenance and extreme weather events;
 - (B) Discharges of wash water resulting from the hosing or cleaning of gas stations, auto repair garages, or other types of automotive services facilities;
 - (C) Discharges resulting from the cleaning, repair, or maintenance of any type of equipment, machinery, or facility including motor vehicles, cement-related equipment, and port-a-potty servicing, etc.;
 - (D) Discharges of wash water from mobile operations such as mobile automobile washing, steam cleaning, power washing, and carpet cleaning, etc;
 - (E) Discharges of wash water from the cleaning or hosing of impervious surfaces in industrial and commercial areas including parking lots, streets, sidewalks, driveways, patios, plazas, work yards, and outdoor eating or drinking areas, etc.;
 - (F) Discharges of runoff from material storage areas containing chemicals, fuels, grease, oil, or other hazardous materials;
 - (G) Discharges of pool or fountain water containing chlorine, biocides, or other chemicals at the point of entry to the enclosed storm sewer system or stream; discharges of pool or fountain filter backwash water;

- (H) Discharges of sediment, or construction-related wastes, etc.;
 - (I) Discharges of food-related wastes (e.g., grease, food processing, and restaurant kitchen mats and trash bin wash water, etc.).
 - (J) Discharges of heated water from commercial or industrial operations;
 - (K) Discharges of dyes (without prior permission of the stormwater department);
 - (L) Discharges of laundry waste water;
 - (M) Known discharges from leaking water or sewer lines remaining uncorrected for seven (7) days;
 - (N) Discharges or discarding of animal fecal waste or dead animals;
 - (O) Discarding of vehicles, equipment or parts;
 - (P) Discarding lawn clippings, leaves, or branches;
 - (Q) Discarding trash or debris; and
 - (R) Discarding or applying pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, or other chemicals.
- (2) Cause or allow an illicit discharge to the stormwater system, or any component thereof, or onto driveways, sidewalks, parking lots, sinkholes, creek banks, or other areas draining to the stormwater system.
- (b) Subject to the provisions of subsection (c), the following discharges shall not be in violation of this resolution:
- (1) Water line flushing;
 - (2) Landscape irrigation;
 - (3) Diverted stream flows or rising groundwater;
 - (4) Infiltration of uncontaminated groundwater [as defined at 40CFR,35.2005 (20)] to separate storm drains;
 - (5) Pumping of uncontaminated groundwater;
 - (6) Discharges from potable water sources, foundation drains, uncontaminated air conditioning condensation, irrigation waters, springs, water from crawl space pumps, or footing drains;
 - (7) Lawn watering;
 - (8) Individual noncommercial car washing on residential properties; or car washing of less than two (2) consecutive days in duration for a charity, nonprofit fund raising, or similar noncommercial purpose;
 - (9) Flows from riparian habitats and wetlands;
 - (10) Dechlorinated swimming pool discharges;
 - (11) Street deicing for public safety;
 - (12) Any activity authorized by a valid NPDES permit; and
 - (13) Any flows resulting from firefighting.
- (c) If the Stormwater Director finds that any of the activities listed in subsection (b) above are found to cause or may cause sewage, industrial wastes or other wastes to be discharged into the stormwater system, the Director shall so notify the person performing such activities, and shall order that such activities be stopped or conducted in such a manner as to avoid the discharge of sewage, industrial wastes or other wastes into the stormwater system.

SECTION 4. Notification of spills and illicit discharges.

As soon as any person has knowledge of any illicit spills or discharges to the stormwater system in violation of this resolution, such person shall immediately notify the Stormwater Director by telephone of this discharge. If such person is directly or indirectly responsible for such discharge or responsible for the operation of the system or business, then such

person shall also take immediate action to ensure the containment and cleanup of such discharge and shall confirm such telephone notification with a written report to the Stormwater Director within three (3) calendar days.

At a minimum, the written report for any illicit discharge shall include:

- a. Date and time of the discharge
- b. Location of the discharge
- c. Material or substance discharged
- d. Duration and rate of flow
- e. Total volume discharged
- f. Total volume recovered
- g. Cause or reason for the discharge
- h. Remediation and containment action taken
- i. Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) for the discharged material (s)
- j. Action taken to prevent further discharges
- k. Description of any environmental impact

SECTION 5. Requirements for monitoring.

The Stormwater Director may require any person engaging in any activity or owning any property, building or facility (including but not limited to a site of industrial activity) to undertake such reasonable monitoring of any discharge(s) to the stormwater system operated by the county and to furnish periodic detailed reports of such discharges.

SECTION 6. Right of entry.

The Stormwater Director or his designated representatives may enter upon any property which discharges or contributes, or is believed to discharge or contribute, to stormwater runoff or the stormwater system; stream; natural drainage way; or other stormwater system during all reasonable hours to monitor, remove foreign objects or blockages, and to inspect for compliance with the provisions of this resolution.

SECTION 7. Notice of Violation.

Whenever the Stormwater Director or his representative determines that a violation of any provision of this resolution has occurred, the representative may issue a Notice of Violation to the property owner, utility, facility operator, lessee, contractor, permittee and/or the equipment operator causing and/or contributing to the illicit discharge.

The Notice of Violation shall:

- (1) Be in writing;
- (2) Include a description of the property sufficient for identification of where violation has occurred;
- (3) List the violation;
- (4) State the action required;
- (5) Provide a deadline for compliance or to stop work.

SECTION 8. Penalties.

- (a) Any person violating the provisions of this resolution shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punished as provided in the general provisions of the County Code. Each day that a continuing violation of this resolution is maintained or permitted to remain shall constitute a separate offense.
- (b) Any person violating the provisions of this resolution may be assessed a civil penalty by the county of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) per day for each day of violation. Each day of violation shall constitute a separate violation. The county may also recover all damages proximately caused to the municipality by such violations.
- (c) In assessing a civil penalty, the municipality may consider:
 - (1) The harm done to the public health or the environment;
 - (2) Whether the civil penalty imposed will be a substantial economic deterrent to the illegal activity;
 - (3) The economic benefit gained by the violator;
 - (4) The amount of effort put forth by the violator to remedy this violation;
 - (5) Any unusual or extraordinary enforcement costs incurred by the municipality;
 - (6) The amount of penalty established by ordinance or resolution for specific categories of violations; and
 - (7) Any equities of the situation that outweigh the benefit of imposing any penalty or damage assessment.
- (d) In addition to the civil penalty in subsection (b) above, the county may recover all damages proximately caused by the violator to the municipality, which may include any reasonable expenses incurred in investigating violations and enforcing violations of this resolution.
- (e) The county may bring legal action to enjoin the continuing violation of this resolution, and the existence of any other remedy, at law or in equity, shall be no defense to any such actions.
- (f) The remedies set forth in this section shall be cumulative, not exclusive, and it shall not be a defense to any action, civil or criminal, that one (1) or more of the remedies set forth herein has been sought or granted.
- (g) Any civil penalty assessed by the county may be appealed to the Blount County Circuit Court.

SECTION 9. Effective Date.

This resolution shall take effect upon its adoption, the public welfare requiring it.




The Blount County Planning Commission held public hearing on the rezoning request on December 20, 2005. Upon motion by Carl McDonald, seconded by Rick Brownlie, the Planning Commission voted to recommend denial of the rezoning request. This item comes for setting of public hearing by the County Commission. Based on a quarterly schedule, the next appropriate date would be April 11 at 6:35 P.M. The following is staff report on the item for background.

Applicants wish consideration of rezoning of property shown on map on next page as hatched. The depth of the rezoning request is approximately 1000 feet off of Hwy 411 right-of-way. This is of much greater distance than has been approved in the past. The uses in the general vicinity of the requested rezoning are a mix of agriculture, residential and grandfathered commercial. All the surrounding land is zoned R-1.

Staff notes that previous rezoning requests in the general vicinity have been denied based on a change of thinking on what types of commercial uses, if any, should be allowed along Hwy 411. The recently completed Blount

County Growth Strategy advocates for corridor planning for the area to define the desired extent of commercial use, particularly indicating limited commercial uses clustered at major intersections.

Given the denial of previous rezoning requests of similar character in the vicinity, and the call in the Growth Strategy for further planning, staff finds the present request to be inadvisable and premature.



SUBJECT: Recommendations for rezonings from the Planning Commission – setting of public hearing for April 11, 2006

The following two requests for rezoning are recommended favorably by the Planning Commission upon unanimous vote, and are presented for setting of public hearing for April 11, 2006:

Rezoning from R-1 to C-Commercial for property located at 119 Burnett Station Road, being Parcel 3.00 of Tax Map 004C Group A, with condition that access onto Burnett Station Road be improved for site distance by cutting back bank to left of property and through access be provided from parcel fronting on Chapman Highway.

Rezoning from R-1 and S-Suburbanizing to C-Commercial for a depth of 500 feet from Hwy 321 right-of-way for property located at 645 Nelson Lane corner to W. Lamar Alexander Parkway (Hwy 321) being Parcels 70.00 and 71.00 of Tax Map 055, for a depth of 500 feet off of Hwy 321 right-of-way, and with condition that driveway access be constructed to Hwy 321 and Nelson Lane be closed for access to the property.

The rezoning request off of Hwy 321 (second request) lies within the planning region of Maryville Planning Commission. The Maryville Planning Commission also recommends for the rezoning.

The following are updated staff reports on the rezoning requests for background.

1. Request for rezoning from R-1 to C-Commercial for property located at 119 Burnett Station Road, being Parcel 3.00 of Tax Map 004C Group A.

The Planning Commission held public hearing on the request.

Heartland Development, LLC requests rezoning of property from R-1 Rural District 1 to C-Commercial, identified as 119 Burnett Station Road, being Parcel 3.00 of Tax Map 004C Group A (actual tax designation is Map 004EA Parcel 3.00 but the lot is shown on adjacent Map 004C). See map of location on following page with property hatched.

Note that the C-Commercial zone already exists on adjacent parcels 5, 6 and 7 shown on the map, and other properties to the northwest and southeast that front on Chapman Highway, a major arterial road. Heartland Development also owns parcel 6 with common rear property line with parcel 3.

With exception of parcel 5, no other lot fronting on Burnett Station Road is zoned commercial, although there are several grandfathered commercial uses to the south of subject property. The C-Commercial zone is intended to be a high density commercial zone oriented to arterial roads in the county. Staff at first considered highway orientation to be a critical issue, but the applicant has provided a TDOT approved access plan that is oriented to Chapman Hwy. The frontage along Burnett Station Road could then be considered as secondary access.

The C-Commercial zone in the vicinity was established prior to the adoption of the 1101 Growth Plan. Technically, the extension of the zone would be an extension into the rural area of the county. However, staff is reviewing the request as an extension of an existing zone. The extension of the zone would be in general conformity with the land use plan as an incremental extension with primary access off of Chapman Hwy.

Parcel 6 to Burnett Station Road via subject Parcel 3 would allow traffic that wishes to go north on Chapman Hwy to line up with the traffic light to turn left at the intersection.

3. Observation of preliminary grading on the property indicates an access from parcel 6 off of Chapman Highway to parcel 3 and onto Burnett Station Road is feasible.


Existing uses in the area are a mix of residential and commercial, with a church across Burnett Station Road from the subject property. Commercial use predominates on Chapman Highway. The uses are more mixed on Burnett Station Road, but with substantial grandfathered commercial uses.

The main concerns of staff are application of the C-Commercial zone consistent with intent of the zone for orientation to arterial roads, consistency with the 1101 growth plan, and sight distance problems of access to a commercial property on Burnett Station Road. The access concerns have been at least partially addressed by the applicant. The issues of intent of the C-Commercial zone and consistency with the 1101 growth plan are subject to interpretation by the Planning Commission, but could be weighed against improvement of access flow for the existing C-Commercial zone fronting Chapman Hwy at present.


2. Request for rezoning from R-1 and S-Suburbanizing to C-Commercial for property located at 645 Nelson Lane corner to W. Lamar Alexander Parkway (Hwy 321) being Parcels 70.00 and 71.00 of Tax Map 055.

The Planning Commission held public hearing on the request at the last regular meeting.


Mike Gaddis, with contractual interest as prospective buyer, requests rezoning from S-Suburbanizing and R-1 to C-Commercial for property owned by Lena Nelson Sanders at 645 Nelson Lane corner to W. Lamar Alexander Parkway (Hwy 321) being Parcels 70.00 and 71.00 of Tax Map 055. Tax map of parcels hatched is presented on the following page.



Following is a survey that more accurately shows the configuration of the land and relation to existing Nelson Lane.



The following is the zoning in the area with parcels hatched.



Parcel 71 is about one acre in area in residential use. Parcel 70 is a large field of 8.49 acres, vacant but taxed as residential. The total area requested for rezoning is about 9.55 acres. The land is relatively flat near Hwy 321, slopes up to a ridge about 2/3 back on Parcel 70, and then rolls down slightly to the rear of Parcel 70.

Both parcels front on Lamar Alexander Parkway (Hwy 321), but neither parcel has improved access onto the Parkway. Mr. Gaddis has stated that TDOT would allow access from the parcels onto Hwy 321. (TDOT driveway permit has been provided by Mr. Gaddis.)

Both lots are served now at the dead end of Nelson Lane. Nelson Lane proceeds off of Hwy 321 about 600 feet to the southwest with wide entrance at a median cut, but narrows down to a one lane road to the property for about 500 feet after curving around parcels 67.01 and 67.04. It seems that Nelson Lane dead ends into the corner of Parcel 70, and Parcel 71 is serviced by a driveway across Parcel 70.

Nelson Lane in its present condition is not appropriate access for commercially zoned land. Part of the Hwy 321 frontage of the subject lots is of relatively steep grade (particularly fronting Parcel 71), but there is a

portion of the frontage of Parcel 70 nearest to dead end with Nelson Lane that could easily provide an area for improved driveway access to Hwy 321.

Surrounding parcels are in mix of residential and commercial use. Parcels 67.01 and 67.04 front on Hwy 321 but are accessed off of Nelson Lane, are presently zoned commercial, and are in transition between commercial uses. Parcels 68, 68.01, 69, 76, 76.01 and 76.02 are accessed off of Nelson Lane via common driveways and are in residential use. Parcel 72.01 is in commercial use (car repair) with several manufactured home units, but is not zoned commercial. Parcels 74 to 74.03 are accessed off of Long Hollow Road and are residential with several manufactured home units (some of the parcels may be vacant but were not confirmed by observation). Parcel 75 is accessed off of Long Hollow Road and is in grandfathered commercial use (Dyer Tool and storage buildings).

Mr. Gaddis notes that parcel 76.02 contains several old automobiles and busses along the back boundary with subject parcel 70. Staff confirmed this by observation but could not confirm any active commercial use.

The Maryville Urban Growth Boundary lies approximately along the boundary between the S-Suburbanizing and R-1 zones, approximately 500 feet off of the right-of-way of Hwy 321. The subject property extends back from Hwy 321 right-of-way 663 feet at its shortest extent to the northeast, and 798 feet at its longest extent to the southeast.

The boundary set by the 1101 Growth Plan separates land that should be considered for high density uses in the Urban Growth Boundary (500 feet from Hwy 321 right-of-way) and moderate to low density Rural Area uses (remainder of land beyond the S-Suburbanizing zone). The C-Commercial zone was established and intended to be for high density commercial uses oriented to arterial roads. State statutes require that all land use decisions shall be in conformity with the 1101 Growth Plan. Thus, it would not be proper to consider rezoning beyond 500 feet from Hwy 321 right-of-way. This would leave about one-fourth to one-third of the land in non-commercial R-1 zoning, with residential use allowed on minimum 30,000 square foot lots, or density of about 1.5 residential units per acre.

The proposed rezoning, restricted to only 500 feet off of Hwy 321 right-of-way, is consistent with the Conceptual Land Use Plan for commercial use along the arterial classified Hwy 321, and with the 1101 Growth Plan for high density use in the Urban Growth Boundary.

Staff would find a plan that has exclusive, single entrance access off of Hwy 321 (only one driveway cut for both lots), with no access off of Nelson Lane to be appropriate for favorable consideration of the rezoning. The rezoning should not be considered beyond 500 feet measured from Hwy 321 right-of-way. Consideration may be given to a lesser depth of the rezoning in relation to surrounding residential uses, say for the full depth of Parcel 71, and similar depth on Parcel 70, basically in the low area on the parcel next to Hwy 321.

The request has been forwarded to the Maryville Planning Commission and has received favorable recommendation from the Maryville Regional Planning Commission.



The Blount County Planning Commission met in regular session on Thursday February 23, 2006, at the Courthouse. Staff was represented by: John Lamb, Director of Planning; Doug Hancock, Assistant Planner; Roger Fields, Building Commissioner; and Administrative Assistant Gaye Hasty.

Commissioners Present: Chairman, Ed Stucky, Rick Brownlie, Joe Everett, Gary Farmer, Steve Gray, Tom Hodge, Bob Kidd, Bruce McClellan, Kenneth Melton, Bill Proffitt, and Jim Scully. Commissioners Absent: Carl McDonald.

The minutes of the January 26, 2006 regular monthly meeting were approved. Prior to the meeting, these were mailed to members for review.

HEARINGS

Concept Plans: None.

Preliminary Plats – Major Subdivisions:

McGill Property:

The McGill Property off Sunnyview Drive is a proposed 4 lot subdivision along a 50' common driveway easement with future development. Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department recommended for preliminary plat approval subject to:

- A note shall be added to the final plat that Lot 1 shall have driveway access only off of the common driveway.
- All instructions in the staff analysis, including pre-construction meeting, permits and construction of all improvements.
- Copy of POA/Maintenance Agreement documentation to be supplied to staff for review prior to final plat submission.

Commissioner Brownlie made the motion to approve the preliminary plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Scully.

Commissioner McClellan asked if any type of drainage plan would be required since there will be future development on this tract. Mr. Hancock stated that the drainage issue would be left up to the Planning Commission to decide on.

Commissioner Brownlie amended the motion to include requirement for a drainage plan which would be a condition of preliminary plat, seconded by Commissioner Scully. The motion to approve the preliminary plat was approved unanimously.

Grand Pines on the Creek:

Grand Pines on the Creek off Tomotley Road is a proposed subdivision containing 4 large tracts to be served by a 50' private road easement with future development. Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department recommended for approval subject to:

- A drainage easement shall be shown on the final plat for the area behind the fill section of roadway across the wet weather conveyance. Easements shall also be identified around the closed depressions.
- All instructions in the staff analysis, including pre-construction meeting, permits and construction of all improvements.
- Copy of POA documentation to be supplied to staff for review prior to final plat submission.

Mr. Hancock stated that a full drainage plan has been supplied for this subdivision. He explained that a portion of the roadway will be located within the flood plain and has been engineered accordingly.

Commissioner Scully made the motion to approve the preliminary plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Brownlie. The preliminary plat received unanimous approval.

Re-Subdivision of Lot 49 Marble Hill Estates:

The owner have requested that this item be removed from the agenda. Commissioner Scully made the motion to accept the letter of withdrawal, seconded by Commissioner Brownlie. The motion received unanimous approval.

Whitehead and Davis Property:

The Whitehead and Davis Property off of Payne Hollow Road is a proposed 4 lot subdivision with 3 lots being served by a 25' common driveway easement and 1 lot having county road frontage. Planning, Engineering, and Environmental Health Department staff recommended for preliminary plat approval subject to:

- A note shall be added to the final plat that Lot 1 shall have driveway access only off of the common driveway and not along the county road.
- All instructions in this staff analysis, including pre-construction meeting, permits and construction of all improvements.
- Copy of POA/Maintenance Agreement documentation to be supplied to staff for review prior to final plat submission.

Mr. Hancock stated that an additional drainage plan will be required for any additional lots on this parcel. He stated that a drainage plan is not required at this time, nor did he feel it necessary.

Commissioner Scully made the motion to approve the preliminary plat as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Kidd. The preliminary plat received unanimous approval.

Miscellaneous Items:

BCDT Property off John Anthony Lane and Tuckaleechee Pike:

BCDT Enterprises, LLC are requesting to re-divide two existing parcels located at intersections of Highway 321, Tuckaleechee Pike, and John Anthony Lane. The division has unique characteristic of dividing the properties in such a way that part of one property will be split by an existing zone boundary between S-Suburbanizing and C-Commercial. In addition, the 1101 Growth Plan places the two properties in the Rural Area. The division does meet the requirements of the subdivision regulations for lot size.

Planning Department staff recommended for approval of the re-division, with condition that signatures for all appropriate certifications be obtained, and that advance notice be given to the owners that there may be zoning issues involved at a later date.

Commissioner Kidd made the motion to approve the request as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Melton. The motion received unanimous approval.

Request for extension of preliminary plat by Naterra Land for Homestead West Subdivision Phase 1:

Naterra Land has submitted a request for extension of preliminary plat approval for Homestead West Phase 1 subdivision. The preliminary plat for Homestead West Subdivision Phase 1 was approved on May 27, 2004. The preliminary plat approval was extended for six month intervals on March 24, 2005 and again on October 27, 2005. The effect of the actions was to extend the preliminary plat approval for one year to May 2006, beyond the initial year approval deadline of May 2005.

Planning Department staff recommended that the consideration of the request for extension be deferred to allow the applicant to address items 1 through 5 in the staff memo as necessary information for decision.

Mr. Benjamin Mullins attorney for the developers addressed the Commission at this time. He stated that a letter had been sent to Mr. Lamb specifically addressing the concerns in the staff memo. He stated that they felt they could provide enough information regarding the concerns that the Planning Commission could make their decision and not defer the matter. (A copy of the letter from Naterra was distributed to the Commissioners at the meeting, and was mailed by Naterra to each Commissioner prior to the meeting).

Mr. Mel Lager, Vice President and General Manager for Naterra Land spoke to the Commission at this time. Mr. Lager explained that he had begun working for Naterra Land in mid-September and actually began working on-site the beginning of October. He stated that much of his time had been spent trying to understand the difficulties of mountain development and the history on the Blount County Property. He stated that he had spent time with Mr. Lamb and Mr. Dunlap to understand some of the issues they are facing and trying to get the project back on track. Mr. Lager asked if any of the Commissioners had any questions.

Commissioner Brownlie stated concerns regarding the weight of the trucks hauling construction materials and equipment exceeding the weight limit on the bridges. He stated that he had talked to Mr. Dunlap and the Highway Department had made markings of the damages made and that it was his understanding that this activity would stop. Mr. Lager stated that they had tried to redirect those trucks or have tried to lighten the loads the trucks were carrying.

Commissioner McClellan asked how long an extension they were requesting. Mr. Lager replied that they would like to have a twelve month extension.

Commissioner McClellan made the motion to grant a twelve month extension for the preliminary plat, seconded by Commissioner Kidd. A roll call vote was taken:

Site Plans:

Eldon Inc. at 1427 William Blount Drive:

Eldon, Inc. is requesting the addition of a 100' x 175' maintenance building to be located at 1427 William Blount Drive. This is the existing site for Eldon, Inc. The property is located in the Industrial Zone. The site plan indicates that all building setbacks will be met and additional buffering will not be required. The existing parking will not be reduced by the proposed addition. Mr. Fields recommended approval of the site plan.

Commissioner McClellan made the motion to approve the site plan as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Melton. The site plan received unanimous approval.

Blackberry Farm Resort at 1471 West Millers Cove Road:

Blackberry Farm Resort submitted the site plan for the addition of four new rental units to be located on the existing campus for the Blackberry Farm Resort. Blackberry Farm is an existing nonconforming use that has vested rights for expansion under State Law and the Blount County Zoning Regulations. The site plan is located on approximately 29 acres with multiple structures. When considering density the number of dwelling units is considered. In this situation, most of the structures are for commercial over night rental and their accessory buildings. On a parcel containing 29 acres the density would be 43 dwelling units. It is staffs' interpretation that the additions would be conforming to the density requirements. The site plan indicates that all building setbacks will be met and additional buffering is not required. Mr. Fields recommended for approval of the site plan pending the approval of all septic systems that are required by the Blount County Environmental Health Department and the approval of the Storm Water plan.

Commissioner Scully made the motion to approve the site plan as recommended by staff, seconded by Commissioner Everett. The site plan received unanimous approval.

Long Range Planning:

Request for rezoning from R-1 to C-Commercial for property located at 119 Burnett Station Road, being Parcel 003.00 of Tax Map 004C Group A.

This item comes deferred from the last regular meeting. The Planning Commission held public hearing on the request at the last regular meeting. The proponent supplied more design information to staff prior to the meeting. Planning Department staff tentatively recommended for approval of the rezoning, subject to confirmation of appropriate access onto Burnett Station Road,

confirmation of through access from Parcel 6, and favorable determination of appropriateness of C- Commercial zone extension in this particular case. Mr. Lamb stressed that he has reviewed this as an extension of an existing zone off of Chapman Highway and as a much improved access situation.

Commissioner McClellan made the motion to recommend the rezoning request to the County Commission for approval with conditions noted by staff. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Farmer. The motion received unanimous approval and will now be sent to the County Commission for approval.

Request for rezoning from R-1 and S-Suburbanizing to C-Commercial for property located at 645 Nelson Lane corner to W. Lamar Alexander (Hwy 321) being Parcels 070.00 and 071.00 of Tax Map 055.

This item comes deferred from the last regular meeting. The Planning Commission held public hearing on the request at the last regular meeting. The proposed rezoning was forwarded to the Maryville Planning Commission for their review and recommendation. Their recommendation was for rezoning to a depth of 500'. There are still some outstanding issues regarding the access. Mr. Lamb stated that access off of Nelson Lane needed to be resolved. He stated that staff would recommend in favor of the rezoning if the commercial access off of Nelson Lane to this property is cut off. Mr. Lamb stated that the direct access off of Hwy 321 should be sufficient for this property and its use.

Commissioner Kidd made the motion to recommend to the County Commission approval of this rezoning to a depth of 500' subject to the access being built for Hwy 321 and that access to Nelson Lane be abandoned once it is built. Commissioner Farmer seconded the motion. The motion to recommend for approval of the rezoning received unanimous approval.

Discussion of possible amendment to the subdivision regulations and zoning regulations to facilitate combination and reconfiguration of multiple standard lots.

Commissioner Kidd made the motion to assign this item to the Subdivision Regulation Review Committee for further consideration and recommendation, seconded by Commissioner Melton. The motion received unanimous approval.

Discussion regarding design issues, buffering and setback requirements for commercial uses at request of Commissioner Steve Gray:

Mr. Lamb asked if the Commission wanted to go forward with this request. The Commission asked Mr. Lamb to investigate this matter further with assistance from Commissioner Gray.

Discussion of content of review sessions in preparation for discussion of the Blount County Growth Strategy report.

A meeting for discussion of Growth Strategy implementation agenda was set for March 30, 2006 at 5:30.

Chairman Dave Bennett called the meeting to order.

Approval of Minutes

Damon Fortney made a motion, which was seconded by Steve Hargis, to approve the minutes of March 2, 2006. A voice vote was taken and Chairman Bennett declared the motion to have passed.

Public Input

There was no one who wished to speak regarding items not on and on the agenda. There was no action taken in this matter.

Report From Risk Management Department

Don Stallions, Blount County Risk Manager, gave an update from the 10 recommendations given to the Committee at the last meeting regarding the use of the Fairgrounds Facilities. Mr. Stallions stated they had gone out to inspect the facility two more times - one was with the Building Official and the other was with the Risk Management Consultant. Both agreed with what they saw on the first walk through. One question that was answered was concerning the gentleman who had approached the committee and asked to take soil samples at his own expense. Don Stallions stated the man had provided that request to him in writing. However, after speaking with the County Attorney, Mr. Stallions recommended that the only ones who do work at the fairgrounds site should be County employees or contractors working as agents of the county. Mr. Stallions stated it is best to go through the bid process if someone would like to do contract work at the facility. Mr. Stallions stated regarding making recommendations for the committee going forward, what the Risk Management Department would need from the Committee would be what the plans to use the facility for and how the committee plans to use it. He stated the Risk Management Department could make recommendations regarding getting the existing facility ready to go and/or what needs to be done. He stated there are things that need to be done, i.e., electrical and plumbing. Mr. Stallions stated the Risk Management Department is waiting for further clarification from the Committee and then they could move on with it. Mr. Hargis commented on an article he had read in the newspaper concerning BTRA and Murphy Speedway and asked if the racing was off the table at Smoky Mountain. Mr. Lyons stated they would love to bring it right back to Smoky Mountain Speedway as soon as possible, and it does not mean it is dead and they would still race there if they could open it. Herb Handly asked Mr. Stallions if in their inspection they saw any real serious kinds of things or was it mostly routine things that need to be done. Mr. Stallions stated there is a question on the septic system and the electrical in both buildings, especially the concession stand needs to be completely redone. Mr. Stallions also stated it is not ADA compliant. Mr. Stallions stated it wouldn't take a lot to get it to where it needs to be. Mr. Stallions stated there are things that needed to be taken care of before they open it up for the public. Mr. Lyons asked about fencing. Mr. Stallions stated the entrances are fenced and signs are placed for no

trespassing. Mr. Dunn stated law enforcement is checking around the clock. Don Stallions stated the committee needed to decide how they want to use the facility and what they want to use it for, and the Risk Management Department would make recommendations such as to what needs to be fixed code wise before they allow the public on the grounds. Mr. Fortney asked if they could resurrect the hiring of a projects coordinator who could start making inquiries as to who is interested in doing what, then once we have procured that list, then the Maintenance could be asked if they were capable of doing this in house, etc. Dave Bennett said he was going to suggest a subcommittee. There was no action taken in this matter.

Establishing Policies and Procedures Regarding the Use of the Fairgrounds

Dave Bennett recommended to the Committee to get started with developing those policies and to do that in the form of establishing a subcommittee that would report back to the committee for ultimate approval by the full Commission. Mr. Bennett opened the floor for volunteers for the subcommittee for establishing policies and procedures for the Fairgrounds. It was decided for John Keeble, Dave Bennett, Damon Fortney, Mitch Ingram, and Herb Handly to be on the subcommittee. Mr. Bennett stated they would let everyone know when the meetings were so that if they would like to attend, they could have input. There was no action taken in this matter.

Report Regarding Hiring Projects Coordinator

Mr. Bennett stated the item was tabled at the Commission Meeting. Mr. Bennett stated if it is something that they need they would address it when the time comes. There was no action taken in this matter.

Development of a Mission Statement

Mr. Bennett stated they would bring this back up at the subcommittee. Mr. Handly stated he would like for the committee to focus on what the committee's vision for the Fairgrounds facility is and it might be most helpful if we could come up with some sort of mission statement that would guide the group towards making those decisions. He stated this would be a consensus kind of thing that they would all agree on that this is the mission and this is the way we want to move forward, and it would help to keep everyone focused in coming up with a good plan that everyone could work with. It was agreed that it was all right to include the recommendation for the mission statement with establishing the policies. There was no action taken in this matter.

Meeting Minutes for April 27, 2005 Meeting**

The meeting was called to order by Dr. Bob Ramsey. Attending members: J.C. Franklin, Howard Kerr, John Lamb, Craig West, Joe Everett, Greg McClain, and Dr. Ken Bell.

Minutes for the October 2004 Meeting were approved.

Kristi Falco presented the quarterly Keep Blount Beautiful (KBB) report to the board. Ms. Falco advised the board that KBB had received two awards. One for the Landfill Learning Center and Education Programs for grades K - 8, and one for being an outstanding affiliate for the Keep America Beautiful Program. The Little River Clean-up Event was held April 23, 2005. Approximately 300 volunteers participated and about 11 thousand pounds of trash was collected. Area schools education programs and landfill tours are presently underway. Advertising and preparation is underway for the next Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event which is scheduled for May 14, 2005.

An informational presentation was made by John Falco regarding the Maryville Curbside Recycling Company now in operation. The presentation included a description of the services offered as well as a report on the totals of recyclables collected since the company began operations, as well as year to date totals.

The 2005 TDEC Legislative Update was distributed to the board members. The written update included current legislation pending in this year's Tennessee General Assembly. Contact addresses were provided in order to obtain the current status of legislation now pending. A motion was made by J.C. Franklin and seconded by Dr. Bell that a written request be made from the Blount County Solid Waste Authority to the peoples representatives from Blount County currently serving in the Tennessee General Assembly requesting them to vote against any legislation that would increase landfill surcharge taxes and permit fees. All members voted for the motion.

The Blount County Solid Waste Region Annual Report was distributed to the board members. The report included recycling totals and disposal tonnages from the previous calendar year, as well as other pertinent solid waste information regarding the Region's Ten-Year Solid Waste Plan.

The FY 05-06 Landfill Enterprise Fund Budget was presented to the board by Kenny Wiggins. Included in the presentation were projected disposal volumes and funding requirements. The board was asked to approve a resolution recommending a 2-year incremental increase to the tipping fee at the Landfill and the implementation of a \$5 per ton surcharge on asbestos, state approved special waste, and bulk loads of tires from non-licensed tire dealers. The tipping fee increase proposed was to increase the tipping fee from \$26 to \$29 per ton effective July 1, 2005, then to \$32 per ton effective July 1, 2006. Dr. Ramsey made the motion to recommend the increase to the City of Alcoa Board of Commissioners and the motion was seconded by Greg McClain. Animated discussion among several board members for several minutes regarding the proposed increase followed the motion. Voting for the recommendation: John Lamb, Greg McClain, Dr. Bob Ramsey, Joe Everett, Dr. Ken Bell, J.C. Franklin, and by proxy vote, Mark Johnson. Abstained from voting: Craig West. Absent from the vote: Carl Walker and Jackie Hill.







Jobs and Investments Help Blount County Develop

by Matt Murray

There has been a significant increase in the number of inquiries from companies interested in locating or expanding in Blount County. These contacts have been on the rebound since the recession of 2001, but showed an acceleration of interest in 2005. Blount County has economic development representatives in Japan and England that help draw attention to our community. On our website, parts of the “Doing Business in Blount County” section were translated into UK English, French, German, Spanish, and Portuguese to promote easier contacts. The Board hosted 5 delegations from the United Kingdom, a group from

France and worked with a total of 46 prospects in 2005. Members of the Board traveled to China and Japan and found new opportunities for these nations’ companies and new markets for Blount County.

Three new companies from the United Kingdom were incorporated within Blount County. ETL Systems provide worldwide satellite communications. Lumicycle develops lighting systems for pedestrian illumination. And Network Telex provides international telex communications for wire transfer and ship-to-shore communication.

The Board oversaw the grading of a site and the placing of a “spec” building, essentially a shell of a manufacturing plant on it. The building is almost 50,000 square feet and can be expanded. Often it may take 12-15 months for companies to grade a site and build a plant. That is too long for many companies, so though there was no company in mind when this action was taken, it was considered a wise move. It gives companies a chance to come and look at a site that can be put in use very quickly. There have been a number of inquiries about this site and the Board expects it will have a tenant before the end of 2006.

Most exciting was the Economic Development Board news in 2005 of the announcements of the expansions of DENSO and Eldon/Rubbermaid, as well as some smaller locations and developments in the county.

The Board has traditionally promoted industrial parks. In a slightly different direction, working with the City of Alcoa, the City of Maryville, and Blount County, it continues to plan a Research and Development Park. This park is envisioned to accommodate high tech and science-based Research and Development firms. Some of these firms are expected to do production as well as research. This project will capitalize on the capabilities of the airport, Oak Ridge and the University of Tennessee. New job opportunities will be created that are not currently available in existing industrial parks.

The real work for 2006 includes actuating the R& D Park while following through with DENSO to get their site developed and construction underway. This effort involves a very close working relationship of the Board, local governments and DENSO.

Bottom Line Results

Eldon/Rubbermaid Expands in Blount County

For at least two years, the Blount County Economic Development Board, city, and county leaders have worked with Sanford of North America, an office products manufacturer, to facilitate an expansion in Blount County. In early January 2006 the company announced that it was consolidating its operations and moving them to their Eldon plant on William Blount Drive. Eldon is a business unit of Sanford, which in turn is a division of Newell Rubbermaid Inc.

Sanford makes more than 6,000 products, the variety ranges from markers, pens and pencils to professional art products, fine writing instruments and office organization tools.

Even though Sanford had announced in September 2005 that it planned to cut 5,000 jobs nationwide, this expansion brings 200 new jobs to Blount County. These new jobs and expansion are a result of the company's streamlining efforts, which included closing the Madison, WI plant.

The William Blount location has 175,000 square feet, which means the company can take advantage of existing excess space. According to company officials, a reason that the company decided on Maryville was because it is centrally located. Another reason was the attitudes of plant personnel and community members.

Before this expansion, Blount County Chamber of Commerce had ranked the Eldon plant the seventh largest employer in Blount County. Sanford made the announcement about the new jobs only a few weeks after DENSO had announced 500 new jobs here by 2010.

Expected to be completed by mid-April the expansion will centralize the Eldon's division for injection molding operations and distribution systems.

DENSO's Exciting Expansion

Blount County competed with Mexico, California and Michigan for this \$185 million expansion project. From the beginning Maryville was a good candidate, but DENSO had concerns about the local labor force.



So, the City of Maryville commissioned a study to examine area work force resources. The Economic Development Board's Executive Vice President Bryan Daniels said he thought the study was the biggest determining factor in DENSO's ultimate decision.

Using data from an eight-county East Tennessee region, the study showed higher population growth rates than other parts of the state or country, a ready and skilled work force due to recent losses of manufacturing jobs and commuting patterns that reveal around one-fourth of the region's workers travel across county boundaries to get to work. The study also highlighted the low tax burdens and strong public education systems with competitive test scores.

DENSO Manufacturing Tennessee President Mack Hattori, in a press release, attributed the decision to expand production in Maryville to the quality of the local work force. "We are pleased to provide these jobs in East Tennessee," said Hattori. He listed the sound work ethic of East Tennessee and strong local and state support as some of the reasons that prompted DENSO to expand in Maryville.

DENSO announced their expansion plans in early December 2005. In late December, the Economic Development Board approved an incentive package to assist DENSO Manufacturing Tennessee with a \$185 million expansion.

It means 500 more jobs by the year 2010. Even before adding these 500 jobs, DENSO Manufacturing Tennessee is Blount County's largest employer with 2,484 employees as of November 2005, DENSO spokeswoman Anne Klebenow said.

DENSO plans to build a 220,000 square-foot expansion behind the existing Plants 201 and 202 on 55 acres between Mt. Tabor and Middlesettlements Roads. Construction on the expansion is expected to begin in early 2007. Production is not planned to begin in the new local division until 2008, but in the meantime construction and infrastructure improvements must be made. A crucial task is the widening of Middlesettlements Road. Mt. Tabor will need only minor changes. Daniels, representing the Blount Partnership, went to Nashville to work with officials from the Tennessee Department of Transportation about DENSO's need for road improvements.

Daniels said all areas of Blount County should benefit from DENSO's growth.

Planned Growth and Expansion

We've been working hard to bring businesses and to encourage expansions of existing businesses in Blount County.

Two significant expansions are expected to kick off a new growth spurt in our county. Besides the 500 jobs expected by 2010, DENSO's new expansion is projected to create at least 400 extra community jobs to support this large investment. In the past, DENSO's development of Plants 101 and 102 resulted in just such a spurt.



The Eldon/Rubbermaid expansion should also contribute to this surge with its 200 new jobs for the community.

Partially for the DENSO expansion, but mostly to relieve the congestion problem on Middlesettlements Road, we worked with TDOT to develop a plan for four driving lanes and a turn lane to make the road safer.

The EDB worked with Brookhaven Retreat, a treatment center for women with addiction problems, to develop a \$2 million facility with 50 new employees.

We helped Koide, a Japanese automotive supplier to negotiate an expansion of 30,000 square feet involving \$1.5 million in construction at the Stock Creek Development Centre. The result is \$3 million dollars of new taxable property and approximately 15 jobs.

EDB facilitated the structuring and execution of gap financing for Axis Fabrication's expansion. The result was an 18,000 square foot building and a new equipment line costing approximately \$1 million and will add 15 new jobs in the Stock Creek Development Centre.

We helped to negotiate a new 75,000 square foot rental office complex adjacent to the Airport property. The first phase of this new office complex will be 250,000 square feet. This is a real boost to Blount County because the property had been annexed by Knox County as part of the Airport complex, even though the property is actually located in Blount County. The EDB will be a conduit to funnel tax income back to Alcoa and Blount County. The negotiation process brought those three entities and the Airport Authority together to work on one project, which we hope will lead to future joint projects.

We were instrumental in Keisler Engineering locating in Blount County by selling them a 17,000 square foot building, which formerly housed Technical Rubber Products, in our Stock Creek Development Centre. This company manufactures transmissions for the automotive market. Forty new jobs were created in this move. The county and city tax bases are expanded because of Keisler's \$2 million taxable property.

And finally, we've been selling a lot of dirt to Blount County's benefit. For the DENSO project we arranged for 750,000 cubic yards of dirt to be removed from Partnership Parks North and South. Another 750,000 cubic yards of dirt will later be removed for an airport expansion. The removal of this dirt leaves flatter land, good for the development of "spec" projects without the expense of land grading.

The Economic Development Board will continue to work diligently to enlighten prospects about the beneficial aspects of living and doing business in Blount County.

REPORT TO BLOUNT COUNTY COMMISSION –APRIL 2006

I. Introduction:

This report to the Blount County Commission for April 2006. I will continue to provide you this report on a quarterly basis so that you may be informed of hospital activities, services and progress. This report addresses many items, which I hope are of interest to you, regarding hospital operations and activities, as well as the statistical reports, financial reports and budget information for the first eight months of Fiscal Year 2005-2006, and a report on other hospital projects, activities and services.

II. Statistical Reports: (Please see the attached Statistical Report.)

Admissions for the month of February 2006, were 952, versus a budget of 982, which is 3.1% below budget, and 5.5% below prior year.

Patient days were 4,235, or 4.1% below the budget of 4,417, and also 9.1% below the same month last year, as we continued not to see a heavy flu or respiratory season.

The length of stay for February 2006 was 4.5 days, which was equal to budget and .2 of a day, below prior years 4.7 days.

For the month of February 2006, the following tests, treatments and services exceeded this month's budget and last year's actual: Transitional care days, hospice days, outpatient radiation exams, radiation oncology, MRIs, EKG tests, rehab services, outpatient surgical cases outpatient, EHRC outpatient visits and Good Samaritan Clinic visits.

For the first eight months of this fiscal year admissions are almost identical with budget at 7,600, versus a budget of 7,629, and are 2.1% above the same eight month period last year.

Patient days are 1.1% above last year's levels and 3.2% below budget at 33,253, versus a budget of 34,337.

Our average length of stay for the first eight months of this fiscal year has been 4.4 days, versus a budget of 4.5 days, and last year's actual of 4.4 days.

For the first eight months of this fiscal year the following tests, treatments and services have exceeded this year's budget projections and last year's actual: Transitional care days, Hospice days, outpatient radiation exams, radiation oncology, MRIs, Mammograms, RT treatments, EKG tests, outpatient rehab services, outpatient surgical cases, and Good Samaritan Clinic visits.

III. Financial Report:

Financially, February 2006 was a good month for the hospital versus budget. Gross patient revenue for February 2006, was \$32,595,000, versus a budget of \$32,163,000, which is 1.3% above budget.

Total adjustments or deductions from revenue were 1.2% above budget, at \$21,695,000, versus a budget of \$21,428,000.

Our total operating revenues were 1.6% above budget at \$11,929,000, versus a budget of \$11,742,000.

Expenses for February 2006 were only 1.4% above budget at \$11,555,000, versus a budget of \$11,397,000, leaving an operating income of \$374,000, versus budget of \$345,000 for the month. For the month of February, this is a 3.4% return on operations. Excess of revenue over expenses for the month of February 2006 was \$970,000, versus a budget of \$870,000, or 11.5% over budget.

For the first eight months of this fiscal year, gross patient revenue has been 1.6% above budget at \$261,196,000, versus a budget of \$257,103,000. Fortunately, due to increase in percentage of commercial patients, hospital adjustments have been .1% below budget at \$170,372,000, versus a budget of \$170,448,000.

Total operating revenues of \$98,791,000, are 4.3% above budget of \$94,714,000. Expenses for our first eight months of this fiscal year have grown by 3% over budget at \$97,226,000, versus a budget of \$94,394,000, leaving a total operating income of \$1,565,000, which is a return on operations of 1.58%, and \$1,245,000 above budget of \$320,000.

Total excess of revenues over expenses for the first eight months of this fiscal year have been \$5,647,000, versus a budget of \$4,222,000, or 33.8% above budget.

In reviewing our comparative statement of revenues over expenses, you will see for the first eight months of this fiscal year, we are running parallel with last year on operating income at \$1,556,000, compared to prior year of \$1,609,000, and excess of revenues over expenses of \$5,647,000, exceed prior year by \$359,000, or 6.8%.

Also, in the financial reports, you will see the Balance Sheet and our MorningView Village Assisted Living expense reports, which shows that for the first eight months of this year, we have a net income of \$72,000, versus a loss in 2005 of \$278,000.

IV. Other Hospital Matters:

- A. Construction Update: The completion of the Cancer Center has been a success and the hospital has seen tremendous growth in the number of patients it is serving in our community. Several internal renovation projects are underway including the completion of the new Outpatient Diagnostic Center and MRI, located at our Springbrook facility; several new physician offices have been completed in the new Physician Office Building; and the hospital board, at its March meeting, approved construction for a new Food Service Area, to be located on the first floor adjacent to the new Outpatient Lobby.
- B. Breast Health Center: The hospital recently completed and occupied a new comprehensive Breast Health Center, located on the fourth floor of the new Cancer Center and Physician Office Building. This new facility is state of the art and one of the first breast centers in east Tennessee to offer the latest in digital mammography equipment.
