There were 18 present and 3 absent. Commissioner McCulley arrived after the roll was taken. Chairman Pro Tem Samples declared a quorum to exist. The following proceedings were held to-wit:

**IN RE: PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING OFF PREMISES BEER PERMIT APPLICATION OF STEPHEN B. HENRY, D.B.A. THE TALLASSEE STORE.**

Beer Board Attorney Robert N. Goddard administered the oath to Stephen B. Henry. Mr. Henry testified that he made an application for a beer permit for the Tallassee Store; that the application is for off premises sales; that the information on the application is correct; that he has filed a survey showing the number of feet from a residence, from a church, and from a school; that the survey is correct.

Mr. Goddard asked if there were any questions for the applicants. There was no response. Mr. Goddard also asked if there were any members of the audience that wished to speak for or against the application. There was no response.

Commissioner Harrison made a motion to send the item to the County Commission with a recommendation for approval of the beer permit. Commissioner Lail seconded the motion.

A voice vote was taken with Chairman Pro Tem Samples declaring the motion to have passed.

**IN RE: PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING ON PREMISES BEER PERMIT APPLICATION OF MIMI WIESE HIATT, D.B.A. RIDGE VALLEY FARMS, LLC.**

Beer Board Attorney Robert N. Goddard administered the oath to Mimi Wiese Hiatt. Mrs. Hiatt testified that she has made an application for a beer permit for the Silo Café owned by Ridge Valley Farms, LLC.; that the application is for an on premises permit; that she has included in her application the location of the proposed sale of beer; that the ownership of the business in the application is correct; that the information in the application is true and correct; that she has included in the application a survey showing the distances from the closest school, place of public worship, and closest residence; that the information is correct.

Mr. Goddard asked if there were any questions for the applicant from the audience. An audience member asked who did the survey showing the distance from the nearest residence. Mrs. Hiatt answered that the surveyor did the survey. Mr. Goddard stated that the survey was done by registered surveyor Ricky Younger. In answer to a question, Mrs. Hiatt stated that her clients had been bringing in wine and beer and alcohol for nine years. Mrs. Hiatt stated that the beer would be served at the Silo Hill Café. She stated that there is an 11:00 curfew for clients. She also stated that when alcohol is served there will be a uniformed safety officer on the premises to insure that no one drives intoxicated. She stated that she has taken the keys from intoxicated clients and let them pick up their cars later. She stated that the business is registered under Ridge Valley Farms LLC and that it is an existing facility. She stated that she was not operating the Silo Hill Café when the County adopted the zoning ordinance in 2000.

Mr. Goddard asked Building Commissioner Roger Fields if the alcoholic beverages were going to be sold at the same place where the café was. Mr. Fields stated that a little over a year ago Mrs. Hiatt got a building permit through the Planning Commission for expansion of an existing use which was the Ridge Valley Farms to turn a llama barn into another area for her clients. It was approved by the Planning Commission under the expansion of the existing Ridge Valley Farms. There were no special exceptions required.

Mr. Goddard stated that under the zoning ordinances, if you are using the property for a particular purpose you may expand that use as long as you are using it for the same type purpose. Mr. Goddard asked if the use now is for open to the public, not as special events. Mrs. Hiatt stated that it was for both. She stated that she will be open to the public and that she was not doing that in 2000.

A member of the audience asked if the distances on the survey were from corner to corner. Mr. Goddard answered that it was from building to building.

Building Commissioner Fields stated that the applicant would only be allowed to expand the existing use of the property under the grandfather clause of the zoning ordinance. He stated that Ridge Valley Farms could expand, but there was not a separate name for the café when the site plan came through. Mr. Fields stated that she could expand the use for Ridge Valley Farms.

Mrs. Hiatt stated that the café would be an upper class facility. She stated that she lives on the road and does not want harmful traffic. She has a four star chef and that they are just opening the doors this past month. They will be serving plated dinners at \$30 to \$45 a head and \$18 at the lowest. Lunches will be high quality. They will have ABC certified servers and they will be monitoring the consumption. If someone comes in inebriated, they will not be served. She stated that the café has been open for reservations for a month and has been doing catering for some time.

Mr. Goddard stated that under the grandfather provision of zoning, if the property was used for a particular purpose when zoning was enacted then the owner has a right to continue that use and expand that use on the property. He stated that the owner has a right to use the property for special events type use but not to change the use to an open daily type use.

Mrs. Hiatt stated that the hours of the Silo Hill Café would be 11:00 am to 9:00 pm, Tuesday through Sunday and that the special events have an 11:00 pm curfew. She stated that she had a business license for a café now and that the State of Tennessee has inspected and approved the business. She stated that when she bought the property in 1994 she built the main structure and lived in it for a time and began the business.

Mr. Goddard stated that the deed restrictions for the property have no bearing on what the Beer Board can or cannot do. The restrictions are private covenants between private property owners. The Beer Board has no right to enforce them or to deny a beer permit based on restrictive covenants by private individuals. He stated that if the use of the property is not what is zoned, then they would have to get a zoning change. He also stated that the original application was denied because the applicant did not have the distance to the nearest school on the survey. A new survey was submitted with the distance shown on the survey.

Susie Epperson stated that property owner Mimi Hiatt is in violation of legal restrictions for the property. Mr. Goddard stated that those are private covenant restrictions that cannot be enforced by, or taken into consideration by the Beer Board in granting or not granting the beer permit. Mrs. Epperson stated that there have been flagrant violations of the covenants and what does that say to the future for other laws.

Frank Romano stated that when he moved in the area it was peaceful. He stated that Mrs. Hiatt turned it into a circus and moved across the street and well away from the noise and confusion. When the business was started in the 1990's it was never one that served food or a place of public accommodation. It is in diametric opposition to what it was. The Silo Hill Café is a new business and it does not have a business license. There is no license issued to the Silo Hill Café. There is only one for Ridge Valley Farms. She is expanding it to incorporate this new business. He asked that the license be denied.

Wayne Oliver stated that he lives next to the business. He stated that the curfew is when they all leave. He stated that they have no respect for their neighbors. He complained about his driveway being blocked.

Lynn Little stated that he has been a community member for ten years. He has two teenage sons. He stated that 6 Mile Road is a two lane road with no shoulders. He expressed concern for people coming to the establishment to drink and getting back on a two lane highway and putting his children in danger.

Commissioner Hargis made a motion to recommend to the full commission to deny the beer permit. Commissioner Keeble seconded the motion.

A voice vote was taken with Chairman Pro Tem Samples declaring the motion to have passed.

Dear representatives of Blount County or Sevier County organization:

Enclosed, please find a check which represents your share of the COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT GRANT allocated for Senatorial District 8.

I know you may be disappointed that the grant is less than you requested. I share your disappointment. Let me explain the process I went through to arrive at this amount:

I was allotted three-hundred thousand (300,000) dollars for my district.

Some senators and representatives chose to contact privately a few non-profit groups in their districts, and make grant awards directly to them. In this process, a few organizations receive larger grants.

I chose to announce the availability of the grant to all organizations in my district, using newspaper and other public announcements. In this process, many organizations receive smaller grants.

Not surprisingly, the grant program was very popular. The Secretary of State received more than nine-thousand applications from throughout the state. Thousands of applications were culled, as being ineligible. This still left a list of approximately four-thousand applications. This list was presented to my office as raw data.

I divided my 300,000 dollars into two accounts-- a Blount County and a Sevier County account-- based only on populations in the two counties. All groups are intended to receive the same proportionate share of grants, based on population.

I was faced with the task of distributing the grant fund to more than one-hundred organizations. I tried to give each similar organization the same amount (the same award to a Blount County volunteer fire department and to a Sevier County volunteer fire department). Public health and safety organizations, which depend on volunteer donations, received larger grants than governmental organizations, which are financed with taxes.

The process was imperfect, but I did the best I could under the circumstances. I do hope this check helps some.

Thank you for all you do to help make Blount and Sevier counties and their people the wonderful place to work and live that it is today.

**ARTICLE I - SCOPE, PURPOSE AND AUTHORITY**

**Section 101. General.**

a. The National Guard Bureau (NGB) and the Blount County, Tennessee Sheriff's Office (hereinafter referred to as the State) have entered into this Military Construction Cooperative Agreement (MCCA) to establish the terms and conditions applicable to the contribution of NGB funds or in-kind assistance for the construction of a Project. NGB and the State desire to design and construct the Project. The design and construct process links the NGB's obligation to design with the State's obligation to construct the Project using this single MCCA.

b. The attached Appendix/Appendices are integral to this MCCA.

**Section 102. Property and Improvements.**

a. The State has submitted, (or will submit prior to construction of the Project), satisfactory evidence of the necessary property interest to the real estate upon which the Project is to be constructed. The real estate is of a nature and located in an area that is appropriate for the intended construction and for the use intended under local laws and ordinances.

b. Title to any real property improvements, including real property installed equipment, except for IDS or J-SIIDS equipment, constructed under this MCCA shall be held in the State.

**Section 103. Scope of Activities.**

The scope of activities is contained in the Appendix/Appendices.

**Section 104. Performance Specifications.**

The State's performance specifications are contained in the Appendix/Appendices.

**Section 105. Authority.**

a. Title 10 U.S.C. §Chapter 1801 authorizes the NGB *[as the Federal Agent for the U.S.]* to contribute funds necessary for design and construction of the Project. Contribution of funds by NGB and the construction of the Project are necessary to accomplish Federal and State missions of the State Air National Guard.

b. The Project will be used by the Tennessee Air National Guard and other such entities as may be associated with or assigned to the Air National Guard Training and Education Center located on McGhee Tyson Air National Guard Base, Tennessee.

c. This MCCA is a Cooperative Agreement within the meaning of 31 U.S.C. §§ 6301-6308.

**ARTICLE II - OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES**

**Section 201. Obligations of the State.**

- a. The State shall exercise its best efforts to supervise, manage, operate and maintain all activities or projects within the scope of this MCCA according to sound, efficient, commercial practice and the terms, conditions and specifications of this MCCA.
- b. The State will obligate sufficient funds to pay its share of costs of this MCCA.
- c. Once the Project is completed, the State may not permit any use or disposition of the facility constructed which will interfere with its use for the administration and training of units of the Reserve Forces of the United States, or in time of war or national emergency, by other units of the Armed Forces of the United States or any other use by the Federal Government for an indefinite period of time.
- d. In the event the State desires to place the facility(ies) under some use other than the training or administration of the reserve forces of the United States, the State upon the approval of the USPFO, may place the facilities in such other use provided that:
  - 1. If the facility is still adequate for its original purpose and still required for the use of any Reserve Component of the United States, the State replaces the facility in-kind without further Federal contribution; and,
  - 2. Executes a modification to this MCCA recognizing all terms and conditions as applying to the replacement facility for the remaining term of this MCCA. Determination of whether the replacement facility is adequate for use as is, in fact "in-kind" shall be within the sole discretion of the USPFO.
- e. The State will assume full responsibility for maintenance of all improvements to the facility.
- f. With the installation of the Bullet Trap System, Blount County will hold NGB harmless from any future environmental actions in regard to lead abatement. This hold harmless obligation shall be limited to the negligence of the state's employees while acting within the scope of their employment to the extent of liability and the amount of liability provided by the Tennessee Governmental Tort Liability Act.

**Section 202. Obligations of NGB.**

- a. NGB shall reimburse the State for the allowable costs incurred in performance of this MCCA according to the terms and conditions for such reimbursement set forth herein.
- b. Whenever the terms of this MCCA provide for approval by NGB, such approval will not be unreasonably withheld. Any request for such approval shall be considered and acted upon by NGB in a timely fashion.

**ARTICLE III - COSTS****Section 301. General.**

NGB shall reimburse the State for allowable costs of the performance of this MCCA.

**Section 302. Estimated Cost.**

a. The total estimated costs of this MCCA are specified in the Appendix/Appendices.

b. The State shall share in costs of this MCCA performance as provided for in the approved Finance Plans as provided in Section 402.

**Section 303. Cost Sharing.**

a. Wherever any item of cost for the performance of this MCCA as listed in a Finance Plan as required in Article IV of this MCCA, is identified to be funded in-part by State contributions and in-part by NGB contributions, NGB shall be obligated to reimburse the State only for its percentage share of the total costs that would otherwise be allowable under this MCCA.

b. **Cost Share Percentage.** For the purposes of liquidating the State's obligation to pay for its share of the costs of the Project, the percentage share of allowable costs for the design or construction of the Project to be reimbursed to the State shall be identified in the Appendix/Appendices.

**Section 304. Allowability of Costs**

a. Except as otherwise stated in this article or elsewhere in this MCCA, the allowability of costs incurred by the State in performance of this MCCA shall be determined according to OMB Circular A-87, as amended, and 32 CFR Part 33, as amended, at the time the cost is incurred.

b. Costs for acquisition of real property for the purposes of this MCCA are unallowable.

c. Costs of State Improvements are unallowable. These unallowable improvements are Project components in excess of authorized criteria of which will not support Federal reimbursement.

**Section 305. Advance Agreements on the Allowability of Costs**

a. No cost incurred by the State that is contrary to any restriction, limitation, or instruction contained in any Finance Plan under this MCCA shall be allowable.

b. Indirect costs, as such costs are defined in OMB Circular A-87, shall be unallowable, unless such costs are listed in Subsection c.

c. None

**Section 306. Project Close-out and Settlement.**

a. Within 90 days of the final completion of the Project (the date of execution of a PROJECT INSPECTION REPORT, by the State and the United States Property and Fiscal Officer), or upon the termination of this MCCA, whichever comes earlier, the State shall promptly deliver to NGB a full and final accounting liquidating all payments or reimbursements under this MCCA for the Project. After completion of the State's final accounting, NGB shall make a final settlement of the total NGB contribution for the Project. Except for reservations of costs for unliquidated claims or undisbursed obligations arising from the State's performance of this MCCA, costs incurred for performance of the Project which are not disclosed by the State within 90 days of the final completion of the Project shall not be eligible for reimbursement by NGB. The State shall provide a good faith estimate of the total amount of unliquidated claims and undisbursed obligations. At its sole discretion, NGB may extend the 90 day limit for good cause shown.

b. As soon as practicable after all reserved claims are liquidated and all State disbursements for project purposes are made, the State shall submit a final settlement proposal to NGB showing its total costs paid for the Project, the total allowable paid costs the Project, and the total amount of costs which NGB is obligated to reimburse the State under the terms of this MCCA.

**ARTICLE IV - FUNDING LIMITATIONS**

**Section 401. Funding Limitation.**

a. The maximum funding limitation amount of NGB for design and construction is separately specified in the Appendix/Appendices.

b. Subject to the Project Appropriation Limitation and within its discretion, NGB may unilaterally increase the maximum funding limitation reflected in the Appendix/Appendices at any time.

c. Project Appropriation Limitation. Notwithstanding any other funding limitation in this MCCA, the Project construction funding limitation shall not exceed the lesser of 125 percent of the Project construction appropriation or \$1,500,000 above the appropriation.

**Section 402. Method of Funding.**

This MCCA shall be fully funded.

**Section 403. State Advance Funding of Design Option.**

a. Within its discretion, the State may contract, and fund the payment of costs, for the preparation of Project Design Documents in order to fulfill its obligation to provide Project Design Documents. To the extent that costs are required to be reimbursed by NGB, the State's incurrence of the costs shall be for the account of NGB and for which NGB shall reimburse the State.

b. Limitations in this article relate to funds actually for reimbursement of the State for its design. Consequently, the fact that Federal funds may not be presently available for obligation or obligated to this MCCA or available for reimbursement of State costs until completion of the Project Design Documents by the State or the beginning of construction of the Project shall not be grounds for claim by either party that this MCCA is unenforceable because of failure of consideration.

## ARTICLE V - PAYMENT

**action 501. Payment by the Reimbursement Method.**

- a. Each month (at a minimum, if costs have been incurred) the State shall provide to the USPFO a certified statement itemizing the amount of costs incurred during the preceding month and the corresponding accounting classification to be charged. The USPFO shall prepare a Standard Form (SF) 1034 [Public Voucher for Purchases and Services Other than Personal] using the aforementioned certified statement as a supporting document; and,
- b. Upon verification of the amount shown on the Standard Form 1034, the USPFO shall execute the necessary documentation for reimbursing the State and forward the accompanying documentation to the appropriate disbursing officer for payment.
- c. In no case will the USPFO reimburse the State using the percentage of completion project method.

**Section 502. Payment by Advance. (Payments will not be made in advance)**

- a. If NGB should reimburse the State in advance, such advance payment shall be made according to the procedures established by the Defense Finance and Accounting Service, the NGB, and the USPFO.
- b. In addition to any conditions, reports or accounting required under the Defense Finance and Accounting Service procedures, the State shall comply with the following conditions:
  1. Amount of advance. The total amount outstanding advanced and unliquidated at any one time shall not exceed the Congressional appropriation. The Federal Government shall make advance payments to the State to meet its financial assistance needs as close to the time the State is required to make disbursements. The unliquidated advance payments shall not exceed the unpaid amount of this MCCA.
  2. Submission of Requests for Advance Payments.
    - (a) The State shall determine the estimated amount of funds necessary to meet the requirements of paragraph b.3., entitled "Use of Funds", to cover each month's operation under this advance payment financing arrangement. The State shall submit its request for advance payment to the USPFO approximately 30 days prior to the beginning of the period for which any advance payment cash requirement exists.
    - (b) The USPFO will approve/disapprove request for advance payments. The USPFO shall review the initial request mentioned above and all subsequent submissions of cash requirements to determine the reasonableness thereof; and insure adjustments are made in relation to prior advances and liquidations.
    - (c) Upon receipt of the USPFO's request for payment and aforementioned supporting documents, the disbursing officer shall draw a Treasury check payable to the State for the amount authorized by the USPFO and forward such check to the State so that the funds shall be available at the beginning of the period for which the cash requirement exists. Electronic data interchange (EDI) and electronic funds transfer are the DoD standards used to process payment requests and related actions.
    - (d) If the USPFO determines that the amount of the advance payment requested for any period is in excess of the State's needs for the period, the amount of the advance shall be decreased accordingly.
  3. Use of Funds.
    - (a) Funds advanced shall be deposited with the Treasurer of the State in a special account indicating the source and purpose of the funds pursuant to State Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law.
    - (b) The State agrees to minimize the time elapsing between the transfer of funds from the U.S. Treasury and their disbursement by the State.
    - (c) The funds provided by this advance payment arrangement are to be used solely to reimburse the State for such items of allowable costs incurred in the performance of this MCCA. Any interpretation required as to the proper use of funds shall be made in writing to the ANG/FM. Note: Advances under this MCCA are subject to the availability of appropriated funds from which advances can be made.
  4. Liquidation of advances and return of funds. Appropriate payment documents (vouchers and/or payrolls) for actual expenditures shall be submitted to the USPFO during the period for which advance payments have been made; such documents shall be reconciled with the advance payments which were previously made and shall be applied to the liquidation of those advance payments outstanding. Any payments due to the State in excess of the outstanding and unliquidated advance payments shall be paid to

the State. If upon completion of this MCCA, there remains any outstanding and unliquidated advance payment(s), the State shall immediately pay the Federal Government, upon demand, the amount remaining unliquidated. In the event the State fails to make such a payment within 30 days after the date of such demand, interest at the rate in effect at the time, established by the Secretary of the Treasury pursuant to Public Law 92-41, 85 Stat 97, for the Renegotiation Board, shall become due and payable from the date of demand. The State may at any time repay all or part of the outstanding and unliquidated advance payments made hereunder.

5. Access to records. The State shall make records and accounts pertaining to this MCCA available for inspection by auditors and other authorized Federal Government officials as required.

**Section 503. Direct Federal Payment of State Obligations.**

In no event, shall the USPFO make direct payment to a State contractor, State employee, contractor employee, or State vendor for any costs incurred by the State under this MCCA.

**Section 504. Interest.**

The amount of interest due the United States on funds advanced to the State or of interest due the State shall be determined and paid in accordance with 31 U.S.C. § 6503 and such regulations as have been issued by the U.S. Department of Treasury and the Department of Defense, as amended.

**ARTICLE VI - DEFINITIONS****Section 601. Air National Guard Military Construction Cooperative Agreements.**

Air National Guard (ANG) Military Construction Cooperative Agreements mean any agreements entered into by the Department of Defense, National Guard Bureau, with the states, funded by Department of Defense appropriations for the Air National Guard, for construction, minor construction, of the Air National Guard, and for other programs authorized and directed by Congress or the Department of Defense to be performed by the States and the National Guard Bureau.

**Section 602. Air National Guard.**

The Air National Guard (ANG) means that part of the organized militia of the several States and Territories, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia, active and inactive, that--

- a. is an air force;
- b. is trained, and has its officers appointed, under the sixteenth clause of section 8, article I of the Constitution;
- c. is organized, armed, and equipped wholly or partly at Federal expense; and
- d. is federally recognized (32 U.S.C. § 101).

**Section 603. Architect-Engineer Services.**

Architect-Engineer Services mean any service necessary, or reasonably related, to the investigation of a construction site for suitability, layout, engineering requirements, development of plans and specifications for construction, preparation of construction estimates, reproduction of construction contract bid documents, or supervision and inspection of construction.

**Section 604. Armory/Nonarmory Construction Project.**

Armory construction project shall mean the acquisition, construction, expansion, rehabilitation, and conversion of facilities for the administration and training of units of the ANG. A nonarmory construction project is the acquisition, construction, expansion, rehabilitation, and conversion of facilities for administration and logistical support; or, training support of the ANG.

**Section 605. Chief, National Guard Bureau.**

The Chief, National Guard Bureau means the head of the National Guard Bureau or his designee.

**Section 606. Equipment.**

For the purposes of 32 CFR 33.32, equipment means any equipment purchased for the performance of this MCCA that is not "military equipment."

**Section 607. Fiscal Year.**

Fiscal Year (FY) means the Federal Fiscal Year that runs from October 1 through September 30.

**Section 608. Grants Officer.**

Grants Officer (GO) shall mean an individual appointed by the NGB, Head of Contracting Activity (HCA) authorized to provide approvals, receive reports, modify or change the terms of this MCCA, provide funds under this MCCA or take any other action for NGB under this MCCA except for deciding any appeal of a dispute under this MCCA as provided in Section 1203 and any other action delegated to a specific person by this MCCA or Appendix.

**Section 609. Grants Officer Representative.**

Grants Officer Representative (GOR) means a representative of the Grants Officer acting within the limits of his or her authority delegated, in writing, by the Grants Officer. If the Grants Officer designates a GOR, the assistance recipient will receive a copy of the written designation. It will specify the extent of the GOR's authority to act on behalf of the Grants Officer. The GOR is not authorized to make any commitments or changes that will affect the terms or conditions of the MCCA or Appendix.

**Section 611. Interservice Support Agreement.**

An Interservice Support Agreement is a formal agreement that defines recurring services to be provided by one supplier to one or more receivers and defines the basis for calculating reimbursement charges for services. It shall be used to define clearly the terms and conditions of the agreement including, when appropriate, a cost breakdown, and special instruction for each area or category of support.

**Section 612. In-kind Assistance.**

In-kind assistance means the transfer of property or services, (valued at the time of contribution at fair market value) in lieu of funds by NGB to satisfy (in whole or in part) its obligation of assistance support to the State.

**Section 613. Military Equipment.**

Military Equipment is any equipment issued to a State pursuant to applicable military regulations and accounted for by the State and USPFO.

**Section 614. Military Supplies.**

Military Supplies are any supplies issued to a State pursuant to applicable military regulations and accounted for by the State and the USPFO.

**Section 616. National Guard Bureau.**

The National Guard Bureau (NGB) is a Joint Bureau of the Department of the Army and the Department of the Air Force, headed by a chief who is the advisor to the Army Chief of Staff and the Air Force Chief of Staff on National Guard matters. The National Guard Bureau is the channel of communication between the departments concerned and the several States, Territories, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia, on all matters pertaining to the National Guard, the Army National Guard of the United States, and the Air National Guard of the United States (10 U.S.C. Chapter 1011 (In lieu of 10 U.S.C. § 3040)).

**Section 617. Operation and Maintenance Activities.**

Operation and Maintenance (O&M) Activities mean and include, but are not to be limited to actions by the State, through employment by the State, by contract or hire, of sufficient personnel, acquisition by contract of supplies or services, or other necessary actions, to perform the services, tasks, or activities within the scope of this MCCA which are properly charged to an Operations and Maintenance appropriation.

**Section 618. State.**

State means any of the states of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and each territory and possession of the United States, including their political subdivisions, counties, municipalities, cities, town, townships, local public authorities and tax-supported agencies.

**Section 619. State Improvements.**

State Improvements are facilities, portions of facilities, or other work included within the scope of the Project as identified in the Appendices to this MCCA which are desired by the State and for which NGB will make no contribution of funds for either design or construction.

**Section 620. Supplies.**

For the purposes of 32 CFR 33.33, supplies means any supplies purchased for the performance of this MCCA that are not "military supplies."

**Section 621. Territory.**

Territory means any Territory. However, for purposes of laws relating to the militia, the National Guard, the Army National Guard of the United States, and the Air National Guard of the United States, "Territory" includes Guam and the Virgin Islands (32 U.S.C. § 101).

**Section 622. The Adjutant General.**

a. The Adjutant General (TAG) is the head of the State [Commonwealth, or Territory] Military Department, appointed by the Governor of the State [Commonwealth, or Territory], according to the respective State's [Commonwealth's, or Territory's] constitution, or statute.

b. The TAG :

1. Receives funds and property and accounts for all expenditures and property acquired through this MCCA; and
2. Makes returns and reports concerning those expenditures and that property, as required by this MCCA.

**Section 623. United States Property and Fiscal Officer.**

a. The United States Property and Fiscal Officer (USPFO) is the qualified commissioned officer of the Army National Guard or the Air National Guard, as the case may be, designated by the Chief, National Guard Bureau, to be the United States Property and Fiscal Officer of a State or territory.

b. The USPFO:

1. Receives and accounts for all funds and property of the United States in the possession of the National Guard for which he is property and fiscal officer; and

2. Makes returns and reports concerning those funds and that property, as required by the Secretary concerned.  
(32 U.S.C. § 708)

**ARTICLE VII - GENERAL PROVISIONS**

**Section 701. Term of Agreement.**

Unless sooner terminated by its terms, this MCCA shall terminate 1 year after the date of NGB's acceptance of construction project according to the attached Statement of Work for State Construction.

**Section 702. Sole Benefit.**

This MCCA is intended for the sole benefit of NGB and the State and is not intended to create any other beneficiaries.

**Section 703. Amendment.**

This MCCA may be amended only by a written instrument signed by the parties hereto. Appendices may be amended separately. However, no Appendix amendment may modify this MCCA by reference.

**Section 704. Successors and Assigns.**

This MCCA may not be assigned by a party without the express written consent of the other party. All covenants made under this MCCA shall bind and inure to the benefit of any successors and assigns of the parties whether or not expressly assumed or acknowledged by such successors or assigns.

**Section 705. Entire Agreement.**

This MCCA forms the entire agreement between the parties as to scope and subject matter of this MCCA. All prior discussions and understandings concerning such scope and subject matter are superseded and incorporated by this MCCA.

**Section 706. Severability.**

If any provision of this MCCA is held judicially invalid, the remainder of this MCCA shall continue in force and effect to the extent not inconsistent with such holding.

**Section 707. Waiver of Breach.**

If a party waives enforcement of any provision of this MCCA (or Appendices) upon any event of breach by the other party, such waiver shall not automatically extend to any other or future events of breach.

**Section 708. Notices.**

Any notice, transmittal, approval, or other official communication made under this MCCA shall be in writing and shall be delivered by hand, facsimile transmission, or by mail to the other party at the address or facsimile transmission telephone number set forth below or at such other address as may be later designated:

**Section 709. Execution.**

This MCCA may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. Subsequent execution of any or all attached Appendices shall not affect the legality or enforceability of this MCCA. Once approved, a copy of the approved MCCA shall be forwarded to the Acquisition Directorate, Office of Grants and Cooperative Agreements, National Guard Bureau.

**Section 710. Conflict of Interest.**

The State shall insure that its employees are prohibited from using their positions for a purpose that is or gives the appearance of being motivated by a desire for private gain for themselves or others.

**Section 711. Access to and Retention of Records.**

The State shall afford any authorized representative of NGB, the Department of Defense, or the Comptroller General access to and the right to examine all records, books, papers, and documents ("Records") that are within the State's custody or control and that relate to its performance under this MCCA. The State shall retain all such records intact in such form, if not original documents, as may be approved by NGB for at least three (3) years following project completion or termination.

**Section 712. Change of Circumstances.**

Each party shall promptly notify the other party of any legal impediment, change of circumstances, pending litigation, or any other event or condition that may adversely affect such party's ability to carry out any of its obligations under this MCCA.

**Section 713. Liability and Indemnity.**

Except as stated in Section 716, nothing in this MCCA shall be construed as an indemnification by one party of the other for liabilities of a party or third persons for property loss or damage or death or personal injury arising out of and during the performance of this MCCA. Any liabilities or claims for property loss or damage or for death or personal injury by a party or its agents, employees, contractors or assigns or by third persons, arising out of and during the performance of this MCCA shall be determined according to applicable law.

**Section 714. Reports.**

In addition to any financial or other reports required by the terms of this MCCA, NGB may require the State to prepare reports or provide information relating to this MCCA. The State agrees to provide such reports within a reasonable time of request and in such detail as may be required.

**Section 715. GSA Vehicles.**

In addition to the Liability and Indemnity provisions in Section 713, nothing in this MCCA shall be construed as an indemnification by the United States of the State, its employees, agents, or third persons, for liability with respect to any and all claims, including, but not limited to: (1) claims for damages; and (2) claims for reimbursement arising from property loss, personal injury or accident damage related to the use, care, or operation of a GSA vehicle. The State agrees to indemnify the US Government for any liability incurred by the United States Government as a result of the use by the State employee of a Government vehicle. This hold harmless obligation shall be limited to the negligence of the state's employees while acting within the scope of their employment to the extent of liability and the amount of liability provided by the Tennessee Governmental Tort Liability Act.

## ARTICLE VIII - APPLICABLE LAWS AND REGULATIONS

### Section 801. Applicable Law.

This MCCA is incident to the implementation of a Federal program. Accordingly, this MCCA shall be governed by and construed according to Federal law as it may affect the rights, remedies, and obligations of the United States.

### Section 802. Governing Regulations.

To the extent not inconsistent with the express terms of this MCCA, the provisions of 32 CFR Part 33, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements, the, DoD Grant and Agreement Regulations (4/13/98), OMB Circular A-87, and NGR 5-1/ANGI 63-101, which Circular and Regulations are hereby incorporated into this MCCA by reference as if fully set forth herein, shall govern this MCCA.

### Section 803. Nondiscrimination.

The State covenants and agrees that no person shall be denied benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination in connection with the State's performance under this MCCA, on the ground of race, religion, color, national origin, sex or handicap. Accordingly and to the extent applicable, the State covenants and agrees to comply with the following:

- a. Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. § 2000d et seq.), and DOD regulations (32 CFR Part 300) issued thereunder;
- b. Executive Order 11246 and Department of Labor regulations issued thereunder (41 CFR Part 60);
- c. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. § 794) and DOD Regulations issued thereunder (32 CFR Part 56); and,
- d. The Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 U.S.C. § 6101 et seq.) and regulations issued thereunder (45 CFR Part 90).

### Section 804. Lobbying.

- a. The State covenants and agrees that it will not expend any funds appropriated by Congress to pay any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, or a Member of Congress in connection with any of the following covered Federal actions: the awarding of any Federal contract; the making of any Federal grant; the making of any Federal loan; the entering into of any cooperative agreement; and, the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
- b. The Final Rule, New Restrictions on Lobbying, issued by the Office of Management and Budget and the Department of Defense (32 CFR Part 28) to implement the provisions of section 319 of Public Law 101-121 (31 U.S.C. § 1352) is incorporated by reference and the State agrees to comply with all the provisions thereof, including any amendments to the Interim Final Rule that may hereafter be issued.

### Section 805. Drug-Free Work Place.

- a. The State covenants and agrees that it will comply with the provisions of the Drug-Free Work Place Act of 1988 (Public Law 100-690, Title V, Subtitle D; 41 U.S.C. § 701 et seq.) and maintain a drug-free workplace.
- b. The Final Rule, Government-Wide Requirements for Drug-Free Workplace (Grants), issued by the Office of Management and Budget and the Department of Defense (32 CFR Part 28, Subpart f) to implement the provisions of the Drug-Free Work Place Act of 1988 is incorporated by reference and the State covenants and agrees to comply with all the provisions thereof, including any amendments to the Final Rule that may hereafter be issued.

### Section 806. Environmental Protection.

- a. The State agrees that its performance under this MCCA shall comply with: the requirements of Section 114 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. § 7414) and Section 308 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. § 1318), that relate generally to inspection, monitoring, entry reports, and information, and with all regulations and guidelines issued thereunder; the Resources Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA); the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liabilities Act (CERCLA); the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA); and any applicable Federal, State or Local environmental regulation.
- b. The State shall insure that no facility used in its performance under this MCCA is listed on the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) list of violating facilities pursuant to 40 CFR Part 15 without the concurrence of NGB. The State shall notify NGB of the receipt of any communication from EPA indicating that a facility to be or being used in its performance under this MCCA is under

consideration for listing on the EPA list of violating facilities.

c. For the purposes of this section, NGB agrees that the State's obligations in Paragraphs a. and b. of this section above shall not apply to any armory, base, training site, or other facility or portion thereof, the operation and maintenance of which is funded under this MCCA, that is currently or becomes, listed as a violating facility, on the effective date of this MCCA, pursuant to 40 CFR Part 15; nor, shall such listing be the basis for NGB's termination for cause of this MCCA or for NGB's disallowance of any cost otherwise allowable under this MCCA. Subject to the availability of funds, the State and NGB agree to cooperate to remediate, as expeditiously as possible, any facility the operation and maintenance of which is within the scope of this MCCA, the condition giving rise to the listing of any such facility as a violating facility according to applicable statutes, regulations, or other agreements.

**Section 807. Use of United States Flag Vessels.**

The State agrees to comply with 46 U.S.C. § 1241(b) and regulations issued thereunder (46 CFR Part 381) as follows:

a. To use privately-owned United States flag commercial vessels to ship at least 50 percent of the gross tonnage (computed separately for dry bulk carriers, dry cargo liners, and tankers) of any equipment, materials, or commodities that are both (1) procured, contracted for, or otherwise obtained with funds made available by NGB under this MCCA, and (2) transported by ocean vessel, to the extent such vessels are available at fair and reasonable rates;

b. To furnish within 20 working days following the date of loading for shipments originating within the United States or within 30 working days following the date of loading for shipments originating outside the United States, a legible copy of a rated, "on-board" commercial ocean bill-of-lading in English for each shipment of cargo described in paragraph (a) above to both NGB and to the Division of National Cargo, Office of Market Development, U.S. Maritime Administration, Washington, D.C. 20590; and,

c. Subject to existing contracts, to insert the substance of the provisions of this section in all contracts issued pursuant to this MCCA, and to cause such provisions to be inserted in all subcontracts issued pursuant to this MCCA, where the contract or subcontract is for \$100,000 or more and where there is a possibility of ocean transportation of procured equipment or materials.

**Section 808. Debarment and Suspension.**

a. States shall not make any award or permit any award (subgrant or contract) at any tier to any party which is debarred or suspended or is otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal assistance programs under Executive Order 12549, "Debarment and Suspension.

b. The Final Rule, Governmentwide Debarment and Suspension (Nonprocurement), issued by the Office of Management and Budget and the Department of Defense (32 CFR Part 25) to implement the provisions of Executive Order 12549, "Debarment and Suspension" is incorporated by reference and the State covenants and agrees to comply with all the provisions thereof, including any amendments to the Final Rule that may hereafter be issued.

**Section 809. Buy American Act.**

The State covenants and agrees that it will not expend any funds appropriated by Congress without complying with The Buy American Act (41 U.S.C. 10). The Buy American Act gives preference to domestic end products and domestic construction material. In addition, the Memorandum of Understanding between the United States of America and the European Economic Community on Government Procurement, and the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), provide that EC and NAFTA end products and construction materials are exempted from application of the Buy American Act.

**Section 810. Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies.**

The State covenants and agrees that it will comply with the provisions of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 (42 U.S.C. § 4601 et seq.) and regulations issued thereunder (49 CFR Part 24).

**Section 811. Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act.**

The State covenants and agrees that it will comply with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (18 U.S.C. 874) as supplemented in Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 3). As applied to this MCCA, the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act makes it unlawful to induce, by force, intimidation, threat of procuring dismissal from employment, or otherwise, any person employed in the construction or repair of public buildings or public works, financed in whole or in part by the United States, to give up any part of the compensation to which that person is entitled under a contract of employment.

**Section 812. Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act.**

The State covenants and agrees that it will comply with Sections 103 and 107 of the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 327-330) as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5). As applied to this MCCA, the Contract

Work Hours and Safety Standards Act specifies that no laborer or mechanic doing any part of the work contemplated by this MCCA shall be required or permitted to work more than 40 hours in any workweek unless paid for all additional hours at not less than 1 1/2 times the basic rate of pay.

**Section 813. Davis-Bacon Act. (not used).**

**Section 814. National Historic Preservation.** (Any construction, acquisition, modernization, or other activity that may impact a historic property.)

The Contractor/Vendor agree to identify to the awarding agency any property listed or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places that will be affected by this award, and to provide any help the awarding agency may need, with respect to this award, to comply with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (16 U.S.C. 470, et seq.), as implemented by the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation regulations at 36 CFR Part 800 and Executive Order 11593 (3 CFR, 1971-1975 Comp., p. 559).

(36 CFR Part 800 requires Grants Officers to get comments from the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation before proceeding with Federally assisted projects that may affect properties listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.)

**Section 815. Hatch Act.**

The Contractor/Vendor agrees to comply with the Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. 1501 - 1508 and 7324 - 7328), as implemented by the Office of Personnel Management at 5 CFR Part 151, which limits political activity of employees or officers of State or local governments whose employment is connected to an activity financed in whole or part with Federal funds.

**Section 816. Equal Employment Opportunity.** (All construction contracts awarded in excess of \$10,000 by grantees and their contractors or subgrantees.)

Compliance with Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965 entitled "Equal Employment Opportunity," as amended by Department of Labor regulations (41 CFR Chapter 60).

**Section 817. Cargo Preference.** (Any agreement under which international air travel may be supported by U.S. Government funds.)

Travel supported by U.S. Government funds under this agreement shall use U.S.-flag air carriers (air carriers holding certificates under 49 U.S.C. 41102) for international air transportation of people and property to the extent that such service is available, in accordance with the International Air Transportation Fair Competitive Practices Act of 1974 (49 U.S.C. 40118) and the interpretative guidelines issued by the Comptroller General of the United States in the March 31, 1981, amendment to Comptroller General Decision B138942.

**ARTICLE IX - PROCUREMENT**

**Section 901. State Contracts.**

The State's acquisition of goods and services by the State in performance of this MCCA shall be according to applicable State contracting procedures, the standards and procedures contained in 32 CFR § 33.36 and this MCCA.

**Section 902. State Contract Flow-down.**

Subject to existing contracts, the State is required to insert the substance of the provisions of Article VIII in all contracts issued under this MCCA, unless State laws or regulations offer more protection.

**ARTICLE X - PROPERTY**

**Section 1001. Equipment.**

The State shall account for and manage equipment acquired by the State under this MCCA and equipment provided by NGB for performance of this MCCA as provided for in 32 CFR § 33.32.

**Section 1002. Supplies.**

The State shall account for and manage supplies acquired by the State under this MCCA and supplies provided by NGB for performance of this MCCA as provided for in 32 CFR § 33.32.

**Section 1003. Military Equipment and Supplies.**

Notwithstanding Sections 1001 and 1002 above, use and disposition of military supplies and equipment issued to the State pursuant to applicable military regulations shall be according to such regulations. Nothing shall prevent the State from using such issued equipment or supplies in performance of this MCCA. The State shall be responsible for separately accounting for military equipment and supplies used in performance of this MCCA according to existing military accounting systems and procedures.

**ARTICLE XI - LEGAL AUTHORITY**

**Section 1101. Legal Authority.**

The State represents and warrants that it is under no existing or foreseeable legal disability that would prevent or hinder it from fulfilling the terms and conditions of this MCCA. The State shall promptly notify NGB of any legal impediment that arises during the term of this MCCA that may prevent or hinder the State's fulfillment of its obligations under this MCCA.

**Section 1102. Opinion of Counsel.**

Concurrent with its execution of this MCCA, the State shall furnish an opinion of counsel by the highest legal officer of the State, or his or her designee, that:

- a. The State has the requisite authority to enter into this MCCA;
- b. The State can make the warranty set forth in Section 1101;
- c. The State is empowered to assume the responsibilities and obligations the State proposes to undertake under this MCCA;
- d. The provisions of the MCCA intended to secure the interests of NGB are enforceable according to their terms;
- e. The execution of this MCCA has been duly authorized; and,
- f. That the individual signing this MCCA on behalf of the State has the requisite legal authority to bind and obligate the State.

**ARTICLE XII - TERMINATION, ENFORCEMENT, CLAIM AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION**

**Section 1201. Termination.**

This MCCA may be terminated by either party according to the terms and conditions of 32 CFR § 33.44.

**Section 1202. Enforcement.**

a. NGB may take such actions to enforce the terms of this MCCA as may be provided for in and under the terms of 32 CFR § 33.43.

b. Circumstances under which NGB may take the actions provided in Section 1202 a include, but shall not be limited to, the following:

1. Failure by the State to appropriate funds sufficient for its share of Project costs.
2. Unreasonable failure by the State to begin, prosecute, or complete construction of the Project.
3. Failure by the State to complete construction substantially in accordance with the Project Design Documents, approved and accepted in accordance with the terms of this MCCA.

**Section 1203. Claim and Dispute Resolution.**

a. Any claim made by the State arising out of this MCCA shall be presented in writing to the Grants Officer. Such claim shall include: the amount of monetary relief claimed or the nature of other relief requested; the basis for such relief; and, the documents or other evidence pertinent to the claim.

b. Upon receipt of a claim, the Grants Officer shall provide a written decision denying or sustaining the claim, in whole or part, which decision shall include the reason for such action, within 60 days of the date of the receipt of a claim. Such determination shall be final unless appealed by the State pursuant to the provisions of this section.

c. Within 60 days of receipt of the decision of the Grants Officer, the State may appeal the decision of the Grants Officer to the Chief, NGB. Such appeal shall be in writing and shall contain all documents and arguments necessary for a decision on the appeal. All appeals shall be decided on the written record unless the Chief, NGB, in his or her sole discretion, determines to conduct a fact finding session and/or hearing on the appeal. Any such hearing shall be conducted in such manner and under such procedures as the Chief, NGB may determine.

d. Nothing in this section shall limit any other remedy under law available to the State or NGB.

**TECHNICAL APPENDIX**  
**STATEMENT OF WORK**  
**NATIONAL GUARD BUREAU (NGB) DESIGN**

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**1. Purpose.** This Statement of Work defines the National Guard Bureau's (hereinafter referred to as NGB) obligation in providing design for a construction project.

**2. Scope of Services.** By contract or in-house tasking, NGB will provide the Architect-Engineer (A-E) services necessary to develop plans, specifications, and cost estimates (referred to as the Project Design Documents) required for construction of the project.

**3. Architect-Engineer Services.** Architect-Engineer Services shall be designated in the following manner:

3.1. Title I/Type "A" Concept Services: Field surveys and investigations required to obtain data essential for the production of plans and specifications for construction which may include, but not be limited to, topographical surveys, soil borings, soils, chemical and mechanical surveys and investigations, survey of utility location and capacities, and similar fact-finding investigations and technical studies.

3.2. Title I/Type "B" Architect-Engineer Services: Services to perform code and criteria review and to produce construction plans, construction specifications and construction estimates at the preliminary (35 percent completion), pre-final (95 percent completion) and final (bidding documents) phases.

3.3. Reproduction Services: Services to reproduce construction plans and specifications suitable for bidding purposes.

3.4. Title II/Type "C" Construction Supervision Services: Services to supervise and inspect construction performance and review of construction contractor prepared as-built drawings. This service will be provided as part of the Construction Appendix, paragraph 2.4.1.

**4. Project Schedule.** The parties agree to exercise their best efforts to complete the project design within the period set forth on the Project Schedule contained in this Appendix.

**5. Design Responsibilities.**

**5.1. NGB Design.**

Federal funds are available for the design and construction of the project.

5.1.1. NGB will select and contract for A-E design services.

5.1.2. The State shall not issue directions to NGB's design A-E and shall communicate with NGB's design A-E only through, or with the permission of, an authorized representative of NGB.

5.1.3. NGB shall transmit design documents for the State's review, comment, and approval prior to NGB's acceptance of the documents at the 35, 65, and 95 percent stages of design completion. Design documents relating to any NGB Improvements shall not be subject to State approval. The State shall approve, disapprove, or approve subject to comments, the design documents. If the State approves the documents subject to comments, NGB shall make good faith efforts to resolve the comments prior to accepting the documents from the design A-E.

5.1.4. NGB shall carry out final design of the project as defined in this Appendix. The final design shall include construction plans and specifications, construction cost estimates, the construction schedule, and any applicable phasing or sequencing requirements.

5.2. Title to Design Documents. Title to Design Documents shall remain with NGB.

5.3. Limitation of Liability.

5.3.1. NGB acknowledges that it (or its contractor) is preparing Design Documents in its right and not as an agent or contractor of the State.

5.3.2. No NGB or State approval given under this Appendix shall be construed as a warranty of any kind.

## **6. Project Contract Preparation (Optional).**

6.1. Once the Project Design is accepted by the State, NGB agrees to promptly begin definitizing the terms of the construction Project. NGB agrees to submit a proposal and appurtenant cost or pricing.

6.2. The schedule for contract preparation of this project is: 1 June 2007.

6.4.3 Allowable costs. For the purpose of determining allowable costs before construction project contract preparation, the term "costs" includes:

6.4.3.1. Those recorded costs that result, at the time of request for reimbursement, from actual payment for items or services purchased directly for the NGB contract;

6.4.3.2. When NGB is responsible for costs of NGB contract performance in the ordinary course of business, costs incurred, but not necessarily paid, for--

(i) Material issued from the NGB's inventory and placed in the production process for

use on the contract;

(ii) Direct labor; and

(iii) Direct travel.

## **7. Reimbursement of Design Costs.**

There is no reimbursement for design costs in this project.

## **8. Architect-Engineer Fee Limits**

8.1. Architect-Engineer fee percentages are determined according to the Typical Architectural-Engineering Fees for ANG projects of Architect-Engineer Services for National Guard Projects.

8.2. As an alternative, NGB may choose to negotiate a fixed fee Architect-Engineer services contract. If the fixed fee option is chosen, in addition to any other limitation on cost set forth in this MCCA, NGB shall have no obligation to reimburse the State for more than the Federal prorata share of:

8.2.1. Title I/Type A, Concept, costs in excess of 2% (unless approved in advance by NGB) of the estimated cost of construction;

8.2.2. Title I/Type B, Design, costs in excess of 6% of the estimated cost of construction;

8.2.3. Bid Document Reproduction in excess of 25 sets (unless approved in advance by NGB) of bid documents; and,

8.2.4. Title II/Type C, Construction Supervision, costs in excess of 2% of the estimated cost of construction.

TECHNICAL APPENDIX

STATEMENT OF WORK

OWNERSHIP, ACCESS, MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION

1. **Purpose.** This Statement of Work defines the roles and responsibilities of each party to this agreement in terms of ownership of improvements, responsibility for maintenance and repairs of the improvements, access to the improvements, payments of any utilities expended in the operation and maintenance of improvements and the limitations liability extension relative to use of these improvements.

2. **Scope of Responsibilities and Administration.** In general terms it is the intent of this agreement (inclusive of all appendices) that the Blount County Sheriff's Office assume all responsibility, oversight and administration of all improvements accomplished as a result of the terms herein defined.

3. **Range Ownership.** Upon the purchase, installation and manufacturer's certification of the components of these improvements to this firing range it is the intent that the Blount County Sheriff's Office be fully vested in the ownership of such and other related and ancillary improvements as described in other appendices to this agreement. However, if at any time during the period this agreement is in force title to the property whereupon these improvements are constructed changes ownership, the Air National Guard reserves the right to maintain use and access to all improvements made under this agreement. Consequently, any transfer of title to this property must include Air National Guard access to and use of these improvements as an encumbrance.

4. **Maintenance, Repair and Annual Re-certification.** The Blount County Sheriff's Office shall be solely responsible for maintaining and repairing the components of the firing range. In general, it is the intent of this section that all equipment installed under this agreement be continuously maintained in safe and proper operating condition and not be allowed to deteriorate to such a condition that renders it otherwise. The manufacturer of the equipment shall serve as the technical consultant on such situations as might arise where the suitability of service of a component or item is in question. At least once per year the designated representatives of the Blount County Sheriff's Office and a designated representative from the Air National Guard together with the Range Certifying Agency shall tour this range and inspect the condition of the various systems and components thereof and make an assessment as to the condition and safety of such. Necessary maintenance, repairs and adjustments shall be noted and repairs shall be made and the course re-certified.

5. **Scheduling and Coordination.** The Blount County Sheriff's Office shall maintain the master schedule for use of this firing range. The Air National Guard representative will annually provide to the Blount County Sheriff's Office a projected schedule of need for the range. Generally, the Air National Guard will need use of the range on an average of five days per month and the master range schedule shall reflect this minimum level of use. In the event this level of use cannot be accommodated, the Blount County Sheriff's Office will coordinate with the Air National Guard's Representative to insure reasonable access is scheduled. In an effort to minimize confusion regarding the various issues associate with this range each party to this agreement shall appoint a designated representative to coordinate all activities relating to any issue either party has concerning the use of this range.

6. **Operation.** Instruction on the use of this range, establishing and implementing the various training scenarios, supervision of personnel using this range along with the associated and necessary staff to oversee and provide safety observers shall be the responsibility of the agency using the range such as the Blount County Sheriff's Office or the Air National Guard.

7. **Safety.** Each agency using this range shall be responsible for insuring personnel using it are properly briefed on the safe use of the range and are solely responsible and accountable for any incidents arising from the improper use of the range.

8. **Security, Vandalism and Damage from Natural Acts.** It shall be the responsibility of the Blount County Sheriff's Office to insure that all measures and precautions it deems appropriate are taken to insure this range and all equipment installed hereunder is properly protected from vandalism and destruction. Should the equipment be damaged through the act of vandals or acts other than natural occurrences such as flooding, wind, lightning, seismic, etc., the Blount County Sheriff's Office will be responsible for repairs and restoration. Repairs due to damage from natural occurrences will be repaired on a case-by-case basis and costs will be shared as mutually

agreed to and amended into the agreement.

9. **Usage Fees.** In consideration of defrayal of construction costs outlined in Appendix 2 to this Agreement, the Air National Guard shall not, during the period of this agreement (25 years), be assessed any fees or costs relating to the usage, maintenance, upkeep, repair, access, etc. of the improvements made hereunder.

10. **Utilities.** All utility services consumed as a result of any action relating to the construction, operation, maintenance, repair or modifications to this course (to include but not limited to electricity, water supply, wastewater collection and treatment, cable television, emergency telephone service, natural gas, propane, fuel oil, etc.) shall be provide by and defrayed by the Blount County Sheriff's Office.

11. **Site Access.** The Blount County Sheriff's Office shall be responsible for establishing control of and maintaining physical access to the training site where this firing range is constructed. Access to the site is construed to mean the establishment of roads and other vehicular access ways and the associated maintenance actions necessary to maintain these ways in all-weather passable condition. In addition, the Blount County Sheriff's Office shall install any such gates, chains, cables, etc. it deems appropriate and necessary to limit, prohibit or otherwise control unwanted or unnecessary entrance of vehicular traffic to this training site. The Air National Guard shall be provided a copy of the key, combination or other access used to control this site. In return for entrusting the Air National Guard access to the site it agrees to safeguard the use of this access and restrict it to only those members who have bona-fide reasons and need to gain access to this site.

12. **Hold Harmless Agreement.** Notwithstanding any language set-forth in other sections or paragraphs of this agreement, both parties to this contract do hereby agree to hold the other harmless against damages or assessed costs accruing out of any actions as a result of constructing, repairing or using this firing range. This hold harmless obligation shall be limited to the negligence of the state's employees while acting within the scope of their employment to the extent of liability and the amount of liability provided by the Tennessee Governmental Tort Liability Act.

13. **Length of Agreement.** Unless otherwise amended, modified, adjusted or agreed to, this agreement shall be in force continuously for a period not to exceed 25 calendar years commencing from the date appearing on page 1 of the main body of this document.

14. **Additions, Deletions, Changes.** All additions, deletions, or changes to the terms and conditions set-forth in the body and appendices of this agreement shall be made in writing by amending such as established herein. Any verbal or informal agreements not properly and formally included in this agreement shall be null and void.

2.4.3. Final payment shall be after the final Project Inspection Report has been completed and then approved by the USPFO.

**Re:** Funding for Blount County Sheriffs Office (BCSO) Firing Range and Target System

Sheriff Berrong requested I clarify the agreement and funding requirements for the BCSO firing range and target system that will be built. As you are aware, the BCSO has worked with the Air National Guard (ANG) for a number of years in several training endeavors. The ANG asked the federal government for funding approximately a year ago for a firing range and target system to be located at our training area adjacent to the land fill. This year the ANG received full funding for that project in the amount of \$700,000. The agreement is that the ANG would fund that project and the Blount County Sheriff's Office would oversee the project and be responsible for ordering of the materials. The ANG would provide all the labor to construct both the firing range and the target system. These ANG funds would be transferred to Blount County Government and the Blount County Sheriff's Office would pay the bills from these funds for materials. No Blount County tax money would be used. This facility would be for joint use for the ANG and the Blount County Sheriff's Office.

In that agreement with the ANG and the Blount County Sheriff's Office, a figure of \$2,100,000 was listed as "Construction of County Improvements"/Estimated County Share". I wanted to clarify this issue so that everyone would be clear of the intent of the BCSO and Blount County government. Approximately two years ago, the Blount County Sheriff's Office met with several contractors and received an estimate to build a training building at the training facility. This \$2,100,000 figure was the estimate for the training building. This project was part of the overall planning for the long range goals for the BCSO. We met several times with the ANG and discussed different avenues to fund this project. The goal was and still is to someday fund a project with the use of seized drug funds. These discussions are still ongoing with the ANG as to the joint use of this training building and what avenues

we can pursue to fund that project. There were never any discussions to pay for this project with Blount County tax dollars. Since our discussions over the past two years, the 911 Communications Board met and discussed selling property they presently own and build a new facility at the BCSO training property. The Blount County Sheriff Office proposed to join with them and build a training facility to be used jointly. This training facility would be located as a top floor of the building. Let me say again any funding for this project would come from the drug funds or other sources not related to Blount County tax monies.

I hope this clarifies any questions anyone has concerning this project.





1. Property owner, Mimi Hiatt, is in violation of legal restrictions for the property located on Six Mile Road in District No. 7 of Blount County. We request that:
  - a. Mimi Hiatt's **application for a beer license be denied.**
  - b. That Mimi Hiatt **remove the business signs** she has on the property.
  - c. And that Mimi Hiatt **cease all business operations on the property.**
  
2. We sold the property on Six Mile Road to Mimi and Kevin Hiatt on July 30, 1993. The sale was subject to restrictions.
  - a. The Deed of Trust was prepared by attorney Steven Greene in the offices of Costner and Greene in Maryville.
  - b. Exhibit "A" of this document states that the conveyance is subject to stated property restrictions, which were attached to the Deed of Trust.
  - c. Mimi and Kevin Hiatt signed the Deed of Trust with the property restrictions in the presence of witnesses.
    - i. Mrs. Terry Bledsoe, Steve Greene's assistant at Blount Title, is a Notary Public. She signed as a witness and affixed her Notary Public stamp.
  - d. The restrictions were recorded in the Blount County Register's Office on August 4, 1993.
  
  - e. Attached are copies of the following documents:
    - i. The Deed of Trust, which contains Exhibit "A" and bears Kevin and Mimi Hiatt's signatures.
    - ii. The property restrictions,
    - iii. Terry Bledsoe's signature and Notary stamp,
    - iv. And the Registrar's Office stamp.
  
3. As you can see, the restrictions clearly state that:
  - a. The property can ONLY be used for residential and agricultural purposes.
  - b. No signs other than one sign with the farm name is allowed,
  - c. And no noxious or offensive activity is allowed on the property that may be an annoyance or nuisance to the neighborhood.

4. Current owner, Mimi Hiatt, is in violation of the three restrictions listed above.
  - a. The residential building that Mimi and Kevin Hiatt originally built for their primary residence is currently being used as a special events business facility.

  - a. Deny Mimi Hiatt's application for a beer license
  - b. Require Mimi Hiatt to remove the business signs she has on the property.
  - c. And order Mimi Hiatt to cease all business operations on the property.



THIS SECURITY INSTRUMENT combines uniform covenants for national use and non-uniform covenants with limited variations by jurisdiction to constitute a uniform security instrument covering real property.

UNIFORM COVENANTS. Borrower and Lender covenant and agree as follows:

1. **Payment of Principal and Interest; Prepayment and Late Charges.** Borrower shall promptly pay when due the principal of and interest on the debt evidenced by the Note and any prepayment and late charges due under the Note.

2. **Funds for Taxes and Insurance.** Subject to applicable law or to a written waiver by Lender, Borrower shall pay to Lender on the day monthly payments are due under the Note, until the Note is paid in full, a sum ("Funds") for: (a) yearly taxes and assessments which may attain priority over this Security Instrument as a lien on the Property; (b) yearly leasehold payments or ground rents on the Property, if any; (c) yearly hazard or property insurance premiums; (d) yearly flood insurance premiums, if any; (e) yearly mortgage insurance premiums, if any; and (f) any sums payable by Borrower to Lender, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 8, in lieu of the payment of mortgage insurance premiums. These items are called "Escrow Items." Lender may, at any time, collect and hold Funds in an amount not to exceed the maximum amount a lender for a federally related mortgage loan may require for Borrower's escrow account under the federal Real Estate Settlement Procedures Act of 1974 as amended from time to time, 12 U.S.C. § 2601 *et seq.* ("RESPA"), unless another law that applies to the Funds sets a lesser amount. If so, Lender may, at any time, collect and hold Funds in an amount not to exceed the lesser amount. Lender may estimate the amount of Funds due on the basis of current data and reasonable estimates of expenditures of future Escrow Items or otherwise in accordance with applicable law.

The Funds shall be held in an institution whose deposits are insured by a federal agency, instrumentality, or entity (including Lender, if Lender is such an institution) or in any Federal Home Loan Bank. Lender shall apply the Funds to pay the Escrow Items. Lender may not charge Borrower for holding and applying the Funds, annually analyzing the escrow account, or verifying the Escrow Items, unless Lender pays Borrower interest on the Funds and applicable law permits Lender to make such a charge. However, Lender may require Borrower to pay a one-time charge for an independent real estate tax reporting service used by Lender in connection with this loan, unless applicable law provides otherwise. Unless an agreement is made or applicable law requires interest to be paid, Lender shall not be required to pay Borrower any interest or earnings on the Funds. Borrower and Lender may agree in writing, however, that interest shall be paid on the Funds. Lender shall give to Borrower, without charge, an annual accounting of the Funds, showing credits and debits to the Funds and the purpose for which each debit to the Funds was made. The Funds are pledged as additional security for all sums secured by this Security Instrument.

If the Funds held by Lender exceed the amounts permitted to be held by applicable law, Lender shall account to Borrower for the excess Funds in accordance with the requirements of applicable law. If the amount of the Funds held by Lender at any time is not sufficient to pay the Escrow Items when due, Lender may so notify Borrower in writing, and, in such case Borrower shall pay to Lender the amount necessary to make up the deficiency. Borrower shall make up the deficiency in no more than twelve monthly payments, at Lender's sole discretion.

Upon payment in full of all sums secured by this Security Instrument, Lender shall promptly refund to Borrower any Funds held by Lender. If, under paragraph 21, Lender shall acquire or sell the Property, Lender, prior to the acquisition or sale of the Property, shall apply any Funds held by Lender at the time of acquisition or sale as a credit against the sums secured by this Security Instrument.

3. **Application of Payments.** Unless applicable law provides otherwise, all payments received by Lender under paragraphs 1 and 2 shall be applied: first, to any prepayment charges due under the Note; second, to amounts payable under paragraph 2; third, to interest due; fourth, to principal due; and last, to any late charges due under the Note.

4. **Charges; Liens.** Borrower shall pay all taxes, assessments, charges, fines and impositions attributable to the Property which may attain priority over this Security Instrument, and leasehold payments or ground rents, if any. Borrower shall pay these obligations in the manner provided in paragraph 2, or if not paid in that manner, Borrower shall pay them on time directly to the person owed payment. Borrower shall promptly furnish to Lender all notices of amounts to be paid under this paragraph. If Borrower makes these payments directly, Borrower shall promptly furnish to Lender receipts evidencing the payments.

Borrower shall promptly discharge any lien which has priority over this Security Instrument unless Borrower: (a) agrees in writing to the payment of the obligation secured by the lien in a manner acceptable to Lender; (b) contests in good faith the lien by, or defends against enforcement of the lien in, legal proceedings which in the Lender's opinion operate to prevent the enforcement of the lien; or (c) secures from the holder of the lien an agreement satisfactory to Lender subordinating the lien to this Security Instrument. If Lender determines that any part of the Property is subject to a lien which may attain priority over this Security Instrument, Lender may give Borrower a notice identifying the lien. Borrower shall satisfy the lien or take one or more of the actions set forth above within 10 days of the giving of notice.

5. **Hazard or Property Insurance.** Borrower shall keep the improvements now existing or hereafter erected on the Property insured against loss by fire, hazards included within the term "extended coverage" and any other hazards, including floods or flooding, for which Lender requires insurance. This insurance shall be maintained in the amounts and

for the periods that Lender requires. The insurance carrier providing the insurance shall be chosen by Borrower subject to Lender's approval which shall not be unreasonably withheld. If Borrower fails to maintain coverage described above, Lender may, at Lender's option, obtain coverage to protect Lender's rights in the Property in accordance with paragraph 7.

All insurance policies and renewals shall be acceptable to Lender and shall include a standard mortgage clause. Lender shall have the right to hold the policies and renewals. If Lender requires, Borrower shall promptly give to Lender all receipts of paid premiums and renewal notices. In the event of loss, Borrower shall give prompt notice to the insurance carrier and Lender. Lender may make proof of loss if not made promptly by Borrower.

Unless Lender and Borrower otherwise agree in writing, insurance proceeds shall be applied to restoration or repair of the Property damaged, if the restoration or repair is economically feasible and Lender's security is not lessened. If the restoration or repair is not economically feasible or Lender's security would be lessened, the insurance proceeds shall be applied to the sums secured by this Security Instrument, whether or not then due, with any excess paid to Borrower. If Borrower abandons the Property, or does not answer within 30 days a notice from Lender that the insurance carrier has offered to settle a claim, then Lender may collect the insurance proceeds. Lender may use the proceeds to repair or restore the Property or to pay sums secured by this Security Instrument, whether or not then due. The 30-day period will begin when the notice is given.

Unless Lender and Borrower otherwise agree in writing, any application of proceeds to principal shall not extend or postpone the due date of the monthly payments referred to in paragraphs 1 and 2 or change the amount of the payments. If under paragraph 21 the Property is acquired by Lender, Borrower's right to any insurance policies and proceeds resulting from damage to the Property prior to the acquisition shall pass to Lender to the extent of the sums secured by this Security Instrument immediately prior to the acquisition.

**6. Occupancy, Preservation, Maintenance and Protection of the Property; Borrower's Loan Application; Leaseholds.** Borrower shall occupy, establish, and use the Property as Borrower's principal residence within sixty days after the execution of this Security Instrument and shall continue to occupy the Property as Borrower's principal residence for at least one year after the date of occupancy, unless Lender otherwise agrees in writing, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, or unless extenuating circumstances exist which are beyond Borrower's control. Borrower shall not destroy, damage or impair the Property, allow the Property to deteriorate, or commit waste on the Property. Borrower shall be in default if any forfeiture action or proceeding, whether civil or criminal, is begun that in Lender's good faith judgment could result in forfeiture of the Property or otherwise materially impair the lien created by this Security Instrument or Lender's security interest. Borrower may cure such a default and reinstate, as provided in paragraph 18, by causing the action or proceeding to be dismissed with a ruling that, in Lender's good faith determination, precludes forfeiture of the Borrower's interest in the Property or other material impairment of the lien created by this Security Instrument or Lender's security interest. Borrower shall also be in default if Borrower, during the loan application process, gave materially false or inaccurate information or statements to Lender (or failed to provide Lender with any material information) in connection with the loan evidenced by the Note, including, but not limited to, representations concerning Borrower's occupancy of the Property as a principal residence. If this Security Instrument is on a leasehold, Borrower shall comply with all the provisions of the lease. If Borrower acquires fee title to the Property, the leasehold and the fee title shall not merge unless Lender agrees to the merger in writing.

**7. Protection of Lender's Rights in the Property.** If Borrower fails to perform the covenants and agreements contained in this Security Instrument, or there is a legal proceeding that may significantly affect Lender's rights in the Property (such as a proceeding in bankruptcy, probate, for condemnation or forfeiture or to enforce laws or regulations), then Lender may do and pay for whatever is necessary to protect the value of the Property and Lender's rights in the Property. Lender's actions may include paying any sums secured by a lien which has priority over this Security Instrument, appearing in court, paying reasonable attorneys' fees and entering on the Property to make repairs. Although Lender may take action under this paragraph 7, Lender does not have to do so.

Any amounts disbursed by Lender under this paragraph 7 shall become additional debt of Borrower secured by this Security Instrument. Unless Borrower and Lender agree to other terms of payment, these amounts shall bear interest from the date of disbursement at the Note rate and shall be payable, with interest, upon notice from Lender to Borrower requesting payment.

**8. Mortgage Insurance.** If Lender required mortgage insurance as a condition of making the loan secured by this Security Instrument, Borrower shall pay the premiums required to maintain the mortgage insurance in effect. If, for any reason, the mortgage insurance coverage required by Lender lapses or ceases to be in effect, Borrower shall pay the premiums required to obtain coverage substantially equivalent to the mortgage insurance previously in effect, at a cost substantially equivalent to the cost to Borrower of the mortgage insurance previously in effect, from an alternate mortgage insurer approved by Lender. If substantially equivalent mortgage insurance coverage is not available, Borrower shall pay to Lender each month a sum equal to one-twelfth of the yearly mortgage insurance premium being paid by Borrower when the insurance coverage lapsed or ceased to be in effect. Lender will accept, use and retain these payments as a loss reserve in lieu of mortgage insurance. Loss reserve payments may no longer be required, at the option of Lender, if mortgage insurance coverage (in

the amount and for the period that Lender requires) provided by an insurer approved by Lender again becomes available and is obtained. Borrower shall pay the premiums required to maintain mortgage insurance in effect, or to provide a loss reserve, until the requirement for mortgage insurance ends in accordance with any written agreement between Borrower and Lender or applicable law.

**9. Inspection.** Lender or its agent may make reasonable entries upon and inspections of the Property. Lender shall give Borrower notice at the time of or prior to an inspection specifying reasonable cause for the inspection.

**10. Condemnation.** The proceeds of any award or claim for damages, direct or consequential, in connection with any condemnation or other taking of any part of the Property, or for conveyance in lieu of condemnation, are hereby assigned and shall be paid to Lender.

In the event of a total taking of the Property, the proceeds shall be applied to the sums secured by this Security Instrument, whether or not then due, with any excess paid to Borrower. In the event of a partial taking of the Property in which the fair market value of the Property immediately before the taking is equal to or greater than the amount of the sums secured by this Security Instrument immediately before the taking, unless Borrower and Lender otherwise agree in writing, the sums secured by this Security Instrument shall be reduced by the amount of the proceeds multiplied by the following fraction: (a) the total amount of the sums secured immediately before the taking, divided by (b) the fair market value of the Property immediately before the taking. Any balance shall be paid to Borrower. In the event of a partial taking of the Property in which the fair market value of the Property immediately before the taking is less than the amount of the sums secured immediately before the taking, unless Borrower and Lender otherwise agree in writing or unless applicable law otherwise provides, the proceeds shall be applied to the sums secured by this Security Instrument whether or not the sums are then due.

If the Property is abandoned by Borrower, or if, after notice by Lender to Borrower that the condemnor offers to make an award or settle a claim for damages, Borrower fails to respond to Lender within 30 days after the date the notice is given, Lender is authorized to collect and apply the proceeds, at its option, either to restoration or repair of the Property or to the sums secured by this Security Instrument, whether or not then due.

Unless Lender and Borrower otherwise agree in writing, any application of proceeds to principal shall not extend or postpone the due date of the monthly payments referred to in paragraphs 1 and 2 or change the amount of such payments.

**11. Borrower Not Released; Forbearance By Lender Not a Waiver.** Extension of the time for payment or modification of amortization of the sums secured by this Security Instrument granted by Lender to any successor in interest of Borrower shall not operate to release the liability of the original Borrower or Borrower's successors in interest. Lender shall not be required to commence proceedings against any successor in interest or refuse to extend time for payment or otherwise modify amortization of the sums secured by this Security Instrument by reason of any demand made by the original Borrower or Borrower's successors in interest. Any forbearance by Lender in exercising any right or remedy shall not be a waiver of or preclude the exercise of any right or remedy.

**12. Successors and Assigns Bound; Joint and Several Liability; Co-signers.** The covenants and agreements of this Security Instrument shall bind and benefit the successors and assigns of Lender and Borrower, subject to the provisions of paragraph 17. Borrower's covenants and agreements shall be joint and several. Any Borrower who co-signs this Security Instrument but does not execute the Note: (a) is co-signing this Security Instrument only to mortgage, grant and convey that Borrower's interest in the Property under the terms of this Security Instrument; (b) is not personally obligated to pay the sums secured by this Security Instrument; and (c) agrees that Lender and any other Borrower may agree to extend, modify, forbear or make any accommodations with regard to the terms of this Security Instrument or the Note without that Borrower's consent.

**13. Loan Charges.** If the loan secured by this Security Instrument is subject to a law which sets maximum loan charges, and that law is finally interpreted so that the interest or other loan charges collected or to be collected in connection with the loan exceed the permitted limits, then: (a) any such loan charge shall be reduced by the amount necessary to reduce the charge to the permitted limit; and (b) any sums already collected from Borrower which exceeded permitted limits will be refunded to Borrower. Lender may choose to make this refund by reducing the principal owed under the Note or by making a direct payment to Borrower. If a refund reduces principal, the reduction will be treated as a partial prepayment without any prepayment charge under the Note.

**14. Notices.** Any notice to Borrower provided for in this Security Instrument shall be given by delivering it or by mailing it by first class mail unless applicable law requires use of another method. The notice shall be directed to the Property Address or any other address Borrower designates by notice to Lender. Any notice to Lender shall be given by first class mail to Lender's address stated herein or any other address Lender designates by notice to Borrower. Any notice provided for in this Security Instrument shall be deemed to have been given to Borrower or Lender when given as provided in this paragraph.

**15. Governing Law; Severability.** This Security Instrument shall be governed by federal law and the law of the jurisdiction in which the Property is located. In the event that any provision or clause of this Security Instrument or the Note conflicts with applicable law, such conflict shall not affect other provisions of this Security Instrument or the Note which can be given effect without the conflicting provision. To this end the provisions of this Security Instrument and the Note are declared to be severable.

**16. Borrower's Copy.** Borrower shall be given one conformed copy of the Note and of this Security Instrument.

**17. Transfer of the Property or a Beneficial Interest in Borrower.** If all or any part of the Property or any interest in it is sold or transferred (or if a beneficial interest in Borrower is sold or transferred and Borrower is not a natural person) without Lender's prior written consent, Lender may, at its option, require immediate payment in full of all sums secured by this Security Instrument. However, this option shall not be exercised by Lender if exercise is prohibited by federal law as of the date of this Security Instrument.

If Lender exercises this option, Lender shall give Borrower notice of acceleration. The notice shall provide a period of not less than 30 days from the date the notice is delivered or mailed within which Borrower must pay all sums secured by this Security Instrument. If Borrower fails to pay these sums prior to the expiration of this period, Lender may invoke any remedies permitted by this Security Instrument without further notice or demand on Borrower.

**18. Borrower's Right to Reinstate.** If Borrower meets certain conditions, Borrower shall have the right to have enforcement of this Security Instrument discontinued at any time prior to the earlier of: (a) 5 days (or such other period as applicable law may specify for reinstatement) before sale of the Property pursuant to any power of sale contained in this Security Instrument; or (b) entry of a judgment enforcing this Security Instrument. Those conditions are that Borrower: (a) pays Lender all sums which then would be due under this Security Instrument and the Note as if no acceleration had occurred; (b) cures any default of any other covenants or agreements; (c) pays all expenses incurred in enforcing this Security Instrument, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees; and (d) takes such action as Lender may reasonably require to assure that the lien of this Security Instrument, Lender's rights in the Property and Borrower's obligation to pay the sums secured by this Security Instrument shall continue unchanged. Upon reinstatement by Borrower, this Security Instrument and the obligations secured hereby shall remain fully effective as if no acceleration had occurred. However, this right to reinstate shall not apply in the case of acceleration under paragraph 17.

**19. Sale of Note; Change of Loan Servicer.** The Note or a partial interest in the Note (together with this Security Instrument) may be sold one or more times without prior notice to Borrower. A sale may result in a change in the entity (known as the "Loan Servicer") that collects monthly payments due under the Note and this Security Instrument. There also may be one or more changes of the Loan Servicer unrelated to a sale of the Note. If there is a change of the Loan Servicer, Borrower will be given written notice of the change in accordance with paragraph 14 above and applicable law. The notice will state the name and address of the new Loan Servicer and the address to which payments should be made. The notice will also contain any other information required by applicable law.

**20. Hazardous Substances.** Borrower shall not cause or permit the presence, use, disposal, storage, or release of any Hazardous Substances on or in the Property. Borrower shall not do, nor allow anyone else to do, anything affecting the Property that is in violation of any Environmental Law. The preceding two sentences shall not apply to the presence, use, or storage on the Property of small quantities of Hazardous Substances that are generally recognized to be appropriate to normal residential uses and to maintenance of the Property.

Borrower shall promptly give Lender written notice of any investigation, claim, demand, lawsuit or other action by any governmental or regulatory agency or private party involving the Property and any Hazardous Substance or Environmental Law of which Borrower has actual knowledge. If Borrower learns, or is notified by any governmental or regulatory authority, that any removal or other remediation of any Hazardous Substance affecting the Property is necessary, Borrower shall promptly take all necessary remedial actions in accordance with Environmental Law.

As used in this paragraph 20, "Hazardous Substances" are those substances defined as toxic or hazardous substances by Environmental Law and the following substances: gasoline, kerosene, other flammable or toxic petroleum products, toxic pesticides and herbicides, volatile solvents, materials containing asbestos or formaldehyde, and radioactive materials. As used in this paragraph 20, "Environmental Law" means federal laws and laws of the jurisdiction where the Property is located that relate to health, safety or environmental protection.

NON-UNIFORM COVENANTS. Borrower and Lender further covenant and agree as follows:

**21. Acceleration; Remedies.** Lender shall give notice to Borrower prior to acceleration following Borrower's breach of any covenant or agreement in this Security Instrument (but not prior to acceleration under paragraph 17 unless applicable law provides otherwise). The notice shall specify: (a) the default; (b) the action required to cure the default; (c) a date, not less than 30 days from the date the notice is given to Borrower, by which the default must be cured; and (d) that failure to cure the default on or before the date specified in the notice may result in acceleration of the sums secured by this Security Instrument and sale of the Property. The notice shall further inform Borrower of the right to reinstate after acceleration and the right to bring a court action to assert the non-existence of a default or any other defense of Borrower to acceleration and sale. If the default is not cured on or before the date specified in the notice, Lender at its option may require immediate payment in full of all sums secured by this Security Instrument without further demand and may invoke the power of sale and any other remedies permitted by applicable law. Lender shall be entitled to collect all expenses incurred in pursuing the remedies provided in this paragraph 21, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of title evidence.

If Lender invokes the power of sale, Trustee shall give notice of sale by public advertisement in the county in which the Property is located for the time and in the manner provided by applicable law, and Lender or Trustee shall mail a copy of the notice of sale to Borrower in the manner provided in paragraph 14. Trustee, without demand on Borrower, shall sell the Property at public auction to the highest bidder at the time and under the terms designated in the notice of sale. Lender or its designee may purchase the Property at any sale.

Trustee shall deliver to the purchaser Trustee's deed conveying the Property without any covenant or warranty, expressed or implied. The recitals in the Trustee's deed shall be prima facie evidence of the truth of the statements made therein. Trustee shall apply the proceeds of the sale in the following order: (a) to all expenses of the sale, including, but not limited to, reasonable Trustee's and attorneys' fees; (b) to all sums secured by this Security Instrument; and (c) any excess to the person or persons legally entitled to it. If the Property is sold pursuant to this paragraph 21, Borrower, or any person holding possession of the Property through Borrower, shall immediately surrender possession of the Property to the purchaser at the sale. If possession is not surrendered, Borrower or such person shall be a tenant at will of the purchaser and hereby agrees to pay the purchaser the reasonable rental value of the Property after sale.

22. Release. Upon payment of all sums secured by this Security Instrument, Lender shall release this Security Instrument without charge to Borrower.

23. Substitute Trustee. Blount County Commissioners,

I am the owner of the property bordering "Ridge Valley Farms" or "Silo Hill Café", whichever you prefer. This letter is an attempt to stop the operators of this business from further violation of the Blount County ordinances governing this particular business. As was explained to me, this business is "Grandfathered" because the business license was issued prior to the passing of the zoning legislation prohibiting such commercial endeavors. As a grandfathered business, Ridge Valley Farms is subject to the rules governing such a business. As was explained to me, a grandfathered business is disallowed from changing the nature of the business. Ridge Valley Farms, applied for their business license indicating the nature of the business as "A Special Events Facility".

Currently, the owners of this business have opened and are operating on a daily basis the "Silo Hill Café". They have applied for a beer license from Blount County, an issue which will be addressed in another manner. However it appears to me that this violates the grandfather clause in the zoning ordinances of Blount County in that they have drastically changed the nature of the business from a "special events facility" to a daily operating business of public accommodation. This is evidenced by the signs portrayed prominently on Six Mile Rd., another violation of codes which is being address with Roger Fields, a copy of that is enclosed. This is further evidenced by the addition of a name of another business on the same property.

Another violation I wish to point out is that this property, Ridge Valley Farms (Silo Hill Café), and my property were purchased from the same owner's sub-division of a larger parcel. We both agreed to deed restrictions on each of our properties which totally prohibits any of the activities that are being conducted on this property. That would include the "Special Events Facility", and the new "Silo Hill Café" a restaurant for public accommodation. A copy of these restrictions are included here. Mr. and Mrs. Epperson are the former owners of this property and are providing further evidence of these violations in a separate communication.

It is my wish that legal action by the county be taken against the owners of this property considering the gross disregard for the ordinances protecting

the neighboring properties from such activities. This business has proven to be a danger to the community. Parties held at the "Special Events Facility" have shown to provide an occasion for alcoholic consumption, albeit to date provided by the attendees. This has been evidenced in the behavior of the parties, loud and boisterous reveling on many occasions emanating from the facility. In addition automobile operation by the attendees on numerous occasions have exhibited dangerous behavior lending to the belief that alcohol consumption was allowed at these various functions.

These are but a few of the distasteful results from the operation of this business in our formerly agricultural and residential community. The pastoral nature of our community has been severely violated by allowing this business to function. I am pleading to the Blount County Commissioners to investigate these claims and provide whatever legal remedies that are allowed.

Thank you for your attention to this matter.





1. When Bruce and I sold the property on Six Mile Road to Mimi and Kevin Hiatt on July 30, 1993, the sale was subject to restrictions.
  - a. The Deed of Trust was prepared by attorney Steven Greene in the offices of Costner and Greene in Maryville.
  - b. Exhibit "A" of this document states that the conveyance is subject to stated restrictions, which were attached to the Deed of Trust.
  - c. Mimi and Kevin signed the Deed of Trust with the restrictions in the presence of witnesses. Mrs. Terry Bledsoe, Steve Greene's assistant in Blount Title, is a Notary Public. She signed as a witness and affixed her Notary Public stamp.
  - d. The restrictions were recorded in the Blount County Register's Office on August 4, 1993.
  - e. Copies of Exhibit "A", the restrictions, Terry Bledsoe's signature and stamp, and the Registrar's Office stamp are attached.
2. I plan to take copies of the Deed of Trust and the restrictions to the County Commissioners' office this week with a cover letter stating that Mimi Hiatt is in violation of the restrictions and requesting that:
  - a. Her application for a beer license be denied.
  - b. That she remove the unlawful business signs she has on the property.
  - c. That she be required to cease all business operations on the property.
3. I talked with Bob Ramsey who is chairman of the County Commissioners and also on the Beer Board. According to Bob,
  - a. When the County Commissioners' office receives the information I provide them, their office will fax the documents to the county's attorney, Mr. Rob Goddard.
  - b. After reviewing the documents, Mr. Goddard will make a recommendation to the County Commissioners and to the Beer Board concerning Mimi's application for the beer license.
    - i. I am hopeful that he will also make recommendations for the other violations. If not, maybe he will advise us how to proceed.

8. GARBAGE AND REFUSE DISPOSAL. No lot shall be used or maintained as a dumping ground for rubbish. Trash, garbage or other waste shall not be kept except in sanitary containers. All incinerators or other equipment for the

storage or disposal of such material shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

9. SEWAGE DISPOSAL. No individual sewage disposal system shall be permitted on any lot unless such system is designed, located and constructed in accordance with the requirements, standards and recommendations of both state and local public health authorities. Approval of such systems as installed shall be obtained from such authority.

10. LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY. No animals, livestock, or poultry of any kind shall be used, bred or kept on any lot, except that two dogs, one horse and/or cow shall be permitted on any lot containing at least five acres, provided, however, that no animals of any kind may be maintained for any commercial purposes. If the property is maintained as a single tract, and not divided into five acre tracts, two dogs, one horse and/or one cow shall be allowed for every five acres or as the ecology of the land and neighbor surroundings permit. However, in keeping with the spirit of the covenants, nothing would be done to detract from the property or the surrounding neighbor properties.

11. UTILITY YARD. Each dwelling shall have only one utility yard. Each utility yard shall be walled or fenced to hide from view all materials inside and the entrance thereto shall be screened, using materials that are compatible with the style and general landscape of the area. The following buildings, structures and objects may be erected, maintained and allowed to remain on the tract only if same are located wholly within a utility yard: Workshop, pens, yards and houses for pets, above ground storage of construction materials, wood, coal, oil and other fuels, clothing racks and clothing lines, garbage and trash cans and receptacles, above ground mechanical equipment and any other structures and objects of an unsightly nature or appearance.

12. UTILITIES. All utilities serving any dwelling or other outbuilding to be located on the above described property shall be placed underground. No overhead wiring of any type shall be permitted.

13. BOATS, TRAILERS, ETC. All boats, trailers, automobiles, trucks, campers, riding lawnmowers, tractors or similar vehicles shall be maintained in a closed garage.

14. TERM. These covenants shall run with the land and shall be binding on the owners of the above described property and all persons claiming under them and may be enforced against any other party by the parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns and any parties to whom the grantors herein may convey other property with similar restrictions.

15. ENFORCEMENT. Enforcement shall be by proceedings at law or equity against any person or persons violating or attempting to violate any covenant either to restrain the violation or to recover damages.

16. SEVERABILITY. Invalidation of any one of these covenants by judgment or court order shall in no wise affect any of the other provisions which shall remain in full force and effect.

**WHEREAS**, the officer must make at least two trips to the Election Commission Office – one to pick up the JBC and election materials the day before the election and one to return the JBC and election materials on Election Night; and

**WHEREAS**, the officer is responsible for setting up and breaking down the voting precinct and calling the Election Commission Office with all questions; and

**WHEREAS**, the officer currently receives \$5 more per election than the other election workers; and

**WHEREAS**, due to the increase in gasoline prices, the Blount County Election Commission voted on February 29, 2008 to request that the compensation for the officer of elections be increased from \$105 per election to \$150; and

Commissioners Present: Chairman, Jim Scully, Ernest Blankenship, Rick Brownlie, Gary Farmer, Brad Harrison, Scott Helton, Tom Hodge, Bruce McClellan, Bill Proffitt, Robert Ramsey and Ed Stucky. Commissioners Absent: Tonya Burchfield.

The minutes of the December 18, 2007 regular monthly meeting were approved, prior to the meeting these were mailed to members for review.

Commissioner Ramsey made the motion to add to the agenda discussion regarding standards for buffer widths along streams and waterways in the county as referred from County Commission. Commissioner Brownlie seconded the motion that was approved unanimously.

**PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

**Re-zoning from S-Suburbanizing to C-Commercial property located at White Crest Drive identified as Tax Map 057B, Group B, Parcel 014.01:**

The property lies within the urban growth boundary for the City of Maryville and is in the area of other commercial zoned properties.

No one spoke regarding the re-zoning request and the public hearing was closed.

Commissioner Brownlie made the motion to send the re-zoning request to the County Commission with a favorable recommendation, seconded by Commissioner Farmer.

Commissioner McClellan asked if the property owner had been in contact with TVA regarding the power line easement located on the property.

The property owner explained that a portion of the property was located outside of the power line easement and the buildings would be located within that area.

Mr. Fields explained that the property owners would have to submit a site plan proposal to the Planning Commission.

The motion was approved with Commissioners McClellan and Scully voting no. The re-zoning request will be sent to the County Commission with a favorable recommendation.

**Re-zoning from R-1 Rural District 1 to C-Commercial property located on US Hwy 411 North and identified as Tax Map 038, Parcel 070.06:**

The property owner is requesting that this 9.5 acre tract be re-zoned from R-1 to Commercial. The property previously contained a reservoir for the City of Maryville water treatment plant. There are no other commercially zoned properties located in this area of the county. The property owner would like to park excavation equipment on the property. This type of use would not qualify as a special exception in the R-1 zone.

Diane Shafer and John Weston spoke out against the request for re-zoning citing the adjoining residential areas and how a commercially zoned property with this type of business would impact the property values.

Commissioner Helton made the motion to send the request to the County Commission without a recommendation, seconded by Commissioner Harrison.

The motion failed with Commissioners Farmer and Helton being the only commissioners in favor of sending the request to the County Commission without a recommendation.

Commissioner Brownlie made the motion to deny the request for re-zoning and to send the request to the County Commission with an unfavorable recommendation. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Stucky. The motion to deny the request was approved unanimously. The request will be sent to the County Commission with a recommendation to deny the re-zoning request.

**Re-zoning from R-1 to RAC-Rural Arterial Commercial property located at 4628 US Hwy 411 South and identified as Tax Map 100, Parcel 032.01:**

The property owner is requesting that the property be re-zoned to a depth of 500 feet along the highway right-of-way. The parcel contains a total of 14.11 acres. The property is currently being rented to be used for horse stables. The tenant would like to offer veterinarian and grooming services. These services are identified as a permitted use in the RAC zone.

No one spoke out regarding the rezoning request.

Commissioner Helton made the motion to send the re-zoning request to the County Commission with a favorable recommendation, seconded by Commissioner Farmer. The motion was approved unanimously.

**Re-zoning from S-Suburbanizing to C-Commercial property located on Lamar Alexander Parkway at 102 Gateway Road and identified as Tax Map 059, Parcels 048.00, 048.01, and 048.09:**

The property owner is requesting that the property located at 102 Gateway Road be re-zoned from S-Suburbanizing to C-Commercial. The property is identified as Tax Map 059, Parcels 048.00, 048.01 and 048.09. The parcels are located along E. Lamar Alexander Parkway on both the North and South sides of the Highway. Parcel 048.00 is at the corner of E. Lamar Alexander Parkway, Gateway Road and Tuckaleechee Trail and is split by the highway. Parcel 048.00 contains a total of 13.2 acres; parcel 048.01 contains a total of 1.75 acres; and parcel 048.09 contains a total of 1.49 acres. There are no specific plans for the property at this time.

The property is located within the urban growth boundary of the City of Maryville and is in the area of other commercially zoned properties.

No one spoke out regarding this request.

Discussion was held on whether or not a 500' depth restriction should apply to this parcel.

Commissioner Helton pointed out that other properties to the east of this parcel contained at least the same depth as this parcel if not greater.

Mr. Fields stated that the property at the former location of Mack's Junk Yard had been rezoned back to Gateway Road and probably had a depth of greater than 500 feet. He stated that this parcel was limited to access off Highway 321 only. He explained that the 500 foot depth restriction had only applied to properties being in the RAC zone which is outside the urban growth boundaries.

Commissioner Brownlie made the motion to defer the re-zoning request until further information is obtained from the property owner regarding the depth that is needed for the re-zoning. Commissioner Farmer seconded the motion.

Commissioner McClellan stated that according to his calculations the depth of the property was approximately 650' and that if only 500' were allowed for the re-zoning then the owner would be left with a small wedge of property that would be un-usable.

After this determination, Commissioner Brownlie stated that he would like to withdraw his motion. Commissioner Farmer withdrew the second to the motion.

Commissioner Harrison made the motion to send the re-zoning request to the County Commission with a favorable recommendation with the condition that access can only be on Highway 321 because Gateway Road and Tuckaleechee

Trail are minor roads and not appropriate for commercial use. The motion was seconded by Commissioner McClellan. The motion received unanimous approval.

**HEARINGS:**

**Preliminary Plats – Major Subdivisions:**

**Wesley Kerr Property:**

The Wesley Kerr Property off Mint Road is a proposed 3 lot subdivision to be served by a common driveway easement. Planning Department staff noted the following items to be completed:

- All instructions in the staff analysis including pre-construction meeting, permits and construction of all improvements.
- Copy of POA/Maintenance Agreement documentation to be supplied to staff for review prior to final plat submission.

Commissioner Stucky made the motion to approve the plat subject to meeting all requirements, applying identified conditions, and addressing deficiencies, seconded by Commissioner Hodge. The motion received unanimous approval.

**Preliminary and Final Plats – Major Subdivisions: None.**

**Preliminary and Final Plats – Minor Subdivisions:**

**Re-subdivision of Tract 1 of the Orpha Morton Property;**

The re-subdivision of Tract 1 of the Orpha Morton Property off Miser Station Road is a proposed 3 lot subdivision with county road frontage. Planning Department staff noted the following items to be completed:

- All certifications on the final plats.
- Payment of the \$20.00 per lot platting fee.

Commissioner Stucky made the motion to approve the preliminary and final plat subject to meeting all requirements, applying identified conditions, and addressing deficiencies, seconded by Commissioner McClellan. The motion received unanimous approval.

**Miscellaneous Items:**

**Benson Property off Quarry Hollow Road request for variance from septic capacity requirements:**

Alyene Benson (owner) and Rebecca Benson-Duckworth (daughter and prospective owner) request variance from the Subdivision Regulations

requirement that any lot created meet three bedroom approval for septic, and approval of a one lot plat. The daughter wishes to take possession of the prospective Tract 4 in advance of probate of the will, with concurrence of surviving owner/mother.

A one lot plat with remainder greater than five acres was submitted for administrative approval along Quarry Hollow Road. The plat submitted was a revision of a previous plat that would have resulted in three parcels, but was modified to allow a linkage between two sections of the larger tract at the rear of the proposed lot. The remainder land is approximately 12.5 acres.

Soils information provided to the Environmental Health Department showed severe limitations to septic fields. Mr. Ferguson was informed that the proposed lot was a lot of record, and that the lot was being modified to allow linkage of portions of the larger tract indicated as greater than five acres on the plat. Given the assumption that the plat was for a lot of record, Mr. Ferguson signed approval for 1 or 2 bedrooms.

Upon the plat reaching the Planning Department, staff noted that proposed Tract 4 was a new lot and not a lot of record. Staff found that the land was to be subject to distribution to heirs in the future by will, and had been surveyed for such purposes into several prospective tracts. In general, division of land by probate of a will would not be subject to planning review. Being in advance of probate of the will this falls fully under Subdivision Regulations. The minimum approval of a lot is three bedroom capacity for septic.

Staff also notes that the plat does not provide tie-in to any existing monuments, lot corners or intersections and that this would need to be added to the plat if approved.

Commissioner Farmer made the motion to grant the variance with approval of the plat and the plat clearly identify approval is for only a 1 or 2 bedroom structure. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Helton.

Commissioner Stucky made the motion to amend the motion to include instructions for the surveyor to provide a tie-in to any existing monuments, lot corners or intersections be added to the final plat. The amendment was accepted by Commissioners Farmer and Helton.

The motion to grant variance was approved unanimously.

**Butterfly Gap Independence Church off Butterfly Gap Loop Road variance request for lot size:**

This plat comes as a change of lot lines for the Butterfly Gap Independence Church lot. The lots lay along an existing county road. Currently the church site

consists only of the structure and a small area surrounding a portion of the building. The existing lot was conveyed to the church in 1949 and measures 50' x 72' for a total of 3,600 square feet.

The plat comes for determination of variance to allow the change of lot lines, with portions being combined from the James Hall and Earl Blevins Properties. The new lot size is 15,377 square feet to take in the church site, accessory buildings, parking and septic area. A 25' road right-of-way dedication is also indicated which is standard.

Staff has no reservations about the variance being granted as this is not a residential lot and greatly improves the existing situation and provides for the proper road right-of-way dedication.

Commissioner Stucky made the motion to approve the variance as requested, seconded by Commissioner Blankenship. The motion received unanimous approval.

**Discussion regarding the Water Quality Buffer Resolution:**

The County Commission forwarded this item to the Planning Commission for their review and recommendation. Justin Teague, Storm Water Administrator for Blount County explained that the City of Alcoa's regulations could be adopted in Blount County. The City of Alcoa has adopted a 35' stream buffer compared to a proposed 60' buffer on blue line streams. Mr. Teague explained that this only applies to new development and re-development; agricultural and existing lots would be exempt. The regulations have a 60' buffer on impaired streams and high quality waters which does include Little River.

Commissioner Blankenship made the motion to recommend for approval to the County Commission the regulations being used by the City of Alcoa which would be 35' from the center of the stream and 60' on impaired streams and high quality waters during construction, seconded by Commissioner Farmer. A roll call vote was taken:

Commissioner McClellan made the motion to recommend that the County Commission form an ad-hoc committee comprised of Roger Fields, Jim Scully, Scott Helton, Brad Harrison, and Dr. Robert Ramsey to study the issues and possible solutions relating to junk cars. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Helton and received unanimous approval.

**Discussion of LED signs:**

This item was deferred to the February meeting.

**Discussion on ridge line and hill side development:**

Commissioner Farmer made the motion to empower an ad-hoc committee consisting of Commissioners Blankenship, Brownlie, Proffitt and Stucky to work in cooperation with Mr. Lamb to progress with this as much as possible to start developing the blue print for the restrictions. Commissioner Helton seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

**Staff Reports: None.**

Forms were included in the packets for Planning Commissioners to document training hours for 2007.

**Adjournment.**

There being no further business to conduct, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.

## Summary Outline

The Growth Management Advisory Committee was commissioned by the County Public Service Committee and approved by the Blount County Commission in June 2007. The charge of this committee was to recommend a program or process plus funding sources in order to procure development rights of farmland and open green space.

Blount County has 352,000 acres of which 153,000 acres are farmland. There are approximately 2900 parcels of which 15 acres or more are in the greenbelt classification. This committee feels that the commission's timing and direction is right on target in looking for ways to preserve the rural character of Blount County at the request of our citizens.

As we prepare this report, the committee has conducted sixteen meetings and has met with fourteen individuals who have the knowledge and experience to draw from. We have attended two seminars given by nationally recognized individuals plus have conducted a huge internet search of the counties and states in this United States for land procurement.

This report identifies the individuals we have met with and the information gathered. This report also includes facts & figures on tourism, growth and incentives for individuals who want to sell their development rights, funding options and a guideline to put the organizational structure in place. Informational maps are attached to this report.

This report provides a prioritized list of funding options that exceeds (conservatively) \$1.7 million dollars that the commission could utilize. These funding vehicles provide new and innovative means for funding a program of this nature. The commission can vote to task this committee with implementing the next step in the process or establish a new committee who can follow the guidelines in this report, if they choose to, in order to set up the proposed organizational structure. The committee recommends establishing a non profit foundation similar in nature to The Legacy Parks Foundation in Knoxville, Tennessee. With a conservative figure of \$1.7 million dollars in funding identified in this report and \$300 million annually that are available in Federal & State Grants, the committee feels there is every reason to believe this program should succeed if allowed to move forward.

This committee thanks the commission for showing faith in the GMAC and the perspectives of Blount County Citizens. This allowed the committee to formulate this report in order to preserve Blount County's local heritage, environment, open green space, local economy and rural character of Blount County for current and future generations.

## **Growth Management Committee Mission Statement**

The Blount County Growth Management Committee (GMAC) is a civilian organization that will facilitate information to the Blount County Public Service Committee and the Blount County Commission. The GMAC objective is to develop and recommend a program or process for the procurement of Development Rights for identified green space within Blount County.

### **Tourism Facts & Figures**

- The Visitors Bureau was established in 1979.
- They use brochures, print ads, TV & radio spots, billboards and are moving towards the electronic future with an expanded web site.
- 50% of the business is generated around the airport motel/hotels and is mostly business people or travelers.
- The hotels/motels around Townsend generate the other 50% which is mostly tourists but they are now focusing on getting business people for meetings and conventions.
- Pigeon Forge & Gatlinburg were formerly Blount County’s main competition but Chattanooga & Myrtle Beach are now pulling people away because of the internet.
- There will be an estimated \$4,000,000.00 collected in sales tax from tourist related businesses in Blount County this year and an additional \$650,000.00 coming from the hotel/motel tax.
- A U.T. study shows that the tourist sector of Blount County employs more then 2800 individuals with an annual payroll of \$69, 000,000.00.
- Tourists spend more then \$250,000,000.00 annually at these businesses.

It is clear to the committee that a PDR program will enhance the Visitors Center and tourism in Blount County by maintaining the rural character that draws the people here.

## **Growth Figures**

- Population in 1970 = 63,744
- Population in 1980 = 77,700 = 22% Increase
- Population in 1990 = 85,969 = 10.5% Increase
- Population in 2000 = 105,823 = 23% Increase
- Estimated population in 2010 = 126,900
- Estimated population in 2020 = Between 130,000-148,000.
- Estimated population in 2050 = Between 145,000-203,000.
- Calculated growth rate from 2000-2010 = 20%

The population explosion over the past two decades reconfirms the need to put a PDR/TDR program in place rather than later in order to protect the reason most of us settled here, for the rural character and the natural unencumbered beauty of Blount County.

## **Gerry Cohn's Six Step Protection Program**

- Making the case to the public.
- Providing Tools (Information) to the landowners.
- Profitability, marketing and agricultural sector infrastructure.
- Planning/Legal/Regulatory framework.
- Protecting the land.
- Recourses, raising the money and linking to more expertise.

The steps above would protect wildlife, water quality, produce fresh food products, protect rural heritage, promote tourism and stabilize the economy.

## **Liz Upchurch's Overview**

- Develop a vision and specific goals for the green space infrastructure.
- Identify areas to conserve.
- Set priorities for land conservation based on goals set.
- Identify land conservation strategies and tools.
- Seek review and input.
- Adopt and implement plan.
- Develop regulations such as buffer, transfer or PDR rights.
- Establish incentives for tax benefits, density bonuses or reduced infrastructure.

This is very similar or we should say it coincides with Ed McMahon's six step approach. While moving forward with this plan, remember, the greener we get, the better the environment will be around us.

## **Incentives for PDR/TDR**

- You can sell a portion of the development rights or all of it.
- Your land is forever farmland, forest or open space but you'll receive a fair price for the development rights.
- You avoid legal battles with family members on what to do with the property.
- You can set aside an acre or so each for your loved ones in the agreement.
- You can restrict clear cutting of your forest land.
- You can protect the natural wildlife, fish, plants or similar ecosystem on your property.
- You can provide outdoor recreational or educational use for the general public.
- It preserves open space which yields a significant public benefit.
- It preserves properties of historical importance, land areas or certified historic structures.

Bottom-line, the landowner can draw up the PDR agreement that satisfies his or her specifications and needs upfront while receiving financial value to support them.

## **Funding Options**

The following are the GMAC's suggestions and innovative ideas in seeking funding for this program as set forth by our mission statement and the charge from the Commission.

### **1. Motel & Hotel Tax**

- The committee recommends a 1% increase on the tax rate from 4% to 5%.
- The committee estimates this would bring in an additional \$400,000.00.
- .5% of the recommended increase would go to the purchase or transfer of property development rights.
- .5% of the recommended increase would be divided up just as the present 4% rate is. 50% to advertising. 37.5% to the county general fund. 12.5% to the Smokey Mountain Convention & Visitor's Bureau.
- We're assuming the Smokey Mountain Convention & Visitor's Center will stand by this action since it would increase their business revenue.
- Presently Knoxville & Chattanooga are at 8%.
- Pigeon Forge & Gatlinburg are presently at 3% but the additional taxes they have in place would bring their rate to over 5%.

The committee believes that because this revenue is generated from tourism, this money is the perfect fit for preserving the rural character of Blount County.

### **2. Real Estate Transfer Fee,**

- The committee recommends implementing this fee at a \$100.00 per \$100,000.00 value sold.
- The recorder's office expenses for this program would be extracted from this fee.
- The remaining revenue would go for procurement of development rights.
- This would only impact individuals who have sold or are transferring property.
- A private act would have to be established and approved to implement this.
- There were 5630 property transfers in 2007.

This fee fits into the charge the committee was given since it the income would be generated from land sales.

### **3. Alternative or Option on Recording/Transfer Fee.**

- Amend Chapter 370 of Blount County, a private act established in 1972.
- The committee recommends raising all transfer fees to \$5.00 versus the existing \$1.00 fee per transfer which would generate approximately \$175,000.00.

### **4. Set Aside one Cent on the Tax Rate.**

- The committee suggests that the budget committee set aside one cent on the tax rate for procuring development rights.
- This would be about \$255,000.00.
- This would be enough to put a structure in place to oversee land procurement and move it forward. Structure will be discussed in another section.  
The committee believes once the proper structure is approved and put into place, the program would become self sufficient.

### **5. Greenbelt Roll Back Taxes**

- This is land that is presently placed in greenbelt for a tax break under Tennessee law.
- From 2002-2006, land sales out of the greenbelt generated an average revenue of \$116,110.00 per year.
- The committee is requesting a percentage of this revenue go for procuring development rights.
- According to data from the planning department, it is stated that it takes a property forty years to break even on the cost of a development because of the high cost of infrastructure and the services needed.
- Farm land maintains the rural character of the county and puts less strain on the services provided by the county.
- Presently there are 1302 farms in Blount County which total 105,148 acres.
- 2002 records show that there are 619 full time farmers in Blount County with the average age being fifty-seven.
- 2002 records show market value of crops produced is \$15,000,000.00. Value of livestock sold is \$9,352,000.00. Total value is over twenty-four million dollars.

The committee feels these taxes are related to the specific charge we were given and should be considered for maintaining green space in the county. This would also help keep the service cost for Blount County under control and preserve our farmland.

### **6. One Half Percent Increase on the Sales Tax.**

- The committee recommends that the county take the sales tax from 9.25% to the limit of 9.75% because it's the committees understanding that the state may consider taking this revenue unless the county acts first to secure it. We feel the funds need to stay in Blount County.
- We suggest that 50% of the half cent increase go for our PDR/TDR program and the other half to the schools.

### **7. Donation Box on Property Tax Bill.**

- Administered by the Trustee's office.
- Every individual property owner would be given the opportunity to check the box if they so desire and add any amount they choose to go towards the PDR/TDR program.
- This would be voluntary only.
- Would require marketing and promotion once organizational structure is in place.
- Funds collected would only be used for the PDR/TDR program.

The committee feels this provides an avenue for all the property owners of Blount County who want to be involved, to step up and protect the rural character of the county.

### **8. State License Plate.**

- Seek approval from the state to develop a plate for this program.
- We must have a minimum of 1000 individuals who are willing to purchase this plate.
- There are roughly 130,000 vehicles in Blount County to draw from.
- This program opens the availability of grant money through the agricultural license tag that is already in place.
- This program could generate in upwards of \$31,000.00 per year.

The committee feels this is just another way for the citizens to show their true feelings on preserving the green space and can be extended to visitors throughout the state.

### **9. Wheel Tax**

- If the county chooses to institute a wheel tax, the committee recommends 15% go for the PDR/TDR program.
- This allows all non-property owners that live and drive in Blount County (An estimated 29%) to share in the cost of the PDR/TDR program.

### **10. Wind-Fall Revenue**

- The county passes a balanced budget each year that goes into effect July 1 of each year.
- The committee is suggesting that the PDR/TDR program receive 10% of any revenue that exceeds the estimated revenue for each fiscal year.

## **Organizational Structure**

It is the recommendation of this committee that a nonprofit organization be established similar in nature to the Legacy Parks Foundation in Knoxville, Tennessee. The organizational structure and implementation of such an organization could be established through a volunteer committee similar to the present GMAC committee or a subset of the commission. The success of a preservation entity that can produce PDR agreements, obtain grant funding (Federal & State grants equal \$300 million annually), work with inter-government groups, market, promote an ultimately manage a PDR/TDR program of this magnitude would require a full time individual.

In addition, it is the belief of this committee that this individual should not be a government employee. This recommendation also encompasses establishing a collective pool of funding for the start up of this organization. This funding would consist of \$100,000.00 annually for twenty-four months and would be subsidized by the Blount County Commission, City of Maryville and the City of Alcoa.

The nonprofit organization would then use a compilation of the aforementioned funding mediums provided by this committee in order to grow the program and achieve sustainability.

- The committee feels that once funding is approved, the above suggestions can be implemented in a reasonable timeframe. Any or all funding that is approved would go into a separate fund and could not be drawn from until the structure is in place and approved.
- If the program fails to move forward, the procurement fund would go back in the general fund. The committee feels this program could be self sufficient within 24 months.

## **Closing Summary**

The committee encourages our public officials and citizens to read this carefully and please don't be afraid to ask questions for complete clarification and understanding.

The committee thanks the commission for this opportunity to serve you and the citizens of Blount County in an effort to preserve our rural character and natural beauty which is the foundation of this county.

The committee encourages the citizens & commission to continue to support this and move it forward to preserve the present and have it available for future generations to see and enjoy.

Respectfully I submit the following statement concerning raising the hotel/motel tax to fund the preservation of open space by the Blount County Growth Management Advisory Committee. I am hoping the SMCVB will take a position on this matter using the following as a guideline:

The Smoky Mountain Convention and Visitors Bureau (SMCVB) endorses the work of the Blount County Growth Management Advisory Committee. Voluntary preservation of open space, farm land and green space helps preserve the rural nature of the county benefiting everyone including the tourism industry.

We also support the menu of options the committee is recommending to the commission. Chief among the options is the creation of an organization/person to develop purchase right development strategies for the county and to pursue the millions of dollars in grants that seem to be available.

We do think the option to raise and use funds from the hotel/motel tax is an inappropriate use of those funds and that tax. This tax was created to specifically and directly develop the tourism industry in Blount County. Today, the SMCVB provides more than \$250 million dollars of economic impact for Blount County.

In order to continue at this level and grow that base, each dollar gained through the hotel/motel tax should be reinvested in supporting tourism businesses and the overall tourism industry in Blount County. According to the Department of Tourism Development, for every dollar spent for the promotion of tourism, there is a \$16 return on that investment. While the SMCVB supports smart growth and providing for green space, and these efforts will help the SMCVB achieve its mission of sustainable tourism, the use of the hotel/motel tax for this project would not provide enough return on investment to justify this program.

There are numerous other avenues for funding this project, several of which will provide more money for the cause. While these solutions may not be as simple as adding to the hotel/motel tax, Blount County cannot afford to start using its tourism revenue for projects other than those that are tourism-related.

Again, we do support the committee's work and we do think the other funding options identified by the committee are more appropriate for the PDR program. While the committee's mission and efforts are important, and we should do whatever we can to help them and Blount County, using the hotel/motel tax as a way to generate money for any project, other than tourism-related projects, is not a productive use of this money.
